- Indorsement of draft by person of same name as payee is forgery—Question of negligence in permitting draft to get into hands of wrong party, 301, 538.
- Liability of one who indorses a check below name of fictitious payee, to bank which pays check to purported payee, where signature of drawer is forged and payee's indorsement fictitious, 188.

- Responsibility for loss as between bank and insurance company where latter has issued check to fictitious payee and agent of insurance company witnesses payee's mark by way of indorsement and identifies him to bank which cashes check, 482.
