SUBJECT: Disturbance in Tokyo Central Telephone Bureau

TO : Chief of Staff

1. Information:

a. CIC reports that a series of Communist-incited disturbances occurred on 27 and 28 Nov 48, centering around members of the All-Japan Communications Workers' Union (Zentei) in the Tokyo Central Telephone Bureau. Between 30 and 50 employees of the Central Telephone Bureau conducted daily sitdown strikes in the Bureau Chief's office from 24 to 27 Nov 48, demanding increases in allowances. On 27 Nov 48, approximately 90 employees met with the Bureau Chief to press their demands, and during the meeting the Bureau Chief was threatened by the employees in an exchange of heated words. The Bureau Chief notified the Marunouchi Police Station, which sent 20 uniformed policemen to the scene.

b. Six union members who were considered ringleaders of the disturbances were arrested by the police and held in the Marunouchi Police Station for investigation. Other workers conducted demonstrations in front of the police station until 2300 hours, 27 Nov 48, demanding release of the six arrested men. Demonstrations were again held in front of the police station on 28 Nov 48.

c. Subsequent to the arrests, the following persons visited the Chief of Police to demand the release of those being held: KIMURA Sakae, Japan Communist Party Diet member; DOBASHI Kazuyoshi, pro-Communist chairman of Zentei; HORIE Muraichi, Communist member of the Tokyo Board of Education; OKADA Hisao, Communist secretary-general of Zentei; and numerous other well known Communists and Zentei officials. The Chief of the Marunouchi Police Station refused to release the six Zentei workers in spite of all protests.

d. Among the six persons arrested were two members of the Zentei Central Executive Committee, the chairman of the Kanto Regional Council of Zentei, the chief of the Tokyo Central Telephone Bureau sub-branch of Zentei, and the chief of another Zentei sub-branch.

e. G-2 Comment: Information in the files of CIS G-2 indicates that Communist influence is heavy in the Central Telephone Bureau sub-branch of Zentei, and that as the result of a recent election, all officials of that sub-branch are Communists. The continuous harassing of Government bureau chiefs, etc., by workers with petty demands and complaints is a dispute tactic recently invented by Zentei to circumvent Government Ordinance #201, since such demands and complaints are technically legal.

2. Action:

a. Following agencies notified: ADC, Deputy Chiefs of Staff SCAP and FEC, ESS, CCS, CTS, GS, G-3, G-2, 8th Army, Signal Section.

SUBJECT: Current Developments in the China Military Situation
TO : Chief of Staff

1. Essential Elements of Information:

a. Reference is made to AMILAT, Nanking (JUSMAG) radio CYF 739 OAGA (AG No. 12288), 30 Nov 48 and AMILAT, ALUSNA, AIR Attaches, Nanking radio CM 1310 (AG No. 12286), 30 Nov 48 pertaining to military operations in the Hsuehou-Pangfou area.

b. Item 1 indicates that the Nationalist 12th Army Group, with orders to withdraw to the southeast to join the 6th Army Group, is now heavily engaged on all sides by seven Communist Columns in an area five miles southeast of Nanping. Nanping has been occupied by the Communists. ①

c. Item 2 indicates that, under Communist pressure, the Nationalist 6th Army Group has withdrawn from Kuchen to positions in rear of the Hsieh River, eight miles to the south. Nine Communist Columns are now approaching this position. The Nationalist 8th Army Group is also in position just south of the Hsieh River. Communist forces have occupied Kuchen and the area to the southwest thereof. ②

d. Item 3 indicates that the Nationalist 2d, 13th, and 16th Army Groups, moving cautiously south from Hsuehou, have advanced only five miles from their original positions in the past two days. ③

2. G-2 Comment:

a. The Nationalist 12th Army Group is apparently being effectively contained and probably will be prevented from joining the other Nationalist forces to the southeast.

b. According to the Chinese Supreme G-3, the Huai River line, through Pangfou, is being prepared for defense and it is believed that the 6th and 8th Army Groups will attempt to withdraw to this line. Communist pressure is being maintained against the Nationalist 6th and 8th Army Groups during their southward withdrawal and a move around the left

2. G-2 Comment:

a. The Nationalist 12th Army Group is apparently being effectively contained and probably will be prevented from joining the other Nationalist forces to the southeast.

b. According to the Chinese Supreme G-3, the Huai River line, through Pangfou, is being prepared for defense and it is believed that the 6th and 8th Army Groups will attempt to withdraw to this line. Communist pressure is being maintained against the Nationalist 6th and 8th Army Groups during their southward withdrawal and a move around the left (west) flank is seen as a distinct possibility.

c. A further advance of the units from Hsuchou will probably be met by increased resistance from the three Communist Columns still astride the Tsinpu Railroad to the south.

