SUBJECT: Report on Temporary Conference Groups

TO : See Distribution

1. Military Government team commanders will forward to this headquarters by 1 May 1948 a general report on the status of Temporary Conference Groups in their respective areas. (Temporary Conference Groups is the name given to the precursors of what will be School Boards after the Diet passes the new School Decentralization Law.)

2. Reports will be in narrative form and will contain the following data with regard to prefectural, gun, and local groups.

- a. Number of members
- b. Composition
- c. How often do they meet and last meetings
- d. How groups were chosen
- e. Work accomplished; plans made, studies made, recommendations made
- f. Amount of coordination between groups
- g. Guidance to groups--by prefectural education sections and by Military Government
- h. Publicity being given the groups' work
- i. Groups' understanding of their work

It is not necessary that these facts be supplied on each and every group except, possibly, the prefectural group. What is desired is a general picture of the situation and the above facts are intended as suggestive.

3. It is desired that Education officers comment on their impressions of these groups and describe briefly any help they have given them. In order to do this, it will of course be necessary to have some personal contact with the groups. It is suggested that two or three spot checks of groups and their personnel and activities be made by CE officers.

4. The Temporary Conference Groups of Shikoku have various names. They are:

CRITICISMS AND SUGGESTIONS OF EIGHTH ARMY INSPECTING OFFICERS OF
SHIKOKU MILITARY GOVERNMENT TEAM AND REGION CE AND CI
SECTIONS

1. Shikoku team CE and CI sections need planning. Either there are no written plans or those that have been made are inadequate.
2. Teams should have some means of indicating progress, i.e., of checking progress made on plans formulated.
3. Liaison with the Japanese is inadequate--there is no or not enough calling for report from the Japanese. There are also not enough regular meetings. Very important in this respect is for the CE Officer and the CI Officer to know what instructions are coming to the Japanese through their own channels. For example, CE Officers should keep a constant check on current and past Hatsugaku, Hatsu-teki, and Hatsusha (Ministry of Education directives). Due to the paper shortage, CE sections will no longer receive these directives. It is therefore necessary that CE officers check prefectural education sections for copies of them.
4. CE officers should get all new laws on screening from the Japanese. The same is true here as above: the paper shortage forbids the distribution of all these laws through American channels. Therefore the CE Officer must get them from the Japanese in order to keep informed on the screening situation. He should also ask the screening committee to keep him informed on progress, should get to know the committee in his prefecture, and should check on their work. It was emphasized that this is one of our weakest points: the fact that we do not know enough about what is going on in Japanese circles, particularly governmental circles, and that we cannot give the excuse that higher headquarters does not keep us informed. We should get the information ourselves in our own prefectures and a good bit of the information should be relayed to Region. Also, a CE Officer should know the education of his prefecture from start to finish, from top to bottom. He should not only know all there is to know about the prefectural education section, but he should also know gun and city educational setups plus the workings of the Temporary Conference Groups.
5. CE and CI officers should require the Japanese to make and submit plans. Then the job is to supervise the plans and to help correct defects. Too many of our people do not require the Japanese to submit plans of any kind and this is a definite weakness.
6. We should use Japanese personnel for many of our liaison functions. It is not absolutely necessary that these people speak English too well. It is necessary that they understand and sympathize with what we are trying to do.
7. We should recommend good people for official education jobs. If necessary, we should be prepared to suggest certain people for certain jobs. This is not to say that we will say who shall get what or that we will interfere. It is to say that under certain conditions, we should not be afraid to make recommendations.

8. Our publicity on the changes in education is weak. We should be seeing to publicity on grades 10, 11, 12 and on the Temporary Conference Groups. For example, the fact that the higher specialized schools will be broadened in their educational aims and curricula should have some publicity. Also, the night chugakko, its credits, etc. should be publicized.

9. Our lack of knowledge and work with prefectural and local budgets is perhaps one of our worst weaknesses. We should give immediate attention to the budget problem as it affects the building of new schools and as it affects education in general. We should call for reports on budgeting from prefectural education sections, study the reports, and try to make improvements. Particular attention should be paid to "Miscellaneous" expenses under which the Japanese have long been in the habit of putting anything and everything, including big sake parties. (Suggested reference: War Department Education Manual EM 929, Volume 2, Part IV.) CE officers should also have statistics on the amount of expenditures on students of different levels--per capita expenditure for elementary, secondary, etc. The reason for this is that there are great discrepancies on different levels the wrong way. That is, too much may be expended for secondary as opposed to primary when it should be the other way round.

