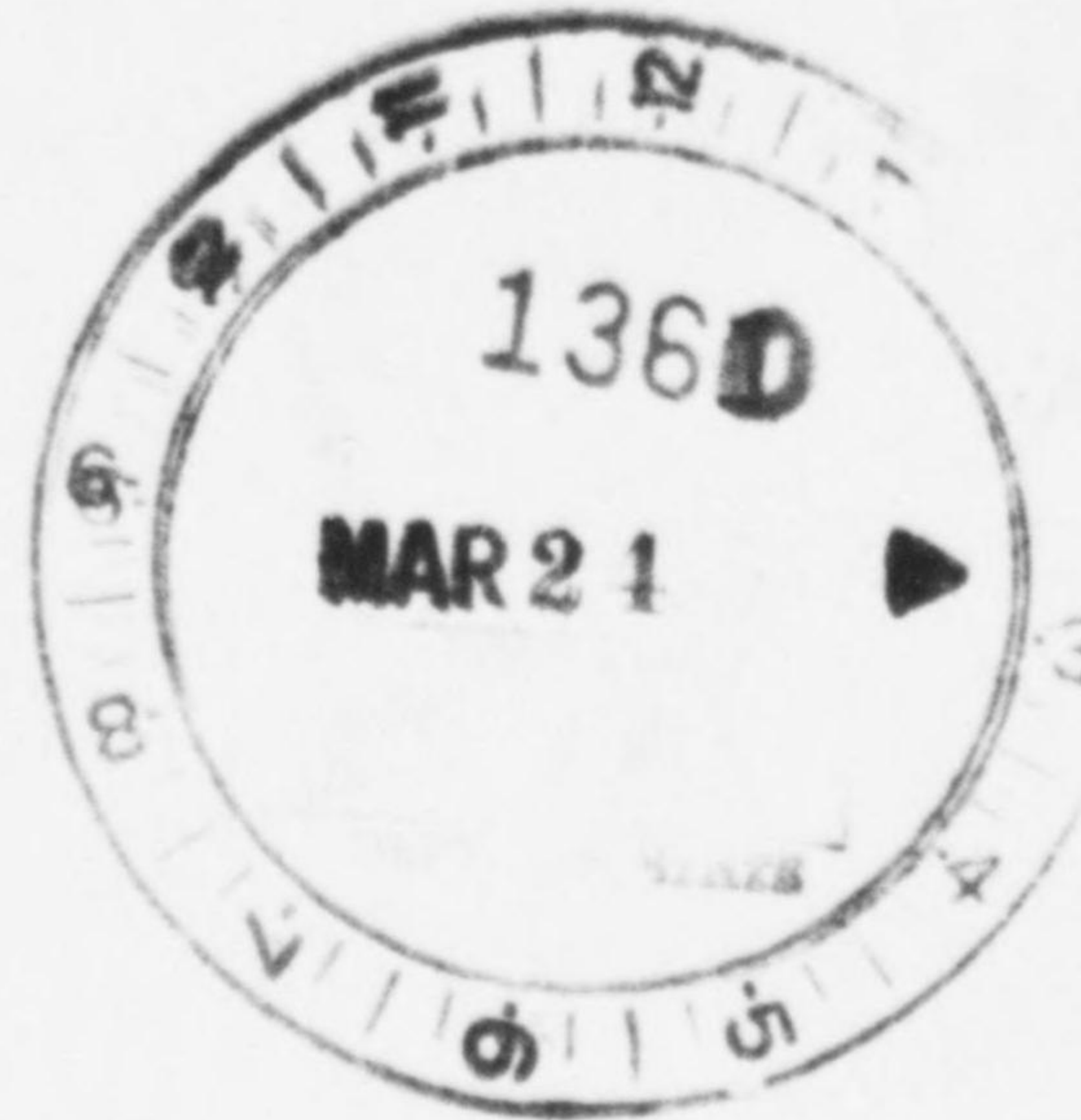

This is in further reference to your letter addressed to Mr. Norfleet dated February 21, 1947, with which you enclosed a copy of a telegram from SCAP suggesting a change in the rate for telegraphic messages between Japan and the United States.

