



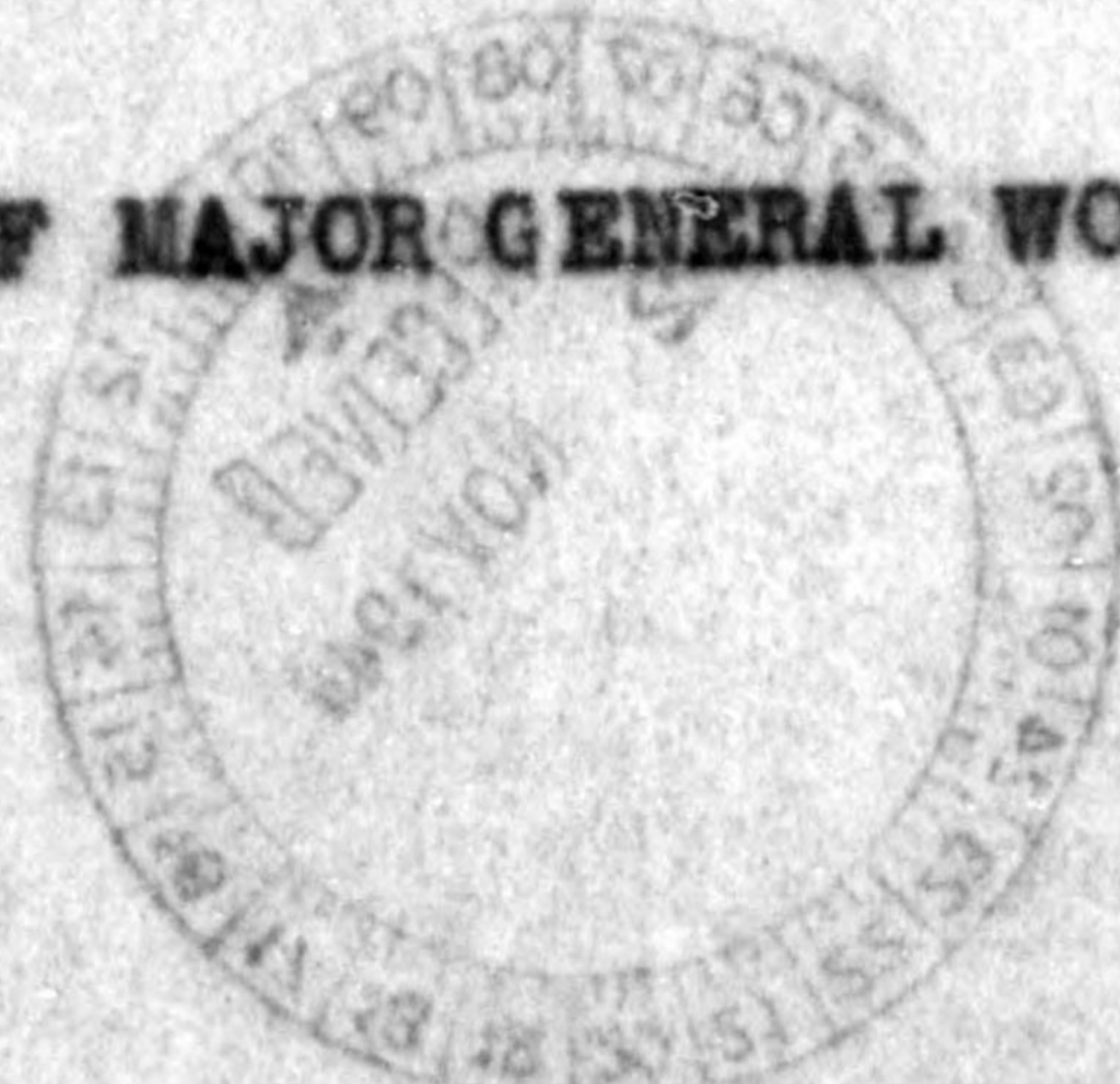

SUBJECT: Request for Use of Transformers and Electric Motors
 TO : Tokai-Hokuriku Military Government Region, Hq & Hq Det.,
 APO 710

1. Inclosed is a request by Mr. Naomi Momonoi, Governor of Gifu Prefecture, requesting that certain transformers and electric motors be exempted from reparations. There are now 72 transformers which belong to the Nagoya Military Arsenal which are being used in this prefecture. Investigation by this headquarters reveals that there are no additional transformers to replace those mentioned in this application. They are serving an integral part of the economy of the prefecture. It is recommended that this prefecture be allowed to retain the transformers for one year.

2. Immediately after determination of the war, agricultural associations in this prefecture obtained 96 electric motors from the Suzuka Naval Arsenal. These motors are now being used by farmers to furnish power for the thrashing, hauling, polishing and milling of rice, wheat and millet. This headquarters has investigated the use of these motors and it is of the opinion that the loss of these motors by the farmers would prove detrimental to the farmers in producing needed food supplies. It is recommended that Gifu Prefectural Government be allowed to retain these electric motors for agrarian purposes only.



The majority of the above equipments should be used for milling and bread making industries being aimed to surmount the bottle-neck in the foodstuffs situation and also for the public works and lumbering industry to reconstruct the devastated houses and roads. Viewing the general trend, it is no doubt, they are the most important industries under the present situation.

If we could be permitted to use them only temporarily, we would hope their sure contribution to cast a light over the development of industries and the foodstuffs situation.



If the factory became unnecessary for the nation. It was promised among the concerned that the company would be returned the factory in superiority when.

Afterwards the factory manufactured the revolving anti-aircraft gun turrets for one year until the war-end.

As the factory become unneedful in accordance with the war-end, on one hand we should like to relax the extreme tightness of clothings making use of it, on the other hand, make the spinning industry become one of the Japanese important industries as in the past, for the purpose of recovery of institutions in the times of Central Spinning Co., Ltd. operation. Besides, we should like to adopt the repatriates and war sufferers in superiority for the stability of civilian living, bear the reparation expenses and moreover manufacture the collateral goods by dint of imported raw cottons.

The reconversion of the fabric factory, is really significant and inevitable for us as the district have been famous for spinning.

In the case of opening of operations we shall be able to introduce fifty thousand cones of spinning machines, seven thousand pieces of gloss-yarn machines and one thousand pieces of loom, and therefore 300 bales 14,400 kan spinning yarn and 1,800 ton of weaving clothings per month.
