What is a WikiProject?

1. A group of editors focused on improving articles around a specific topic or field of interest.
2. A central place for coordination, discussion, and organization of the group's activities.
3. Looks similar to a Wikipedia article, but functions more as a portal.
4. Active participation is key to a successful WikiProject.

How do I find WikiProjects?

1. WikiProjects exist within the 'Wikipedia' space rather than the 'Article' space. When searching for a WikiProject use Wikipedia before the project name in the search bar:
 - a. i.e. [Wikipedia:WikiProject Writing](#)
2. If the project does not exist, it will show up as a redlink when you type the name in.

How do I find WikiProjects?

- 1. No WikiProject is the same, they often vary depending on the scope, goals, and preferred organization of the group.**
- 2. However, most WikiProjects have sections for open tasks, lists of articles in need of edits or creation, and an assessment criteria for content and importance.**

Editing tasks

In an effort to improve, as well as create, articles that define the fields of rhetoric, composition, technical communication, literacy, and language studies, WikiProject Writing participants have developed a series of articles in need of revision and creation. Please do add articles to these lists if you find an article in need of edits or a notable topic in need of creation.

Vital articles in need of edits [edit]

Vital articles are articles deemed most important to improve to the highest quality standard on Wikipedia ([featured article status](#)). There are five levels of vital articles categorized by subject. If you find an article you believe could be vital, check the talk page for a banner that mentions whether the subject is vital or not.

General articles in need of improvement [edit]

General articles are articles under the scope of WikiProject Writing that need some work. We encourage you to add articles to this along with a note describing how the article can be improved. This can be as simple as mentioning an award a scholar received or restructuring the article for clarity.

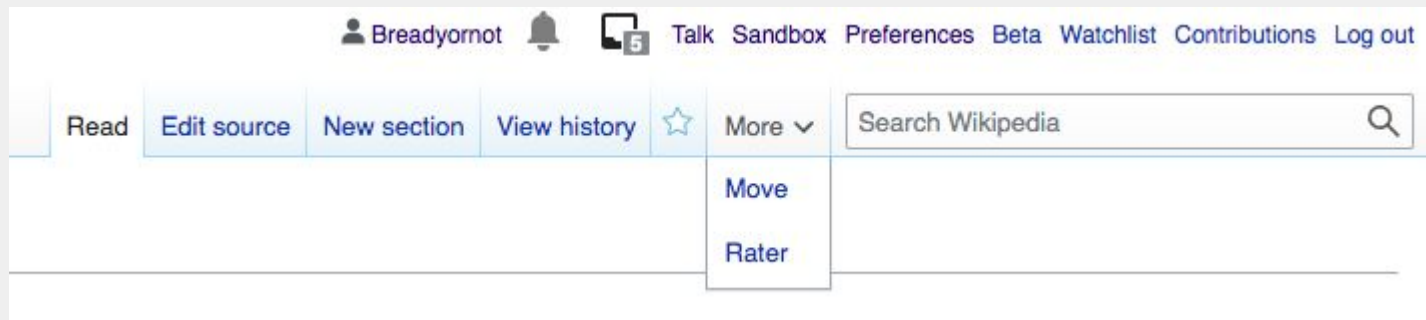

Hyperlinks & redlinks

Hyperlinking and adding redlinks

*In order to increase the accessibility of articles under the scope of WikiProject Writing, it is important to add hyperlinks that allow articles to be linked to each other. An article without any hyperlinks is considered an orphan. A topic/person without a Wikipedia article may be hyperlinked with a *redlink* - used to designate an article in need of creation.*

1. **Hyperlinking:** Head to an article under the scope of WikiProject Writing.
 - **Source editor:** Add a set of brackets ([example]) to the topic you wish to hyperlink. Your link will either publish in blue or red, depending on if the article exists on Wikipedia yet.
 - **Visual editor:** Highlight the topic you wish to hyperlink or redlink. Click on the 'Link' icon from the toolbar and select the Wikipedia article it refers to in the drop down menu. If an article does not exist, click on the 'Page does not exist' link from the dropdown to create a redlink.

Adding hyperlinks and redlinks are a great way to find new articles for creation & to link pages across articles.



Watching articles

Watching articles

Watching articles refers to opting into receiving email notifications about any edits made to an article(s) of your choosing. This function allows you to keep track of ongoing discussions about an article, as well as serve a peer review function by offering feedback on recent edits. Additionally, you can check how many editors are currently watching a specific article to monitor the amount of feedback you may receive on a recent edit or talk page post.

Here's how you can watch an article & check how many Wikipedians are watching an article:

1. Click on the star icon in the top right of your screen, next to the 'View history' button to add yourself to the watch list of an article.
2. Select 'Page information' under tools on the leftmost side of the web page. From here you will find the total number of editors watching the page under 'Basic information.'

Watching articles allows you to serve a peer review function by offering feedback on recent edits.



Adding wikidata statements

Adding Wikidata statements

Wikidata [↗](#) is one of Wikipedia's sister projects that helps to categorize and inform connections between article topics, people, etc. Wikidata can be edited by both humans and bots in any language and showcase content gaps across language Wikipedias, proving incredibly useful for combating knowledge inequities.

Wikipedia articles can have associated 'items' on Wikidata. Each item has a unique identifier called a 'Q-number' (i.e. [Q4119870](#) [↗](#)). These items are made up of properties and values that can be easily documented by reading the lead section of a Wikipedia article. Properties connect items to values (i.e. instance of, date of birth etc). A value connects the item to the property (i.e. academic, March 15, 1972, etc). An item, property, and value together are called statements.

By creating items for Wikipedia articles as well as adding properties and values, we make information more accessible to a wider audience. This can lead to translations across language Wikipedias, generating [queries](#) [↗](#) that showcase relevant content gaps under our scope, and greater categorization of articles that already exist under WikiProject Writing's scope.

Here's how you can find the wikidata statement on a Wikipedia article and add properties and values yourself:

1. Head to any Wikipedia article
2. Click on 'Wikidata item' under 'Tools' on the leftmost side of the screen
