

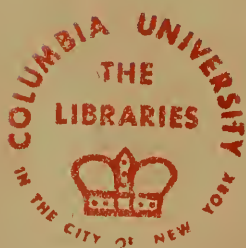
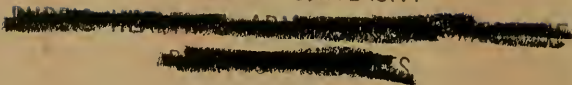
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


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REPORT ON VITAL STATISTICS.

NEW YORK, January 1, 1879.

EMMONS CLARK,

Secretary of the Board of Health :

SIR—I have the honor to submit a report on the Vital Statistics of the City of New York for the year 1878.

That portion of the report which relates to births, marriages and still-births will be presented by Dr. John T. Nagle, the Deputy Register, as in former years, while my attention will be restricted to the presentation of the year's mortality.

The deaths from all causes during the year were 27,008, on an estimated population of 1,083,371, giving a death-rate of 24.93 per 1,000 persons. Of this number, 13,997 were males, and 13,011 were females; 8,990 were foreign born, and there were 12,410 deaths among children under five years old.

This mortality was distributed among the five great classes of diseases as follows, viz.: zymotic diseases, 7,648; constitutional, 6,436;

local, 10,213; developmental, 1,701; and deaths from violence, 1,010.

The mortality was remarkably equable, so far as the influence of the seasons was concerned. Thus, in the first quarter, there were 6,664 deaths; in the second quarter, 6,334; in the third, 7,645; and in the fourth, 6,365.

CLASS 1. Of the various zymotic diseases it will be noticed that there were but two deaths from small-pox, while there were four from chicken-pox. There were 272 deaths from measles, 1,099 from scarlatina, 1,007 from diphtheria, 499 from croup, 382 from whooping cough, 2,451 from diarrhœa, and 245 from typhoid fever. There were 149 attributed to syphilis; there were two deaths from hydrophobia, and a single one each to trichinosis and malignant pustule.

CLASS 2. *Constitutional Diseases.*—There were 132 deaths from rheumatism, 570 deaths from carcinomatous affections, of which number 263 were males and 475 were females. There were 5,698 deaths from the different tubercular diseases, out of which 4,466 fell to phthisis pulmonalis.

CLASS 3. *Local Diseases.*—This class, always formidable, was represented by 10,213 deaths, being 37.81 per cent. of the entire mortality. There were 2,410 deaths from diseases of the nervous system; the respiratory organs gave a mortality of 3,762; there were 1,175 deaths from diseases of the organs of digestion, and 1,341 from diseases of the urinary system.

CLASS 4. *Developmental Diseases*.—There were 506 deaths from premature births, and 433 from senile debility.

CLASS 5. *Deaths by Violence*.—Of the 1,010 deaths in this class, 809 were attributed to accidents and negligence, 58 were homicidal, and there were 142 deaths from suicide.

