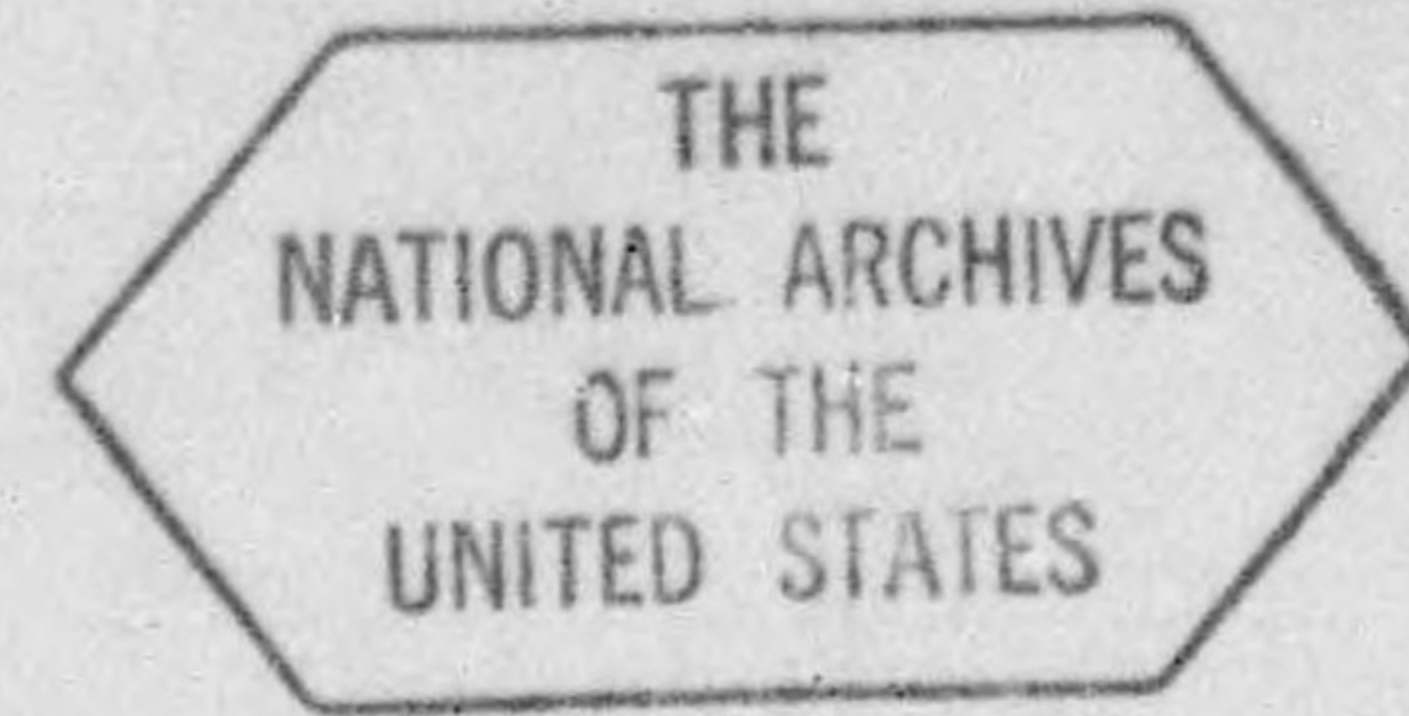

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Release of Invalid and Non-convertible Japanese Owned
Foreign Currencies and Foreign Currency Instruments

1. References:

- a. Cabinet Order No. 52, "Concerning the Purchase of Gold, Foreign Currencies and Foreign Currency Instruments," 15 March 1949.
- b. Foreign Exchange Control Board Bulletin No. 1, December 1949.

2. The Japanese Government, within fifteen (15) days of the publication of this memorandum, will receive invalid and non-convertible Japanese owned foreign currencies and foreign currency instruments from the Office of the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, at the United States Vaults, Bank of Japan, Tokyo.

3. Items have been selected from those acquired by the Japanese Government pursuant to the provisions of reference 1a above.

4. Actions authorized by laws and regulations cited in reference 1b above, or by subsequently approved legislation, may be taken, based on informal approval of appropriate staff sections of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Direct Communications, necessary to expedite planned actions, are authorized.

5. The Japanese Government will maintain records of actions taken. Prior to the implementation of authorized actions, property will be held in a blocked account separate and apart from other Japanese Government assets.

Cabinet Order No. 52

Cabinet Order concerning the Purchase of Gold, Foreign Currencies and Foreign Currency Instruments. In accordance with the Ordinance relative to the Orders to be issued in consequence of the Acceptance of the Potsdam Declaration (Imperial Ordinance No. 542, 1945) the Cabinet hereby establishes this Cabinet Order.

Article 1 - (Purchase of Gold and Foreign Currencies)

1. The Government may purchase those foreign currencies which were delivered to the Bank of Japan by the Japanese living in Japanese territory pursuant to the Imperial Ordinance concerning the foreign currencies, etc. (Imperial Ordinance No. 634, 1946) and may also purchase gold and foreign currencies impounded by the Government from the Japanese repatriated from foreign countries due to the fact that the import permit for these gold and foreign currencies could not be given in accordance with the provisions of Article 1 of the Ministerial Ordinance (Ministry of Finance Ordinance No. 88, 1945) concerning the Control of Financial Transactions such as Import and Export of Gold, Silver, and Negotiable Instruments.

2. In case the purchase is to be made in accordance with the provisions of the preceding paragraph, the Minister of Finance and the Minister of Commerce and Industry shall issue a notification to that effect and about the description of foreign currencies in case of their purchase.

Article 2 - (Purchase Price)

1. The purchase price of gold and foreign currencies shall be determined by the Minister of Finance and the Minister of Commerce and Industry on the basis of the military conversion rate of the United States dollar to Yen.

Article 3 - (Payment of Purchasing Price)

1. The Government shall pay the purchasing price (appraised by the purchase price) as provided for in the preceding Article to the original owners for those gold and foreign currencies which are purchased in accordance with the provisions of Article 1. However, as for the evaluation charge of fineness of gold, the original owner shall bear the expenses.

2. When the Minister of Finance and the Minister of Commerce and Industry are to pay the purchasing price in accordance with the provisions of the preceding paragraph, they shall issue notification concerning the necessary particulars for the receipt of the said purchasing price, notifying the original owners at the same time of the payment of the purchasing price.

