1. Concur in general text with the exception of 3a (5), 3b (1) and (3), and 3c (1) and (3).

2. Recommend the following changes:

a. Delete present 3a (5) substitute: Observe prescribed channels of communication and liaison with designated Japanese agencies on matters of combined military interest (subparas b and g below). However, CINCPAC will maintain direct liaison with Japanese agencies dealing in joint intelligence for the purpose of handling policy matters and joint operational intelligence which can not be handled by the major subordinate commands.

b. That 3b (1) be modified to read: "Provide guidance to Chief, Security Advisory Section-Japan for performance of supervisory and support functions with the Japanese".

c. Add as 3b (3): Observe prescribed channels of communication and liaison with designated Japanese agencies on matters of combined military interest (subparas b and g below). However, CG, AFPE will maintain direct liaison with the Director of Information, First Staff Headquarters of the National Safety Agency for the purpose of free exchange of intelligence and free discussion of operational intelligence.

Basic, is CN from G-3 to CofS, pertaining to briefing of CinC on negotiations for obtaining agreement on combined planning. A proposed memorandum was submitted to CofS and approved on 22 July 52. Subsequent to submission of proposed draft, at which time it was stated that promulgation thereof should occur when an agreement is reached between CINCPAC and the Japanese Prime Minister to engage in combined planning, G-3 considered that another condition should obtain--The Security Advisory Section (SAS-J) should be organized on a joint basis in order to prevent an excessive burden being placed on SAS-J because of its unilateral nature, and to prevent the COMNAVFE Advisory Group with the Japanese Coastal Security Force from being deprived of the direct channel communication necessary to its endeavor. SAS-J is presently developing recommendations with respect to formation of a joint advisory group. G3 recommends promulgation of memo on staff responsibilities await organization of SAS-J on joint basis, and that dual channel authorization for communication with Japanese forces, now vested in SAS-J and COMNAVFE obtain as an interim arrangement. CN 2 from CofS to G3 proposed insertion of new par. 3 of memo which will permit direct liaison for purposes of free exchange of intelligence between G2, FEC, and appropriate intell agencies of NPRJ. CN 3 sends proposed change to SAS-J for comment. CN 4 from SAS-J proposes rewording new para to include the Director of Information, First Staff Headquarters of the National Safety Agency as a source with whom to exchange info and provide that conferences are arranged through G2 SAS-J and that G2 SAS-J have appropriate representation at all such meetings. CN 5 forwards to G2 for comment. Inst CN is G2 concurrence.

SUBJECT: Assignment of FEC Staff Responsibilities Relative to
Combined US-Japan Defense Planning

1. The proposal of SAS-J in C/N 4, para 2, solves only one of the three aspects of information on Japan for which G-2 has a primary responsibility.

2. The attached paper deals solely with the exchange of intelligence information on Communist countries; furthermore, SAS-J proposes to limit G-2 to the Security Bureau of the National Safety Agency.

3. G-2, FEC occupies two positions: He is the theater G-2, and he is the theater Army G-2. In the former capacity, he should have access to the national agencies of the Japanese government; but in the capacity of theater Army G-2 he should maintain his liaison with the ground forces of Japan--the NFRF. For this reason it is believed that the proposed para 3 to the basic memorandum should incorporate the views of both SAS-J and the Deputy Chief of Staff. G-2 would thus be allowed access to the Security Bureau and to appropriate intelligence agencies of the NFRF.

4. In this connection SAS-J is a training, rather than an operational agency. It corresponds to KMAG for Korea and MAAG for Formosa. We do not obtain intelligence on Communist countries from the G-2's of these two military advisory groups; but rather, we obtain it by liaison with the appropriate intelligence office of the foreign country concerned.

5. In implementing the foregoing, it is considered that the ICGJ, which was established for the express purpose of arranging for exchanges of intelligence information between the United States and Japan, be considered the agency through which the collection of intelligence is coordinated. In any case, the Intelligence Division is not a "collection agency." It is solely an intelligence production agency operating on the basis of reports of information which it receives and collates.

