During the year ending June 30, 1899, the American Printing House for the Blind has distributed 225 volumes and furnished various articles of apparatus for the instruction of the blind to blind persons in the State and to the Kentucky Institution for the Blind.

An inventory of the property of the American Printing House for the Blind shows the following assets:

IN WASHINGTON, D. C.: In the hands of the Secretary of the United States Treasury, \$250,000 four-per-cent United States bonds.

IN LOUISVILLE, KY.: Six and  $\frac{3}{8}$  (more or less) acres of land.

A three-story brick building, with a two-story wing, and a fire-proof one-story vault.

*In the cellar*—A steam heating apparatus; stoking tools; 4 hand grenades; 3 flasks and bench; 10 packing boxes; 2,000 bushels of Pittsburgh coal; old machinery; 1 lot of old piping; 60 cases; 4,500 lbs. type; 3 wooden racks.

*In the casting-room*— $1\frac{1}{2}$  box tin foil; 1 flask; 500 pounds of type metal; furnace and tools for handling metal; 1 barrel charcoal; 3 boxes tin.

*In the building of the Kentucky Institution for the Blind*—1 Hall's fire-pro safe.

The enumeration of the pupils in the various institutions for th education of the blind in the United States for the year ending Jun 30, 1899, gave ~~4,300~~ 4,300 pupils. The quota for each pupil is \$2.42+

The following tables show the number of pupils in each institution and how much has been distributed to each institution, under th provisions of the act of Congress, approved March 3, 1879, entitle "An Act to Promote the Education of the Blind," by which th American Printing House for the Blind receives \$10,000 annually.

The New York Institution for the Blind has, as usual, used it quota under the direction of Mr. Wait in preparing and publishing music in point notation.