Article 4 - (Collection of Foreign Exchange Instruments)

1. The Government may collect the claims in relation to foreign exchange instruments delivered to the Bank of Japan by the Japanese living in Japanese territory pursuant to the Imperial Ordinance concerning the Delivery of Foreign Currencies, etc. in behalf of their original owners and may also collect those regarding certificates indicated in foreign currencies, in behalf of their original owners, impounded by the Government from the Japanese repatriated from foreign countries due to the fact that the import permit for these foreign exchange instruments and certificates indicated in foreign currencies should not be given in accordance with the provisions of the Ministerial Ordinance concerning the Control of Financial Transactions such as Import and Export of Gold, Silver, and Negotiable Instruments.

2. In case the collection is to be made in accordance with the provisions of the preceding paragraph, the Minister of Finance and the Minister of Commerce and Industry shall issue a notification to that effect and about the currencies indicated on the certificates and the description of the certificates.

Article 5 - (Purchase of Foreign Currencies Collected)

The foreign currencies collected by the Government as provided for in the preceding Article 4 shall be treated as those foreign currencies which come under the provisions of Article 1, and the provisions of Article 1, para. 1, Article 2 and Article 3 shall apply mutatis mutandis to these foreign currencies. In this case, the original owners shall bear the collection charge.

Article 6 -

The purchase made in accordance with the provisions of Article 1 and Article 5 shall be operated with foreign trade fund.

Supplementary Provision:

This Cabinet Order shall come into force as from the day of its promulgation.

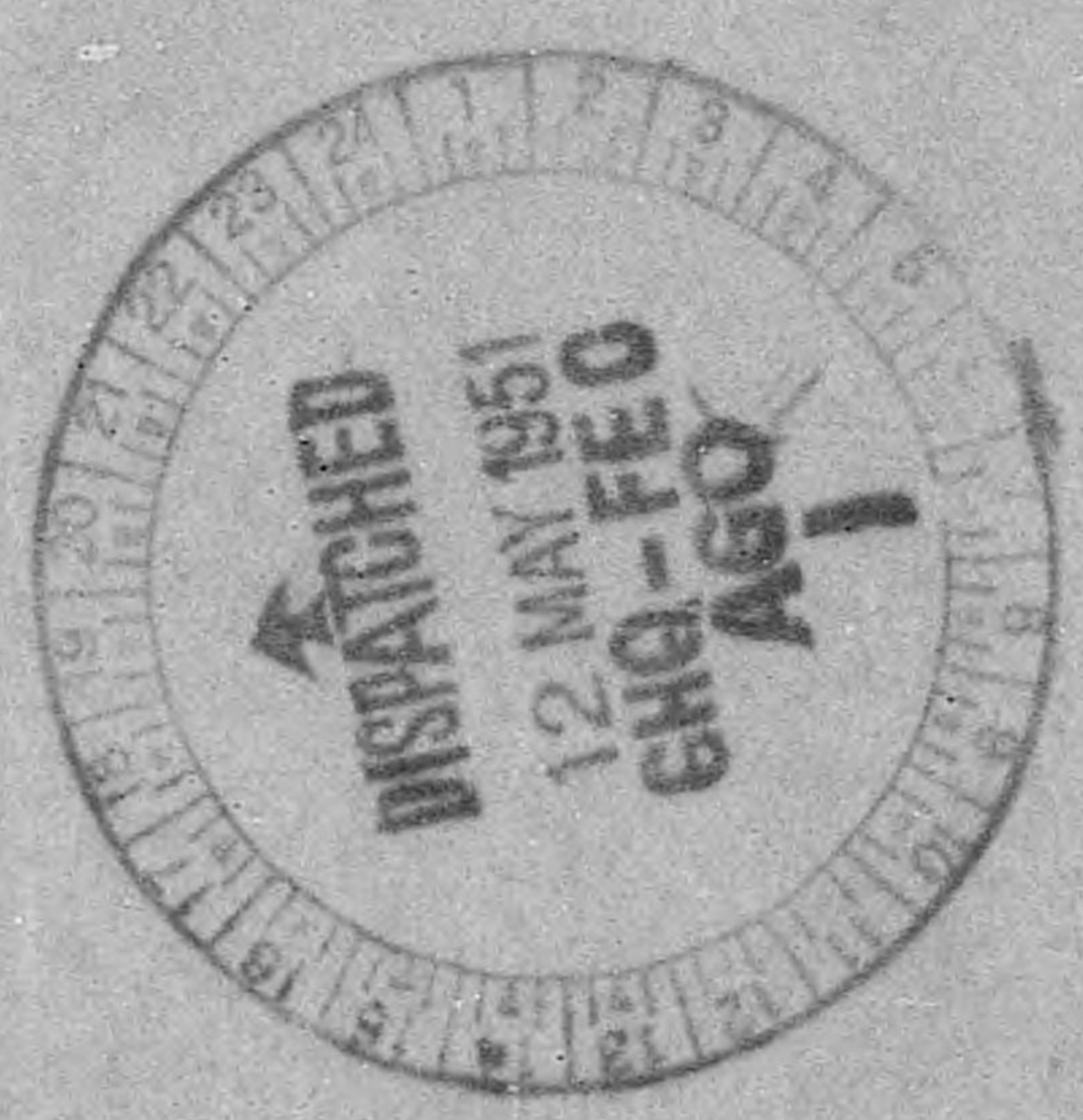

of Stimulating Exports

1. Reference is memorandum for the Japanese Government from
General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers,
AG 091.31(17 Jul 48)ESS/FTC, SCAPIN 2020, 24 June 1949, subject as
above.

2. Memorandum referred to in paragraph 1, above, is rescinded
effective 1 July 1951.

3. All foreign exchange credits which accrue under the authority
of paragraph 3 of memorandum referenced in paragraph 1, above, on or
before 30 June 1951 may be utilized by exporters in accordance with
the terms of said memorandum any time up to date of expiration as out-
lined in subparagraph 6a of said memorandum.

4. It is suggested that the Japanese Government make budgetary
provisions to provide foreign exchange after 30 June 1951 for the
type of expenditures presently provided by the foreign exchange re-
tention system.

SUBJECT: Remittability of Profits of Foreign Concerns in Japan

1. Reference is Ministry of Finance Memorandum dated 10 February 1951, subject: Concerning the Remittance of Profit and Expenses by Foreign Banks in Japan.

