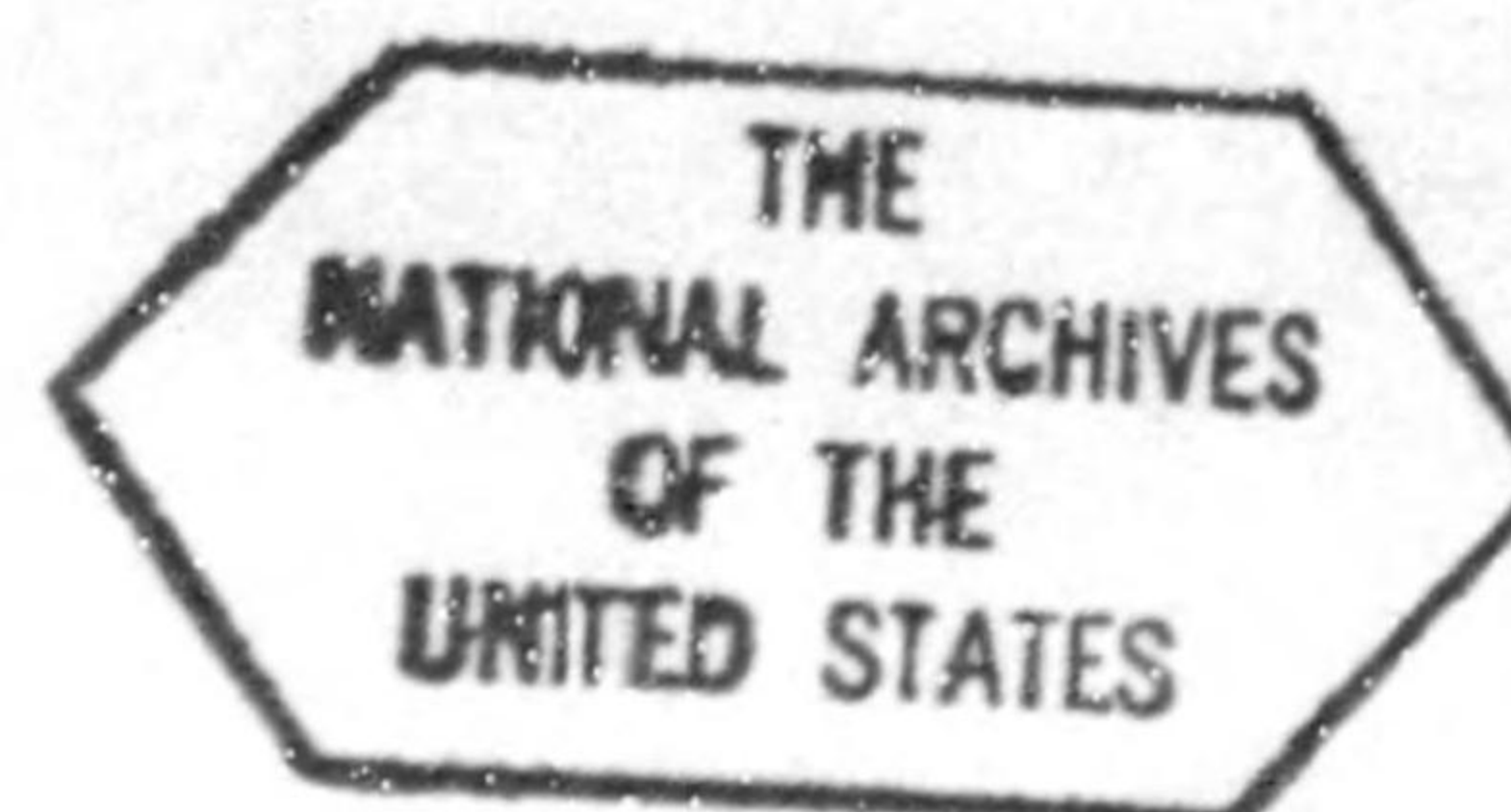

Rules for Business

Jensen-Sha was a private publishing company, and I, Junichi Koizumi, was its master. At my age of fifty I was suffered from a mental disease, and was sent to Matsuzawa Hospital.

Thence every thing was left to the manager, Kiyondo Inoue, for some time.

The manager and all staff resigned from the office one after another, and no post was filled up, so that when I was obliged to wind up my office as a sacrifice of the business consolidation, there had been no employee there.

After the termination of Pacific War, I restored my business, and became a member of the Japan Publishers' Association too. But at the beginning of June, preceding the announcement of the fundamental principle of the purge, I left the publishing circle again in fear of banishment, and instantly reported the fact to the Japan Publishers' Association, because I had been inspired to do so by newspaper with the account of the ordinance.

Please, excuse me of imprudence.