3. Action:

a. Following agencies notified: ADC, JSFOG and G-3.

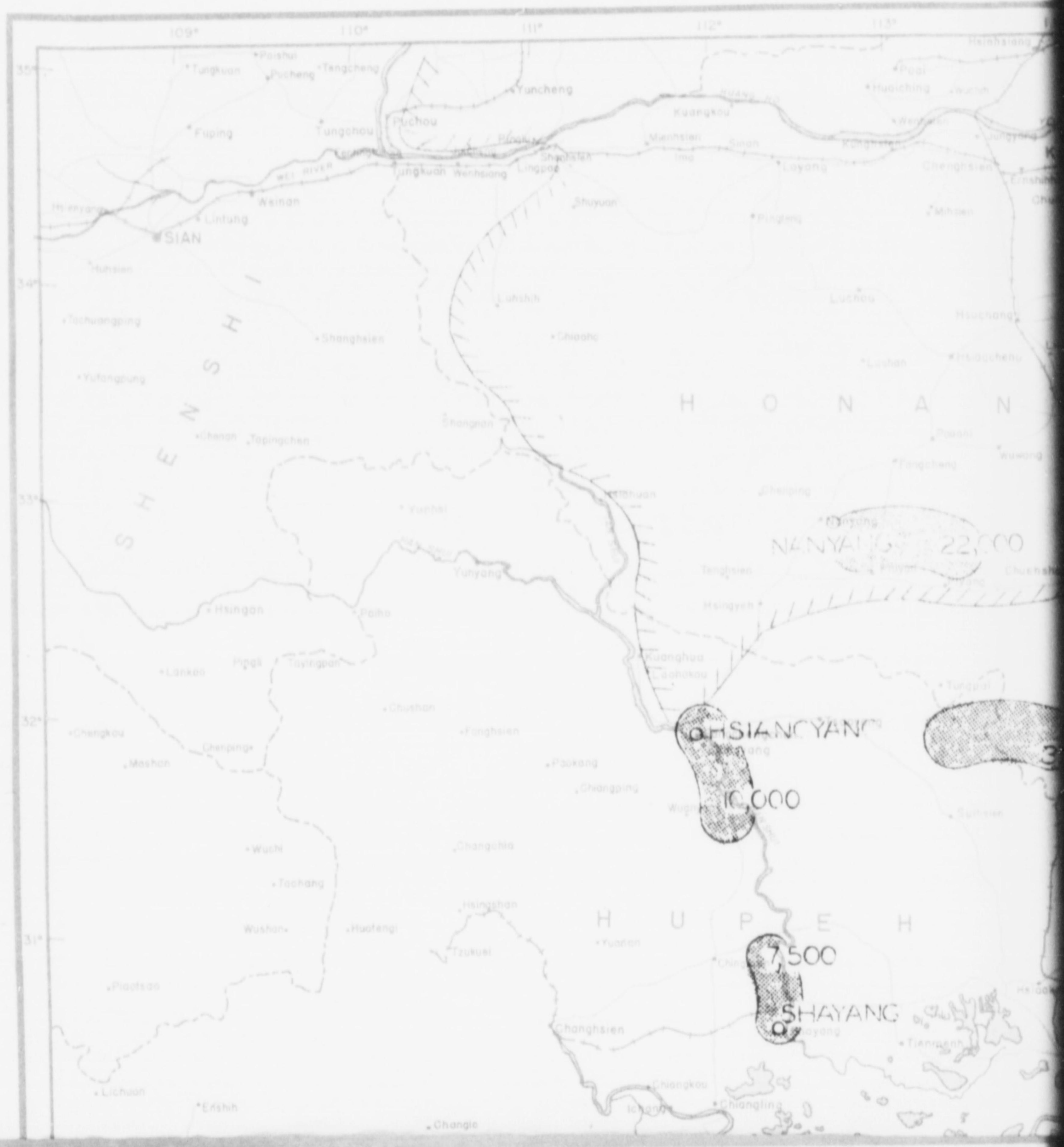

