1. Reference is made to the report of the Commander-in-Chief, Yar East Command, to the Commander Naval Forces, Yar East, dated 23 Jan 48, subject, "Report of Travel of Certain Aliens."

2. The S. S. ANDREAS, Panamanian vessel, which arrived at Nagoya on 11 Mar 49 from Muroran, Hokkaido, listed the following aliens as crew members: HUNTER, Arnold, Estonian, age 38, officer; and GEORGEKOW, George, Rumanian, age 18, officer.

3. It was reported that while the S. S. ANDREAS was in port in Muroran, Hokkaido, ELIZAMA Augusto, an officers mess boy and elisen of Peru, allegedly abandoned the ship and was apprehended by the Seventh Division Military Police of Muroran, Hokkaido. At the time of arrest, ELIZAMA had in his possession military detourment and elisen certificate from the Republic of Peru. When interviewed, ELIZAMA stated that while in port at Muroran he asked the ship's captain for permission to see the ship's doctor. When the request was refused, he visited the hospital in Muroran and returned to the ship with a medical certificate which he presented to the captain. At that time, the captain stated that he no longer was employed aboard the vessel. It was reported that ELIZAMA will be taken, probably under guard, to the United States via Yokohama, and Company in Yokohama, which is the agent for the S. S. ANDREAS.

4. The vessel is expected to remain in Nagoya until 16 or 17 Mar 49 before proceeding to the United States via Yokohama. It has not been determined by the company as yet.

TO : Director of Intelligence, Alaskan Command, APO 942, c/o
Postmaster, Seattle, Washington.

1. Reference is letter from Commander-in-Chief, Alaska, dated 11 January 1949, subject as above, pertaining specifically to the establishment of a joint Army-Navy-Air Force system of reporting travel of certain aliens toward the Base of Interior.

2. Joint discussions have been initiated here among all local agencies concerned to evolve plans for a unified system of surveillance and reporting. These plans encompass the following elements considered essential to efficient operations:

a. Establishment of a central responsible agency to receive reports from all parts of entry or transfer points within the Far East Command (whether under the jurisdiction of Army, Navy or Air Force) and to relay pertinent information obtained thereby to interested agencies. (This responsible agency is expected to be G-2, General Headquarters, Far East Command.)

b. Uniform instructions as to:

- (1) Categories of personnel to be covered.
- (2) Specific information to be reported.

c. Uniform means of transmitting information.

d. Assignments of certain specific responsibilities in connection with surveillance and securing of information.

3. With reference to 2b above, it must be emphasized that although it is our desire to exercise surveillance over and to report on the movements of personnel traveling through the Far East Command who may be of intelligence interest, it is essential that we limit our objectives to the practical possibilities afforded by facilities and personnel available. It would be of great assistance to us in this connection if recipients of this information indicate to us their minimum requirements. (See 2b (1) and (2) above.)
