BROADWAY BANK, New York City :

5's altered from 1's.

MARINE BANK, Baltimore, Md. :

5's, vignette, a man ploughing on right end a woman with a sheaf.

3's, vignette, a ship under sail.

MATAPAN BANK, Dorchester, Mass. :

10's altered from 2's.

3's, a pretty good imitation of the genuine.

BANK OF CHARLESTON, S. C. :

10's, the denomination covering the whole left margin.

NORTHWESTERN BANK OF VIRGINIA :

5's, vignette, females, cap of liberty, sheaf of wheat, &c.

STATE BANK OF INDIANA :

5's, imitation of new plate, vignette, a male and female figure, with a circle and spread eagle between them; engraving coarse and dark.

HAGERSTOWN BANK, Md.

5's, vignette, a landscape, river and sail boat.

BANK OF WILMINGTON AND BRANDYWINE, Del.

5's, letters B. and D., engraving blurred, requires close examination.

NORTH KINGSTON BANK, Wickford, R. I.

5's, vignette, view of a suspension bridge; steamboat at bottom of bill.

FELL'S POINT SAVING INST., Baltimore.

3's, vignette, female and eagle

5's, vignette, a man reclining over an urn or jar.

FARMER'S AND MERCHANT'S BANK, Baltimore.

1's, vignette, famson and the lion.

MARINE BANK OF BALTIMORE, Baltimore.

10's, vignette, a man resting on a spade.

BANK OF RONDOUT, New York.

10's altered from 1's and 2's.

STATE BANK OF OHIO.

10's, vignette, a male and female figure supporting a shield, with the letter X upon it. Good imitation, but may also be detected by closely observing the likeness of Harrison on the left end.

The above counterfeits are filled up to suit various branches.

2's, Relief notes, Lancaster Bank—new issue. Paper whiteish, engraving coarse, and the signature of Clarkson not well done.

We understand that a new spurious \$10, on the State Bank of Indiana, has lately been put in circulation. As yet we have no description of it.

Look out for the old \$20 counterfeit bills of the State Bank of Indiana. They are about, with deficiencies supplied. Vignette, a large building with colonade and cupola

LANCASTER COUNTY BANK, Lancaster, Pa.

5's, vignette Mercury offering a bag of coin to a female, who holds a key in her hand,—at her side is a winged lion on an iron chest. On the left end a female holding a pair of scales, and on right two females. Rawdon, Wright & Hatch, engravers.

1's, vignette, Neptune in his ear. On right end figures representing Industry and Prosperity, and on the left railroad cars. Rawdon, Wright and Hatch, engravers.

D. LAWARE CITY BANK, Delaware City, Del.

5's, altered from 2's. Vignette of the two's and altered notes is a female, holding in one hand a sickle, and in the other a bunch of wheat, at her side a sheaf, plough, &c. On right end a steamboat, and on the left, head of John Q. Adams. The true 5's are wholly unlike these

FARMERS' BANK, Lancaster, Pa.

2's, Relief, new issue. Engraving coarse and dark; paper white and thick.

Look out for 50's on the Bank of the State of North Carolina, payable at various branches; some payable to J. W. Borden.

Counterfeit 2's of the Rockingham Bank, Portsmouth, N. H., are now afloat. In addition to the worthless 2's on the same bank, recently noticed.

STATE BANK OF INDIANA.

2's, new emission. Vignette, a man felling a tree, man and sickle,—woman with figure 2 in her right hand—close imitation of the genuine.

The city scrip of Springfield, Ill., has advanced from 50 cents to 95 cents on the dollar, the result of funding—total city debt on the 1st April, 1850, \$11,774 02

The health of the city continues good—the Board of Health report no cholera. The quarantine regulations are in full force at this time.

Business, this spring, has not been as brisk as it was expected by our merchants. The great amount of emigration to California is considered to be the cause of it.

LAND WARRANTS.—There is but little doing in Land Warrants,—holders are not disposed to sell better than \$125, and buyers prefer knowing more of what will be done at Washington, in relation to the public lands, before they purchase. In this unsettled state of the market, we quote them \$120 @ \$127.

Beware of a counterfeit of the latest \$5 bill of the State Bank of Indiana, which has just appeared. It can be readily detected by observing the *indistinctness* and *want of expression* in every countenance on the bill, while those of the genuine are distinct and pleasant. In the counterfeit the lines of clouding, the stalks of corn, and the basket near the right hand number, are *distinct* and *plain*, while in the genuine they are not prominent.

CITY BANK OF NEW ORLEANS.—The charter of this institution expired on the 1st instant. All its assets, debts and credits, have been made over to the Louisiana State Bank, which institution has agreed to liquidate all just demands against the late City Bank. The stockholders of the retired institution receive par value for their stock, on application to the branch of the Louisiana State Bank, which has been established in the same building, lately occupied by the City Bank.

COUNTERFEIT DOUBLOONS.—The Augusta, (Ga.) papers mention the arrest in that place of three persons, having in their possession counterfeit Mexican doubloons and other spurious gold coins, with bank notes of doubtful character. The spurious doubloons are represented to be of full weight, and having no other suspicious appearance than being of a red color, similar to what is usually termed jeweller's gold.

FINANCES OF KENTUCKY.—The Auditor of Kentucky furnishes an estimate of the receipts and expenditures of the State Treasury, for the two years ending October 10, 1851. Total amount of the probable expenses of the government, including unpaid appropriations for the previous years, \$724,143 24: probable amount of receipts, including balance in treasury, October 10, 1849, \$727,172 68—leaving a supposed balance in the treasury, October 10, 1851, of \$3,029 44.

FARMERS' BANK OF KENTUCKY—A new Bank with this title has been chartered by the Kentucky Legislature, with the privilege of having numerous branches. The mother Bank is to be at Frankfort. Louisville papers state that a large amount of the stock has been taken.

A London correspondent of the Philadelphia American, cautions the public against a new counterfeit coin, as follows: The brokers of our Atlantic cities must very carefully examine British sovereigns and half sovereigns, as a very large quantity of spurious coin is now in circulation in London, but it is so well made and finished that the best judges are often deceived. These sovereigns are manufactured in Birmingham by most accomplished counterfeiters, and they are actually worth 16 shillings sterling each. I understand that a considerable quantity has been sent to the continent and to the United States. I have lately seen counterfeit half-crowns, shillings and sixpences, which are usually offered at public houses, but they are easily detected.

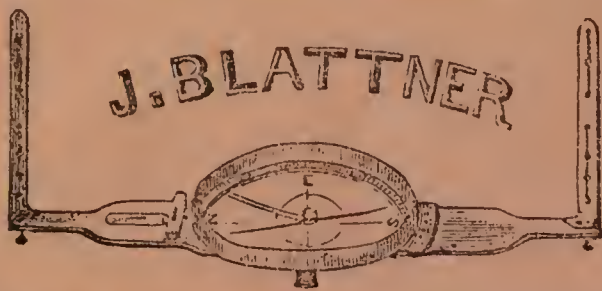



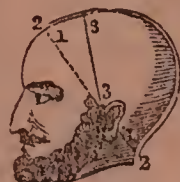