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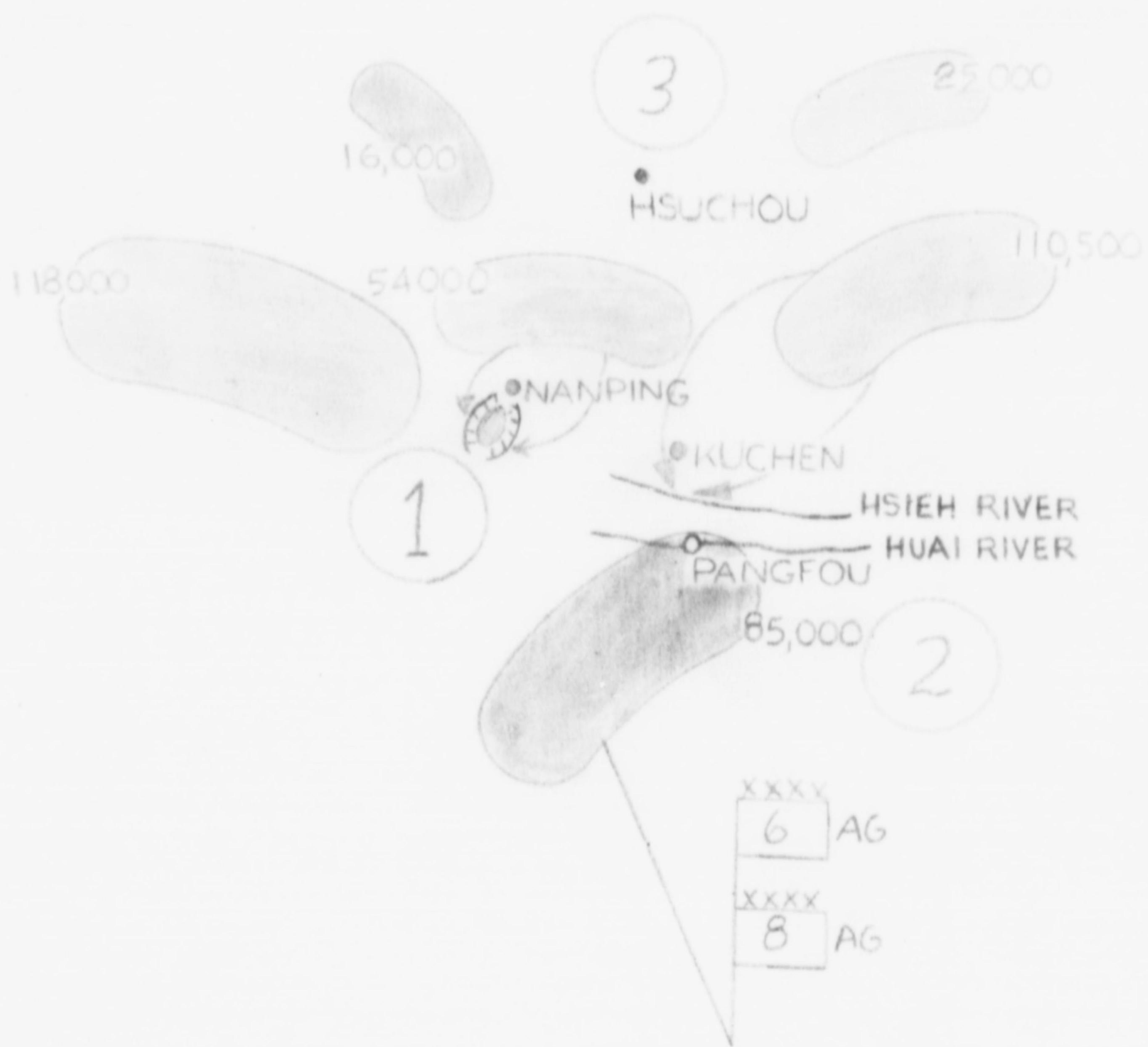

