

4. EVENTS OF INTEREST DURING PERIOD:

a. As of 2400 hours, 6 March 1952, total strength of the NPR was 74,488.

b. As of 1200 hours, 14 March 1952, 4906 members of the NPRJ have received commissions (3777 permanent, 1129 temporary.) Of this number, 751 have received special appointments authorized by GHQ (698 permanent, 53 temporary.)

c. The following incident was reported by the Senior Adviser, Camp McKnight: "At 0730 hours, 7 March 1952, NPR truck No. 32-0172 and GHQ Bus U. S. No. 2097665 were involved in an accident at the intersection of Ginza Street and "W" Avenue. No passengers were on either the NPR truck or the U. S. bus and the drivers were not injured. The accident was attributed to driver of the U. S. Army bus, as determined by on-the-spot investigation by Japanese Metropolitan Police and U. S. Military Police. The NPR is conducting a formal investigation.

d. Conferred with Mr. Shishido, Personnel Bureau, NPR Headquarters, in connection with proposed Pay Law for NPR. CAS suggestions with respect to this proposed law were presented to Mr. Shishido. He indicated that the draft presented to CAS is tentative only and is subject to change.

Medical Division

1. Personnel:

Medical Section, GGHQ, has information reflecting improper personnel management. Several graduates of medical technician classes at Kurihama have been assigned to non-medical units upon return to camp by reason of non retention of vacancies within the unit from which they departed for training in the General Group school. Another instance was one region directed an individual upon completion of medical technician training at Kurihama to proceed to Tachikawa for instructions in Ordnance in Ordnance School. The reason being that there was sufficient travel money for this transfer by insufficient money to send a better selected representative from one of the region camps. This matter is being taken up with personnel and training officer.

2. Training:

On-the-job training for Medical was given a boost by having Lt Jane Clauson, ANC, deliver remarks before the JLC nursing conference at their invitation. Since nurses supervise a considerable portion of on-the-job technical training a better understanding on their part is helpful, and this opportunity permitted extension of understanding to all JLC units (8168 Hospital - Yokohama - 10 March).

3. Hospitalization:

a. That general concept of hospital plans, location, operation, etc., were considered at length with Logistics Division, GGHQ. A representative from Medical Section was present but could not finalize any concurrence for Medical Section. A plan was ~~inspected~~ ^{agreed} in that facilities for those hospitals would be provided on the basis of currently on troop list. It incorporates concepts of using facilities most available with the most reasonable cost to realize on rendition of service; it furthers a concept that GGHQ Medical Section denying requirements and limitation for a unit by attaches a unit for a region for operation, administration, training and control. These items are to be further considered between Logistics Division and Medical Section of GGHQ.

b. Detailed project for Fukuyama is being pursued with this Division and Medical Section to expedite the enlargement of Fukuyama Hospital operation. Decision reached by GGHQ Medical Section and G-3 show that no arms would be issued for external security for this unit on the basis that few arms may provoke and attack agitators. Arms are

permitted if the concept of Geneva convention is followed since a Medical unit may use arms in self defense or for the defense for the sick and wounded. This matter is not considered of great consequence except as for precedence.

4. Supply:

a. A supply letter has been drafted in an attempt to establish authority for Medical units to requisition supply and equipment over and above the authorized allowance to the extent equal to items that are on hand but unserviceable. This procedure is considered necessary since some units have burned out the heating element of sterilizer which could be replaced and since training allegedly ~~has~~ been interfered with by broken litters. This letter would presently be compatible with a general letter now being considered by Logistics wherein unserviceable property handled is reclaimed.

b. Delayed procurement, common to all services at this time, involves some equipment currently needed particularly No. 2 Chest.



SUBJECT: Weekly Activities Report

In compliance with IRS, Executive Office, dated 10 December 1951, the following Weekly Activities Report is submitted:

a. Projects Completed

(1) Prepared, Staffed with Ordnance and Operations, and forwarded to Transportation Section, NPR, a suggested re-draft of NPR Notification, subject; "Vehicle Operation and Training at Camps".

(2) Completed review of proposed Property Accounting Regulation.

b. Current Projects

(1) Conferred with Supt 1st Class Namikawa, Stores Section, GGHQ, concerning procurement of clothing and equipment from 1951-52 Supplemental budget to support initial requirements for an NPR augmentation. Stores Section has submitted PRs for 26 items to G-4 for approval and processing, and will submit PRs for the remaining 20 items by 15 March. Delivery completion dates have been requested by or before 31 May 52.

(2) Continued editing of T/O & E's for Snow White.

