Explanation of the Articles of the Calendar.

These pages are calculated for Toronto and Quebec, and for ordinary purposes will serve with sufficient accuracy for every city in Canada.

MOON'S PHASES.—This Table gives the times for the two meridians when the moon passes the geocentric longitudes of 0°, 90°, 180° and 270° east of the sun. It gives also the times of her greatest and least distance from the earth.

TWILIGHT.—In this table are given the times at which twilight begins in the morning and ends in the evening, *i. e.*, the times when the sun's centre is 18° below the horizon.

GREATEST ELONGATION OF THE POLE STAR.—This column gives the greatest azimuth of the Pole Star east or west from the meridian as observed at a place in latitude 45°. When the greatest elongation corresponding to any other latitude is required, the number given in the column should be corrected by means of the following table.

The 1st correction for the degrees of latitude is to be subtracted from the greatest elongation given in the calendar, or added to it, according as the degrees of latitude are less or greater than 45°.

The 2nd correction, which is always additive, is found by multiplying the number given in the third line of the table by the number of minutes in the latitude.

Thus for latitude 43° 20'... 1st correction = -4' 5"	2nd correction + 2.0 × 20 = + 40"

THE PLANETS.—The times of rising and setting of the five chief planets are calculated for Toronto, and are corrected for refraction. The times of culmination, although computed for the meridian of Toronto, will serve approximately for the whole of Canada. The meridian zenith distances, being designed merely to aid in finding the planets, have been given only to the nearest tenth of a degree, as seen from the latitude of Toronto.

When the planetary day is shorter than the mean solar day, and commences soon after the midnight of the preceding day, the planet will sometimes arrive a second time on the meridian before the expiration of the actual civil day. From analogous causes a planet will sometimes rise twice or set twice in the same civil day. When two culminations occur in the same day, or two risings or settings, the times of both are registered.

The times of the SUN'S RISING AND SETTING are given for the upper limb, and are corrected for refraction both for Toronto and Quebec.

The civil times both for the rising and setting of the Moon's centre are given for every day for Toronto and Quebec.

The MOON'S MERIDIAN ZENITH DISTANCES are given to the nearest tenth of a degree for Toronto. They are not corrected for parallax or refraction.

The column SUN ON MERIDIAN gives the time that a watch should shew when the shadow of a sun dial is on the noon mark.

MOON'S AGE.—This column shews to the nearest tenth of a day the Moon's age at Toronto Noon.

The column, MOON ON THE MERIDIAN, gives the mean time at which the moon's centre passes the meridian of Toronto, when in the column headed Moon's rising or setting or Moon on meridian the letters A.M. occur, unaccompanied by any number; they denote that the numbers given for the succeeding days relate to the morning, and those for the preceding days to the afternoon, but that the Moon does not rise or set or cross the meridian (as the case may be) on that day.

The column, UPPER TRANSIT across the meridian, gives the time of the rest of the year.

The four last columns give the time at which the preceding upper transit occurs.

From the time of sunrise, by adding or subtracting the longitude, the instant of sunrise or sunset is obtained.

From the times of sunrise and sunset, and by adding or subtracting the longitude, the times of daybreak and twilight are obtained.

To ascertain whether a star is above or below the horizon, subtract the declination from the latitude, or add it to the latitude, and the remainder will be the height of the star above or below the horizon.

The column, UPPER TRANSIT OF POLE STAR shows for every day the mean time at which the Pole Star makes its upper transit across the meridian of Toronto. It passes in the morning from April 9 to October 9, and in the afternoon for the rest of the year. On October 9 there will be a second transit, occurring at 11h. 57m. 4s. p.m.

The four last columns, although computed for Toronto, will serve with sufficient accuracy for the whole of Canada.

The time at which the lower transit of the Pole Star occurs may be found by adding 11 h. 58 m. 2 s. to the time of its preceding upper transit.

From the time of the upper transit of the pole star may be found the time of its greatest western or eastern elongation, by adding or subtracting the constants given in the annexed Table.

Star Table.

From the times of the upper transit of the Pole Star may be derived, with the aid of the following table, the times of elongation, and of the rising and setting of the principal fixed stars, as seen from the parallel of 45° north latitude. To ascertain when any star found in the following table will be on the meridian, add the number in the left-hand column of figures to the preceding meridian transit of the pole star given in the calendar. To find the time of rising of a star, subtract the number opposite to it in the right-hand column of figures from the time of its meridian passage. For the setting of a Star, add the same number to the time of its meridian passage. Those stars marked (.....) revolve in a circle of perpetual apparition, and do not rise or set at places in and to the north of latitude 45°.