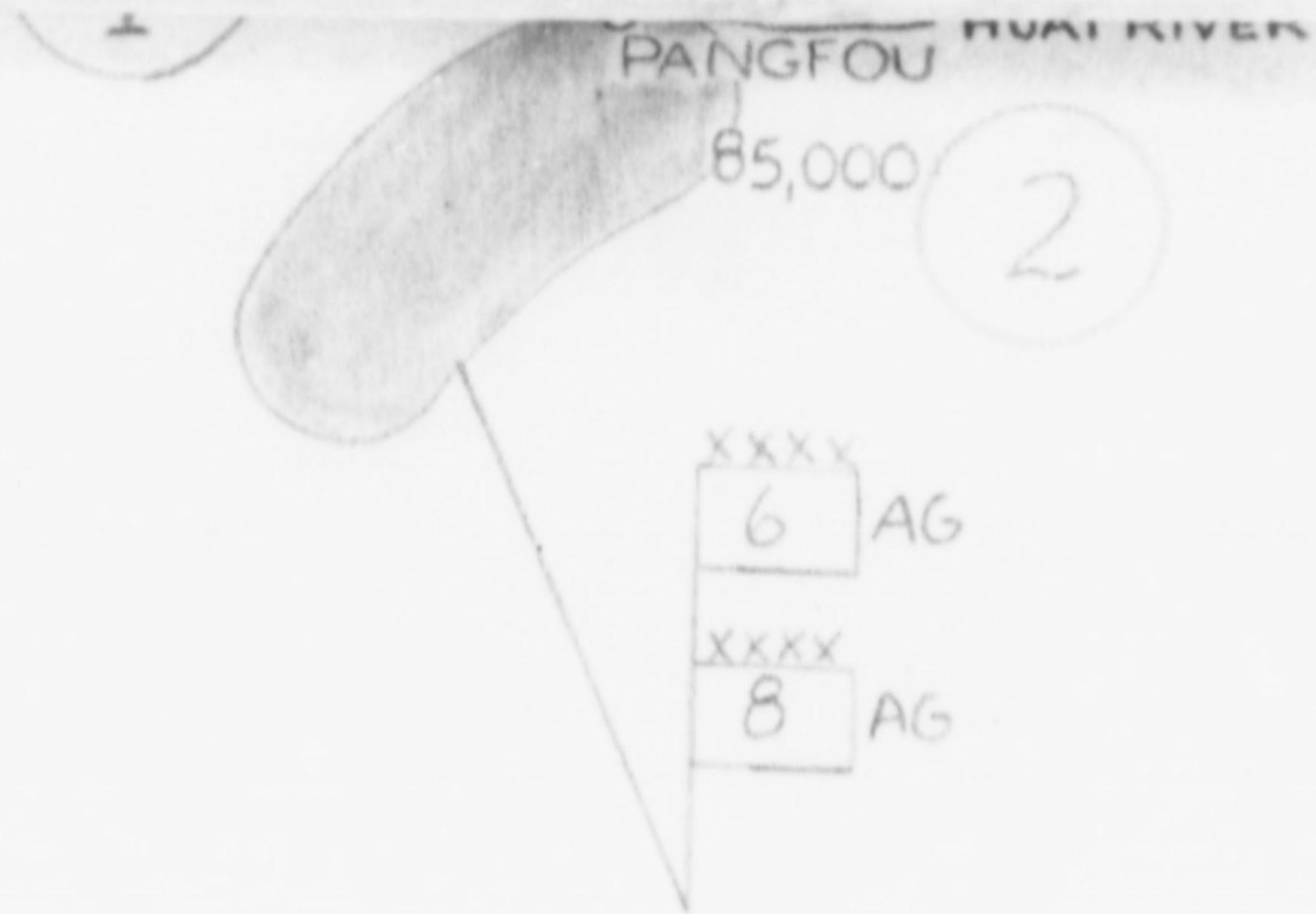
