

Assasination of President John F. Rennedy Lydia DIMYTRUK

- Reference is made to the report of Special Agent Robert P. CENBERLING, dated to November 1961, Field Ciffice File Non-ber. DALLAS (89-41), Subject: LEE MARVEY CEMALD: Assassination of Frenident JOHN FITAGERALD RENNEDY, 11/22/63, Dalles, Texas. This con impolection reported an interview by your office of k r. born on 5 September 1922 in Tale, USSA, served in the Soviet Army in world war ii before joining the Viessov forces is fighting against the Soviets. After the war he lived in Cormany and bolgium and was active in several anti-Communist Russian emigre organizations including the National Labor Alliance (N 18). In 1955 ECSTENKO was identified as a Seriet agent in claudestine contact with the Seviet Embassy in Brussels. He was expelled from the NTS in February 1957 and on 20 August 1957 he left Bruscels for Moscow. In a radio broadcast from East Berlin on 17 September 1957 spenesred by the Soviet Committee for Return to the Homeland, KOSTERKO bitterly attached Russian emigre organizations in the Sest. Prior to leaving Belgium for the USSE EUSTERED reportedly revealed that he had worked for Soviet intelligence since 1942 and that he was trained in the Soviet Union for intelligence work and dispatched to the West as a Seviet agent.

It was reported that in July 1957 he returned to Beigium to attempt to expedite a view for Lydia to join him in the United States. As of August 1957, DYMITROS's U.S. residence was listed as 159 East Mylsion Street, Packford, Michigan.
