DIRECT EXAMINATION OF NANAMI, Toshio by Mr. Blakeney

- 20,208

 The witness stated that he lived in Shizuoka Prefecture and identified Exhibit 2441 as his affidavit, and certified that with one correction of a date the affidavit was true and correct.
- 20,209 The affidavit stated * the witness became aide-decamp to MINAMI on December 26, 1933, MINAMI then being Military Advisor. On December 10, 1934 when MINAMI became Commander of the Kwantung Army, the witness as a major accompanied him to Manchukuo and remained there until May 6, 1936, when MINAMI resigned and returned to Japan.

On April 2, 1934 MINAMI called on the special envoys from Manchukuo, Cheng Hsiao-Hsu and Hsi Hsia, who were officially visiting in Japan. He paid a return call to these envoys. He went with him and was able to meet them. At that time MINAMI took with him a letter that had been sent to him as War Minister by Pu-Yi in 1931 and asked Cheng * to judge whether it was Pu-Yi's true handwriting. After examining it, Cheng assured him that it was and MINAMI asked him to write a certificate.

On April 3 about 1:00 PM the witness called on Cheng at the Imperial Hotel to receive this letter. Cheng took out the letter which had been left with him and wrote in his presence at the end of the letter - the Emperor's own handwriting - and signed it February 20, 1934 (according to the lunar calendar). The witness received it and returned it to MINAMI.

- This letter, Exhibit 278A, stated that the government of China, through wrongful measures toward the Eastern Frovinces, has opened hostilities against a friendly country. Therefore, he had sent TOYAMA, his tutor, to Japan to convey a message of sympathy to MINAMI.
- To his regret, twenty years had passed since his dynasty had turned over the reins of government to the HAN 20,213 race. It had no desire that chaos should increase. * To establish stability in East Asia it is imperative for China and Japan to collaborate and assume common responsibility. If they be half-hearted in removing the obstacles, no end of alarming events would arise and this would only result in bringing the Communists in position of influence. There is grave concern over the situation. He consequently hoped that the people would unite and strive to cope with the situation.

- to Japan. I was a Colonel when the Pacific War came to an end.
- 3. On April 2nd, 1934 General Minami Called on the special envoys from Manchoukuo, Mr. Cheng Hsiao-Hsu and Mr. Hsi Hsia who were on an official trip to Japan and were staying at the Imperial Hotel. His visit was to pay a return call to the envoys who had called on the General at his residence whilst he was absent. I accompanied the General as usual and was able to meet the envoys. On that occasion, General Minami took with him a letter that had been sent to him by Pu-Yi in 1931 when the General was Minister of War and asked Mr. Cheng Hsiao-Hsu to judge whether it was the true hand writing of Pu-Yi or not. After looking at it earnestly, Mr. Cheng assured that it was his true hand writing. General Minami asked him to write a certificate for it before he took leave of Mr. Cheng.
- 4. On the next day, April 3rd, (February 20th of the Lunar calendar) at about one oclock in the afternoon, I again called on Mr. Cheng at the Imperial Hotel to receive the above letter by order of General Minami. (It was written on a piece of Yellow Silk cloth) Mr. Cheng was waiting for my call, took out the letter which had been left with him previously and solemnly wrote in my presence at the end of the letter, "The Emperior's own hand writing" and signed "February 20th, 1934," "Cheng Hsiao-Hsu," and he carefully

handed it to me. I therefore received it and returned it to General Minami.
