T-1 continues to receive MM literature and its publication "On Target" but has attended no meetings. HAROLD C. TAYLOR, Denver, after reading about the organization, joined MM and received material but attended no meetings. TAYLOR broke off with MM in 1962. JAMES T. SMITH, Denver, joined MM in 1961, but later disassociated himself with the organization. GEORGE TALLENT on 9/13/63 furnished information that MM was anti-Semitic. A Prichard, Ala., businessman received a letter signed by "MORT EUTENEUER," purportedly mailed from Denver, 1/8/64, requesting his support for MM. Sources believe there is a group of MM presently active in Colo. Sources of opinion that this group includes a gunsmith student named PHILLIP PETARS; an accordion teacher named CHARLES E. TAYLOR, 2513 South Quitman Street, Denver, advised on February 3, 1964, that in August or September, 1961, he corresponded with DE PUGH as a result of reading an advertisement in a local newspaper. He stated that the advertisement had to do with securing a catalog on guns. TAYLOR stated he was interested in collecting guns and had no interest in any political activities of the MM. TAYLOR stated he did not secure from DE PUGH any guns of any type and, after receiving some literature from MM, he decided to disassociate himself with the organization and wrote a letter to DE PUGH requesting that his name be removed from DE PUGH's mailing list. TAYLOR stated he recalls receiving a letter from DE PUGH right after he joined MM to help organize a group in Denver but because of his disinterest in the aims of the MM he did not make any effort for such an organization and did not attend any meetings whatsoever held in Denver or anywhere else in the United States.

TALLENT stated that recently he had become disaffected with both the church and with the MM inasmuch as he has determined that elements of both organizations are strongly anti-Semitic and anti-Negro.

TALLENT advised that he knew ROBERT DE PUGH of Norborne, Missouri, on a personal basis. He stated that DE PUGH is the national leader of the MM and that he has visited DE PUGH on a number of occasions, his last visit being in April, 1963. TALLENT stated that he was asked by DE PUGH at that time to attend an intelligence and sabotage school sponsored by the MM; however, he was uncertain as to whether he would attend the school and did

not know either the location or the dates when this school was to be conducted. TALLENT stated he is in possession of DE PUGH's manual on guerrilla warfare, sabotage and espionage.

TALLENT advised that the chain of command of the MM is set up with cells of individuals at the lowest level. He said there are never more than six persons per cell. A certain number of cells then come under a group leader and there are never more than thirty persons per group. A certain number of groups make up a district and all the United States is divided into six such districts. All these districts come directly under DE PUGH. TALLENT advised that the organization is potentially dangerous and there are strong anti-Semitic and anti-Negro elements in the individual cells which could overthrow DE PUGH and possibly even the U.S. Government. TALLENT stated that many cells in the organization are willing to take arms against the United States should the need arise.

On September 20, 1963, TALLENT advised that he was being sent to the Faith Theological Seminary, Elkins Park, Philadelphia 17, Pennsylvania.