2. All authorizations for remittability of profits are subject to the availability of foreign exchange as provided by Japan's foreign exchange budget.

3. It is noted that consideration will be given to permitting full remittability of profits of foreign banks in Japan subject to the availability of foreign exchange for budgeting therefor.

4. The attention of the Ministry of Finance is specially invited to the necessity of determining the categories of foreign concerns that will be entitled to remittability of profits which no doubt will require careful screening of both new and existing licenses.

MEMO FOR RECORD:

As a measure to provide necessary record of remittances abroad by parties to informational media service contracts licensed by the Ministry of Finance, the Ministry has proposed that licensees report immediately on a prescribed form the amounts of remittances made prior to 1 November 1950, and that each licensee be provided with a prescribed record form on which the bank through which a remittance has been or will be made after 1 November 1950 will enter pertinent details of the remittance. Proposed measures are complementary to ordinary requirement of confirmation by banks that applicant for remittance has a license. Ministry of Finance is advised that there is no objection to it instituting the proposed measures.

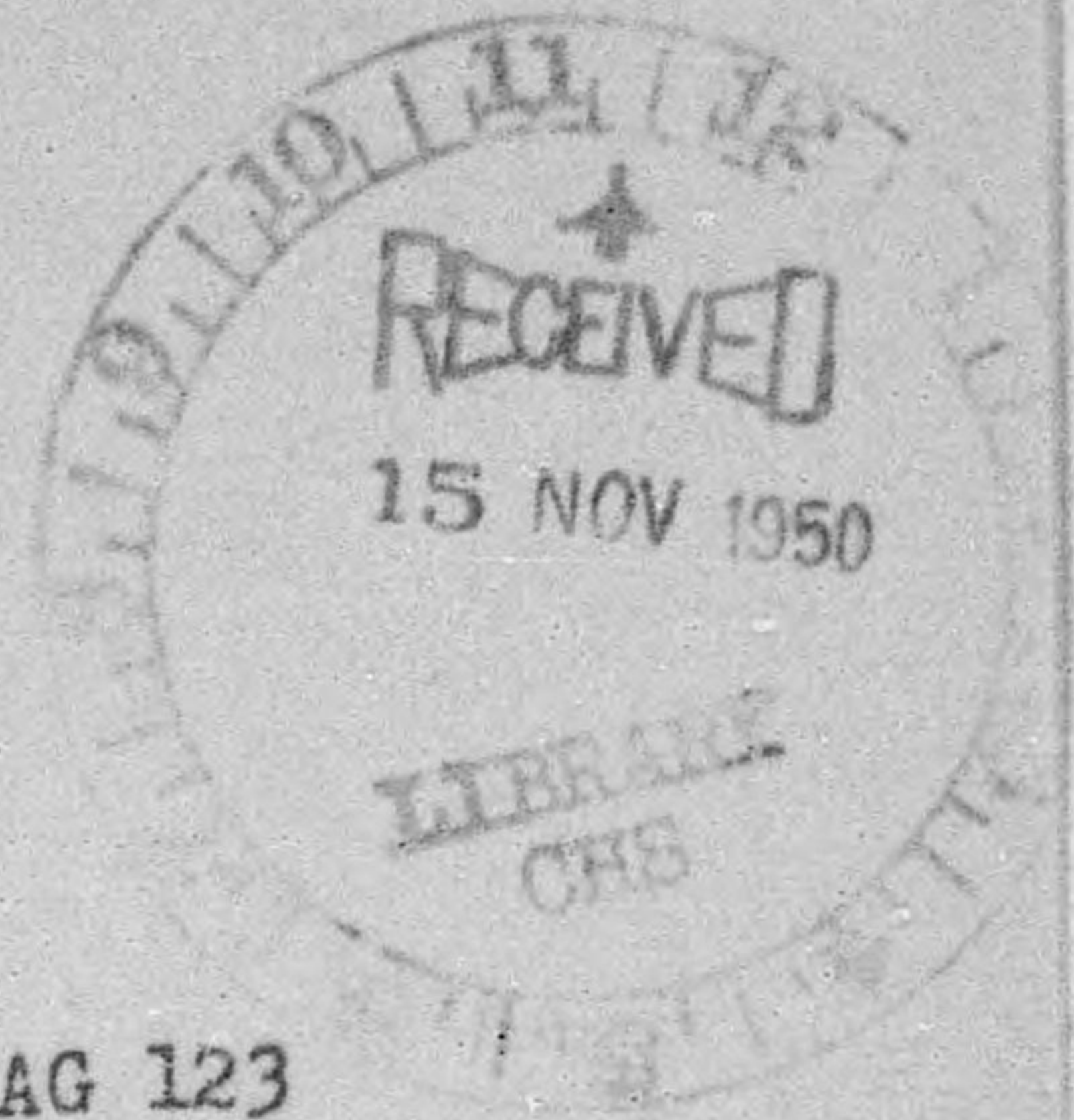

SUBJECT: Status of Foreign Exchange Conversions

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government AG 123.7 (6 May 48)CPC/CD, SCAPIN 1963, dated 17 January 1949, subject, "Purchase by the Japanese Government of Foreign Currencies and Exchange Instruments," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. Attached hereto as Inclosure 1 is a report of United States dollar credits accruing from the conversion of certain foreign coins, currencies and other financial instruments accumulated under terms of reference 1, above, and subsequently delivered into the hands of the National City Bank of New York, Tokyo Branch, for processing. The Ministry of Finance will immediately compensate in Japanese yen, in compliance with terms of reference 1, above, all Japanese receipt holders for these specific foreign currency units.

3. Attached hereto as Inclosure 2 is a report of certain foreign coins, currencies and other financial instruments delivered into the hands of the National City Bank of New York, Tokyo Branch, for attempted conversion into United States dollars, but which proved to be non-valid for the reasons cited. These items will be released to an accredited representative of the Ministry of Finance, against signed receipt, at 1000 hours, 15 August 1950, by the National City Bank of New York, Tokyo Branch.