6. G-2 is also interested in Japanese armed forces from another standpoint. Japan is a foreign country. As such, the maintenance of Order of Battle information, including strength, equipment, logistics, disposition, organization, and movements is a responsibility of G-2. In most foreign countries, the reporting responsibility is fulfilled by the service attaches. The collection responsibility rests

(1) Guard Company sentries on duty will be relieved by personnel provided by installation commanders except as directed by this headquarters (G3).

as may be necessary to repel trespassers on United States facilities or installations and to prevent damage or destruction to such areas. United States facilities or installations will be protected by defensive action on their periphery. Commanders will not initiate active measures beyond the boundaries of facilities or installations unless directed by Commander-in-Chief, Far East, through the Commanding General, Headquarters and Service Command.

(2) Authority for the use of tear gas and tear gas adamsite combinations will be requested from the Commanding General, Headquarters and Service Command. Employment will be made in accordance with Appendix 1, FM 19-15, April 1952.

(3) Commanding Officers of units and/or responsible officers of installations and buildings, Hq FEC, Headquarters and Service Command, and JLCOM units in Metropolitan Tokyo Area will include in their plans the following provisions within the capabilities of assigned personnel and available arms and equipment:

(a) Duties of each individual or group.

(b) Establishment of primary and secondary defensive positions within the installation or building, using all means and weapons available.

(c) Establishment of first aid station within building or area if feasible.

(d) Communication and/or liaison with lower and higher echelons.

(e) Such other provisions which may be peculiar to the individual installation or building.

(4) When directed by Commanding General, Headquarters and Service Command, all personnel will carry individual weapons, ammunition and gas masks to and from places of duty.

(5) In the event of a civil disturbance or threatened violence to U.S. Forces personnel or installations, and/or airborne attack prior to declaration of an emergency by higher authority, local commanders will take necessary action to:

(a) Notify this headquarters immediately and include information relative to reinforcement requirements.

(b) Keep this headquarters informed of the situation through G3.

(c) Invoke provisions of Alert Plans, if deemed necessary.

(d) Maintain surveillance at the scene of the disturbance or action.

(e) Comply with "Condition Green" if announced. (Appendix D).

6. All allied armed forces personnel stationed in Metropolitan Tokyo Area will be subject to control of the Commanding General, Headquarters and Service Command, in the initial stage of any emergency.

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TAB 2 - TIDAL WAVE INSTRUCTIONS

1. GENERAL:

a. Tidal waves are caused by submarine earthquakes. They travel with great speed (500 miles per hour), hence limited time will be available for precautionary measures. Warnings must be forwarded with utmost speed. Immediate measures to minimize loss of life and damage to property must be taken.

b. Two tidal wave disaster situations are possible:

(1) Near on-shore wave: A high crest and rapid rate of water rise can be expected with disruption of major utilities and pollution of water supply.

(2) Distant tidal wave: A low crest and a less rapid rate of water rise can be expected. More advance warning is possible and precautionary measures to evacuate personnel and equipment and provide protection of installations can be taken.

2. Dissemination of Warnings:

a. Warnings originating from Hawaii or agencies on the West Coast of the United States will be disseminated directly to Hq, FEC.

b. Warnings recorded by the Central Meteorological Observatory in Japan are disseminated via 2143d Air Weather Wing communication facilities to Hq, FEC.

c. The Adjutant General, Hq, FEC (Adjutant General's Radio & Cable Division), Room 66, Building A, Pershing Heights, telephone 265-320 and 265-329, will notify by the fastest available means (telephone or messenger or combination thereof) and in the order of priority shown, the following:

(1) Commanding General, Headquarters and Service Command, Far East Command (Staff Duty Officer).

(2) Secretary of the General Staff, Hq, FEC.

(3) Civil Information and Education Section, Hq, FEC.

(4) Signal Officer, Hq, FEC.

(5) Deputy G3 or G3 Duty Officer, Hq, FEC.

(6) G2 Duty Officer, Hq, FEC.

(7) Public Information Officer, Hq, FEC.