Eclipses.

In the year 1866 there will be three Eclipses of the Sun, and two of the Moon.

I.—A partial eclipse of the Sun, March 16, 1866, invisible in Canada.

II.—A total eclipse of the Moon, March 30, 1866, visible in Canada.

The first contact with the shadow occurs at 98° from the northernmost point of the Moon's limb towards the east and the last contact at 53° towards the west; in each case for direct image. The magnitude of the eclipse (Moon diameter = 1) 1.520.

III.—A partial eclipse of the Sun April 14, 1866, invisible in Canada

IV.—A total eclipse of the Moon, September 23-24, 1866, invisible in Canada.

V.—A partial eclipse of the Sun, October 8, 1866, visible in part of Canada.

From a point in or near Quebec, in latitude 46° 20.2' N., and longitude 4h 44m 48s W., a partial eclipse is visible.

First contact occurs October 8, 10h 50.4m A.M.

At Toronto, latitude 43° 39.4' N. and longitude 5h 17m 33s W. no eclipse will be visible. The nearest approach of the centres of the Sun and Moon will occur at 10h 52m 7s a.m., Toronto mean civil time, when a space of two seconds of arc (2'') will intervene between the limbs of the two bodies. The point of approximate contact is 27° to the east of the northernmost point of the Sun's limb.

The mean temperature of the year 1864 was 44° 70, or 0° 163 in excess of the average of 25 years. The deviation of the monthly means above or below their respective averages, and irrespective of sign, had an average amplitude of 1° 33; thus indicating a year of unusually equable temperature, the average amplitude in twenty-five years being 2° 33. The highest temperature was observed on August 8th, when the thermometer marked 94° Fah., and the lowest on 17th February, when -15° was recorded, giving a range of 109°.

The warmest day of the year was June 25th, having a mean temperature of 81° 77, and the coldest day February 17th, with a mean temperature of -4° 62.

The mean deviations of temperature in the four seasons, with their proper signs, were: -0° 33 in Winter; +0° 79 in Spring; +1° 27 in Summer; and -0° 60 in Autumn.

The yearly range of the Barometer was 1.656, or 0.124 below the average of the past nine years. The yearly mean pressure was the lowest recorded during the past eighteen years, and was under the average .6637. The highest pressure, 30.327, was noted at 10 a.m. on 9th December—the lowest, 28.671, at 2 p.m. on 4th November.

As regards rain and snow, there was, on the whole year, an excess amounting to 0.636 inches of water. An excess occurred in Winter, Spring, and Autumn—the total precipitation exceeding the average by 1.136 inches in Winter, 1.788 inches in Spring, and 0.186 inches in Autumn. In Summer, the rain was deficient as compared with the average by 2.465 inches. This deficiency was not much greater than that of the summer of 1863; but the distribution among the three summer months was very different in the two years, for while in the summer of 1863 there was a moderate deficiency in each month, the rain in June, 1864, was less than one-fifth, and in July little over one-third of the average fall; that of August being above the average in the ratio of 5 to 3 nearly.

The number of nights possible to Aurora during the year was 188, as follows:—In January, 11; February, 11; March, 15; April, 10; May, 12; June, 24; July, 19; August, 12; September, 14; October, 11; November, 9; and December, 10. Number of Auroras observed 34—distributed over the year as follows:—In January, 0; February, 4; March, 2; April, 4; May, 3; June, 5; July, 3; August, 6; September, 4; October, 2; November 1; December, 0.

Mean elasticity of aqueous vapour was, in January: .110; February, .119; March, .133; April, .194; May, .233; June, .280; July, .473; August, .516; September, .347; October, .248; November, .182; December, .121. Mean for the year being .263. Average for the past seven years being .260.

The average lowest monthly mean of cloudiness in column (2) is the least of the twelve monthly means derived from each from twelve years, and does not include the least months in each year, as these fall differently in recent years. This explains why the highest minimum column (4) should be less than the average minimum. The average value of the greatest as well as of the least monthly means of the several elements, and given in column (2), are similarly obtained, and therefore do not necessarily lie between the numbers in columns (3) and (4). In the case of the warmest days, or the highest temperatures in each year, and other analogous quantities, the averages in column (2) are derived from the corresponding elements in each year, independently of the time of their occurrence, and must of necessity lie between the numbers in columns (3) and (4).

