2. The Japanese Government is directed to restore the machinery and equipment listed in inclosures 1, 2 and 3, which have been packaged in compliance with reference 1b above, to the Government of the Republic of China.
3. The property listed in inclosure 1 will be moved to Yokosuka, that listed in inclosure 2 to Osaka and that listed in inclosure 3 to Sasebo where restitution will take place.
4. The movement of the subject property to the designated ports will be completed within thirty (30) days from date of this memorandum and after such movement has been completed, a report will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

5. The Japanese Government will provide adequate storage for the subject property pending instructions for its stowage aboard the claimant nation's vessels. Further instructions regarding date of restitution, name of claimant nation's craft, and instructions for stowage aboard such craft, as well as the name of the representative of the Government of the Republic of China who will receive and receipt for the subject property will be forwarded at a later date. Inclosed are necessary release forms.

6. The Japanese Government will designate by name an authorized representative to execute the receipt forms in its behalf and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of his appointment immediately upon receipt of this memorandum.

7. The inclosed receipt forms, consisting of an original and five (5) copies, are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the Government of the Republic of China and the Japanese Government, and are to be distributed as follows:

a. Original and one (1) copy to be returned to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, by the Japanese Government

b. Two (2) copies to be retained by the Government of the Republic of China

c. Two (2) copies to be retained by the Japanese Government.


