7. Nagasaki Prefecture. On 11 December 1948 the first meeting to investigate the dispatch nurses was held in the Team Public Health Section and attended by the Regional Public Health Nurse, Team Labor Officer, Ken Labor section and two dispatch nurses. Each city and town in the prefecture has attempted to solve the problem on a local level. In Sasebo a union was formed under the Labor Stabilization Board. So far there was not been an opportunity to investigate this union. In Nagasaki City an Employment Exchange Fee-Charging Agency was set up by Miss Masue Yoshii and approved by the Labor Ministry 1 October 1948. This agency retains all the features of the old boss system. A report of further investigation of this agency was requested of Capt. Foltz, Team Labor Officer.

8. Conclusions: The dispatch nurses in each prefecture have been investigated by the Regional Public Health Nurse with the Team Labor Officer and Ken Labor Section being invited to attend the initial investigation. In all cases the Ken Labor Section was requested to continue the investigation and set up a registry in PESO for licensed dispatch nurses. In only a few prefectures has this request been complied with. The Labor Ministry has furthermore, approved the Union in Oita Prefecture based on a constitution which is wholly undesirable. It has also approved the Employment Agency in Nagasaki City which retains features presumably out-lawed by 8th Army O. D. 29. The Ken Labor Section in that prefecture has requested the agency to post a bond of \$10,000 when it should have been set at \$50,000 according to the Labor Ministerial Ordinance # 12, 29 December 1947. They, furthermore, made no mention of advising the agency of the additional annual license fee of \$10,000 as required under the same ordinance.

In most cases the Ken Labor Sections appear to have been delinquent in discharging their duties as regards this group of nurses and in guiding them along approved lines under 8th Army 0. D. 29 and 52, Shoku-Hatsu 655 and Labor Ministerial Ordinance #12. While this is a nursing problem and holds the interest of the Regional Public Health Nurse the final solution and settlement is in the hands of the Ken Labor Sections.


