

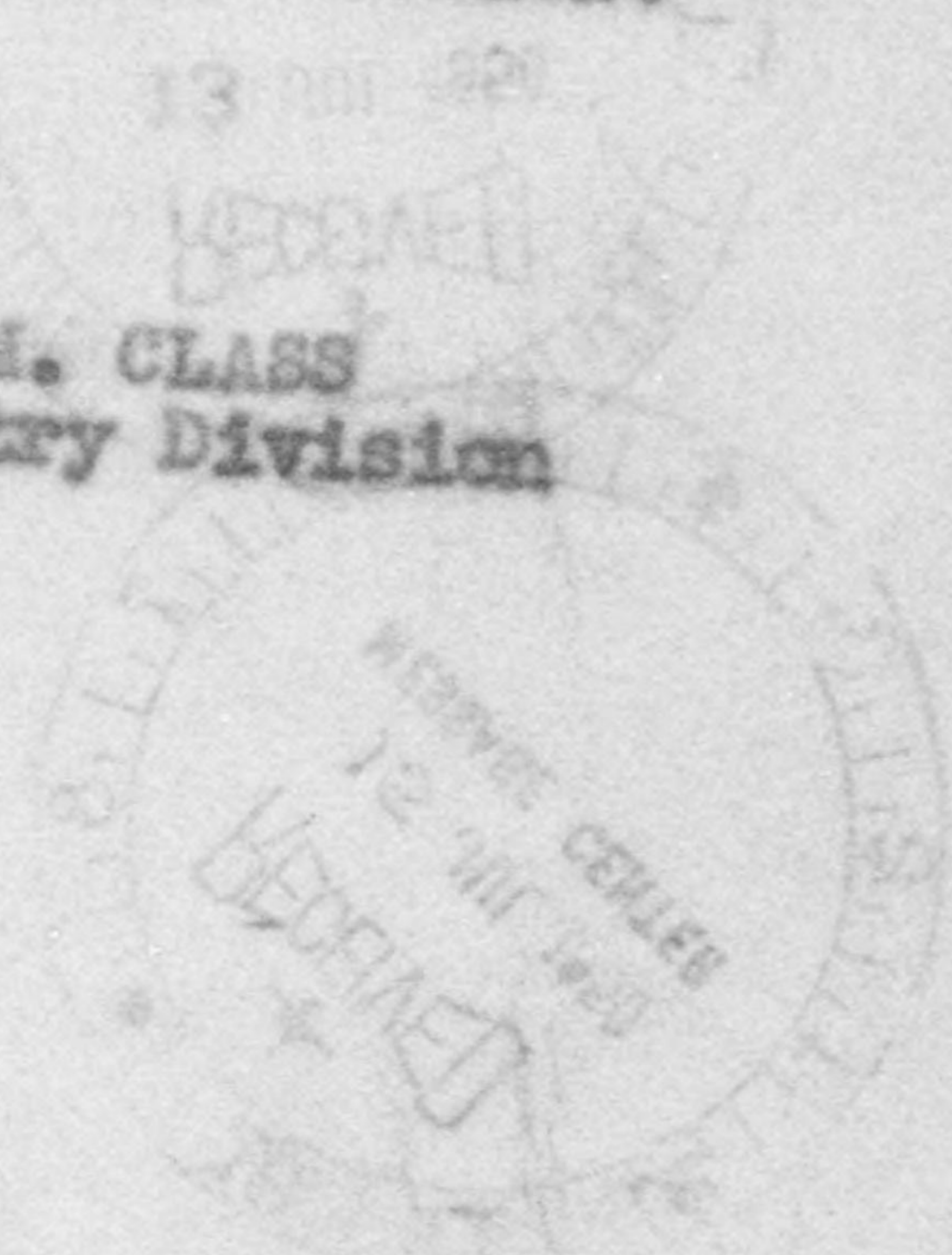

X. The reason why the preservation of the plant is petitioned:

a. The rehabilitation of the textile industry.

Since the establishment of the company in 1920 until the outbreak of the Sino-Japanese Hostilities, we had made and supplied Sakamoto's Cop-change Automatic Looms, Plain Looms, Preparing Machines to many spinning

and weaving factories in Japan.

Our Sakamoto's Cop-change Automatic Loom is the origin of looms of this type in Japan and as many as 60% of all the automatic looms installed in Japan are our Sakamoto's Looms.