(8) Medical Section, Hq, FEC.

d. If message is received initially by either the Chief of Staff, Adjutant General or Staff Duty Officer, Hqs & Svc Comd, message will be relayed to G3 and to Composite Service Unit for dissemination.

e. The Composite Service Unit, Headquarters and Service Command, will disseminate warnings in accordance with Appendix C, Annex 9.

f. Tokyo FEN will broadcast tidal wave warnings by all electrical means immediately upon receipt of such warnings from Commanding General, Hqs and Svc Comd.

1. The original paper on this subject was designed to inform subordinate commanders of the existence of an established procedure for reporting to CINCFE on riots, disorders, and the like. 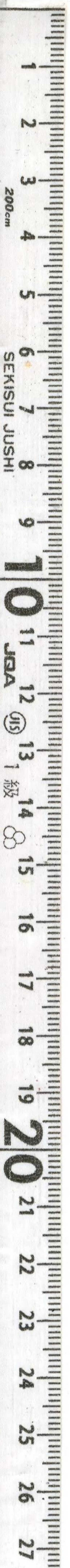

1. Attached is a draft letter to subordinate commands for your approval. This letter informs them that when civil disturbances, riots or demonstrations by subversive elements become nationwide and/or serious enough to pose a threat to the security of Japan and the U. S. Forces, the Assistant Chief of Staff, G2, Headquarters, Far East Command, will proclaim a Condition "X".

2. Under Condition "X" a special collection, evaluation and reporting agency is established by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G2, Headquarters, Far East Command, in the G2 Action Center, Headquarters Building (Pershing Heights), Tokyo. The purpose of this special agency is to receive, evaluate and disseminate G2-G3 information to the Chief of Staff, Headquarters, Far East Command, Headquarters Staff Sections and subordinate commands, when warranted, on the situation as received from the Counterintelligence Corps Detachments, subordinate commands, Japanese police and other Japanese Government security agencies.