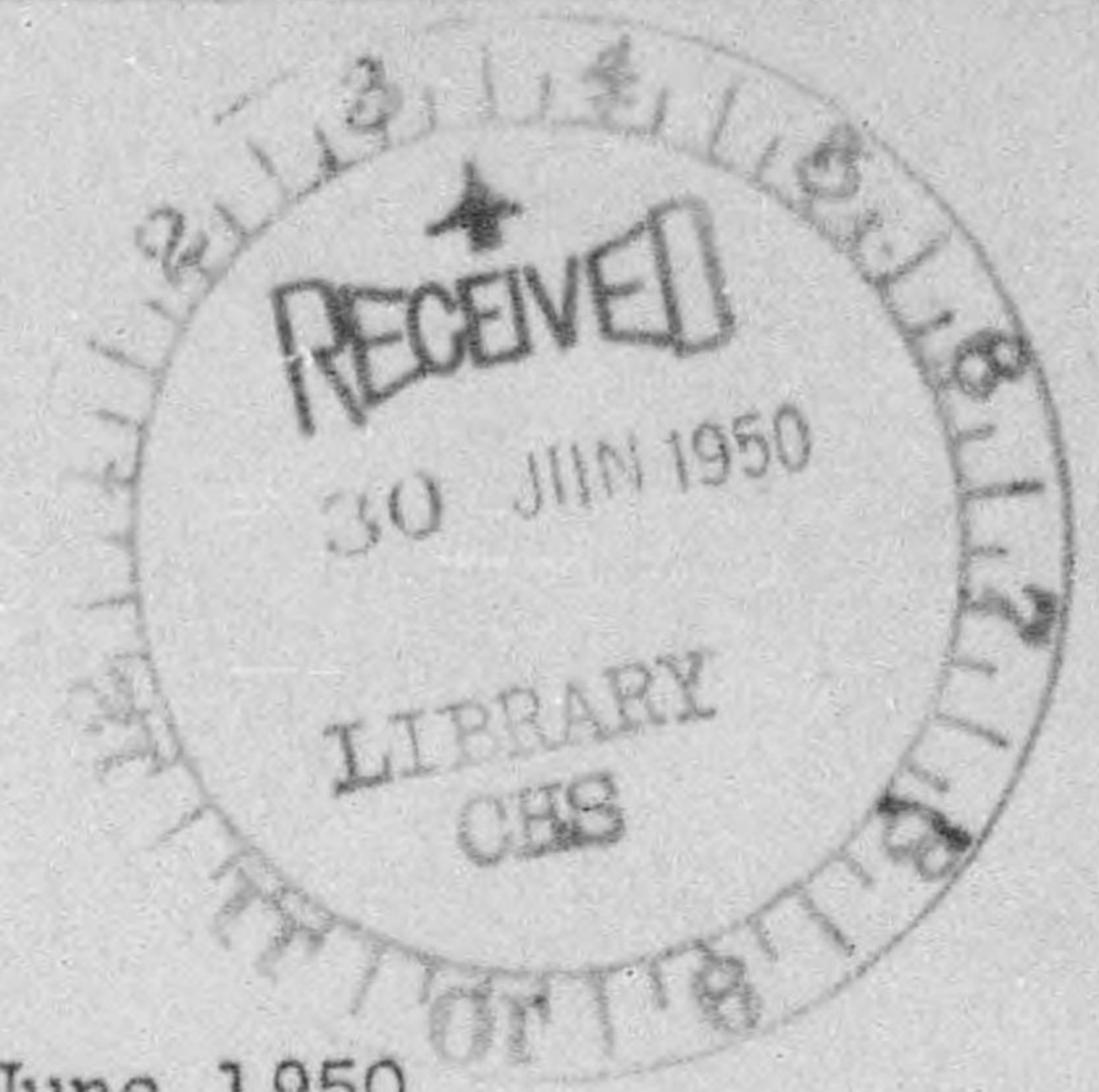

Subsequent instructions will be issued concerning treatment to be accorded Japanese holders of individual receipts for bank drafts, bills of exchange, travellers checks, other foreign exchange instruments and foreign currencies delivered into custody of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers under terms of reference lb, above.