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PROGRESS OF POPULATION IN CANADA.

Quebec, in 1622, fourteen years after its commencement, is said to have contained only 70 persons, exclusive of those attached to the military and religious establishments.

In 1640, the Governor states the non-military population of the whole Province was about 700.

In 1660, the number in the Province was 3,418 souls, of whom 1,344 were capable of bearing arms.

In addition to the above there were about 700 persons scattered through the Province, and in 1670 the Governor placed the whole population at 9,180.

In 1679, when the population was 9,400, the births were 64, or 1 in 23, and the deaths 85, or 1 in 110; there were 6 marriages (132), or 1 in 71 married.

Between 1675 and 1685, the quantity of beaver sent to France was 895,381 lbs.; about as much more found its way through the British colonies. In the trade returns of these years are mentioned two articles now unknown to our commerce, capillare and ginseng.

1684.—There was a grand review at Fort Frontenac, at which were assembled nearly 1,000 Indian warriors, from the immediate neighbourhood. At the same time there were said to be 1,000 Indians, 6 Frenchmen and 2 Jesuits in the Indian castle of Cognawaga, and a large number of Canac Sadagh (Lake of Two Mountains). There were no encampments at La Galette (Prescott), Oun' dakoni (Sanoque), Gannlons (Napinee), Gannersaki (mouth of the Trent), and Ganalchesklagon (Port Hope).

1685.—M. Dongan (Intendant) rated the population at 12,000. In this he is evidently wrong, as the census of 1686, under M. de Nonville, made it only 12,373.

1687.—The population amounted to less than 10,000. In the spring of this year an immense herd of walrus came up the river St. Lawrence, and a large number were taken near Quebec.

1688.—Mr. Cox, of Carolina, endeavoured to form an English settlement in Canada, but failed, as did also his son, who made a similar attempt in 1725. In this year were enrolled in the militia 2,730 men-at-arms, of whom Quebec furnished 300.

1706.—M. Randot estimates the population at 20,000.

1714.—M. de Pouchetrain reports that there were 4,484 men capable of bearing arms.

We have no returns from 1714 till 1719, when a census was taken, as also in 1720, 1721 and 1734.

1735.—The Governor reports 10,000 fighting men in the Province, including 32 companies of regulars.

1740.—A few years before this date the King of France given license to a company to work the mines at Three Rivers, had loaned them £20,000 for twenty years without interest, and, still further to encourage them, had undertaken to build two ships of war annually at Quebec.

1743.—The French had two vessels of 60 tons each on the Ontario.

1744.—Census taken. Population return never reached again, and of course is not in the documents.

1748.—Population very nearly 50,000.

1750.—There were at this period 58 well peopled parishes between Quebec and Montreal, viz., 20 on the north and a like number on the south shore of the St. Lawrence. The population was thought to have reached 53,000.

It was either in this or the preceding year that M. M. De La Jonquière proposed to build a fort at Toronto, which he proposed to call Ronville, after his friend the minister of marine. This fort was intended to counteract the influence of the British fort at Chouagnon (Oswego). M. De La Jonquière also proposed that a small number of galley slaves should be annually sent to Canada.

1754.—A general census was taken this year, with the following results:

The Quebec list contained 274 officials, priests and nuns; 100 first-class merchants, 200 master tradesmen, 400 less wealthy traders, 600 carters, 1,200 women, and 5,320 children and servants.

In 1754, no snow fell in Canada after the 20th January, and a great death raged towards the end of the year: the price of provisions rose to an enormous pitch.

Immediately before the English invasion, M. De Montcalm, in a letter to Paris, states the whole population of Canada was less than 82,000. This is evidently an error, unless he included all the military and Indians. The English, deriving their information from spies, rated the population at 60,000. This agrees pretty nearly with the report of M. Bouchette, who made it 65,000. It is a matter of regret that no record has been kept of the population at the time of the capitulation; neither was there of those who, under sanction of the treaty, went to France. We have of course the military return, which gives the number who left in the English fleet, viz.: officers, 230; soldiers, 2,425; women and servants, 507. Immediately after the capitulation, more than 500 deserted.