10. On school inspections, it was suggested that CE officers occasionally obtain information about specific schools before visiting them. For example, a CE Officer might give the prefectural officials a list of ten schools about which he wants a variety of information. Then, of the ten schools, he might at some time in the future inspect two or three of them. When he makes his inspections, he could then check on the accuracy of the information he has received and also have a preview of what to expect when making the inspection. CE officers might also have prefectural officials accompany them on some of their school inspections. In any case, they should certainly hold critiques of inspected schools with prefectural officials. Other suggestions were: vary techniques of inspecting schools: special orientation of Teacher Consultants after school inspection; advance notice occasionally of CE officers' coming to schools; improving of in-service training of teachers mainly by having a critique with all the teachers after an inspection and a special talk with the principal and the head teacher. In addition while making school inspections, CE officers should check on local Temporary Conference Groups by having an interview with the members of the groups or with the heads of the groups.

11. CE officers should encourage the reading by teachers of professional educational publications. These publications might get wider reading if some sort of system of circulating the materials were set up by the prefecture.

12. There is a catalogue of educational films which has been distributed through Japanese channels and approved by the Ministry of Education for use in schools. These films can be borrowed or purchased. (Mr. Judson, CI&E, SCAP, suggests that the films should be bought in blocks rather than individually. That is, a set of films on one subject would be better than several different unrelated films.) Schools can also buy and rent films from the Japan Visual Education Association.

13. Social Education sections should build up "service" functions. That is, they could set up speakers' bureaus. Rather than CE officers individually making speeches, they could train these speakers' bureaus in particular fields, say, Adult Education.

14. Priority economics programs in information could profit from special work with women's organizations. This would be particularly true of such programs as the Fish and Vegetable and Power Conservation programs.

15. There is a need for more aggressiveness on the part of CE and CI officers in handling the Japanese. The officer making this criticism said that in some cases the Japanese were running us or completely ignoring us in their operations. We should have a firm grip on the situation by pushing, prodding, and sticking to our requests. We should not accept the usual negativism but should so operate that this negative approach is impossible. This, of course, does not mean that we push the Japanese around, but it does mean that we be firm and aggressive.

16. CE officers should check for essential construction by getting after allocation boards to make equitable construction allocation of materials. (Effect liaison with Economics officers). Schools could very probably get more material if allocations were more equitable. In this connection, CE officers should know how much additional space will be necessary for the compulsory eighth grade. Also, how much has already been done toward getting space and materials for the compulsory eighth grade.

17. CE officers have not been paying enough attention or any attention to the Temporary Conference Groups. These are extremely important because they are the precursors of the to be established school Boards.



Photographs would be particularly valuable to show condition of certain rare historical sites and art works and would also be a record of certain rare objects--scrolls, architecture, etc.

1. This headquarters has two qualified Arts and Monuments specialists who have made a number of inspections of historical sites and art objects in Shikoku but whose reports lack the value and validity they might have if photographs accompanied some of the reports. Photographs would be particularly valuable to show condition of certain rare historical sites and art works and would also be a record of certain rare objects--scrolls, architecture, etc.

2. It is requested that the following equipment be issued this headquarters to be used in implementing its Arts and Monuments inspections and reporting. Standard equipment approximating the following general specifications would be suitable.

- a. 2 cameras--small: Bantam or 35 mm.-f 3.5 lens
- b. 2 carrying cases for a, above
- c. Film--4 dozen rolls
- d. 1 set of developing and enlarging equipment and a suitable quantity of paper
- e. 2 tripods--light weight

3. The above-mentioned specialists will be thoroughly oriented and trained in the use of cameras, and a photographic technician will be hired on a part-time basis for processing of films and prints. Although the use of the Army Photographic Service was considered, it was thought to be impractical because the work is all to be done in the field, often in remote areas.


2. Attention is invited to deficiencies in the implementation of subject letter:

a. Records of inspections of cultural property on the part of Japanese national field examiners received by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, show that, as a nation-wide average from all regions, 46% of all National Treasure structures and 55% of all National Treasure objects have been inspected. Current records of inspections in the Shikoku Military Government Region, however, show no National Treasure structures and 9% of National Treasure objects inspected.

b. The last series of reports received by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, containing reports dated 25 July, 2 September, 9 September and 30 September, was transmitted by the Shikoku Military Government Region on 19 December. The intervals between inspections themselves and the delay of some 80 days in submitting these reports indicate the need for corrective action.

3. It is requested that particular emphasis be placed on regular inspections of items registered as National Treasures and Important Art Objects and that transmittal of all findings and reports be expedited.