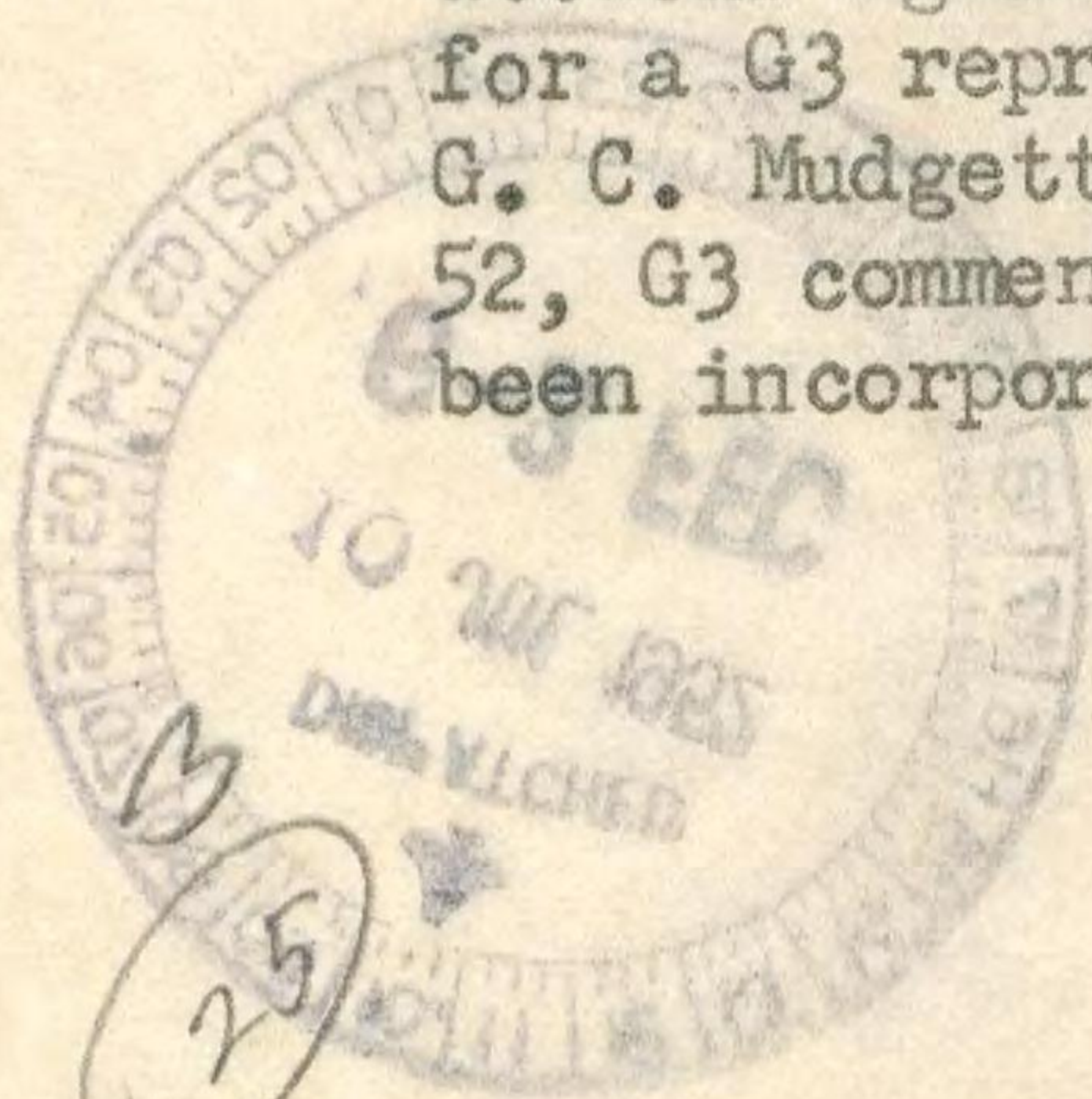

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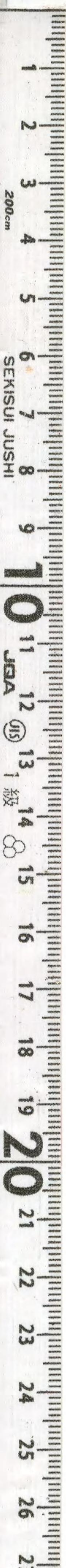

This letter informs them that when civil disturbances, riots or demonstrations by subversive elements become nationwide and/or serious enough to pose a threat to the security of Japan and the U. S. Forces, the Assistant Chief of Staff, G3, Headquarters, Far East Command, will proclaim a Condition "X".

2. Under Condition "X" a special collection, evaluation and reporting agency is established by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G3, Headquarters, Far East Command, in the G2 Action Center, Headquarters Building (Pershing Heights), Tokyo. The purpose of this special agency is to receive, evaluate and disseminate G2-G3 information to the Chief of Staff, Headquarters, Far East Command, Headquarters Staff Sections and subordinate commands, when warranted, on the situation as received from the Counterintelligence Corps Detachments, subordinate commands, Japanese police and other Japanese government security agencies.

1. The following was discussed in a conversation between Major General Riley F. Ennis and Brigadier General G. C. Mudgett on 28 Jun 52.

a. When civil disturbances, riots, or demonstrations by subversive elements become nationwide and/or serious enough to pose a threat to the security of Japan and the U. S. Forces, the Assistant Chief of Staff, G2, Headquarters, Far East Command, will proclaim Condition "X". Condition "X" was enforced on 30 May and 25 June 52, two Communist holidays, during which disturbances and riots were expected to and did occur.

b. Under Condition "X" the Security Div, G2, establishes a special collection, evaluating and reporting group in the G2 Action Center located in Room 320, Building A, Pershing Heights. Here all reports pertaining to the situation received from CIC, Japanese Police, SIB, and other sources are analyzed, evaluated, and disseminated to the Chief of Staff, Staff Section, Headquarters, Far East Command, and, when appropriate, to subordinate commands.

c. It is understood that in future occasions necessitating the establishment of Condition "X", G3 will be represented by a Liaison Officer who will be present in the G2 Action Center. He will keep G3 informed of the situation and will receive reports from the subordinate commands through G3 Operations Division. Until such time as a G3 telephone is installed in the Action Center, which it is understood G3 will initiate, communications between the Action Center and G3 operations will be by courier.

d. The Deputy, G2, will notify G3 and the subordinate commands by telephone or radio when Condition "X" exists. The message will be Condition "X" to be placed in effect at _____." Similarly, the Deputy G2 will notify the same addressees when Condition "X" is to be terminated by the message "Condition "X" will terminate at _____".

