### The British Transport Commission (Male Wages Grades Pensions) (Amendment) Regulations, 1960

<i>Made</i> - - - -	27th April, 1960
<i>Laid before Parliament</i>	3rd May, 1960
<i>Coming into Operation</i>	4th May, 1960

The Minister of Transport in exercise of his powers under section 98 of the Transport Act, 1947(a), and of all other powers him enabling in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1.—(1) These Regulations shall come into operation on the fourth day of May, 1960, and may be cited as the British Transport Commission (Male Wages Grades Pensions) (Amendment) Regulations, 1960.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889(b), shall apply for the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The Rules of the British Transport Commission (Male Wages Grades) Pension Scheme as set out in the Schedule to the British Transport Commission (Male Wages Grades Pensions) Regulations, 1954(c), as amended by the British Transport Commission (Male Wages Grades Pensions) (Amendment) Regulations, 1957(d), shall be amended as follows :

(1) After Rule 5 there shall be inserted the following Rule :—

“ Transferred staff. 5A. A member of a salaried staff superannuation fund or scheme who is transferred within the employment of the Commission to a grade or class not eligible for membership of such salaried staff fund or scheme shall, on ceasing to contribute to that fund or scheme and whether or not he remains a member thereof become a member of Section A or Sections A and B in accordance with the provisions of Rules 4 (b) and 5 (c) notwithstanding that he may have passed his 45 birthday but provided that he can by minimum pensionable age complete 20 years' continuous employment as defined in Rule 4 (a).”

(2) At the end of Rule 14 (a) there shall be inserted the following proviso :

“ Provided that in the case of a person to whom Rule 5A applies, entitlement to a pension under this subsection shall not be conditional upon his having been a member of Section A for ten years or more.”

(3) At the end of Rule 15 there shall be inserted the following proviso :

“ Provided that in the case of a person to whom Rule 5A applies entitlement to a pension under this Rule shall not be conditional upon his having been a member of Section A for ten years or more.”

(4) At the end of paragraph (b) of Rule 26, there shall be inserted the words “ and shall, if he is not already a member of Section B, become a member of Section B provided that he has not passed his 64th birthday.”

(5) For Rule 30 there shall be substituted the following Rule :

“Any person to whom Rule 16 (a), Rule 17 (a) or Rule 19 (a) (ii) has been applied who subsequently re-enters the service may be re-admitted to membership of the Scheme, notwithstanding the provisions of Rule 4 (b), on such terms and conditions as the Central Committee may decide.”

(6) In Rule 32 for the word “five” there shall be inserted the word “ten”.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)*

These Regulations amend the Rules of the British Transport Commission (Male Wage Grades) Pension Scheme.

The amendments make provision for :

- (a) A member of a Salaried Staff Superannuation Fund, who is transferred within the employment of the Commission in certain circumstances, to become a member of the Pension Scheme, notwithstanding that he has passed his 45th birthday.
- (b) A member of Section A who is promoted to salaried status and remains a member of the Pension Scheme to become a member of Section B, provided he has not passed his 64th birthday.
- (c) A member who has left the Commission's service and later re-enters it to be re-admitted to membership of the Pension Scheme, notwithstanding that he does not re-enter the Commission's service within two years of the date on which he lost his employment with the Commission.
- (d) The maximum period of membership of the Central Committee of Trade Union Nominees who are not members of the Scheme to be extended from five to ten years.