This loom and its parts are patented and therefore no other makers have the right to manufacture them.

Many factories equipped with our automatic looms lost their equipment during the war, and even those that were fortunate enough to escape war damages are in a very poor operating condition due to the deterioration of the equipment caused by the absolute negligence of up-keeping during the war.

It is natural enough that the textile industrialists who are exerting their utmost in processing the imported cotton are very anxious to have their looms repaired or reconstructed and to get loom-parts.

The orders received from them during the period, from January 1946 to August 1947:

The permission for reconversion as well as for continuance of operation having been granted, we have so far been able to comply with their demands, which we now expect will increase a great deal with expected development of our textile industry accelerated by the recently granted credit.

We cannot help desiring that our plant may be exempted from reparation so that we may be able to use our plant equipment freely and continue to comply with their demands.

b. The production of looms for export.

Before the Pacific War, we had exported to China, Korea, British India, Netherland East India, Brazil, Argentina etc. our products which amounted to

and after the war, we have made 50 automatic looms by the order of the Board of Trade which are to be exported as collateral for Japan's imports.

Recently private foreign trade has been opened by the benevolence of the Allied Forces and we have also learned that the manufacture of 2,500 looms slated for export has been sanctioned. We do not know yet how

many of these looms we shall be ordered to make, but we do expect much in view of our past exports.

There have been enquiries for 500 silk and rayon automatic looms from Russia, we learned. We have received enquiries from Messrs. Fatell & Co., Ltd., Bombay for 1,000 automatic looms and 500 plain looms designating "Sakamoto's Loom".

We earnestly desire that our plant may be exempted from reparation so that we may be able to accept their orders and contribute towards the development of Japan's foreign trade.

c. The maintenance of technique and prevention of unemployment.

Special technique is necessary for the manufacture of looms which is only attainable by many years of experience and training. In spite of many difficulties we encountered during the war, we have fortunately succeeded in maintaining leading technical experts.

If our plant equipment be removed, not only these experts will be scattered and lost but also our 700 employees together with 1,500 dependents will lose their jobs aggravating the social uneasiness, we fear.

d. Re: Our plant equipment.

As mentioned previously, we have at our Takatsuka Plant 130 machines which had been dispersed to Nara Prefecture to be installed in our Yamato Plant where they were to be used for ammunition production and which were brought back in April 1946 for better custody.

These machines are not necessary for the manufacture of looms but other machines and equipment which we have had all the time at Takatsuka Plant are indispensable, and we earnestly desire these may be exempted from reparation.

e. Re: Change of number of machines requested to be exempted from reparation.

When we presented our original petition on Aug. 29, 1946, our plan was to attain the monthly production of 350 looms operating 322 machines of which 288 machines we have had since before the war and 34 machines we installed after the outbreak of the war. But the result of our past operation since the reconversion is roughly 150 looms, average monthly production with 380 operating machines.

This low production is attributable to the following reasons:

1. Less working hours - The workers used to work 12 hours a day but now due to union activities, they work only 8 hours a day under better working conditions.

2. Curtailment of production hour due to the poor power condition.
3. Irregularity of supply of coke and raw materials as well as their shortages.
4. Improvement of our products - We are now making some parts of looms with steel which used to be wooden before the war, in order to prevent twisting of looms. More labour and machines are required in this process.
5. Abandonment of sub-contract - We used to have about 30 % of our work done by sub-contractors, but we are now obliged to do almost all the work at our hands as most of them have been burnt out during the war.

562 machines mentioned in Paragraph J. are now requested to be exempted from reparation in order to attain the production aim of 350 looms per month conquering the above mentioned obstacles.

Our original petition carried as attachments plant-layouts, and recommendations from the ministry of commerce and industry, and from the prefectural government for exemption.

A subsequent petition from the ministry of commerce and industry was presented in November 1946.

We should be very much obliged if you would give this petition due and favourable consideration.