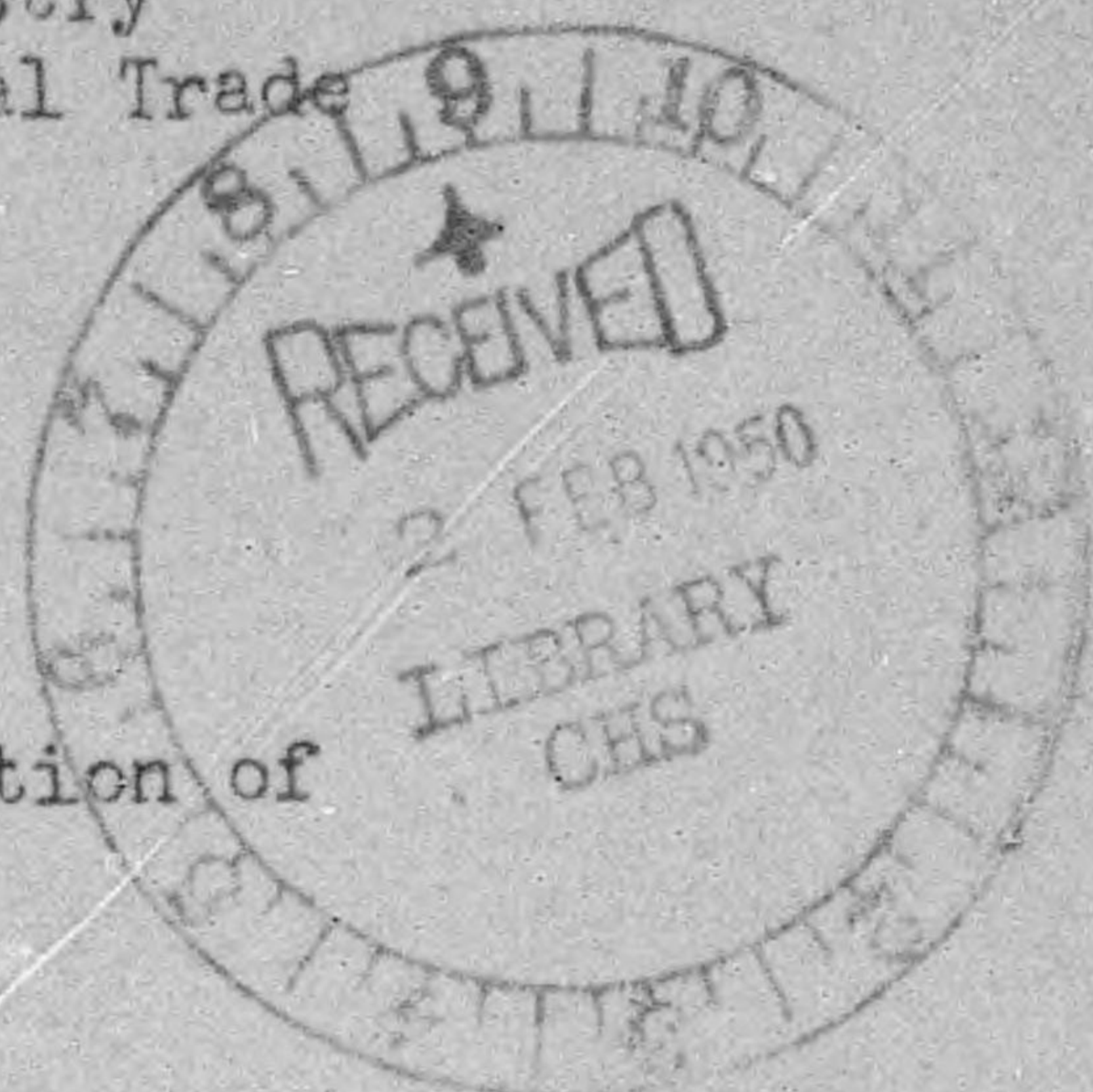

c. Approval of the extension of expiration date for utilization of foreign exchange will be on a case basis and in no event will extension exceed ninety (90) days from original expiration date;

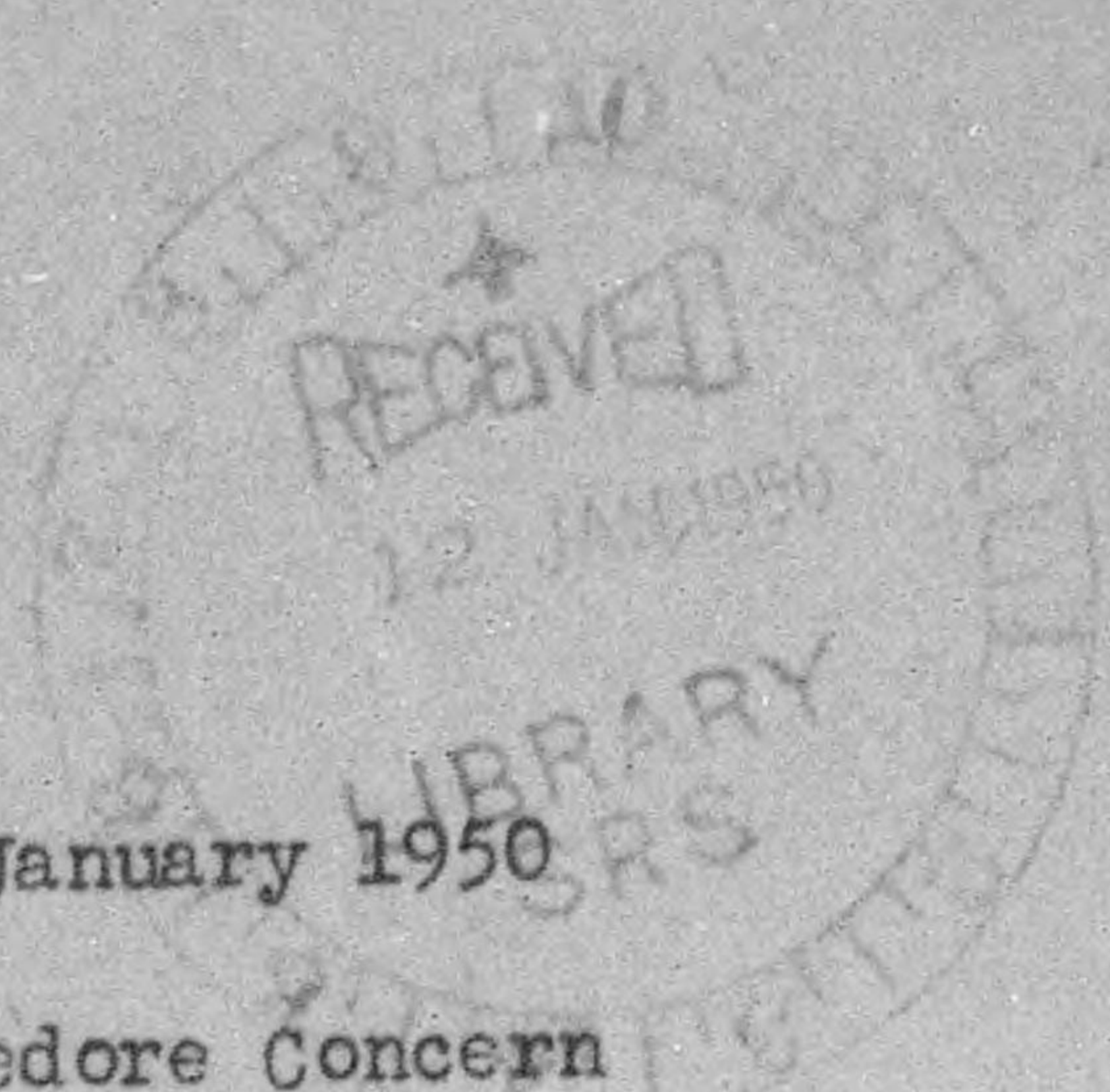

1. Reference is memorandum from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, FOM No. 1612(FIM) dated 6 December 1949, subject: Application for Approval of Foreign Exchange Transaction, which forwarded an application from the Sankyu Transportation Company, Tokyo, requesting authority to receive from Scott and English, Ltd., in payment for stevedoring services, approximately Stg. £2,410 which would be sold to a foreign exchange bank in Japan against yen.

2. No objection is offered to the above referenced application insofar as the proposed exchange transaction is concerned.