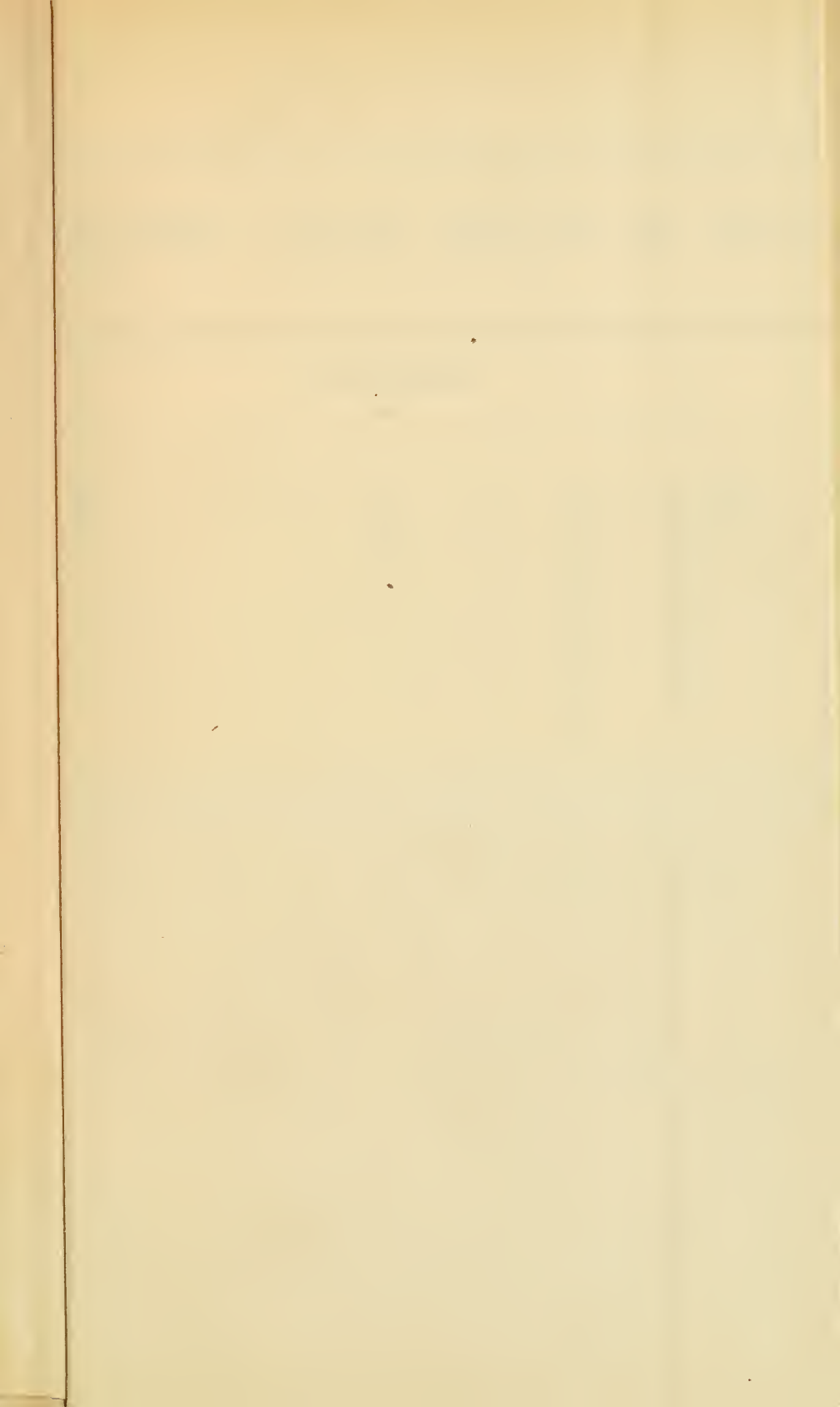

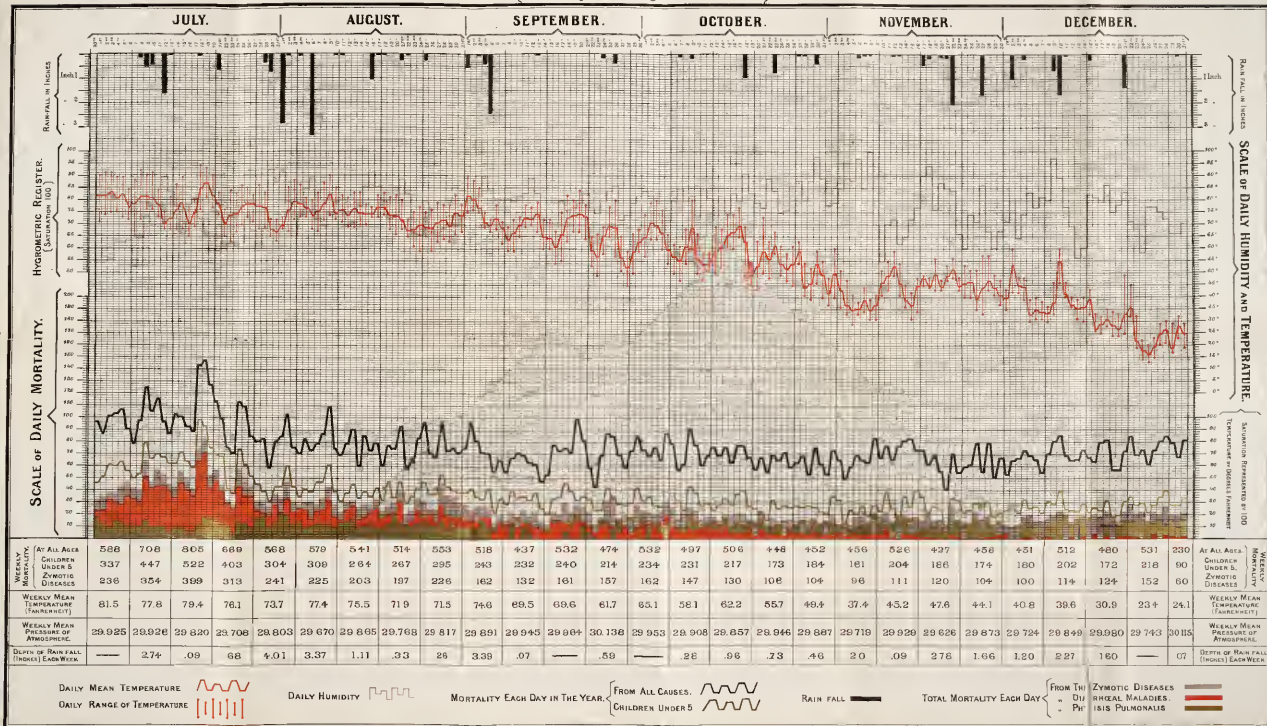

DEATHS FROM ZYMOTIC DISEASES.

A study of the following quarterly tables will be interesting, as confirming the recognized connection between the seasons and the various zymotic diseases.

While the total mortality for these four periods varies within narrow limits, the zymotic mortality is more sensitive, as the figures show, viz. : First quarter, 1,456; second quarter, 1,567; third quarter, 3,038, and fourth quarter, 1,587.

The contagious diseases—scarlatina, diphtheria, and measles—obey for the most part the general law of contagion, and prevail in the cooler weather when the city is filled with people, and when doors and windows are kept shut, as for example :

On the other hand, malarial fever and diarrhœal diseases thrive in the warmer months, the latter running as follows: First quarter, 122 deaths; second quarter, 389 deaths; third quarter, 2,119 deaths, and fourth quarter, 315 deaths, while malarial fever reaches a maximum of 112 deaths in the third quarter; whooping-cough, with a total mortality of 382, reaches its maximum of 138 deaths in the third quarter. Typhoid fever is responsible for 33 deaths in the first quarter, 29 in the second, 93 in the third, and 90 in the fourth.

The statement of the comparative mortality from prominent causes of death for the years 1877 and 1878 is a very instructive one. During these years there was a general depression in business circles, emigration was at a low ebb, and the growth of the city seemed to be suspended. There were no great epidemics; the contagious diseases were in abeyance, and there were no long-continued extremes of heat and cold. The effect of these conditions is seen in a comparatively moderate mortality for both years. The difference between the deaths of the