

ACORUS calamus Sweet Flag, handsome foliage, bogs.

ALETRIS farinosa Colic Root, 12 to spirels of white flowers, \$2 doz.

ALLIUM cernuum Nodding Onion, umbels of pink flowers, 1 to 2', \$2 doz.

album White form of above, \$2 doz.

tricoccum The Mountain Ramp, white flowers in umbels, 12".

ALSINE pubera Stitchwort, 6", covered with white star-like flowers in spring.

AMSONIA salicifolia Blue Milkweed, handsome

foliage, light blue flowers in spring, 2'.

tabernaemontana Similar, but with large foliage. ANEMONELLA thalictroides. Rue Anemone, 6", many white flowers over a long period in spring, tuberous, \$2 doz.

AQUILEGIA canadensis Columbine, 18", red and

vellow flowers.

ARISAEMA triphyllum Jack-in-the-Pulpit, 1 to 2', interesting hooded plants, bright red fruits in fall, \$2 doz.

ASARUM arifolium Arrowleaf Ginger, handsome evergreen foliage usually marbled, interesting brown flowers.

canadense Deciduous Ginger, large green leaves, good as ground cover.

heterophylla Bladder-like "jugs" of brown.

shuttleworthi Large Bloom Ginger, largest "jugs" of any of the gingers, handsome foliage.

virginicum Evergreen Foliage, usually marbled. ASCLEPIAS tuberosa Butterfly Weed, large heads of bright orange flowers in summer, 1 to 2'. ASTER mixed, all colors, mass plantings, \$1.50

novae-angliae Bright rosy purple flowers in large clusters, very handsome, 3 to 4'.

CASSIA marylandica Wild Senna, panicles of bright yellow flowers, brown stamens, very handsome, 3'.

CAULOPHYLLUM thalictroides Blue Cohosh, excellent foliage, bright blue berries in fall, 2'.

CHAMAELIRIUM leteum Fairy Wand, spikes of white flowers of great beauty, 2'.

CHELONE chlorantha Handsome white flowers, 2', very rare, 35c.

lyoni Showy pink flowers in summer, 2'.

CHIMAPHILA maculata Spotted Wintergreen, waxy white flowers, 6", \$1.50 doz.

CHROSPERMA muscaetoxicum Crow Poison, grasslike foliage, white flowers, 1½ to 2'.

CHRYSOGONUM virginianum Rough foliage, bright vellow flower heads, 6".

CIMICIFUGA racemosa Black Snakeroot, white

spires, 4 to 6'.

CLAYTONIA Carolina. White flower with pink stripes. Broad foliage. Very rare, 35c.

virginica Spring Beauty, grasslike foliage, pink flowers for long period, 4", bulbous, \$1.50 doz.

CLINTONIA umbellulata Blue Beads, umbels of white flowers, spotted brown, handsome foliage, 8".

CONVALLARIA majalis Lily-of-the-Valley, spikes of fragrant white flowers, 8", orange fruits in fall. COREOPSIS lanceolata Bright yellow flowers all summer, 2'.

pubescens Similar, but dwarf, 8 to 12".

saxicola 3 ft. Very handsome foliage and showy flowers. The best, 35c.

tripteris Golden yellow flowers.

CUTHBERTIA graminea A most excellent plant for rock gardens. Bright, rosy flowers on 4" stems nearly all summer. Similar to "Spiderworts." A real treasure, 35c.

rosea Somewhat larger than above. Deep rose colored flowers.

DELPHINUM tricorne Mountain Larkspur, bright blue flowers, 12", \$2 doz.

DENTARIA diphylla Toothwort, white flowers on 6" stems, \$2 doz.

furcata Small foliage, root stocks monoiliform.

DICENTRA canadense Squirrel Corn, panicles of white and yellow flowers, 12", \$1.50 doz.

cucullaria Dutchman's Breeches, panicles of pink

and white flowers, 12", \$1.50 doz.

eximia Plumy Bleeding Hart, beautiful foliage all summer and sprays of pink flowers continuously, 12 to 20'.

DIONAEA muscipula Venus' Flytrap, interesting bog plants.

DISPORUM maculatum Fairy Bells (Prosartes) nodding white bells with brown spots, bright orange fruits in fall.

DODECATHEON hugeri Shooting Star, pure white flowers with brown eye on 2' stems. One of our choicest plants.

