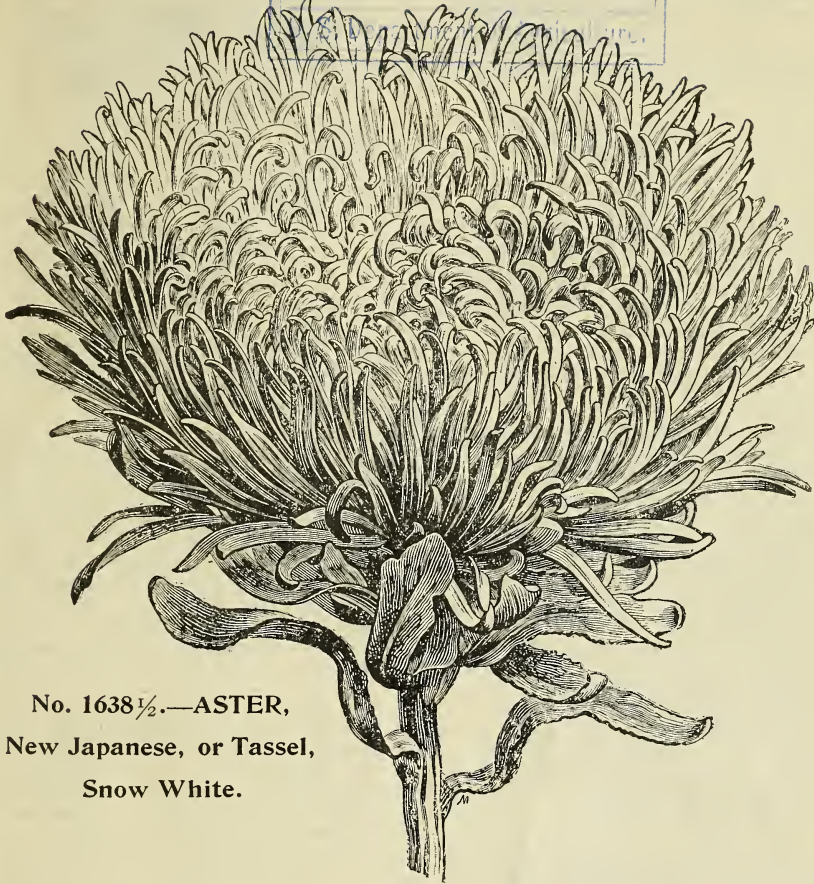

**COMPARATIVE PRODUCT TESTS.**—Last season (1896) we conducted an interesting comparative product Celery test, and have published a full report of same in bulletin form under the title of "N. Y. TEST GARDEN." It will be sent free to all who are interested. Under the above title we expect to publish, from time to time, other interesting tests, all of which the public will be invited to inspect.

**SPECIAL FLORISTS' MIXTURES.**—We call florists' attention to our Special Florists' Blends and Mixtures in the leading florists' seeds, as Asters, Nos. 1643n, 1648a, 1655a, 1672a, 1676a, 1684a, 1703a, 1703b, 1703c, 1703d; Cyclamen, 2006; Pansies, 2632, 2709, 2710 and 2737; Sweet Peas, 2788; Primulas, 3117; Stocks, 3165; Tom Thumb Nasturtiums, 3241; and Verbenas, 3286. These Blends and Mixtures we make up of separate colors, in proper proportions, insuring a greater variety and number of colors than can be obtained in any other way. We recommend them to those florists who require a large assortment, and do not want to buy them in separate colors. It has been the custom for years to offer mixtures at less price than desirable separate colors, because the grower or dealer make it a dumping-place for undesirable colors and surpluses. When flowers are grown in mixtures, the free seeding colors or kinds soon predominate, causing the number of colors to decrease. All our other mixtures are imported from the best growers, and are as good as any offered.

**OUR METHODS.**—All orders are filled on farms near city, and shipped from New York, thus saving the great cost of a city store. We refrain from issuing a large, expensive descriptive catalogue and doing extensive advertising, as the cost of both would have to be added to the price of the seeds. We leave lengthy descriptions to others, but offer the best tested seeds for less money. We prefer to have Planters know what they want rather than be influenced by highly colored chromos and high-flowing descriptions. These savings we give the Planters in reduced prices. In other words, not having such expenses, we sell the best seeds at the production prices before these extra charges are added.

**WORDS OF COMMENDATION.**—We annually receive hundreds of unsolicited letters from prominent florists and gardeners, bearing testimony as to the quality of our seeds, and we would submit same but for want of space; however, we will send a list of such at any time to those who feel interested.

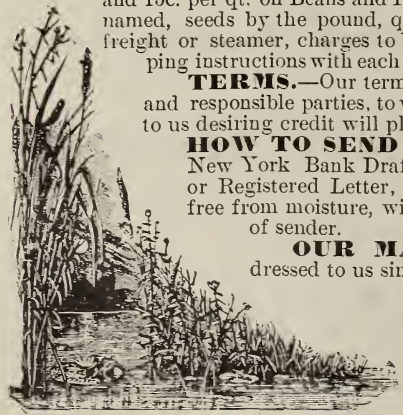
**CATALOGUE NUMBERS.**—For brevity and the convenience of our correspondents, we have prefixed a catalogue number to each variety of seed, which can be used when ordering or referring to any kind.

**POSTAGE.**—Seeds in packets and ounces will be prepaid to any Post-office. If larger quantities are to be sent by mail, add to order for postage at the rate of 8c per lb. and 15c. per qt. on Beans and Peas, and 10c. per qt. for Sweet Corn. At prices named, seeds by the pound, quart and bushel will be shipped by express, freight or steamer, charges to be paid by party receiving the same. Send shipping instructions with each order.

**TERMS.**—Our terms are CASH with order, except to old customers and responsible parties, to whom special terms are made. Parties unknown to us desiring credit will please send satisfactory reference with order.

**HOW TO SEND MONEY.**—Remittance should be made by New York Bank Draft, Postal Money Order, Express Money Order, or Registered Letter, at our risk. Postage stamps, when clean and free from moisture, will be taken in small amounts, but at the risk of sender.

**OUR MAIL** is so large that communications addressed to us simply New York go direct in our post-office box.

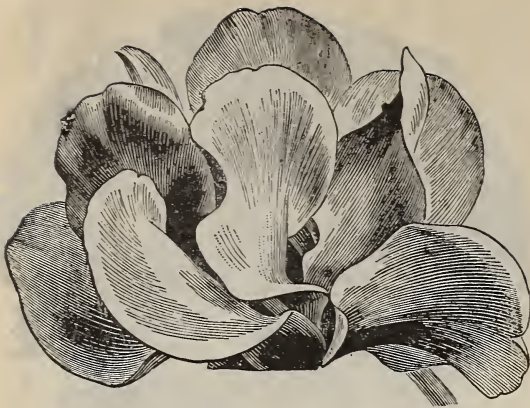
