This a/c flew to Sarangani Bay, but was unable to contact Peacock due to radio failure. The target was pointed out to the SBD's by the use of smoke bombs. The assigned target was hit by the SBD's. This a/c fired eight rockets at buildings and also strafed them, but results were unobserved. Peacock still could not be contacted, whereupon the plane returned to base.