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Foreign Exchange and Foreign Trade Control

1. The following memoranda for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers are rescinded:

subject: Controls over Exports and Imports of Gold, Silver, Securities and Financial Instruments;
- b. AG 130(22 Sep 45)ESS, SCAPIN 45, 22 September 1945,
subject: Control of Financial Transactions;
- c. AG 091.31 (9 Oct 45)ESS, SCAPIN 110, 9 October 1945,
subject: Import of Essential Commodities;
- d. AG 160(30 Oct 45)SS/FI, SCAPIN 211, 30 October 1945,
subject: Contracts by Persons in Japan with Foreign Concerns.
- e. AG 091.31 (10 May 46)ESS/IE, SCAPIN 943, 10 May 1946,
subject: Reports Relative to Import-Export Commodities;
- f. AG 091.31 (9 Aug 48) ESS/FTC, SCAPIN 1926/1, 19 November 1948,
subject: Return from Abroad of Commercial Quantities of Manufactured Articles for Repair and Return to Owner.
- g. AG 091.31 (9 Mar 49)ESS/FTC, SCAPIN 1982, 9 March 1949,
subject: Import Procedure.

2. Effective this date the Japanese Government will supervise and authorize the import of goods into Japan in accordance with the "Foreign Exchange and Foreign Trade Control Law", and provisions of this memorandum.

3. The Japanese Government will obtain approval of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

- a. For trade plans and foreign exchange budgets approved by the Ministerial Council prior to their implementation by the Japanese Government.

- b. For initiation of negotiations for procurement by the Japanese Government of imports for the Japanese Government account.
 - c. For all changes in the basic rate of exchange.
 - d. For the designation of currencies to be authorized for foreign exchange purposes.
 - e. For measures pertaining to the manner or degree of concentration of foreign exchange.
 - f. For the export or import of gold, silver or other precious metals.
 - g. For transactions relative to property which is within the jurisdiction of the Civil Property Custodian by reason of the existence therein of the interest of a non-Japanese national on or since 7 December 1941 with the exception of those transactions which have already been authorized by memorandum to the Japanese Government or agencies thereof.
 - h. For such other matters as may be designated later by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
4. Property or cargo owned by the occupation forces or agencies thereof, cargo derived from American aid programs, and cargo reimbursed in part or wholly from American aid programs or for which transportation has been paid from such programs will not be subject to the provisions of the "Foreign Exchange and Foreign Trade Control Law" unless specifically stipulated by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
5. Direct communication between appropriate agencies of the Japanese Government and General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers is authorized to implement this memorandum.

