Subject: War Assets Administration

On April 10, 1947, Mr. John Arcana, A-2, War Department, called this office to request some information on the security standards of the War Assets Administration. He was informed that the Board had no security channels into the War Assets Administration and that we consequently knew nothing of its security. Mr. Arcana indicated that he was quite anxious to find out something about the agency on matters of security since Mr. Thomas Drumm, Deputy Director, Real Property Disposal, had requested some confidential publications from the Air Corps. The same morning a Mr. Capon in Navy (Ext. 5904) called to say that he had some material which should go to the War Assets Administration but in view of the fact that we were unable to tell them anything about the security standards employed there, would wait for clearance of the request from us.

In view of the interest of the two departments, the Secretary visited Mr. John King, Deputy Director, Compliance Enforcement Division, War Assets Administration, relative to the security practices of the agency. Mr. King stated that the Administration had no security regulations as such and that the security practices used in the building occupied by them were brought in verbally by former Army and Navy officers, who, I gathered, made up a large part of their personnel. Mr. King referred me to Mr. Fuller who had been with the Administration since it was created and in a discussion with Miss Campbell in that office (6225 (6225) SWAA) she informed me that the standards were good from a State Department standpoint and that the documents would get adequate safeguarding in Mr. Drumm's care. Miss Campbell is located in Annex No. 2, 425 2nd St., N.W.

A security officer should be appointed in this agency as soon as possible.


Subject: President's Scientific Research Board

Reference is made to your letter of June 24, 1946 in which you informed the Security Advisory Board of the resignation of Mr. Berg, formerly designated as the Security Officer for the Office of Economic Stabilization, and requested that consideration be given your opinion that the Office of Economic Stabilization did not require representation on the Security Advisory Board.

It is realized that many agencies and departments do not have an appreciable amount of current classified information. The fact, however, that many documents were classified in war time indicates that most agencies and departments have classified documents in their possession. Since it is the responsibility of every government employee to give to classified information the protection its classification deserves and since every agency is a potential recipient and originator of such information, it is the opinion of the Security Advisory Board that every federal agency and department should have a Security Officer or other responsible official who is aware of approved security regulations.

Liaison between the Office of Economic Stabilization and the Security Advisory Board will not mean that the Board will require representation from your agency at all its meetings. It will mean, however, that you will be advised of current security policies and directives and that the Board would feel free to consult with you should a matter of interest to your agency arise. If this arrangement is satisfactory with you the Board will list your name for liaison purposes for the Office of Economic Stabilization.