1763.—An attempt was made to rouse the Canadians to rebellion, but the letters and papers were intercepted. On Saturday, July 2nd, the Chevallier Chaussegros De Levy was presented to the King (George III.), in full court, at St. James', being the first of His Majesty's new subjects who had that honour.

1769.—The trade of Canada with England employed 34 ships, with 408 men. The gross amount of imports and exports was upwards of £220,000 sterling.

1778.—The Count Estaing published a proclamation, imploring the Canadians to shake off their allegiance to England. From 1763 to this date, upwards of 7000 persons were supposed to have emigrated from Canada.

1783.—Population estimated at 113,000, 10,000 of whom were in what is now Upper Canada. This year the immigration of the U. E. Loyalists commenced.

1784.—This year a census was taken of the three Governments of Quebec, Montreal and Three Rivers. The following was the result:

Of the above the parish and city of Quebec gave 6,472. This census is valuable as it gives the following Agricultural items, of which it is the first we have:—Bushels of grain sown in the spring, 383,349; horses, 30,096; oxen, 22,094; cows, 44,201; young cattle, 32,200; sheep, 84,066 hogs, 70,460; fowls, 10,836.

1780.—In this year the mercantile population increased very much. The imports amounted to £325,116 sterling, and the exports to £343,263. Amongst the latter were 103,824 minots of wheat, 10,476 bbls. of flour, £187 worth

In 1792, immediately after the separation of the Provinces, the Lower was divided into 21 counties, with after-divisions as counties:

The figures are those given by the census of 1825; if, then, we set down 230,000 as the number of inhabitants in 1792, the increase between the two periods will be about 84 per cent., or rather more than 2 1/2 per cent. annually.

In 1820, it was proposed to subdivide the Province into 38 electoral divisions. No measure was carried into effect till 1831, when the 40 counties above given were formed, which division remained in force till the union, in 1841, when the number was reduced to 40, or rather 38. On the increase of the representation from 42 to 65 members for each section, the Lower Canada counties were extended to 60. These frequent subdivisions make comparison of local increase a very difficult matter.

1831.—Mr. Bouchette, taking the census of 1827, 471,876, adds, for natural increase, 59,575, or about 3 to 100; for immigration, 23,000; for outposts, 1,600, in all, 561,060. A census being taken, however, gave only 511,922.

1836.—The estimate for this year is founded on a return laid before Parliament by the Roman Catholic Bishop of Quebec, which showed that the Roman Catholics numbered 501,224; and as the proportions of the denominations had been well fixed, the formula taken to express the population was 512,827, being pretty near the average rate of increase, 2.38 per annum.

1844.—The rate of increase between these two periods is very high, under the circumstances. The outbreak in the district of Montreal must have very materially thinned the population, and certainly the transfer of the Government departments from the Upper to the Lower Province scarcely balanced the loss.

* The number of British-born subjects then in the Province was about 15,000.

1848.—The estimate of this year is worthy of notice, showing how near the truth those acquainted with fundamental laws of increase, when, as in Lower Canada, not acted upon by exterior circumstances, as I who have knowledge of the people under consideration, can see Lower Canada having neglected to take a census in 1848 and as no little interest was felt in the relative population of the two sections, it became necessary for the Board of Registration and Statistics, with the sanction of the Government, to endeavour to arrive at some approximate calculation. For this purpose the aid of two gentlemen, well acquainted with the subject, and whose judgment could be relied on (the Hon. E. P. Tache and J. Cauchon), was sought, and most kindly afforded, as was also that of Mr. Tache. These three gentlemen determined to adopt a different basis of calculation, with the following result:

Lower Canada, taking the several periods, gives the following averages:

1825 to 1827, 5.60 per annum; 1827 to 1831, 2.12; to 1836, 2.38; 1836 to 1844, 2.57; 1844 to 1848, 2.86; to 1852, 3.91; 1852 to 1861, 2.70. If we take the number for 1825 to be correct (423,630), we have an increase between that and 1831 of 687,030, being 162.39 per cent. which will represent an increasing ratio of something under 4 per cent., or, allowing for uncertain increases in the periods, of 3.13, being little below the average of the United States.

In Upper Canada the increase has been very irregular. Its highest averages were from 1822 to 1835; it rose immediately after the rebellion, in 1836. Our late average, say from 1856 to 1865, have been small.

