By the schooner Monk, arrived here on Sunday, we have been informed that the Spanish troops after having landed at Cabo-Rojo, marched against Tampisome Mexican troops on a small hill where they had placed 4 pieces of cannon. The Spaniards took possession of nets; the Mexicans after having fired three or four times took flight leaving perate. their guns &c. to the enemy; the loss of the Spaniards is calculated to the amount of 50 men, that of the Mexicans is unknown.

The Spaniards afterwards took Puelo Viejo on the 3d, without any opposition and on the 7th they entered Tampico de las Tamaulipas.