two years was only 805, and when we compare the deaths under the various headings we find them nearly alike. There were 612 more deaths from Diarrhœa in 1877 than in 1878, while on the other hand there were 422 more deaths from Phthisis Pulmonalis in 1878, but in other items the difference is generally insignificant.

Similar causes produced similar effects. It is such a result as this that gives interest and value to vital statistics and it is a result that does not often occur on so large a scale.

Phthisis Pulmonalis is charged with 4,466 deaths during the year, giving a percentage of 16.54 on the mortality from all causes, a percentage somewhat in excess of the average mortality for the last 59 years, which was 14.36. Indeed we are obliged to look back to the year 1843 to find so relatively high a death-toll to this disease.

Of this entire number 2,256 were males and 2,210 were females. As regards nativity, 1,880 were born in this country, 1,473 were born in Ireland, 689 were Germans, while the countries of 424 were unknown.

Of these decedents, 428 were less than 57 years old; between the ages of 5 and 10 years there were 438 deaths, while in those from 10 years old and upwards there were 3,344 deaths.

The ages of 256 were unknown, and there were 120 deaths among people of color.

The weight of mortality rested most heavily on those between the ages of 20 and 35, the maximum occurring at 25 years.

As regards the seasons, March with its 417 deaths was the most fatal month, though December with 403 fatal cases disputed its bad pre-eminence.

Among the following tables is one showing the mortality by wards, and another showing the distribution of 981 deaths among the public institutions. A table will be found showing the deaths from Phthisis since 1820, with the annual percentage on the total mortality.