SUBJECT: Interpretations of SCAPIN 448

TO: Commanding Officer, Shikoku Military Government Region, APO 1050

The following interpretations, by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, AG 000.3 (15 Dec 45)GIE, SCAPIN 448, 15 December 1945, subject: "Abolition of Governmental Sponsorship, Support, Perpetuation, Control, and Dissemination of State Shinto", are quoted for your information and guidance.

a. Public school sponsored visits to shrines, temples and churches are in violation of SCAPIN 448 and are prohibited. By a school sponsored visit is meant either group visitation planned by a school and conducted with or without participation of teachers or principals, or a visit to a shrine, temple, or church by an individual student as an assignment. Teachers may not suggest study projects which involve such visitation to a religious institution or personage for their proper completion.

b. Shrine or temple visitation by individuals who are students is not in violation of SCAPIN 448 unless such visits are the result of public school assignment. It is not a violation of SCAPIN 448 for students to tell about visits to shrines, temples or churches during class discussions, but a teacher may not require a student to tell about such visits.

c. The giving of talks or conducting of discussions on religious topics by priests or ministers in public school buildings before students during school hours is a violation of SCAPIN 448.

d. Requiring a public school student to attend a religious festival, or to visit a priest or minister to inquire about religious matters, or suggesting a study topic which implies such a visit for its proper completion is a violation of SCAPIN 448.

e. Requiring an individual student to discuss in class his religious beliefs and practices or those of his family is a violation of religious freedom and freedom of conscience.

1. It is desired that meetings between the Shikoku Military Government Region CI&E Women's Affairs Officer and women from the Social Education Section of the prefectures be held in Takamatsu 29-30 January 1948. Since these women are actively engaged in working with women's organizations, this conference is being held to help establish their thinking and acting in line with Occupation policy.

2. These women should be actually working in Social Education work with women's organizations in the prefectures. It is desired that the following women be invited by local CI&E officers to attend this conference.

Ehime - Miss Yokoyama
Kagawa - Mrs. Ono and Mrs. Nakayama
Kochi - Miss Yoshikado
Tokushima - Mrs. Kushi

If these particular women cannot attend, substitutions may be made. If there is more than one woman in each prefecture, two or three may be invited. Informal notification of the names and numbers of women accepting invitations and expected in Takamatsu on 28 January should be made to this headquarters by 22 January.

3. Arrangements will be made to house the women in a hotel in Takamatsu, the expense to be borne by the Japanese government. They should bring with them either their own rice rations or meal tickets.

4. Orders may be issued giving the Japanese women permission to ride in Allied coaches. It has been learned that if orders come from teams, RTO personnel will honor them. Orders should cover both traveling days--the 28th and 31st of January 48.

5. The women should leave their prefectures on Wednesday, 28 January, in the Allied coaches. Arrangements will be made for them to return by Allied coaches on 31 January 48. However, if they desire to leave after the session on the 30th on Japanese trains, they will be free to leave after approximately 1700.

6. It is desired that the women be prepared to speak informally to the group on what their work is. Copies of directives from prefectural governments setting forth their work should be brought with them.



1. It is desired that meetings between the Shikoku Military Government Region CIES Women's Affairs Officer and representatives of women's associations be arranged in each prefecture according to the following schedule:

Places of meetings need not be in principal cities of prefectures, but if possible, meetings should be arranged with Japanese train schedules in mind. Suggested hours are 1000 to 1200 and 1330 to 1530.

2. The tentative schedule of the three days' meetings is as follows:

a. First day: meeting with officers of the organizations. Two officers from each association are to be invited. One should be the president; the second one may be anyone chosen from the officers.

b. Second day: meeting with two representatives from each woman's association. One should be the president. The other should be a woman who is not an officer, elected by secret ballot from the organization.

c. Third day: meeting of women interested in learning more about Girl Scouting. If any troop committees have been appointed, the members are particularly invited. Prospective leaders also are to be urged to attend.

3. The numbers of representatives and officers may be increased for these associations close to the meeting places, in proportion to the size of the places where the meetings are held. However, priority should be given to the two representatives selected from the organizations, with any extra space being given to any additional women who may desire to attend.



1. It is requested that Mr. T.H. McGrail, Education Division, CI&E, SCAP, make a field trip to Shikoku for a period of four days during January. The purposes of the visit would be:

- a. To make a close study of the Shikoku university situation.
- b. To confer with Shikoku CI&E officers on the situation.
- c. To attend a conference of Shikoku Japanese representatives who are interested in the establishment of a university on Shikoku.
- d. To help conferees reach an agreement.
- e. To make appropriate recommendations to SCAP and the Mombusho on a university for Shikoku.

2. Due to the difficulties inherent in arranging for a visit with a comparatively complicated mission and to ensure at least technical success of and adequate preparation for the trip, it is also requested that the above SCAP Advisor establish, through technical channels, liaison with this headquarters to fix necessary details or to alter any of the above suggestions.

3. Japanese activity centering around the problem of establishing a university on Shikoku, while well justified, has lacked proper direction and has been prompted by motives other than educational ones. In addition, previous efforts of the Japanese to reach agreement have been abortive due to lack of thought of the real educational needs of Shikoku and lack of adequate perspective of good higher educational practices. It is believed that the above-mentioned advisor could be most helpful in resolving these difficulties by adequate study and proper aid in stimulating good Japanese leadership and cooperation. On the other hand, it is feared that if some constructive action is not taken in the near future, the situation may deteriorate even further than it already has, and that certain interests may succeed in pressuring an undesirable solution of the problem.
