Resuming combat activities after three days of reconnaissance flights, this scheduled 12 plane strike was briefed to release over a target area approximately 1000 yds. x 1000 yds. at the Western end of Koror. The attack plan called for an approach at 15,000' with specific instructions that everyone release not lower than 10,000'. Excellent area bombing results were achieved. The entire target area was covered with smoke, dust, and debris for some ten minutes following the strike.

One plane was prevented from taking off on this strike due to Magneto trouble of a minor nature. It is believed that a shorted solenoid was responsible for the one bomb which failed to release.

The last division in on the target noted five or six bursts of Heavy calibre AA at 9000'. It was inaccurate.

Word of the successful termination of hostilities did not reach this strike until the rendezvous had been completed at approximately 0905.