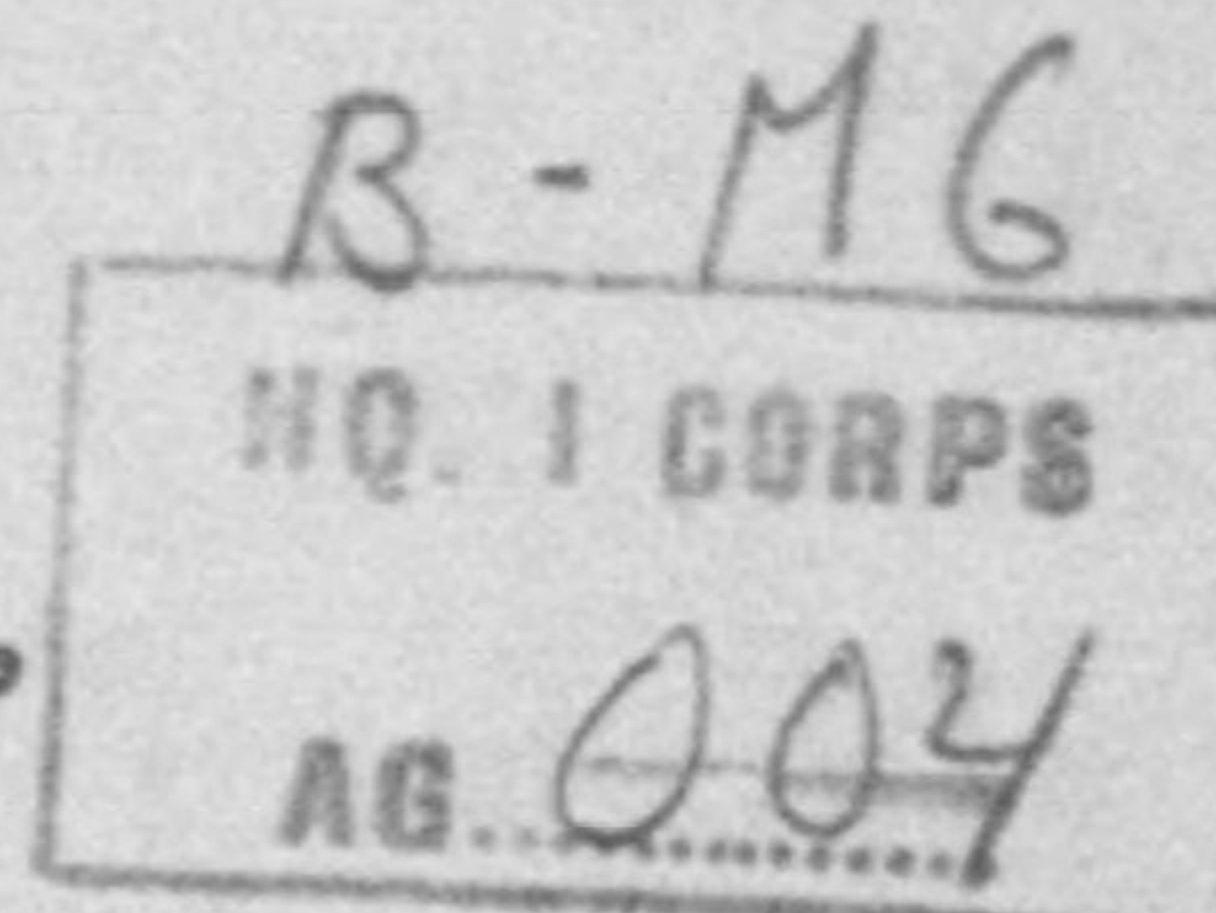

On the machine tool inventory of Enshu Shokki K.K., Takatsuka Plant, there are 130 items that were brought to this plant from Enshu Shokki K.K., Yamato Plant (Munitions, Inventory number 28-1) in 1946 prior to either plant's designation for reparations. Three other items are not on numbered inventory, so the total concerned is 133 items of equipment.

2. At the time the local plant was placed under custody the management reported there were no dispersed machinery. The question was intended to cover equipment in the plant as well as outside of the plant, but apparently was misunderstood in process of translation. This Headquarters made an inspection of the plant in July after all SCAPIN 1219 repairs had been completed and it was noted that a large group of stored lathes had no chucks. At that time it was reported that these machines had been brought back from the Yamato Plant in Nara Prefecture where they had been used for shell turning; chucks were missing because the special chucks for shell turning had been removed and destroyed on Army order and no standard chucks were available.

3. The equipment concerned had no connection with integrated machine tool facility. None of it is in use. It is all well maintained and practically are class I. The Company's report and inventory list is attached as inclosure.