COURT OF CHANCERY.—This Court has the like jurisdiction as the Court of Chancery in England, in cases of fraud, accident, trusts, executors, administrators, co-partnerships, account, mortgages, awards, dower, infants, idiots, lunatics and their estates, waste, specific performance, discovery, and to prevent multiplicity of suits, staying proceedings at law prosecuted against equity and good conscience, and may decree the issue, repeal or avoidance of letters patent, and generally the like powers which the Court of Chancery in England possesses to administer justice in all cases in which there is no adequate remedy at law. PRACTICE COURT AND CHAMBERS.—One of the Common Law Judges holds a Court during each Term, called the "Practice Court," for hearing matters relating to the adding or justifying bail, discharging insolvent debtors, administering oaths, hearing and determining matters on motion, and making rules and orders in causes and business depending in either of said law courts. Chambers are held each day in Common Law and Chancery by one of the judges of the said courts, for such business relating to suits therein as may be transacted by a single judge out of court. Clerk, Common Law—Wm. B. Heward. Clerk, Chancery—Thomas Black.

HEIRS AND DEVISEE COURT.—Commissioners, the Judges of the Superior Courts, and such other persons as may be appointed by commission under the Great Seal. Their duties are to determine claims to lands in Upper Canada, for which no patent has issued from the Crown in favour of the proper claimants, whether as heirs, devisees or assignees. Sitings at Toronto, first Monday in January and July in each year. Clerk of Commissioners, W. B. Heward.

COUNTY COURTS.—Presided over by a resident Judge in each county. Their jurisdiction extends to all personal actions where the debt or damages claimed do not exceed £50; and to all suits relating to debt, covenant or contract, where the amount is ascertained by the acts of the parties or signature of the defendant, to £100; and to all bail bonds and recognizances of bail given in the County Court, to any amount; but not to cases involving the title to lands, validity of wills, or actions for libel, slander, criminal, or seduction. An appeal lies to either of the Superior

Courts of Law. These Courts also possess equity powers, to the amount of £50, subject to an appeal to Chancery.

SURROGATE COURTS.—The jurisdiction of these Courts relates to all testamentary matters and causes, and to the granting or revoking of probate of wills, and letters of administration of the effects of deceased persons having estate or effects in Upper Canada, and all matters arising out of or connected with the grant or revocation of probate or administration, subject to an appeal to the Court of Chancery. The County Judges are also Judges of the Surrogate Courts. Surrogate Clerk, Sir J. L. Robinson, Bart.

COURTS OF QUARTER SESSIONS.—Chairman, the County Judge in each county, who, with one or more Justices of the Peace, holds a Court of Quarter Sessions in his county four times a year for trials by jury in cases of felony and misdemeanor, but treason and capital felonies are exempted from their jurisdiction.

RECORDERS' COURTS.—In the Cities of Toronto, Hamilton, London, Kingston, and Ottawa, the Recorders' Court takes the place of the County Sessions, the Justices for Counties having no jurisdiction in the Cities—the care of which is confided to the Recorder, Mayor, Aldermen and Police Magistrate of each. Sessions held first Monday in March, June and September, and third Monday in December. Recorders—George Duggan, Toronto; James O'Reilly, Kingston; John E. Start, Hamilton; William Horton, London; J. B. Lewis, Ottawa.

INSOLVENT DEBTORS' COURTS.—By the "Insolvent Act of 1864," 27 & 28 Victoria, cap. 57, passed on the 30th June, 1864, provision is made "for the settlement of the estates of insolvent debtors, for giving effect to arrangements between them and their creditors, and for the punishment of fraud." In Lower Canada, this enactment applies to traders only. In Upper Canada, to all persons whether traders or non-traders. In these courts, the county court judge in each county presides—the only appointments made in pursuance of this statute being those of "official assignees," who are to be nominated "by the Board of Trade at any place, or the council thereof, within the county or district in which such Board of Trade exists, or in any county or district adjacent thereto in which there is no Board of Trade." This important statute is proving a great boon to the community, in enabling parties who from unavoidable circumstances find themselves paralyzed by hopeless liability to obtain relief, and recommence business.

DIVISION COURTS.—For the summary disposal of cases by a Judge; but a jury of five persons may be demanded in certain cases. Their jurisdiction extends to actions of debt or contract amounting to £25; injuries or torts to personal chattels amounting to £10; but not to actions for gambling debts, liquors drunk in a tavern, or notes of hand given therefor, ejectment, title to land, &c., or any toll, custom or franchise, will or settlement, malicious prosecution, libel, slander, or libel, seduction or breach of promise, or actions against a J. P. for anything done by him in the execution of his office, if he objects to it. Courts are held once in two months in each division, or oftener, at the discretion of the Judge. The Divisions are established by the Courts of Quarter Sessions.

