Ambassador Fay will then make the traditional presentation of shamrocks in a Waterford glass bowl to you. Following this, Mrs. Fay will present Mrs. Nixon a book of paintings from the Irish National Gallery. A single stand-up microphone will be provided for your use in acknowledging these gifts.

Following these presentations, you will ask Mr. John Moore (brother of Dick Moore) to step forward and at that time you will make the announcement of his selection as the new Ambassador to Ireland.

Mr. Moore is Vice President of W.R. Grace and Co., Director of Grace Line, Inc., President and co-founder of the Ireland-United States Council for Commerce and Industry, and Vice President and Trisive of the American Irish Historical Society.

He is, also, a member of the Friendly Sons of St. Patrick, the forms of Hibernians and the Irish Georgian Society.

ST. PATRICK'S DAY VISIT SCENARIO CONTINUED:

Mr. Moore has made more than 30 visits to Ireland and will assume his post in June.