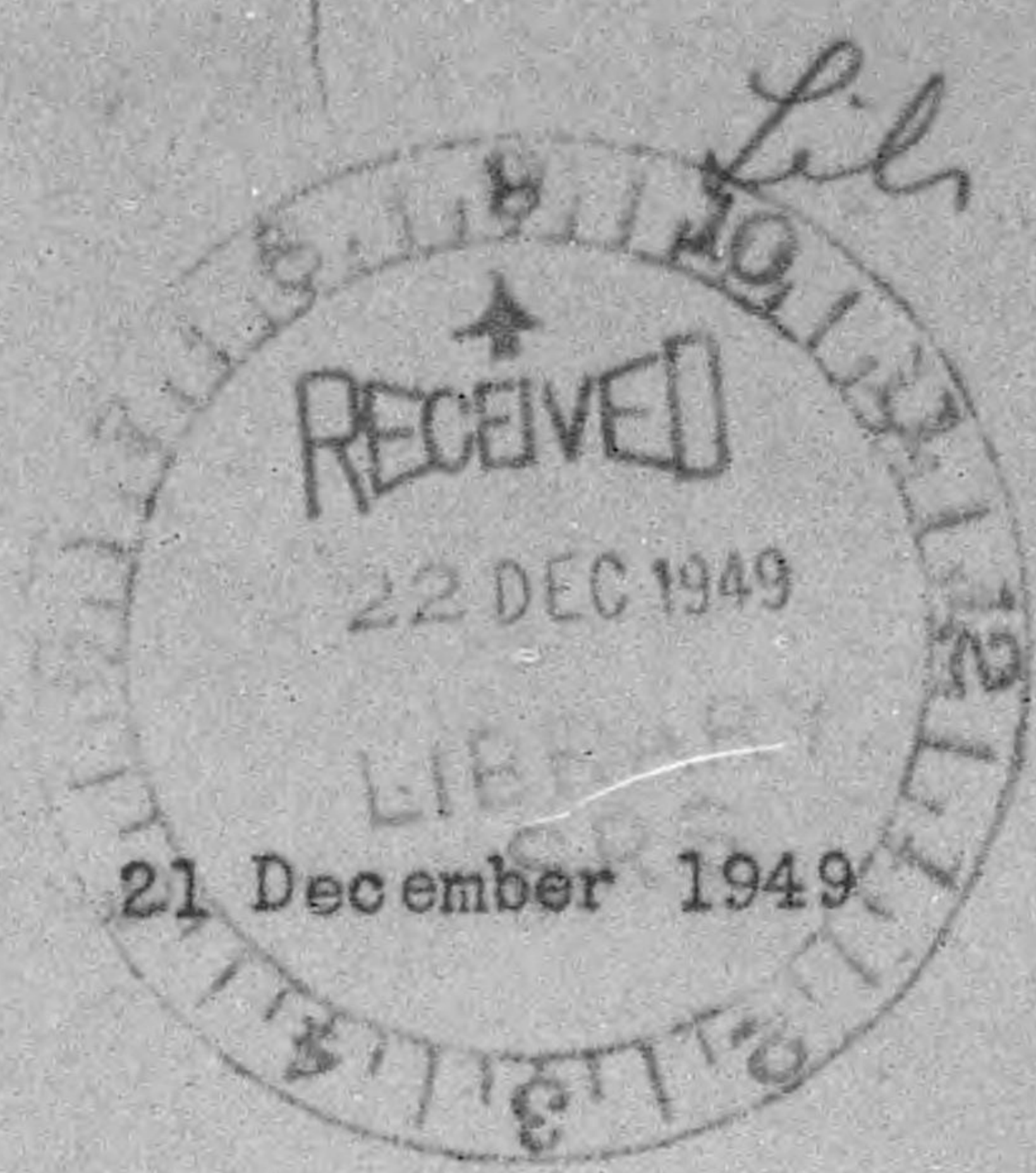

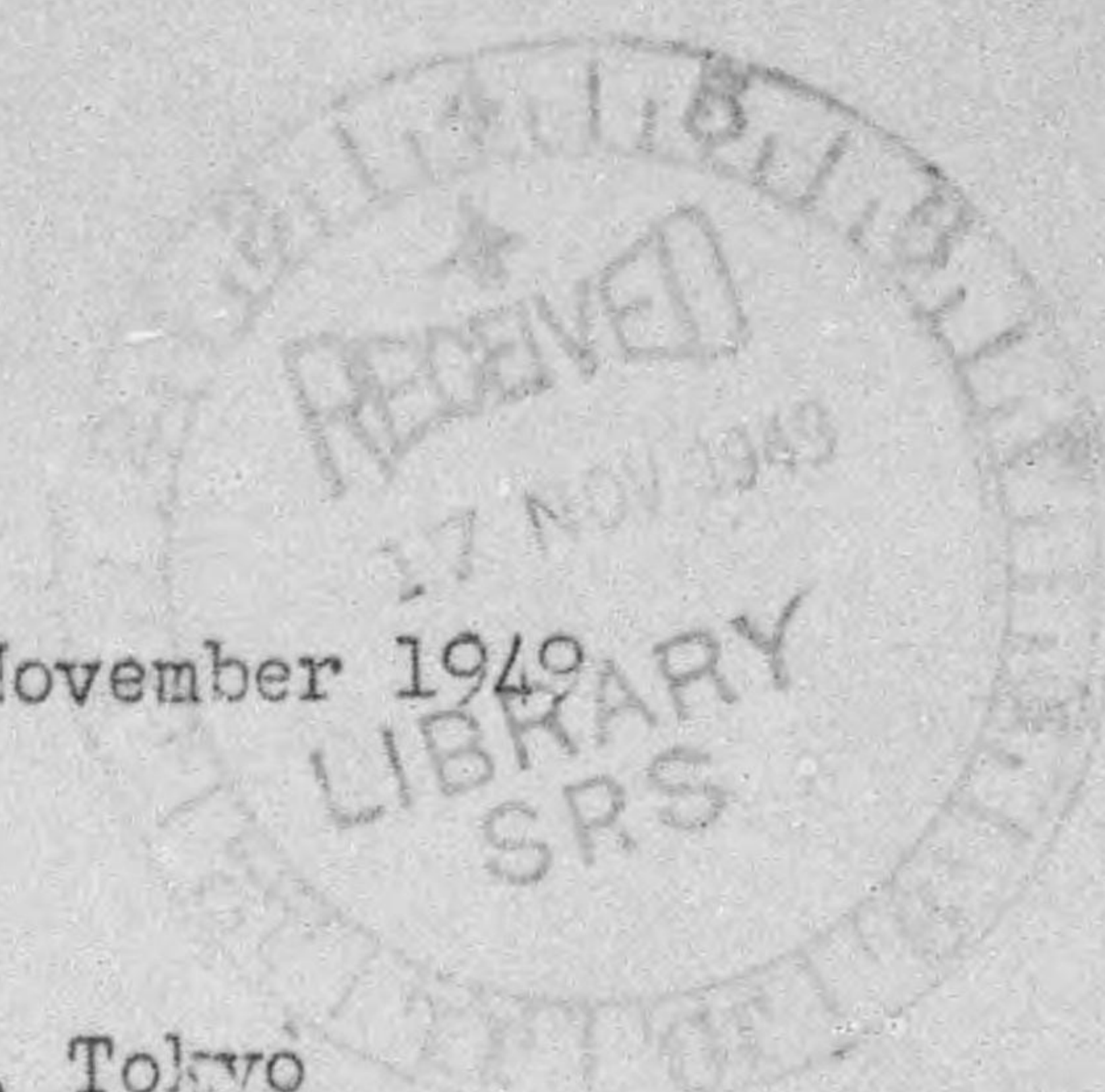

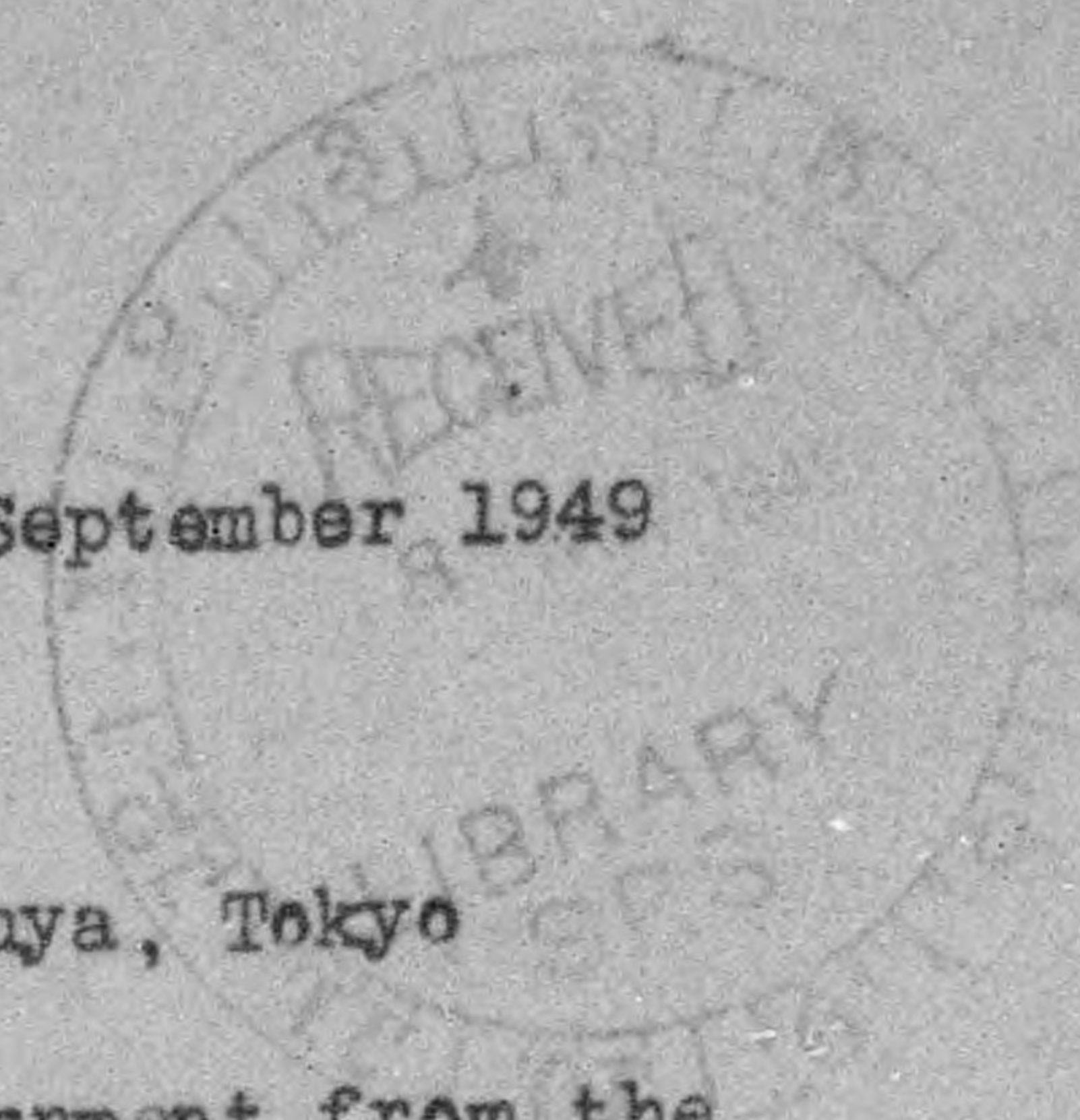

1. Reference is Memorandum for the Japanese Government from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 014.33(22 Jun 46)ESS/FI, SCAPIN 1034, dated 22 June 1946, subject: Japanese Repatriates from Canada.

2. Inclosed are two schedules of payments relative to a total of 104 Japanese personnel previously repatriated to Japan. Amounts listed in the schedules represent funds due the repatriates as proceeds from the sale of their property by the Canadian Government. Should the amounts shown by the schedules differ from those indicated by repatriates' CT-JAP-2 certificates, which were merely estimates of the value of their property, the amounts shown by the inclosed schedules are to be taken as being correct.

3. Payments will be effected in accordance with the provisions of reference Memorandum provided:

