Plants carried by us, but not mentioned herein, will be furnished at a liberal discount from retail rates. We in no case allow the selection of several varieties to make up a dozen at dozen rates, but charge retail rates, in this case allowing our usual trade discount on the whole.

The stock herein offered, unless specially noted to the contrary, is grown on good soil to insure plenty of fibrous roots and proportionate tops. Frequent transplanting is our motto and the secret of the universal success of our stock.

TERMS.—Cash, or satisfactory security, upon delivery of stock.

REMIT by bank draft on Boston, registered letter, money order, or express order on Reading, Mass. We prefer not to send goods C.O.D., as it is a useless increase of office detail.

PACKING done in the most thorough manner, in bales or boxes, to insure safe arrival at all distances. A cost charge is made for material used. Our **SHIPPING FACILITIES** are unsurpassed, owing to our proximity to the numerous railroads and steamship lines leading out of Boston to all parts of the country and world at large. Responsibility for the safe delivery of goods after delivery to forwarders by us remains with the forwarders alone.

ERRORS should be brought to our attention immediately after receipt of the goods, for immediate correction by us.

SHIPPING SEASON.—Our shipping seasons are approximately as follows:

Deciduous Trees, April 1 to May 15; in fall, September 15 to hard frost.

Evergreen Trees, April 15 to June 15; fall, August 15 to October 1.

Hardy Perennials, April 1 to June 1; and August 1 to hard frost.