There is also the usual table showing the occupations of those who died from Phthisis. While the influence of occupation upon this disease is a matter of even popular recognition, it is more than doubtful if we can draw reliable conclusions alone, without knowing also the relative number of persons engaged in the various pursuits.

Of the 223 deaths certified in the following tables as having been due directly or remotely to intemperance, 46 were natives of the United States, and 173 were foreigners. Of this last number 10 were of English origin, 36 were Germans, and 108 were Irish. As regards their sex and social condition, 147 were males, and 76 were females; 58 were single, 125 were married, and 24 were widowed, while the condition of 16 was unknown.

The prominent causes of death are seen to have been Bright's disease of the kidneys, with 43 deaths; delirium tremens, with 18 deaths; gastritis, with 16 deaths; congestion of the brain and apoplexy, with 14 deaths; pneumonia, with 13 deaths, and cirrhosis of the liver, with 7 deaths. Ten deaths are charged simply to "intemperance."

The table of the various occupations of the decedents does not seem to be of value as illustrating any connection between avocation and intemperance. It will be noticed that nearly one-half of those dying had no occupation whatever, but it is probable that this was a result of the habit rather than the cause.

The year compares favorably with previous ones in the reported cases of death from alcohol, as will be seen from the following table, viz. :

There would seem to be no reason to doubt the reliability of this comparison, since medical certificates are becoming more accurate every year. Human nature not having changed materially during the last decade, the medical profession probably continue to report about the same classes dying of alcoholic stimulants that they did ten years ago. And if this is so, we may perhaps be justified in regarding this comparative table with encouragement.

It is not necessary to remind the experienced statistician, however, that many times 223 persons have died in New York during the year past from the intemperate use of alcoholics. It is only the outcast and friendless sot that secures a true death certificate. As we rise in the social scale the poison of alcohol loses its potency. The wealthy and favored classes do not die of it. This is natural, and will always be so. When the only good to be expected from a harsh truth is dry statistical information, the tender hand of the good physician will often refuse to give pain to the friends of his poor patient, or "draw his frailties from their dread abode."

During the year 1878 there were 142 persons in the city who took their own lives. Of this number 22 were native born, 14 were of Irish birth, while Germany, as usual the heaviest contributor, gave 58. The tables show that of the whole number 42 were single, 83 were married, 9 were widowed, while the condition of 8 was unknown. The chosen means of exit was by cutting instruments in 18 instances, by drowning in 8 cases, the pistol in 38 cases, hanging in 24, and poisoning in 45.

There were 1,010 violent deaths in New York during the year 1878 ; and of these deaths 128 were due to fractures and contusions—street railroads causing 34, steam-cars 26, and other vehicles 32 deaths. There were 90 deaths from burns and scalds. Falls of various kinds killed 236 persons, including 19 falls in the streets, 55 falls from roofs, 34 falls down stairs, and 16 through hatchways. There were 24 deaths from accidental poisoning.

During the year there were 85 persons who deceased at the age of 90 years or over. Sixteen of them reached 100 years and upwards. The females, numbering 64, greatly exceeded the males, of whom there were but 21. Of the whole number, 85, there were 26 from the United States, three of whom were colored, 5 from Germany, 4 from England, 3 from Poland, and one each from France and Scotland, while Ireland contributed 45, or more than half.

Six of these nonagenarians were single, 2 were married at the time of death, 73 were widowed or had lost their wives, while in regard to 4, their condition is not stated.

The student of our vital statistics will notice that for several years past our annual mortality has not varied much from year to year, but on the whole, has been a pretty constant quantity. Not only has the grand total remained about the same, but the individual diseases which have contributed to it have maintained about the same numerical proportions to each other. It is generally accepted that an unusual mortality is to be explained by unusual circumstances, and that it is far from being a matter of accident or caprice. The extraordinary circumstances affecting the death-rate of a city, are a marked increase or diminution in its population ; epidemics, especially those from contagious diseases, and sudden changes of temperature, with extremes of heat and cold. These have not been present of late years as prominent features.

In closing this report, I have occasion to again acknowledge the receipt from Professor Daniel Draper, Observer of the Central Park Observatory, of the interesting and instructive meteorological tables, which are to be found in this volume—and to return thanks to the clerks who have been engaged upon the records during the year, as well as to Dr. John T. Nagle, Deputy Register, whose report on the births, still-births and marriages, for 1878, will be found immediately following.

