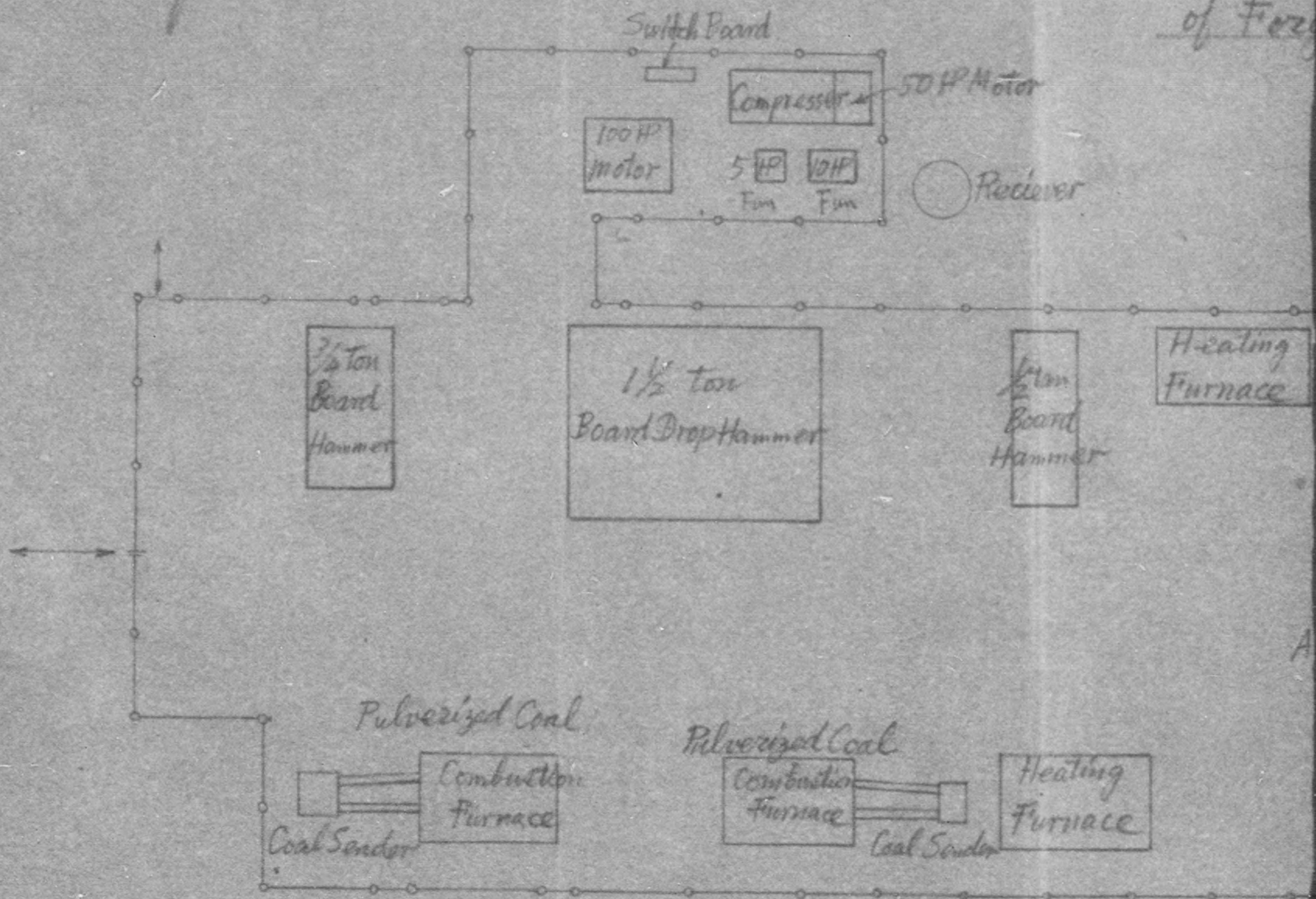

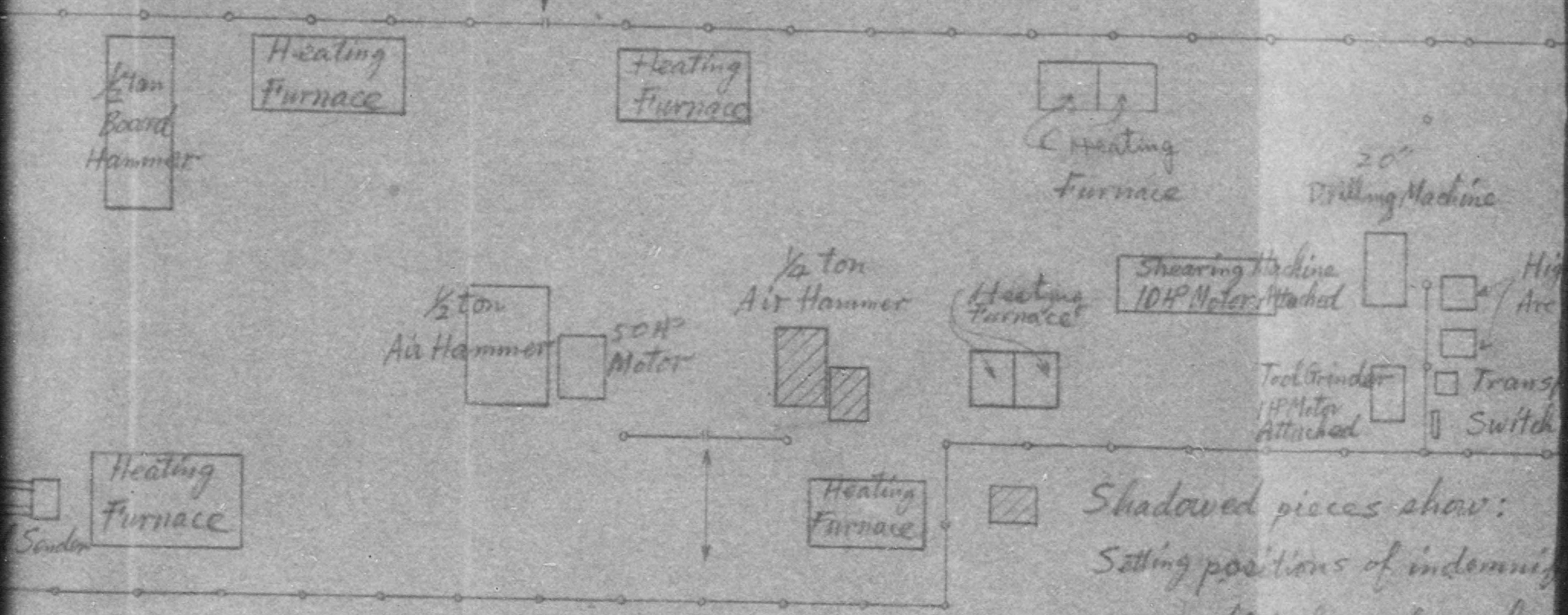


# Machine Arrangement Picture of Forging Workshop

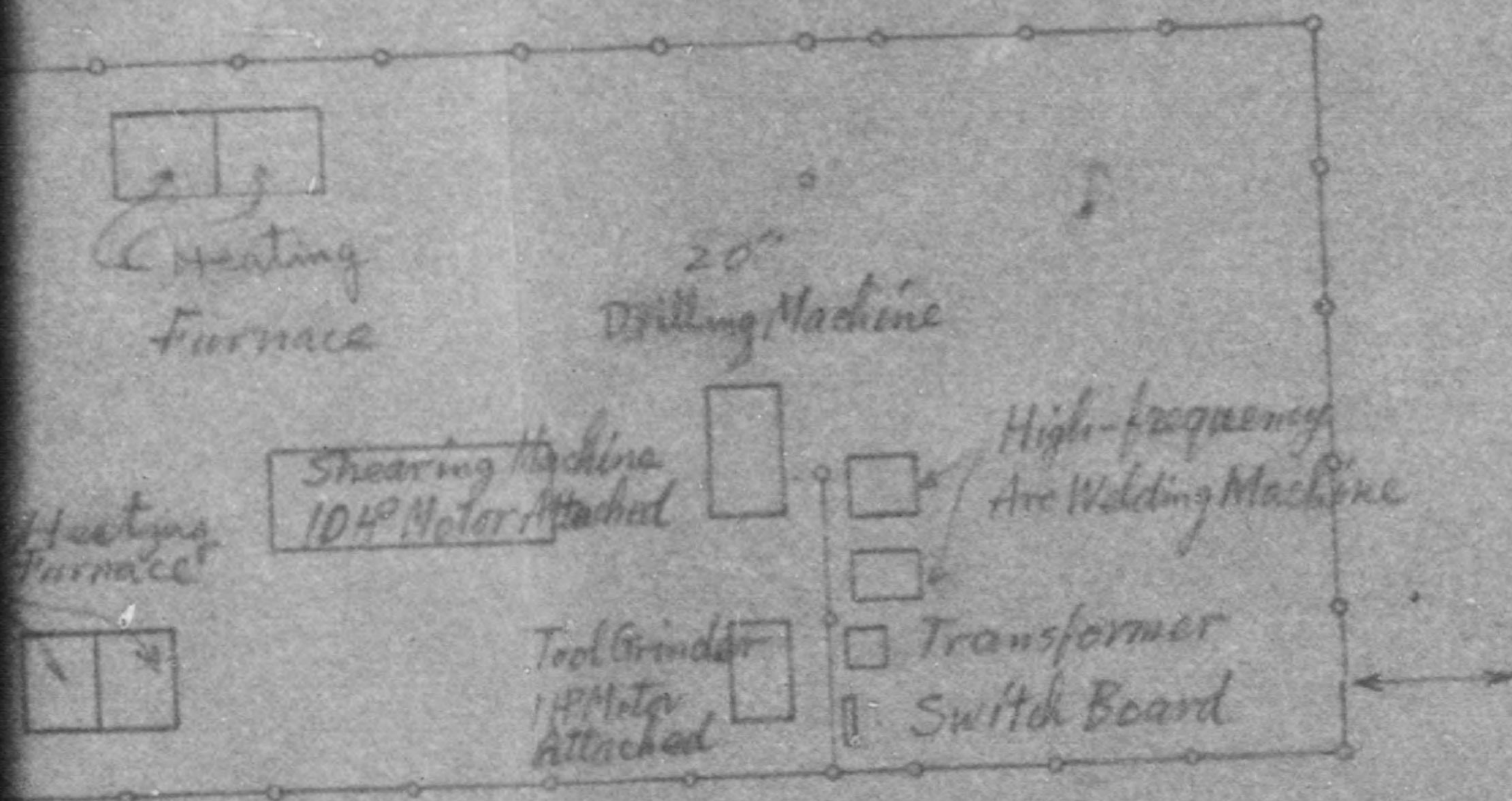

SUBJECT: Concentration of Dispersed Machines.

TO : Senior Military Government Officer  
Tochigi Military Government Team  
Utsunomiya.

1. In accordance with your order dated 10 January 1947, we are investigating the dispersed machines of the reparation factories. We ordered to concentrate the machines on the attached list to the main-factory because they are not necessary any more.

2. Of the dispersed machines in Ashikaga Mokko K.K., Ise-cho, Ashikaga City, the air-compressor, 38-11-346, is not used now, but 15 H.P. electric motor, which is attached to the above, is now used for manufacturing the furnitures for the Occupation Forces. So your kind permission for contineous use of the motor will be appreciated very much.

3. The dispersed machines of Ashikaga Brick Mfg. Co., Yamagawa Keno-mura, Ashikaga-gun, which had been used for manufacturing bricks in the wartime and not used for manufacturing body of airplane and etc., are not used now because it is afraid that brick is frozen on account of cold weather and because of fuel shortage. But Shigeru Sunaga, the manager, desired to re-open production of bricks and clay tile for reconstruction as soon as they can get fuel.

Formerly these dispersed machines had been not maintained in good condition, but the manager stated that they hereafter maintain them as good as they are in the main factory with responsibility. So your kind permission for contineous use will be appreciated.

We will concentrate the above machines if they don't use them at the time of our second inspection three weeks after.
