1. On Friday 13 Sept. it was learned by this office that a number of machines has been sold from military arsenals, after the date of Japanese Surrender and prior to the occupation, for civilian uses with the purported instructions to the buyer that they maintain machines in satisfactory condition and return them on demand.

2. Telephone advices were given your office and you instructed that inventories on these additional machines must meet the original dead line.

3. On Sept. 14th representatives of the prefectural Financial Bureau, Nagoya (custody of arsenals), Liaison Office, Commerce and Industry Department, and a representative of the Financial Bureau Tokyo were instructed to complete inventories of the machines at once and to complete movement of the machines into the central location at the Numazu Naval Arsenal by 9 October.

4. The inventory number of the Naval Arsenal is No.37-23. These additional machines to be collected there will be numbered No.37-23(a) (ref. ODS/4 Incl I, IIIB3(b)).

5. We have ordered moved into the arsenal all former arsenal machines now in this prefecture. The attached report from the Financial Bureau shows that some of the machines were originally from Toyokawa Naval Arsenal and Nagoya Military Arsenal in Aichi Prefecture, Maizuru Naval Arsenal, Kyoto, and Osaka Military Arsenal, Osaka.

6. This office has taken no action regarding machines from this prefecture now located outside the prefecture as shown on page 2 of the attached report; as we believe that if the machines are not now on inventory they should be placed on inventory in the prefecture or fu where now located.

SUBJECT : Report on machines sold or leases to civilian factories between 14 August 1945 and the date of occupation.

TO : H. Q. Shizuoka Military Government Team.

THRU : Japanese Liaison Office Shizuoka.

From the records in the Military and Naval Arsenals and from inspection of remaining reparational machines in their plants, the following measures were taken by the Nagoya Financial Administration Bureau.

All machines, dispersed or rented, were returned to their original arsenals for better care and maintenance. Later, 13 July, it was found that a considerable number of machines, not listed in the above-mentioned records, had been sold or rented to civilian factories during 15 August 1945 - 15 September, 1945.

An order was immediately (13 July) issued to all these factories to report to the Nagaya Financial Administration Bureau, the types of machines, number of machines and their condition and also to maintain the machines in the best of condition and to be ready at any time to move them to their original arsenals.

The following are the list of these machines which had been the property of Military and Naval Arsenal. The list was made from the reports received from civilian factories.
