ASSASSINATION OF JOHN F. KENNEDY NOVEMBER 22, 1963 DALLAS, TEXAS

By letter dated October 20, 1978, the United States Secret Service, Miami, Florida, furnished to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), Miami, a copy of a letter sent to that agency by the United States Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), Miami, Florida, dated October 13, 1978. letter advised that an informant for DEA had indicated that he was acquainted with Frank Sturgis of Watergate Notoriety, and during a conversation Sturgis told the informant that he had killed President John F. Kennedy. This remark was supposed to have been made in the presence of an individual by the name of Bill Johnson. DEA advised that this informant could be made available for interview.