SIR—I have the honor to report that during the year ending December 31, 1878, there were 25,729 births, 7,629 marriages, 2,192 still-births, and 27,005 deaths * (of this number, 3,033 certificates of death and still-birth were received from the Coroners,) reported to this Bureau. During the same period 158 permits were granted to remove bodies from various city cemeteries and vaults, and 1,207 were issued to pass bodies through this city. There were 200 transcripts from the record of birth, 188 of marriage, and 1,168 of death granted, and 1,614 searches of the records made.

BIRTHS.

The returns of birth still continue to be incomplete, the number returned during the year was but 25,729, which represents an annual birth-rate of 23.75 per 1,000 of the estimated population. There were fully 12,000 births that took place in this city and which were not reported to this Bureau during the year. Of the number of births that were reported, 25,381 were white and 348 were colored ; 13,154 were males and 12,575 were females ; 14,697 children had foreign-born parents and 5,920 had native-born parents ; 3,465 had foreign-born fathers and native-born mothers, while 1,338 had native-born fathers and foreign-born mothers ; 26 returns had the nativity of the fathers stated only, of this number 20 were foreign and 6 native ; 259 certificates had the nativity of the mother stated only, of this number 151 were native and 108 foreign-born. The given-name was stated on 19,893 certificates, and on 5,836 certificates the given-name was not determined upon when the certificates were returned to this Bureau.

The age of one mother was reported to be 14 years, and another mother reported as 15 years, gave birth to her second child ; 1,533 children were born to mothers between the ages of 15 and 20 years ; 5,817 to mothers whose ages ranged from 20 to 25 years ;

There were 2,535 certificates received in which the age of the mother, and 2,757 in which the age of the father, was not stated.

The highest number of children borne by any native mother was 14 ; 5 women who were born in the United States gave birth to their fourteenth child, and the highest number of children borne by any foreign-born mother was 17 ; 3 women who were born in foreign countries having given birth to their seventeenth child during the year. The number of native-born women who gave birth to their first child was 2,840 ; to their second child, 1,927 ; to their third, 1,426 ; to their fourth, 991 ; to their fifth, 626 ; to their sixth, 388 ; to their seventh,

241 ; to their eighth, 180 ; to their ninth, 122 ; to their tenth, 66 ; to their eleventh, 39 ; to their twelfth, 17 ; to their thirteenth, 8 ; to their fourteenth, 5. The number of foreign-born mothers who gave birth to their first child was 2,611 ; to their second child, 2,307 ; to their third, 2,241 ; to their fourth, 1,927 ; to their fifth, 1,561 ; to their sixth, 1,189 ; to their seventh, 875 ; to their eighth, 640 ; to their ninth, 418 ; to their tenth, 274 ; to their eleventh, 151 ; to their twelfth, 70 ; to their thirteenth, 44 ; to their fourteenth, 15 ; to their fifteenth, 10 ; to their sixteenth, 4 ; to their seventeenth, 3.

There were 257 multiple births during the year. Of this number 254 were twins, and 3 were triplet births. Of the multiple births, 93 mothers and 86 fathers were born in Ireland ; 76 mothers and 62 fathers were born in the United States ; 47 mothers and 65 fathers were born in Germany ; 7 mothers and 16 fathers were born in England ; 7 mothers and 7 fathers were born in Bohemia ; 5 mothers and 5 fathers were born in Austria ; 4 mothers and 1 father were born in Switzerland ; 3 mothers each were born in British America and Sweden, and 4 fathers were born in Sweden ; 2 mothers each were born in Holland, Italy, Poland, Russia and Scotland ; 2 fathers were born in Italy, 1 in Poland, 2 in Russia and 1 in Scotland ; 1 mother each was born in France and West Indies ; and 2 fathers were born in France and 1 in West Indies. Of the triplet births, 1 father and 1 mother were born in Germany, and 2 fathers and 2 mothers were born in Ireland.

The nativity of the mothers of children born during the year was in the following countries, viz. : Austria, 214 ; Bohemia, 537 ; British America, 153 ; England, 754 ; France, 267 ; Germany, 7,788 ; Ireland, 5,180 ; Italy, 144 ; Poland, 408 ; Scotland, 178 ; Switzerland, 100 ; and the United States, 9,536. The nativity of 50 mothers was not stated, and the balance were in other foreign countries than those specified.