2. In an informal conference on 30 Jun between Lt Col Barker, Security Division G2, and Lt Col Lee, G3 Operations, it was agreed that the various commanders will make their reports on any action taken to deal with an emergency by telephone consistent with security. Classified radio messages will be used where security requires. The telephones to be used for G3 reporting between subordinate commanders and G3 for Condition "X" are: 265-593 between 0800 and 1700 hours; and 265-591 between 1700 and 0800 hours.

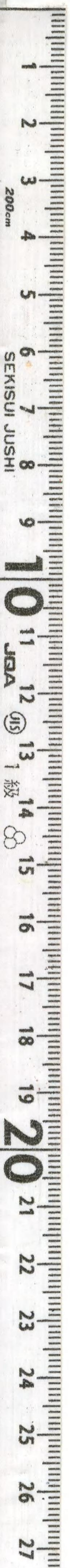

This C/S forwards a letter of instructions to the subordinate commands informing them of the addition of the G3 representatives to the Action Ctr. 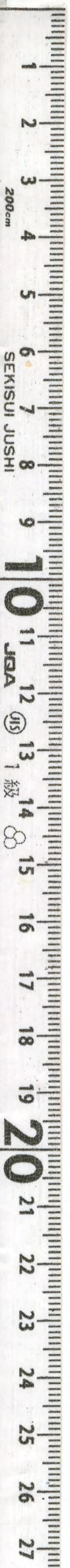

1. Attached is a letter to subordinate commands for your approval. This letter informs them that when civil disturbances, riots, or demonstrations by subversive elements become nationwide and/or serious enough to pose a threat to the security of Japan and the U. S. Forces, the Assistant Chief of Staff, G2, Headquarters, Far East Command, establishes as an adjunct of his office an emergency reporting agency known as Condition "X". Condition "X" was placed into effect on 30 May and 25 June 1952, two Communist holidays, during which disturbances and riots were expected to and did occur.
2. The emergency reporting agency for Condition "X" (physically located under such conditions in the G2 Action Center) in the past has been manned by G2 personnel, but it has been agreed upon informally between the Assistant Chief of Staff, G3 and myself that in the future a G3 representative will be added to the group. The G3 liaison officer will receive and pass on to the G2 Action Center all G3 operational information as it affects the situation, and will keep the Assistant Chief of Staff, G3, informed of events as they occur in Japan. Both the G2 and G3 information will be disseminated to the Chief of Staff, Headquarters Staff Sections and subordinate commands when warranted.