CLERK OF THE PROCESS.—For sealing and issuing Writs of Summons and other Writs in the Queen's Bench and Common Pleas (alternately)—Robt. Stanton, Assist. Clerk.—A. H. B. Wadsworth. The Deputy Clerks of the Crown in the several Counties are supplied with writs from Toronto, and re-issue the same in their respective counties.

Terms of the Courts.

APPEAL TERMS commence on the second Thursday next after Hilary, Easter and Michaelmas Terms.

LAJ TERMS.—Hilary begins first Monday in February, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week; Easter begins first Monday in May, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week; Trinity begins Monday next after 21st August, and ends on the Saturday of the ensuing week; Michaelmas begins third Monday in November and ends Saturday of the ensuing week. Long vacation from 1st July to 21st August.

CHANCERY TERMS.—Examination Terms—From 1st Tuesday of February to the Saturday after 2nd Tuesday of April; and from 1st Tuesday of September to the Saturday after 1st Tuesday of November. Hearing Terms—From 4th Monday in April until Saturday of the following week; and from 3rd Monday in November until Saturday of the following week. The Court also sits every Tuesday (except during the regular vacations) throughout the year, for hearing motions for Decrees, motions for or to dissolve special injunctions, and appeals from the reports of the Master or Deputy Masters. Long vacation from the 1st July to 21st August.

COUNTY COURT TERMS commence on the first Monday in Jan., April, July and Oct., and end the following Saturday.

LETTER RATES.

Letters posted in Canada addressed to any place within the Province pass, if prepaid, for 5 cents per 1/2 oz., but if posted unpaid such letters are charged 7 cents per 1/2 oz.

On Letters to Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and Prince Edward's Island, the rate is 5 cents per 1/2 oz., with optional prepayment.

The rate on Letters to the United Kingdom is, by Canadian Packet, not exceeding 1/2 oz. - - - - - 12 1/2 cts. Exceeding " and not exceeding 1 oz. - - - - - 25 " Exceeding " 1 oz. and not " 2 oz. - - - - - 60 " and so on, increasing two rates of postage for each additional ounce.

and by Cunard Packet, 17 cents per 1/2 oz., &c. Letters for the United Kingdom must be prepaid, or they will be charged a fine of 6d. sterling on delivery.

Letters for British Colonies and Possessions beyond Sea, and Foreign Countries, via England, must be prepaid. The rate on Letters for the U. States, is 10 cents per 1/2 oz. " to Cuba - - - - - 20 cents per 1/2 oz.

There is a further charge on delivery of Letters addressed to British Columbia. Letters - - - - - 10 cents per 1/2 oz. Newspapers - - - - - 2 cents each.

MAILS FOR CANADA FROM ENGLAND.

Two Ocean Steamers carrying mails for Canada leave Liverpool in each week, viz.: a Canadian Packet on every Tuesday, via Derry on Friday, sailing to Quebec in summer and Portland in Winter, by which the Postage rate 6d. stg. per 1/2 oz.; and a Cunard Packet every Saturday, via Cork on Sunday, bringing Mails for Canada, alternately to Boston and New York, by which the Postage rate to Canada is 8d. stg. per 1/2 oz.

The British Post Office forwards letters to Canada by the next packet sailing after the letter is posted, unless the letters bear a special direction—"By Canadian Packet" or "By British Packet"—and in that case they are kept over for the Packet designated. "By Canadian Mail" is not a distinct superscription; for any Mail for Canada is a Canadian Mail," by whatever Packet forwarded.

REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.

Persons posting Letters containing value, should be obliged to require them to be registered, and to obtain from the Post Master a Certificate of receipt for Registration.

The charge for Registration, in addition to the Postage, as follows, viz.:

Letters to any other place in Canada, or British North America - - - - - 2 cents. Letters for the United States - - - - - 5 " Letters for the United Kingdom - - - - - 12 1/2 " Letters for British Colonies or Possessions, sent via England - - - - - 25 "

Letters for France and other Foreign Countries, via France, an amount equal to the postage rate. Both the postage charge and registration fee must in all cases be prepaid.