The nativity of the fathers of the children born during the year was in the following countries, viz.: Austria, 255 ; Bohemia, 525 ; British America, 143 ; England, 746 ; France, 327 ; Germany, 9,265 ; Ireland, 5,279 ; Italy, 181 ; Poland, 465 ; Russia, 100 ; Scotland, 253 ; Switzerland, 114 ; Sweden, 113 ; United States, 7,264 ; 2 were born at sea, 283 were of unknown birth, and the balance were natives of other foreign countries. It will be seen from the returns that the births of children of Irish parents are considerably less than those returned of German parentage, showing greater neglect to comply with the law on the part of those who practice midwifery among the Irish than of those who practice midwifery among the Germans.

MARRIAGES.

The number of marriages reported to have occurred in this city during the year was 7,629 ; this represents an annual rate of 7.04 marriages to every 1,000 of the estimated population. The returns of marriage, like those of birth, are also incomplete ; fully 20 per cent. of those that take place in this city are not received by this Bureau. This is particularly noticeable among the Irish population. The number of persons of this nationality who were reported to have been married during the year was 1,460, and the number of persons of German nativity who were married during the year was 3,775. The Irish population is larger than the German, but the marriages of persons of German nativity were more than double the number of the marriages reported of persons of Irish birth. This great difference should not exist, and shows that there is a neglect to comply with the law, of persons who solemnize marriage among the Irish.

7,435 of the grooms who were married during the year were white, and 194 were colored ; 7,447 of the brides were white and 182 were colored ; it therefore appears that 12 colored men were married to white women, and one white man married a colored woman.

5,988 grooms were married for the first time, 1,104 the second time, 71 the third time, 2 the fourth time; and on 464 marriage certificates the number of the groom's marriage was not stated. 6,127 brides were married the first time, 887 the second time, 33 the third time; and on 582 the number of the bride's marriage was omitted.

The age of 189 grooms was under 20 years, 2645 were between 20 and 25, 2249 were between 25 and 30, 1130 " " 30 " 35, 624 " " 35 " 40, 334 " " 40 " 45, 186 " " 45 " 50, 109 " " 50 " 55, 66 " " 55 " 60, 24 " " 60 " 65, 17 " " 65 " 70, 10 " " 70 " 80, 1 was " 80 " 90 years and the ages of 43 were not stated.

The age of 1,959 brides was under 20 years, 3122 were between 20 and 25 years, 1312 between 25 and 30 years, 546 between 30 and 35 years, 337 between 35 and 40 years, 146 " 40 " 45 " 80 " 45 " 50 " 35 " 50 " 55 " 14 " 55 " 60 " 1 " 60 " 65 " 2 " 65 " 70 " 1 " 70 " 80 " and the age of 73 was not stated.

The nativity of 79 brides was stated as Austria, 105 as Bohemia, 62 British America, 242 England, 88 France, 1,604 Germany, 777 Ireland, 109 Italy, 65 Scotland, 58 Switzerland, 4,112 United States; 4 were born at sea, 118 had no birth-place stated, and the balance were natives of other foreign countries. 5 Chinamen were married during the year to white women; 2 of the women were born in Ireland and 3 in the United States.

The table of ages of those married will show some interesting features. In one instance a bachelor at the age of 88 years married a

spinster of 23 years, while a spinster whose age was between 40 and 45 years, married a bachelor between 20 and 25 years; 1 widow between 50 and 55 years married a bachelor between 30 and 35 years, and another widow between 55 and 60 years, married a bachelor between 45 and 50 years; 2 spinsters between 20 and 25 years were married to widowers, one of whom was between 65 and 70 years and the other between 70 and 75 years; and 1 widower between 75 and 80 years, married a spinster between 50 and 55 years; another widower, between 40 and 45 years, married a spinster between 50 and 55 years; and another widower, between 80 and 85 years, married a spinster between 45 and 50 years. A widow whose age was between 40 and 45 years, married a widower between 75 and 80 years; and another widow, between 20 and 25 years, married a widower between 65 and 70 years.

STILL-BIRTHS.

2,192 still-born infants were reported to this Bureau during the year; of this number 1,229 were males, 946 were females, and the sex of 17 was not stated. The period of utero-gestation of 1 was stated as the 1st month, 13 as the 2d, 33 as the 3d, 79 as the 4th, 123 as the 5th, 234 as the 6th, 279 as the 7th, 336 as the 8th, 1,062 as the 9th, 21 as the 10th, and the period of utero-gestation of 8 was not stated.