DRABA ramosissima Whitlow Grass, sheets of white flowers for a long period in spring, beautiful grey foliage all year. A real treasure 6".

EPIGAEA repens Trailing Arbutus, pink wax-like flowers in March, 4".

EUPHORBIA corollata Flowering Spurge flowers like "Baby's Breath" in summer. Excellent, 2'. ERIGERON pulchellus Robin's Plantain, clusters of mauve daisies, 12".

ERYNGIUM yuccifolium Sea Holly, heads of

white thistlelike flowers, 2'.

ERYTHRONIUM americanum Trout Lily, Yellow lily-like flowers, beautiful marbled foliage, 6", \$2 doz.

GAULTHERIA procumbens Aromatic Wintergreen, handsome evergreen creper, red berries in fall, 4".

GENTIANA andrewsi Closed Gentian, deep blue bottles 12".

decora Bright blue flowers, bogs.

latifolia Large bright purplish-blue flowers, usually in clusters, very handsome and showy, 1', 35c.

prophyrio Intense blue, one of the most choice plants, 50c.

GERANIUM maculatum Wild Geranium, lavender blossoms, 12", \$2 doz.

GILLENIA trifoliata Indian Physic, white starlike blosoms on red stems, very attractive, 2'.

HELENIUM autumnale Sneezewood, bright yellow flowers in fall, 2'.

HELONIAS hullata Swamp Hyacinth, pink spikes with blue stamens 12", bogs, 35c.

HEPATICA americana Liverwort, foliage hand-somely marbled, flowers usually blue, 4", \$2 doz.

acutiloba Leaves with acute lobes, flowers usually white, 6", foliage also marbled, \$2 doz.

HEUCHERA americana Wild Alum Root, handsome marbled foliage, feathery spikes of white, 2'. villosa Large foliage and blooms in fall.

HOUSTONIA caerulea The common "Bluet" skyblue, 4".

lonqifolia Purple flowers, 6".
montana Bright pink flowers, 4".

purpurea Purple flowers, 6 to 12".

serpyllifolia Evergreen ground cover, sky blue flowers.

HYMENOCALLIS occidentalis Spider Lily, gorgeous white lilies with spidery effect, very fragrant, 2', \$1.50 each.

crassifolia With smaller flowers, likes bogs, 15",

HYPOXIS hirsuta Yellow Star Grass, bright yellow flowers all summer, 6", bulbous, \$2 doz.

IRIS cristata Crested Iris, sky blue flowers in abundance, 4", \$2 doz.

cristata alba Pure white form of above, choice

scariosa Branched Gayfeather, two weeks later than above, large indidvidual flowers on 4' spikes. spicata Spiked Gayfeather, spikes of purple, 3'.

LOBELLA cardinalis The Cardinal Flower, in-

tense red flowers, 2' bogs.

syphilitica As blue as the above is red, 2', bogs. LYCOPODIUM lucidulum Shining Club Moss, 3" pots.

obscurum Turkey Brush.

selago Fire club moss, 2" tufts of dark green spines. Likes moisture.

tristachyum Similar to Christmas Green but

stems creep beneath the ground, very handsome. 50c.

LYSIMACHIA nummularia Creeping Charlie, escaped; evergreen trailer with yellow flowers.

MARSHALLIA grandiflora Very handsome scabiosa-like flowers in lavender. 2'.

MELANTHIUM virginicum Va. Bunch-flowers, very showy clusters of flowers in summer, 3'.

MERTENSIA virginica Virginia Bluebells, beautiful blue flowers in spring, 18".

MANFREDA virginica False Aloe, handsome suc-

culent foliage, cream flowers.

MIMULUS ringens Monkey Flower, grinning

blue flowers in summer, 2 to 4'.

MITCHELLA repens Turkey Berry, excellent evergreen ground cover, red berries in fall, 1".

MITELLA diphylla Bishop's Cap, 12" spikes of white capshaped flowers, good foliage.

MONARDA didyma Oswego Tea, red flowers, 2'.

fistulosa Horse Mint, purple flowers, 3'.

MYOSOTIS palustris Forget-Me-Not, escaped, likes bogs.

NEPETA hederacea Ground Ivy, excellent ground

cover, purple flowers.

