HIGHLIGHTS:

For the week, both grain and soybeans bids traded up and down but finished slightly lower late in the week. Weather and spring planting concerns remains a significant market factors. Poor export sales figures anchor lower trends. Bids were mostly lower across the Board, Wheat 3 to 5 cents higher, except Minnesota 1 to 6 cents lower. Corn 5 to 7 cents lower, Sorghum 3 to 12 cents lower and Soybeans bids 4 to 6 cents lower. Wheat were bids ended up slightly higher after an early week cold snap dip down in Central Kansas promoted talk of frost damage. Minnesota ended up lower as flooding of the upper Mississippi halted barge traffic and grain movement. Spring planting of corn moving up into the mid-corn belts. Weekend rains forecast and this could delay seeding which is already behind a year ago. Its is still early enough to get in hugh acreage but some flooded areas maybe a little late. Fertilizer, nitrogen, drop around 70.00 dollars from last winter high but still very expensive and adding substantially to production cost for this year crop. Soybean bids were lower with zip export announcements and favorable harvest weather out of South America.

WHEAT:

Kansas US No 1 Hard Red Winter, ordinary protein rail bid 4 3/4 cents higher at 3.34-3.54 per bushel. Kansas City US No 2 Soft Red Winter rail bid 4 3/4 cents higher at 2.81-3.06 per bushel. St.Louis truck US No 2 Soft Red Winter terminal bid 3 to 5 cents higher at 2.40 per bushel. Minneapolis and Duluth US No 1 Dark Northern Spring,14.0-14.5 percent protein rail 1 to 6 cents lower at 3.66 1/2-3.81 1/2 per bushel. Portland US Soft White Wheat bid 3 cents higher at 3.21-3.24 per bushel.

CORN:

Kansas City US No 2 rail White Corn 6 to 7 cents lower at 2.13-2.16 per bushel. US No 2 truck Yellow Corn 7 cents lower at 1.93-1.95 per bushel. Omaha US No 2 truck Yellow Corn 7 cents lower at 1.84-1.85 per bushel. Chicago US No 2 Yellow Corn truck/rail bid 5 1/4 to 7 1/4 cents lower at 1.96 1/2-2.06 1/2 per bushel. Toledo US No 2 rail Yellow corn 6 1/4 to 7 1/4 cents lower at 1.85 1/2-1.91 1/2 per bushel. Minneapolis US No Yellow Corn rail 5 1/4 cents lower at 1.82 1/2 per bushel.

OATS AND BARLEY:

US No 1-2 non-milling rail Oats at Minneapolis had no quote this week. US No 3 or better Malting Barley, 70 percent or better plump out of Minneapolis had no quote. Portland US 2 Barley, unit trains and barges-export steady to 5 cents lower at 4.65 per cwt.

SORGHUM:

US No 2 yellow truck, Kansas City 12 cents lower at 3.45 per cwt. Texas High Plains US No 2 yellow sorghum (prices paid or bid to the farmer, fob elevator) 2 to 5 cents lower at 3.27-3.45 per cwt.

OILSEEDS:

Illinois Processors US No 1 Yellow truck Soybeans 1 cent lower to 3 cents higher at 4.39 1/4-4.46 1/4 per bushel. Kansas City US No 2 Yellow truck Soybeans 4 to 6 cents lower at 4.32-4.34 per bushel. Minneapolis Yellow truck soybeans 4 3/4 cents higher at 4.14 1/2 per bushel. Decatur 44 percent soybean meal, processor's bid rail 1.50 to 4.50 lower at 147.00-151.00 per ton; 48 percent Soybean Meal, 1.50 lower at 157.00-160.00 per ton. Decatur crude Soybean oil processor bid 62 points lower at 12.70-13.20 cents per pound. Sunflower Crude Oil 60 points lower at 14.70 cents per pound.
