appointed by Dr. Young, the Provincial Medical Officer, to consider the feasibility of admitting maternity cases to the Health Centre, in order to make the matter plain, it will be necessary at the same time to discuss the attitude of the medical men of Victoria to the Health Centre.

The majority report was signed by Drs. Barty, McPherson and Thomas. It was also signed by Mrs. Booth, who has since stated publicly that she is not known to a minority report was to be presented, she would not have signed the majority one, as she certainly agreed with Miss Corbett of the V. O. N., who signed the minority one, that maternity cases should be admitted to the Health Centre.

In criticizing the report signed by the Victoria doctors I cannot help mentioning that it has been compiled, after considering the matter simply from a Victoria point of view, and not a Saanich one also that they have considered the subject, altogether from a wrong angle.

The chief objection that they raise is the distance of the Centre from the City of Victoria, viz. 4 1/2 miles, all of which is paved road. I think that there is very little in this point, as everyday experiences will show.

In their daily practice they have to attend maternity cases in patients' own homes. Very often there is a long road to be travelled, and I am certain that in many cases the doctor would rather, if at all possible, have the patient in the Health Centre, where he would be able to secure modern conveniences and quietness for his patient.

As far as I can observe, at the present time, competition is very keen in the medical profession in the City of Victoria, and in view of that fact, the patient always stands a chance of having her convenience considered, as well as those of the doctor.

I will not deal with the minority report signed by Miss Corbett of the V. O. N., and supported by Mrs. Booth, both of whom have had a wide experience in Public Health matters.

This report which is a constructive one, states that the plan of the building is easily adaptable to the admission of maternity cases, by using the left wing on the ground floor exclusively, thus leaving the right wing clear for other purposes.

It suggests the installation of storm windows so as to prevent the present waste of fuel in the institution.

It states that one private and three semi-private paying and non-paying patients could be treated in the left wing of the building.

The present staff of nurses is three and the report suggests the engagement of one additional nurse, should maternity cases be treated in the institution.

Other improvements mentioned in the excellent report signed by Miss Corbett, would not require to be carried out at the present time, but would be a matter for future consideration.

After considering both reports fully, I have come to the conclusion that where there is a will there is a way, and that the installation of maternity cases is quite feasible at the present time.

In my closing letter to-morrow I will deal with exaggerated statements which have been made as to the cost of improving the service provided by the Health Centre at the present time and also the supposed opposition to the plan of the medical profession in Victoria to the Centre treating maternity cases.

AMPLIFIES A RADIO SET 100,000 TIMES

Armstrong Invention Tested Before Engineers Simple Outfit Will Make Outside Aerials Unnecessary

New York, June 23.—An invention amplifying an ordinary radio receiving set 100,000 times and eliminating outside aerials was demonstrated by Major Edwin H. Armstrong, formerly in charge of the radio service in France.

The radio engineer who tunes in every night to WJZ will be benefited by this new invention in two ways, Major Armstrong asserts. "An outfit equipped with a super-regenerative circuit, is so sensitive that outside aerials are unnecessary. Receiving sets without outside aerials have been possible for some time, but they have never been able to afford them. With the super-regenerative circuit, inside sets can be manufactured at the same price as those requiring the cumbersome outdoor aerials.

"To illustrate the difference between a receiving set equipped with a super-regenerative circuit and the ordinary set, I have found that a signal, which can just be heard with a simple regenerative circuit at the most critical zero point can be heard clearly over the room with the super-regenerative circuit." Major Armstrong concluded, "is that one vacuum tube is made to do the work formerly done by three. It has been known for several years that the limit of amplification is reached when the negative charge in the tube approaches the positive. In experimenting I found that it was possible to increase the negative charge temporarily, for about one 20,000th of a second far above the positive, and still keep the average down. It is possibility of increase which permits the enormous amplification which I have demonstrated, and enables me to eliminate two tubes from the circuit."
