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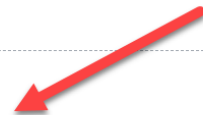
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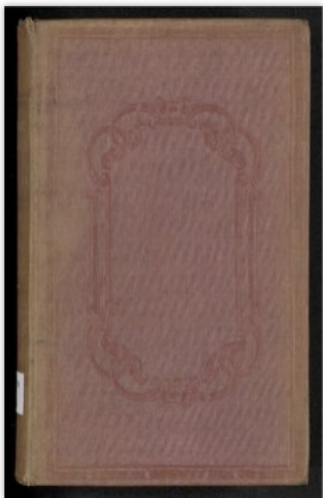
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Strange Case of Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde is a gothic novella by Robert Louis Stevenson. The narrative follows a London lawyer as he investigates mysterious connections between his friend Dr Henry Jekyll and the evil Edward Hyde. Stevenson said the idea for the story came to him in a dream, but further inspiration may have come from the writer's friendship with Edinburgh-based French teacher Eugene Chantrelle, who had appeared to lead a normal life in the city but was convicted and executed for the murder of his wife in May 1878.

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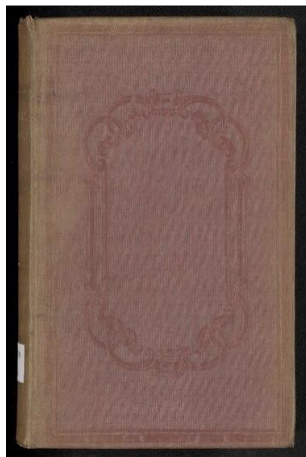