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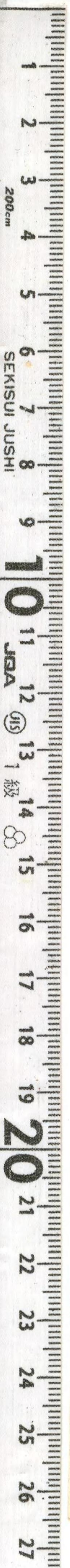
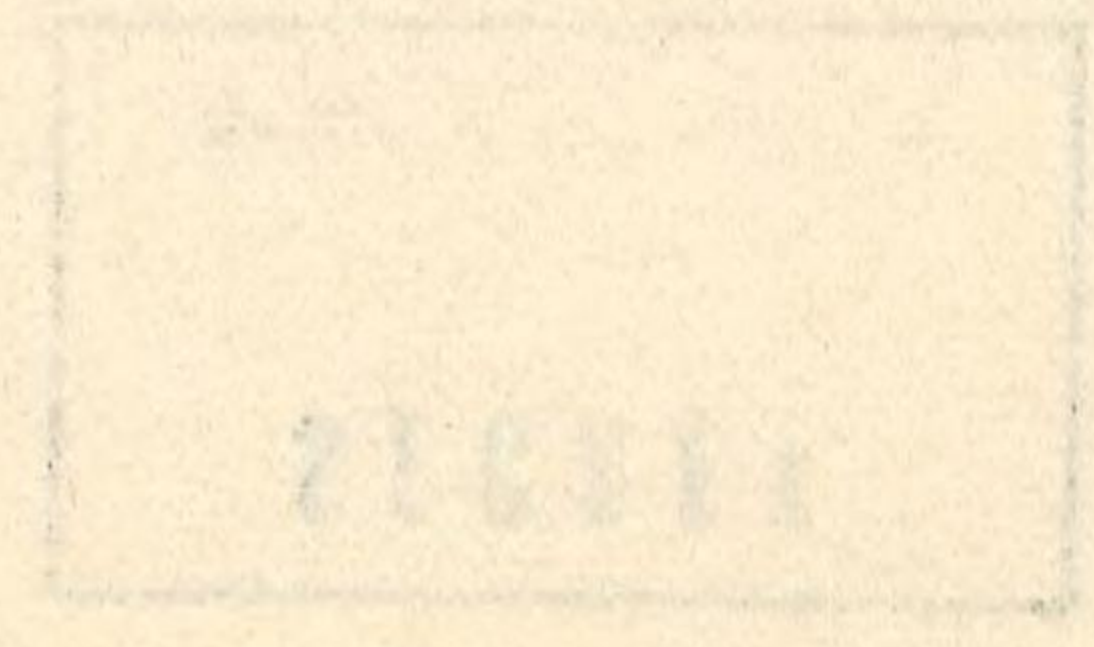

UBJECT: Operational Plan for 30 May 1952.

O: All Personnel, Arsenal Area.

General Situation.

30 May 1952 has been designated as a day of commemoration by the Communist Party as the result of the four (4) specific incidents listed below:

a. Chinese Anniversary - In 1925, in Shanghai, a Chinese woman was murdered by the Japanese militarists. This murder resulted in wide spread rioting throughout the city and many deaths and arrests.

b. Korean Anniversary - In 1930, in Manchuria, Koreans attacked the Japanese with weapons for the first time. Many Koreans were killed.

c. Anti-Fascist Anniversary - In 1949, in Tokyo, Hashimoto, Kinji was killed during a demonstration. The Communists claim he was pushed from the third story window of a Metropolitan Government building during a police action.

d. Youth Fatherland Front Anniversary - In 1950, in Tokyo, during memorial services for Hashimoto, Kinji, Occupation personnel who were observing the meeting were injured by the demonstrators, eight of whom were later tried and convicted by the Occupation authorities.

In an extra edition of the JCP organ, Akahata, dated 2 May 52, the CP Central Guidance Department appealed to the people to carry out a general strike in protest against the Japanese Government's suppression of the May Day riots and to conduct more revolutionary struggles in the future. On 8 May 52, in response to this appeal, the JCP Tokyo Metropolitan Committee issued an appeal calling upon the people of Tokyo to hold a rally in the People's Plaza in commemoration of the 30 May Anniversary. The major points of the appeal called for halting the arrests of those persons who participated in the May Day 1952 riots; releasing arrested May Day demonstrators; opposing the outlawing of the JCP; dissolving the National Diet and overthrowing the Yoshida Cabinet; instituting a national strike in opposition to the Subversive Activities Prevention Bill; and observing the 30 May Anniversary in the People's Plaza.

In view of previously mentioned JCP notifications and informants' reports received subsequent to May Day, it is anticipated that the National Students Self-Government Federation (Zengakuren) and various rear groups will be used on 30 May to spearhead a mass demonstration in the Imperial Plaza. Further, acts of violence are considered possible in view of the abnormally large number of meetings that were held by the JCP and front organizations, during which, efforts were made to stir up the emotions of Party members and sympathizers against alleged provocations.