NOTHOSCORDUM bivalve Bulbous plants similar to onions but without alliaceous odor, white flowers, purple stripe on reverse of petals, 12".

OPUNTIA opuntia Prickly Pear, spiny cacti, yellow, 6".

APLECTRUM hyemale Putty Root, handsome grey-green leaf in winter, cream flowers in summer,

CYPRIPEDIUM acaule Pink Moccasin Flower,

showy pink slippers.

GOODYERA pubescens Rattlesnake Plantain,

beautifully marbled leaves, white flowers in summer, 8".

HABENARIA ciliaris Yellow fringed orchid. Very showy.

nivae The Savannah orchid. Lovely white spikes of flowers, 12-18", 50c each.

clavellata Small greenish-white flowers.

cristata Crested Orchid, deep yellow, 35c each.

LIMODORUM tuberosum Grass Pink, showy rose-pink flowers.

LIPARIS liliifolia Twayblade, small purple flowers.

PARNASSIA caroliniana Grass of Panassus, handsome white flowers on wiry stems in fall, 12", bogs, 35c.

grandifolia Similar to above but larger leaves. Very choice and rare, 50c.

PARONYCHIA argyrocoma Silver Wort, soft, grey silk foliage resembling phlox subulata, small white flowers, 4", sun.

PASSIFLORA incarnata Crucifixion Plant, 3' vine, large blue flowers, edible fruits.

lutea Yellow flowers.

PENTSTEMON hirsutus Beard Tongue, showy purple flowers in summer, 12".

Mary Alice Pale pink with red eye, completely

covering the foliage. Very neat.

Sir Guilford Large, bright pink blossoms with red eye. Very showy and handsome.

SUBULATA alba Pure white.

australis Small rosy pink flowers.
lilacena Rampant grower, lavender flowers.
rosea Bright rose flowers, red eye.
rosea red The brightest red we have. Showy.
wilsoni Compact growth, blue.
vivid Slow growing, salmon pink, very choice.

PYXIDANTHERA barbulata Pixie Moss, white flowers, 1", rare and difficult, 35c each.

brevifolia Smaller form, 35c each.

SAGITTARIA graminea White waxlike flowers, 6", bogs.

latifolia Arrowheads, handsome foliage plants,

waxlike flowers, 2', bogs.

SANGUINARIA canadensis Bloodroot, showy white flowers as the leaves appear, 6".

SARRACENIA flava Pitcher Plant, large pitchers and yellow flowers, 2', bogs.

jonesi Small trumpets, red flowers, 1'.

minor The pitchers have "glass windows," choice, yellow, 12" 35c each.

purpurea The Sidesaddle Plant, red flowers. rubra Bright trumpets, Red flowers, 8".

SAXIFRAGA micranthilifolia Lettuce Saxifrage, white flowers, 2', bogs.

petiolaris The fall blooming saxifrage, two lower petals having yellow spots on them, 6 to 12".

virginiensis Sprays of white flowers in spring, 6

reddish flowers in summer, very rare, 50c each.

telephiloides 8 to 12" tall, pale pink or white. ternatum Best ground cover in shade, white, 4".

SHORTIA galacifolia Oconee Bells, one of the choicest native plants, white bells on 6" stems. Very rare.

SILENE caroliniana Bright pink flowers, very choice and beautiful, 50c.

ovata Catchfly, white flowers on 2' stems.

stellata White fringed flowers, 2'.

virginica Fire Pink, fiery red stars, excellent, 12".

SISYRINCHIUM anqustifolium Blue - Eyed Grass, grasslike foliage, bright blue flowers, 12".

SMILACINA racemosa False Solomon's Seal, clusters of white flowers at tip of stem 2'.

SPIGELIA marylandica Carolina Pink Root, bright red tubular flowers lined with yellow, very good, 12".

polygamum Tall Meadow Rue, handsome foliage, 4'.

THERMOPSIS caroliniana Yellow Lupine, spikes of bright yellow flowers, 4'.

TIARELLA cordifolia Foam Flower, panicles of

misty white flowers, very good, 1'.

species A' new species found by Dr. Wherry. Large panicles of white flowers. Grows very compact and does not spread by runners like T. cordifolia, \$1 each.