725 of the mothers and 608 of the fathers of the still-born children were natives of the United States, 589 mothers and 557 fathers were born in Ireland, 526 mothers and 626 fathers were born in Germany, 65 mothers and 52 fathers were born in England, 42 mothers and 51 fathers were born in Italy, 32 mothers and 36 fathers were born in Poland, 17 mothers and 18 fathers were born in Bohemia, 10 mothers and 16 fathers were born in Austria, 11 mothers and 8 fathers were born in the West Indies, 114 mothers and 139 fathers were of un-

known birth, and the balance were born in other foreign countries than those specified.

The returns in the earlier periods of utero-gestation are not complete ; those of a later period are nearly complete, as they are generally interred in cemeteries where a burial permit is required.

The number of permits issued for the burial of those who died in this city during the year was 27,005, and for the burial of still-born infants was 2,192. The largest number of the dead and still-born of New York was interred in Calvary Cemetery, Lutheran, City and Greenwood Cemeteries, following in the order named.

12,433 of the dead and 892 still-births, or 45.64 per cent. of the still-born and those who died during the year, were buried in denominational cemeteries ; of this number, 673 of the dead and 82 of the still-born, were buried in Jewish cemeteries ; 11,043 of the dead and 768 of the still-born, were buried in Roman Catholic cemeteries ; 171 of the dead and 10 of the still-born, were buried in the Methodist Episcopal cemeteries ; 187 of the dead and 10 of the still-born, were buried in Methodist Protestant cemeteries ; and 359 of the dead and 22 of the still-born, were buried in Protestant Episcopal cemeteries.

There were 2,772 unclaimed bodies and 493 still-births, buried at the expense of the city in City Cemetery ; and 75 of the immigrant dead and 11 still-births, were buried at Ward's Island, at the expense of the Commissioners of Emigration.

REPORT ON VITAL STATISTICS.

NEW YORK, January 1, 1880.

EMMONS CLARK,

Secretary of the Board of Health:

SIR—I have the honor herewith to submit the report upon the Vital Statistics of the City of New York, for the year 1879.

That part of the report which pertains to births, marriages and still-births has been prepared, as usual, by Dr. John T. Nagle, the Deputy Register, and will be found immediately following the report on the mortality of the year. The registration of births continues to be incomplete and to fall very far short of being a perfect record. Such questions, therefore, as concern the ratio of the deaths to the increase of population, and the development of the National family from out of the various nationalities that come to us, cannot be intelligently considered while the data are so inaccurate. At almost every meeting of the Board, the economic value of the registration of births is attested by importunities on the part of parents to be allowed to atone for the neglect of bygone years, which has prevented their children from securing an inheritance, and in some instances they have invoked the aid of the Courts to compel the registration.

My attention will be confined in this report to the Mortuary Statistics for the year. The number of deaths reported from all causes whatsoever, was 28,342, which, on an estimated population of 1,097,563, gives a death-rate of 25.82 per thousand.

Of this whole number, 14,807 were males, and 13,535 were females; there were 18,804 among natives of the United States, and 9,538 among foreigners; there were 442 deaths among people of color; there were 12,777 deaths among children under five years of age; and there were 15,055 deaths in tenement houses.

This mortality was distributed through the different seasons as follows, viz.: During the first quarter, the deaths numbered 7,576; during the second quarter, they decreased to 6,606; they rose in the third quarter to 7,686, this being the summer quarter, and fell again in the fourth to 6,474.

As in former years, the nomenclature and classification of diseases was that adopted by the "Royal College of Physicians," of London.

Among the classes, the deaths were thus apportioned, viz.: 1st, zymotic diseases had 7,994 deaths; 2d, constitutional diseases had 6,417 deaths; 3d, local diseases had 11,082 deaths; 4th, developmental diseases had 1,844 deaths; and 5th, deaths by violence had 1,005 deaths.

