Sir According to our annual
Custom we transmit you an acct current, also
an acct sales of Flour, for all of which we
think that the highest market price has
been obtained - but especially the last 59 bush
which was sold to a baker, we not being able
to get an offer over 45 1/2 cts. at that time - therefore
the balance was stored - but whether it will
net as much, as if sold on the wharf is very
doubtful - owing to the weather being so unusually
warm for the season, that all the millers adjoining
the city have been sending their Flour in, and
it has caused a glut in the market, which has
produced different results from what were
anticipated by the principal dealers. Also very large
quantities have been recd. from the south - and
is now selling at about 44 1/4 with the exception
of a few of the best brands. Of Lees brand when
we examined the quality and found it poor. A was
perfectly good, and all but one little turned out fine
middlings - which being in demand for the
export market was sold ~~at~~ much above its
proportionate value.

On the 31st Dec. we wrote you stating that it would
be perfectly convenient for us to accept for any
amt. that you might want - also that when amts
exceeded \$250 cts. we would prefer drafts at one day
sight. As yet that having been drawn on, we
fear the letter has miscarried, and therefore
renew our former remarks. The receipt of your
draft for 1000 of Lundy Flouring was also acknowledged.
We hope the spring market for flour will be better
than present appearances indicate, although pros-
pects are far from flattering.
