

Basic Guidelines for your Wikipedia entry:

- 1) **Language:** Should be Accessible, easy to follow, precise and unbiased.
- 2) **Title:** Use this format <Name of Book/Text (Book)>
- 3) **Introductory line or the lead:** This is the line that you see before the table of contents. Your lead should not be longer than two lines. Write a clear description of the book and include the name of book, author, year of publication, disciplinary roots or some other pertinent information. Keep the details for the main part of your entry.
- 4) **Section Headings:** Organize your entries into sections to keep in line with Wikipedia's guidelines. Avoid using numerals (other than years), questions or links in your section headings. Examples of section headings: Key themes/ Arguments, Impact in feminist scholarship/Legacy, Similar Works, Previous editions etc.
- 5) Link out to other content as much as possible or else your entry will become an orphan.
- 6) Do use verifiable sources
- 7) Create a list of keywords that can be linked to other Wikipedia content for the See also section
- 8) Before you publish make sure you have colleague read through your entry, so s/he can point out what you have missed or whether the language is understandable.
- 9) Give reference to imp themes/ arguments linked with this text- from other text on the same theme- other text from the same author.
- 10) Add references for preparing bibliography.
- 11) Add reference and specify (you can do it by making it separate section/ or mentioning it in detail) major concept/ theoretical framework used in the text- any methodological contribution