a. The yen equivalent of the United States dollar amounts listed in the inclosed schedules will be paid to the individuals concerned at the exchange rate prevailing at the time such payments are made.

b. There will be no overall restriction as to the amount of yen to be paid to the individuals concerned.

c. A monthly report in quadruplicate will be made to the Japanese Finance Division, Economic and Scientific Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of yen payments made by the Bank of Japan to the repatriates.

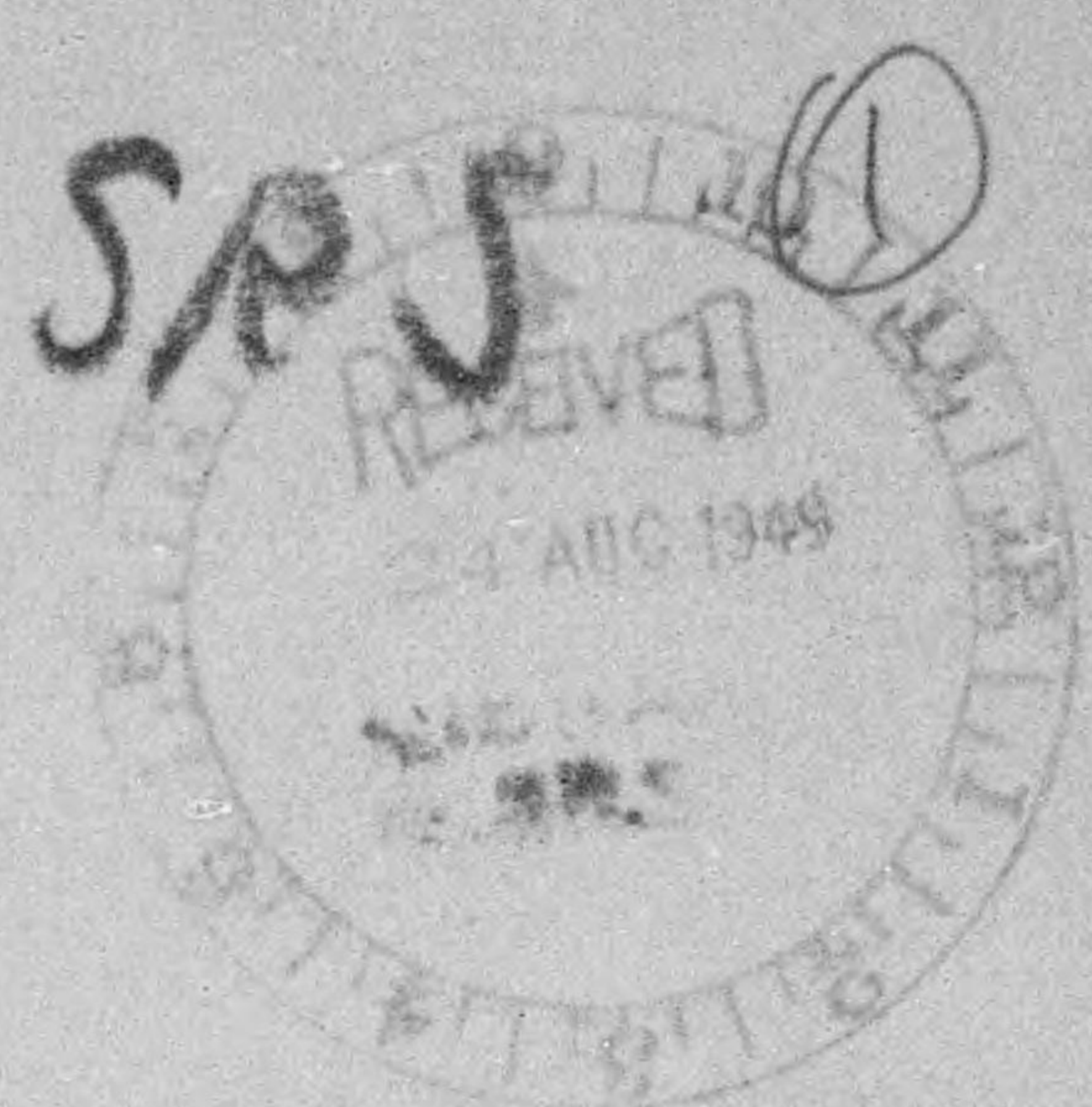

The company permitted to engage in purchase and re-sale of Japanese goods in accordance with reference 1 c. above and any other person who may in the future be specifically authorized by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to purchase and re-sell Japanese goods to Occupation Forces' agencies and personnel may make such sale under the procedure outlined in references 1 a. and 1 b. above, notwithstanding the provisions of reference 1 a. which limit its applicability to sales to persons entitled to possess foreign trade payment certificates.