Application for official sanction for the use of the Imperial Plaza has not been submitted to Governmental authorities; however, it is assumed that permission for its use would be refused.

2. Personnel.

a. All personnel of Arsenal Area CIC Field Office will be on a limited alert status from 0001 hours, 30 May 52, through 2400 hours, 30 May 52. All personnel will be on duty at Area Headquarters from 0700 hours, 30 May 52, until released by the Commanding Officer.

b. Specific duty assignments for the 30 May 52 operation are contained in Annex I. Personnel not assigned specific duties will stand by on an alert status in the Headquarters to be dispatched in an emergency.

c. No personnel will mix directly in any crowd, or become involved in any meeting or demonstration. Meetings and demonstrations will not be covered by agents, but reports of results will be obtained through Japanese police and other sources as expeditiously as possible.

3. Transportation.

All organic vehicles of this organization will be available by 0700 hours, 30 May 52.

4. Instructions for Observation of Celebrations.

a. Coverage of 30 May 52 activities is broken into separate operations as follows:

(1). Observation of any meeting or demonstration at the Imperial Plaza.

(2). Observation of reported mass violence in Tokyo-to.

b. The details of the operations are as follows:

(1). Observation of any demonstration on the Imperial Plaza will be covered by teams of agents located atop the Dai Ichi, NYK and Teikoku Buildings. These agents will transmit the results of their observations by means of radios mounted on the roofs of the respective buildings. If necessary, verbal report will be made to the office of the AC of S, G2, Hq, FEC, by field 'phones installed on the roof of the Dai Ichi Building. Two teams with radio vehicles will be located at Hq, 441st CIC Detachment (Norton Hall), and will be dispatched at the discretion of the Operations Officer, Arsenal Area CIC Field Office.

(2). Other radio vehicles and personnel will be on immediate call at Arsenal Area CIC Field Office for dispatch as required.

(3). Coverage of sporadic incidents and events in urban Tokyo will be generally maintained through police authorities. However, in the event of mass disorders, radio vehicles will be dispatched to observe and report. No agents will mingle or have direct contact with any crowds. All observation will be done strictly from a distance sufficient to insure safety of personnel and equipment.

(4). Coverage of demonstrations in the Tachikawa Liaison Office area, will be maintained in the same manner as outlined in para 4b(3) above. The normal complement of the Tachikawa Liaison Office will be augmented by an additional radio vehicle manned by a team of

agents, to be dispatched at the discretion of the Officer in Charge of the Tachikawa Office.

c. All personnel assigned to these teams are indicated in Annex I

d. Tokyo city maps will be distributed to all vehicle commanders.

6. Personnel not assigned specific missions will remain at this Headquarters from 0700 hours, 30 May 52, until dispatched or released by the CO.

5. Operational Control.

Control of all 30 May 52 operations will remain with this headquarters. As information is received by telephone or radio, it will be screened, correlated, recorded and forwarded immediately in draft form to the 32, 4th CIC District. Information so reported will then be typed in final Spot Report form and likewise forwarded to 4th CIC District Spot Report Section.

7. Liaison.

Agents of Liaison Section will be dispatched to Metropolitan Police Bureau Headquarters; National Rural Police, Tokyo-to Headquarters; Provost Marshal's Office, and Headquarters and Service Command. Liaison will be maintained with Tokyo Ordnance Depot, Tokyo Quartermaster Depot and Tokyo Engineering Works Ordnance Shops.

8. Communications.

Communications between Arsenal Area, Tachikawa Liaison Office, Radio CP's and radio vehicles will be in accordance with Signal Instructions in Annex II. Security will be maintained at all times. Names of personnel will not be used. Names of organizations and representatives of various governments will be by code as indicated in the Signal Instructions.

Communications by Liaison representatives will normally be by telephone.

9. Supply.

One blackjack will be issued prior to 0730 hours, 30 May 52, to each person with a specific assignment in the field. Binoculars will be issued to each team commander stationed at a CP located on roofs of buildings.

10. Orientation.

Orientation of personnel will be conducted by Section Chiefs prior to the implementation of this Operational Plan.
