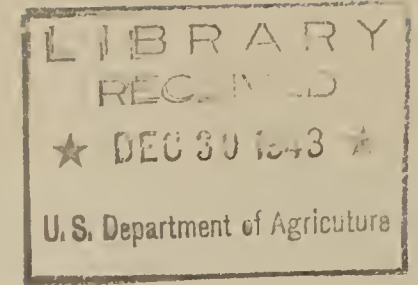

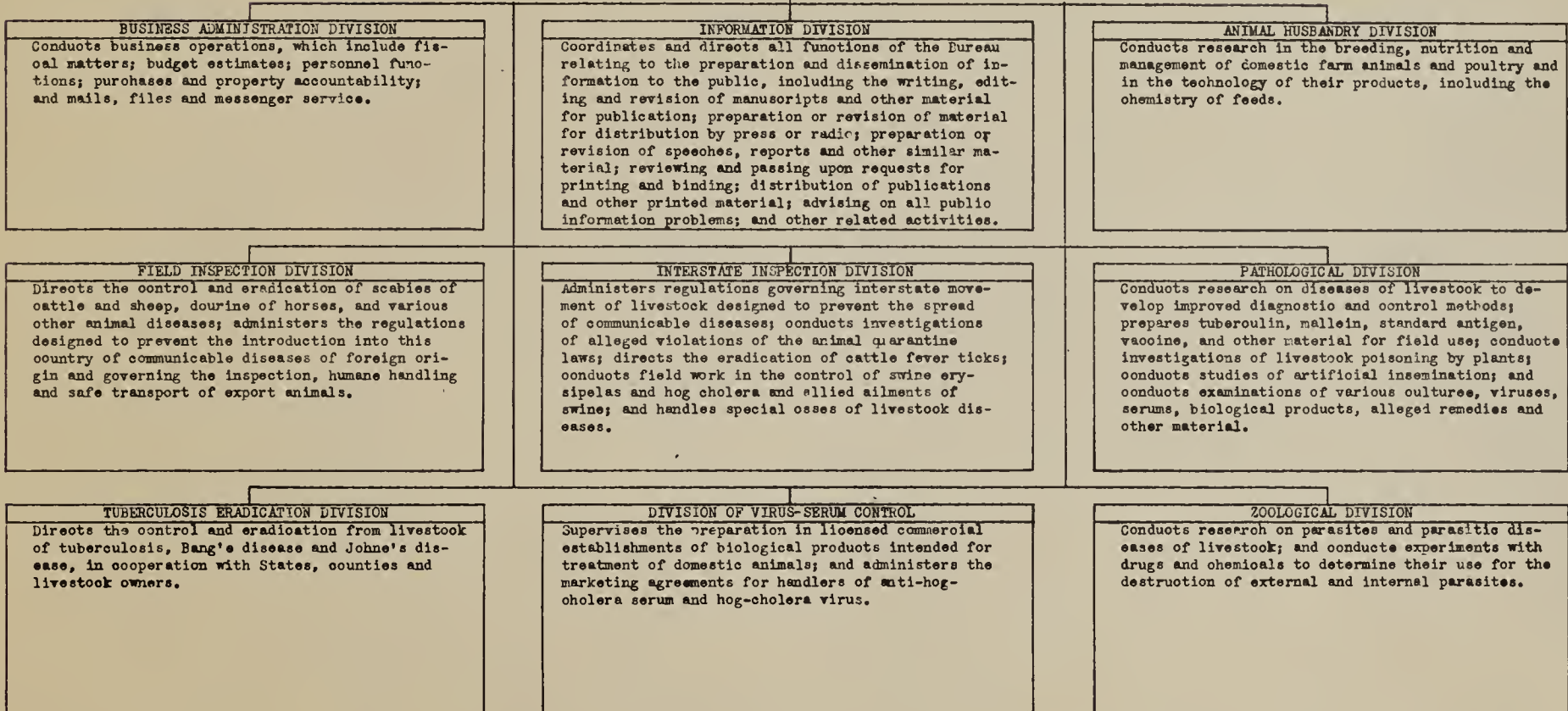

The Bureau is primarily concerned with the protection and development of the livestock industry and animal food resources of the United States. It conducts scientific investigations of the causes, prevention and treatment of livestock diseases, some of which are transmissible to man; investigates the prevalence of livestock diseases and aids in their control or eradication, often directing extensive field activities; carries on investigations and experiments in the breeding and feeding of animals; and administers the animal quarantine acts, the diseased-animal transportation acts, and the Virus-Serum-Toxin Act.