Registration is not an absolute guarantee against the scurrage or loss of a Letter; but a Registered Letter to be traced when an Unregistered Letter cannot, and the stamp and delivery or non-delivery can be proven. A Registered Letter is thus secured against many of the

casualties which, from incorrect address, forgetfulness of the receiver, or other error, may affect an Unregistered Letter.

MISCELLANEOUS CHARGES.

The charge on Parcels by the Parcel Post, which is limited to places within the Province, is 25 cts. per lb. (with 3 cts. additional if Registered.)

One cent per oz., payable in advance by Postage stamp, is the rate on Printed Circulars (Printed Circulars, if sent in envelopes, whether sealed or unsealed, are liable to printed postage), Prices Current, Hand Bills and other Printed Matter of a like character, and on Books, bound or unbound, when posted at a Canadian Post Office addressed to any place in Canada, British North America generally, or the United States.

The postage upon Prices Current addressed to the United Kingdom is two cents each, which must be prepaid by postage stamps, or they will be sent to the Dead Letter Office to be returned to the sender.

These rates must invariably be prepaid on transmission from Canada. Photographs, provided they are not upon glass or in cases containing glass, may be forwarded to Great Britain, &c., at the Book rate of postage. Book Packets addressed to the United Kingdom may be registered on payment of the ordinary registration fee, viz., 12 1/2 cents in addition to the postage.

NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

Newspapers published in Canada may be sent by Post from the office of publication, addressed to any place in Canada, at the following rates, if paid quarterly in advance by either the publisher at the post office where the papers are posted, or by the subscriber at the delivering post office:

When the above rates are not paid in advance by either publisher or subscriber, such Papers are charged one cent each on delivery.

TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS.

Transient Newspapers—that is to say, Canadian Newspapers posted otherwise than from the office of publication, and American or British papers posted or re-posted in Canada, must be prepaid 1 cent each, by postage stamp, or they cannot be forwarded—except only British Newspapers distributed to regular subscribers by Canadian Booksellers or News Agents—such papers pass free as they would do if received in the Canadian Packet Mails.

NEWSPAPERS BY MAIL FROM ENGLAND OR UNITED STATES.

Newspapers received from England by the Canadian Packet Mails are delivered free.

Newspapers from England by the Cunard Packet Mails are charged 2 cents each on delivery. (This is the American transit charge.)

United States Newspapers, brought by mail into Canada, are charged one cent each on delivery.

PERIODICAL PUBLICATIONS.

The rate on all Periodicals, other than Newspapers, passing by mail in Canada, save such as may be addressed to or received from the United Kingdom, and such as are exempted from postage by Statute, will henceforth be one

THE CANADIAN LITERARY INSTITUTE is located at Woodstock, and is under the control of the Regular Baptist Denomination. It has three different departments, viz.: Primary, Higher and Theological, the average attendance at which consists of fully 100 students. The Primary School is attended by pupils over eleven years of age, who study the various branches of an ordinary English education. In the Higher Department a regular course of instruction is laid out for those whose means or other circumstances forbid to take a university course. Students are also prepared for the study of Theology, or for matriculation in Arts, Law or Medicine. The fees for attendance on these departments vary from \$20 to \$28 per year. In the Theological Department, attended by about 30 students, the tuition is gratis. GRAMMAR SCHOOLS.—Each of these Schools (which form the intermediate link between the Common Schools and the Universities) is managed by a Board of Trustees appointed jointly by the County and Town Councils. In cities, the Trustees are all appointed by the City Council, except where there is only one School in the county. The head master must be a graduate of a British or Colonial University, unless certificated and appointed before 18th September, 1865. Besides fees, local rates or contributions to the extent of half the government grant must be raised for the masters salary. The grant is payable to these schools only which attain a certain standard, and is based on the average attendance of pupils in the prescribed studies. An extra grant is provided for masters taking certain Meteorological observations and giving military instruction. Pupils attending these Schools are prepared for matriculation in the Universities. There were 95 Grammar Schools, with 5,599 pupils, in Upper Canada, in 1864.

COMMON SCHOOLS.—Each Township is divided into School Sections of a suitable extent for one School; and in each of these Sections three Trustees are elected to manage its School affairs. In cities, towns, and villages, the schools are managed by a Board of School Trustees, elected for the Municipality. There were 4,225 Common Schools, with 371,695 pupils, in Upper Canada, in 1864.