(3) Reviewed with NPR counterpart procurement status of all QM items in process of procurement to assure that Stores Section, GGHQ, is making prompt submission of necessary procurement requests with specifications, and that follow up action is taken by Chief of Stores, thru G-4, and the NPR procurement unit to guard against any unnecessary delay.

c. Future Projects

(1) None

d. Events of Interest

(1) Supt Kayo, Chief, GGHQ Stores Section, reported orders were being issued transferring technical service responsibilities of the Service Group to the corresponding sections of the GGHQ as of 2400 hours, March 9th, and that remaining command responsibilities would be transferred to GGHQ, on 31 March. Also advised his section would assume supervision of general depot administration approximately 15 March 1952. All control of Technical Service units passes to control GGHQ Technical Services 2400 hours, March 9th.


(2) Conferred with Supt Kayo, Chief GGHQ Stores Section, relative improvement of instruction and administration in preparation for opening of 2d basic officers course. Students of first course complained that mess, billet and laundry service was unsatisfactory. Changes are being effected in Stores School staff to replace unqualified instructors.

(3) Conferred with Lt Col Balck, 4th Region Logistics Advisor, relative activation Kyushu Distribution Point at Camp Fukuoka, reiterating requirement for a minimum of one entire factory type building for depot storage operations. Objected to any consolidation of camp and depot accountability; or the delay of depot activation as proposed, should funds requested, for sub dividing building into separate storage areas, be denied by GGHQ (NPRJ).

(4) Recommended CAS Comptroller Division concur in GGHQ action to allot funds for partitions in a warehouse building at Camp Fukuoka, provided they were employed as approved by Chief, 4th Region (NPRJ) to alter one building required for regional utilization; and thus assure availability of the already partitioned building for depot storage operations.

(5) Conferred with Supt 1st Class Namikawa, Stores Section GGHQ, concerning latest procurement plans for clothing and equipment to support an NPR augmentation. Present plans, subject to approval of Ministry of Finance, call for use of ¥500,000,000 in 1951-52 supplemental budget for this purpose procuring only the items that would be immediately needed and which had been setup in the 1952-53 budget as replacement items for the present force. (Office memo prepared)

(6) Specifications for woolen clothing in the NPR are being changed, at the insistence of the Ministry of Finance, to provide for at least 20% artificial wool instead of 100% pure wool in order to substantially reduce the cost without appreciably changing wearing qualities.

MEDICAL DIVISION

1. Personnel:

a. 1st Lt Jane Clauson, ANC, joined this Section and has been assigned for duty with GG School Center, Kurihama, and replaces Lt. Sloan who has been transferred to Tokyo Army Hospital.

b. Medical Section, GHQ, FEC, indicated that Capt Lewis C. Martin, MSC, is being assigned to this Section against existing requisitions. This officer has had hospital administrative experience and is badly needed at Fukuyama; Senior Adviser, 3rd Region, will be informed.

2. Training:

a. Plan is being drafted whereby 50 NPR officers and 50 enlisted men may attend a recurring veterinary food inspection course given at the Institute of Public Health, Tokyo.

b. Some training will be discontinued for NPR technicians since the facility whereat training had been arranged; namely, the FEC Medical Specialists School, is discontinuing medical courses for pharmacy, laboratory and operating room technicians.

c. An inspection of on-the-job training at the US Army Medical Depot, Camp Drew, was made on 6 March by Maj St. John, this Division, and Supts Honna, Yoshimura and Kameda, Medical Section, GGHQ. Of particular interest to the NPR visitors was the reprocessing of medical equipment in which salvage material was restored to a useful state.


d. An information sheet estimated to be of interest to US personnel participating in on-the-job training of NPR members has been prepared and will be informally disseminated by Surgeon, JLC.

e. NPR officers from GG School Center, Kurihama, ~~was~~ having a conducted tour through the 8168th AU, US Army Hospital, Yokohama, were conducted on the tour by an on-the-job NPR trainee. Observer stated the tour was extremely well-conducted and the student officers were much impressed by the responsibility and capability of a fellow NPR member.

SUBJECT: Wkly Activities Rpt, Med Div, 7 March 1952

3. 1st Region Quarterly Medical Conference: On 5 March, Colonels Shellenberger and Reid, this Division, attended the 1st Region Quarterly Medical Conference at Nerima. Conferees were present from each camp in 1st Region and discussion was entered into freely. It is believed this process is of considerable assistance in working out operational details. Mention of unsatisfactory medical equipment (litters 10%) points out the need for a supply instruction letter whereby material can be expeditiously replaced and full salvage value realized.

4. Fukuyama: Impetus is being given to build-up of the hospital operating at Fukuyama. Supply status was checked during visit by Major Healy, this Division; a representative of the hospital staff visited Medical Section, GGHQ, concerning deficiencies and carried back drugs which were in insufficient supply, and Medical Section, GHQ, FEC, is expediting providing an additional MSC officer experienced in hospital administration. Priority of attention will be given this project until it is functioning satisfactorily.