As you may know, the Commission on March 12, 1947, ordered that an investigation be instituted in the matter of charges for communications service between the United States and overseas and foreign points. Hearings in this proceeding are scheduled to commence on April 14, 1947. Accordingly, it would seem desirable to defer action on SCAP's request for the time being.

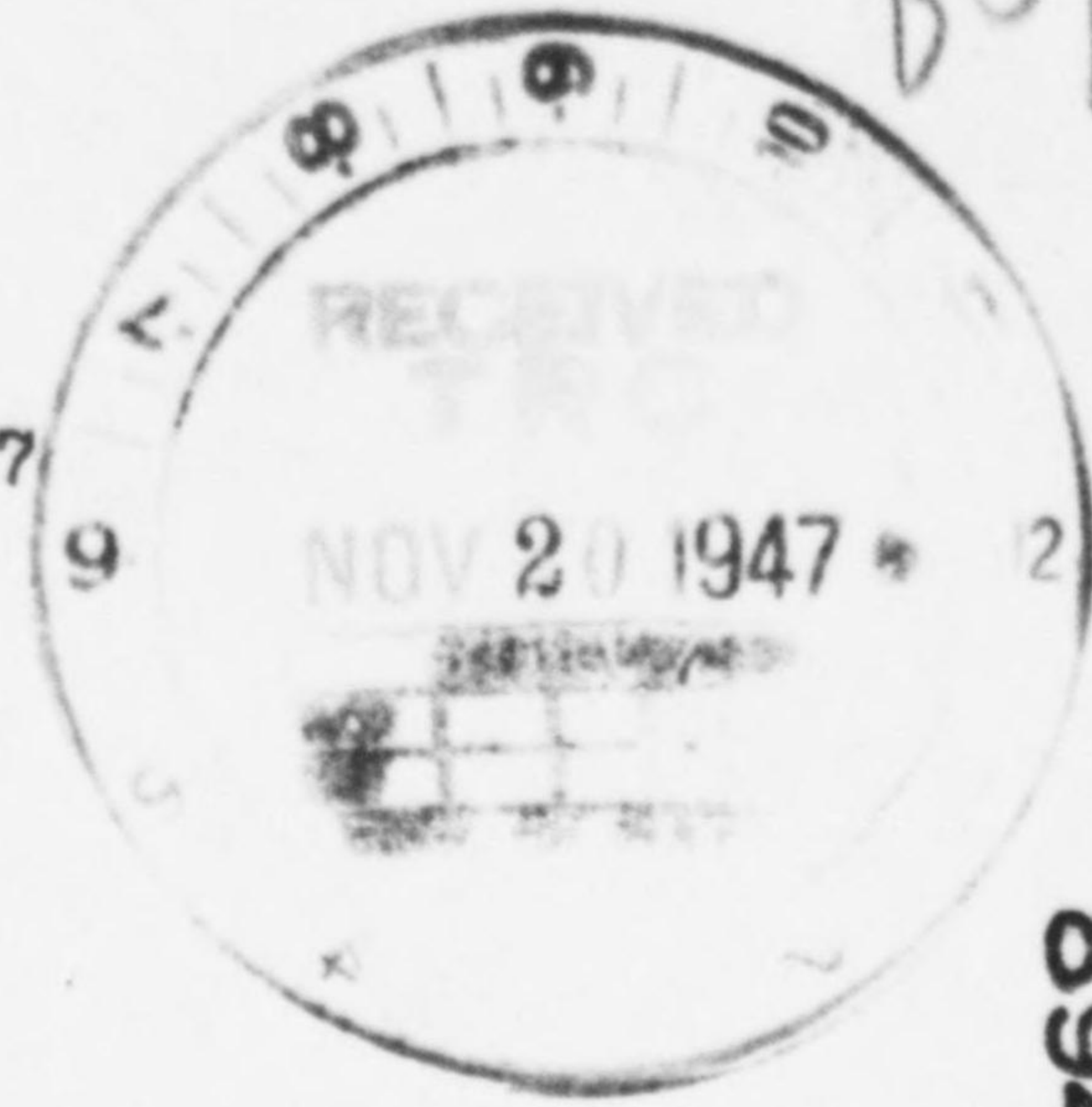