PUBLIC SCHOOL LIBRARIES.—Each School and Municipal Corporation, desirous of establishing Free Public Libraries, is aided by the Educational Department granting 100 per cent. on local appropriations, and supplying books from the Depository in connexion with the Department. Up to the end of Dec. 1864, about 897 Libraries had been established, with 382,007 volumes.

EDUCATIONAL MUSEUM.—Connected with the Educational Department is a Museum, containing specimens of School apparatus and furniture; a valuable collection of Italian, Dutch and Flemish Oil Paintings and Statuary casts and busts. The Museum is freely open to the public.

THE TOTAL NUMBER OF EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS of all kinds reported by the Educational Department as in operation in Upper Canada during 1864, was 4,595, attended by 385,722 pupils, and expending \$1,840,878 in their support. Under the superintendence of the Council of Public Instruction, Lower Canada.

The Institution is at present supported by appropriations of county councils for the maintenance and education of indigent deaf mutes and blind persons who reside in their respective counties. The cost of each pupil is \$140 per annum. Liberal provision for the mental and mechanical instruction of this class, it is expected, will be made during the next session of the Legislature. On every promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange, for \$5 and under, 1 cent; over \$25 to \$50, 2 cents; over \$50 \$100, 3 cents.
On every promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange, executed singly, for the first \$100, 3 cents; for every additional \$100, or fraction of a \$100, 3 cents.
On every draft or bill of exchange executed in duplicate, for the first \$100, 2 cents; for every additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 2 cents.
On every draft or bill of exchange executed in more than two parts, for each part for the first \$100, 1 cent; for every additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 1 cent.

The duty to be paid by stamps affixed at the time of making, upon which the signature or some integral portion of the instrument shall be written. The stamps to be affixed by the maker or drawer of the instrument, or if drawn out of the province by the acceptor or first indorser in the province. Penalty for neglect to affix stamps, \$100. Stamps in all cases to be defaced at the time of affixing the same, by writing or stamping the date thereon, and such stamp shall be held *prima facie* to have been affixed at the date stamped or written thereon, and if no date be so stamped or written thereon such adhesive stamp shall be of no avail.

ACT TO SECURE TO WIVES AND CHILDREN THE BENEFIT OF ASSURANCE ON THE LIVES OF THEIR HUSBANDS AND PARENTS.

[Passed in the Session of 1865.]

HEREAS it is expedient to permit persons to insure their lives for the benefit of their wives and children; and for Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enact as follows:

It shall be lawful for any person to insure his life for any term thereof, or for any definite period, for the benefit of his wife or of his wife and children, or of his wife and some or one of his children, or of his children, or for some or one of them, and to apportion the amount of the insurance money as he may deem proper where the insurance is effected for the benefit of more than one.

The said insurance may be effected either in the name of the person whose life is insured, or in the name of his wife, or of any other person (with the assent of such other person) as trustee; and the premium on any policy of insurance hereafter effected under this Act, shall be payable during the whole of the said person's life, or during the lesser period, by annual, half-yearly, quarterly, or monthly payments.

It shall be lawful, within one year after the passing of this Act, for any person by writing indorsed upon or attached to any policy of insurance on his life, which may be then effected and issued before the passing of this Act, to declare that such policy and insurance shall be for the benefit of his wife, or of his wife and children, or of his wife or some or one of his children, or of his children

only, or some or one of them; and to apportion the amount of the insurance money as he may deem proper, when the insurance is declared to be for the benefit of more than one.

4. When no apportionment is made in any policy or declaration as aforesaid, all parties interested in the said insurance shall be held to share equally in the same, and when it is stated in such policy or declaration that the insurance is for the benefit of the wife and children generally, or of the children generally without specifying their names, then the word "children" shall be held to mean all the children of the person whose life is insured, living at the time of his death, or whether by any other marriage or not.

5. Upon the death of the person whose life is insured, the insurance money due upon the policy shall be payable according to the terms of the policy or of the declaration as aforesaid, as the case may be, free from the claims of any creditor or creditors whomsoever.

6. Nothing contained in this Act shall be held or construed to restrict or interfere with the right of any person to effect or assign a policy for the benefit of his wife or children as at present allowed by law, nor shall it affect any assignment of any existing policy made before the passing of this Act, nor any action or proceeding pending at the time of the passing of this Act in any court of law or equity.