TOFIELDIA glabra Racemes of white flowers

VIOLA affinis Large light blue flowers. Uncommon.

canadensis White with lavender reverse.

hastata Yellow flowers, brittle rhizomes.

eriocarpa Smooth yellow violet.

palmata Deep blue flowers.

papilionacea Common blue violet.

pedata Bird's foot Violet, light blue, large.

peddata bicolor Upper petals bright purple, lower blue.

primulifolia Small white flowers.

pubescens Yellow flowers with purple stripes.

rostrata Blue with long spurs.

rotundifolia Large foliage, yellow flowers.

striata Creamy-white, purple lines. One of the best.

villosa Marbled foliage, blue.

walteri Small blue flowers, choice and rare, 35c each.

YUCCA filamentosa Adam's Needle, spike of white bell-shaped flowers in summer, 2'.

ZEPHYRANTHES atamasco Meadow Lily, Grass like foliage, with fading pink, 12", fragrant.

AESCULUS pavia Dwarf Red Buckeye, clusters of orange-red flowers followed by "buckeyes" in fall, 2 to 3', \$1 each.

AMELANCHIER, canadensis Service Berry, mists of white flowers in spring, edible fruits in summer, 2 to 3'; \$1 each.

AMORPHA fruticosa Locust like foliage, purple flowers, 2-3', 75c each.

ARONIA arbutifolia Beautiful white flowers, bright red berries in fall, 2 to 3', 75c.

nigra Black Choke Berry, 1 to 2', 50c.

ASIMINA triloba Papaw Large fragrant fruits, 2-3', 75c each.

AZALEA aborescens Sweet Azalea, white fragrant flowers, 1½ to 2', \$1.00.

calendulacea Flame Azalea, from cream to orange and almost red, 2 to 3', \$1 each.

canescens Mountain Azalea, bright, clear pink, 1½ to 2', \$1.50.

nudiflora Wild Honeysuckle, showy pink flowers before the leaves appear 1½ to 2', \$1.

vaseyi Shell-pink Azalea, gorgeous pink flowers

marked with green, 11/2 to 2', \$2.

BACCHARIS halimifolia Dark green foliage, showy white pappus in fall. Handsome 2-3', 75c.

CALLICARPA americana Lavender flowers in summer, bright violet fruits in fall, 2-3', 75c.

CALYCANTHUS floridus Sweet-Shrub, fragrant chocolate-colored/ flowers, 2 to 3', 75c.

CATALPA speciosa Handsome flowers, cream marked with orange, 2 to 3', 75c.

CEANOTHUS americanus Jersey Tea, mists of white flowers in summer, 25c.

CERCIS canadensis Red Bud, rose pea-shaped flowers before leaves appear, 3 to 4', 75c.

CHIONANTHUS virginica Fringe Tree, fleecy white flowers in spring,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  to 3', \$1.

CLADRASTRIS lutea Yellow wood. Large loosely clustered campanulate shaped flowers, 1', 50c.

CLETHRA acuminata Sweet Pepper Bush, fragrant white flowers in late summer, 3', \$1.

alnifolia Similar to above, 2', \$1.

COMPTONIA asplenifolia Sweet Fern. Fernlike foliage, fragrant when bruised, 1½-2', 50c.

CORNUS alternifolia White flowers, dark blue fruit, 2-3', 75c.

amomum Silky Dogwood. Bright purple branches clusters of white flowers followed by blue fruits, 3', 75c.

florida Dogwood, showy white flowers, bright red fruits in fall, 2 to 3', 75c.

floridus, fl. pl. A double form of our common dogwood. Grafted plants, 2-3', \$2.00; 3-4', \$3.50.

rosea Pink dogwood. Grafted plants 2-3', \$2.00; 3-4', \$3.50.

stolonifera Flowers and fruits white, 2-3', 75c. CYRILLA racemiflora Racemes of white flowers, 1½ to 2', \$1.

DIRCA palustris Leatherwood, clusters of 2 to 4 cream flowers in spring, cannot break the wood,  $1\frac{1}{2}$ , 75c.

EUONYMUS americana Strawberry bush. Bright

orange fruits in fall, 75c.

atropurpurea Wahoo; Upright shrub or tree. Scarlet fruits, 2-3', 75c.

FOTHERGILLA alnifolia Clusters of white stamens in balls before the leaves appear, 6", 50c.

monticola Large heads of white stamens. Foliage a golden yellow in fall, \$1.