1. *Zymotic Diseases*.—The deaths from this interesting group were much below the average for the five years immediately preceding. There were but 25 deaths from small-pox, the average for the previous five years having been 419. Measles resulted fatally in 244 instances, the average for the last five years having been 255. Scarletina, on the other hand, reached the formidable figures 1,477, the average for the period above referred to having been 873.1. Diphtheria again

fell to 671 deaths, the average having been 1,540.1. There were 2,965 deaths from diarrhœal diseases, the average for the preceding five years having been 3,518.1.

2. *Constitutional Diseases.*—The following were all slightly in excess of the five years' average, viz. : Rheumatism with 165 deaths ; cancer with 572, and phthisis pulmonalis with 4,343 deaths.

3. *Local Diseases.*—Of these, nervous diseases are credited with 2,486 fatal cases ; apoplexy and cerebral congestion were responsible for 623 deaths ; convulsions resulted fatally in 666 instances, while a mortality of 536 was attributed to meningitis. There were 1,266 deaths from diseases of the circulatory apparatus, and 4,165 from diseases of the organs of respiration—1,263 being due to bronchitis, and 2,554 to pneumonia.

4. *Developmental Diseases.*—Among children, the deaths from diseases of this class were 987, while among women there were 311 deaths. Old age, with its complications, furnished 433 deaths.

5. *Deaths from Violence or Casualties of various kinds.*—This class, which is almost peculiar to large cities, is an exceedingly interesting one, but it presents so many separate topics, that its consideration may best be deferred until we reach the special tables dedicated to it.

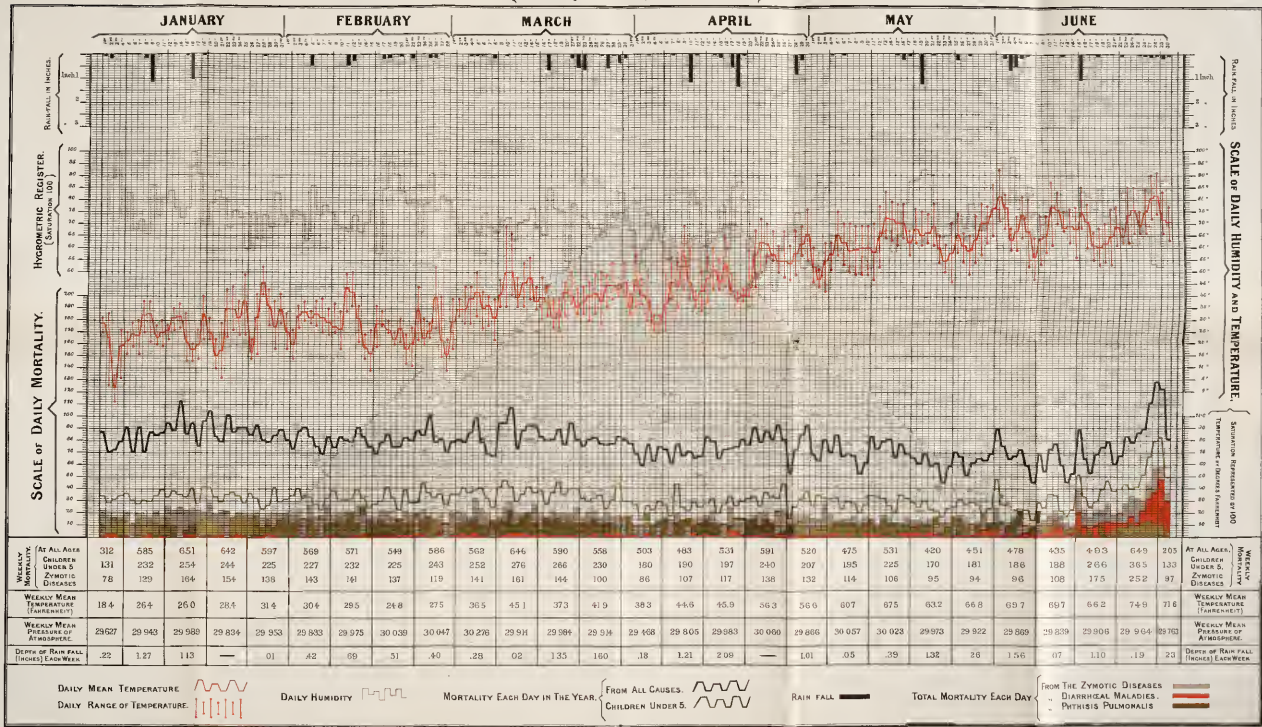

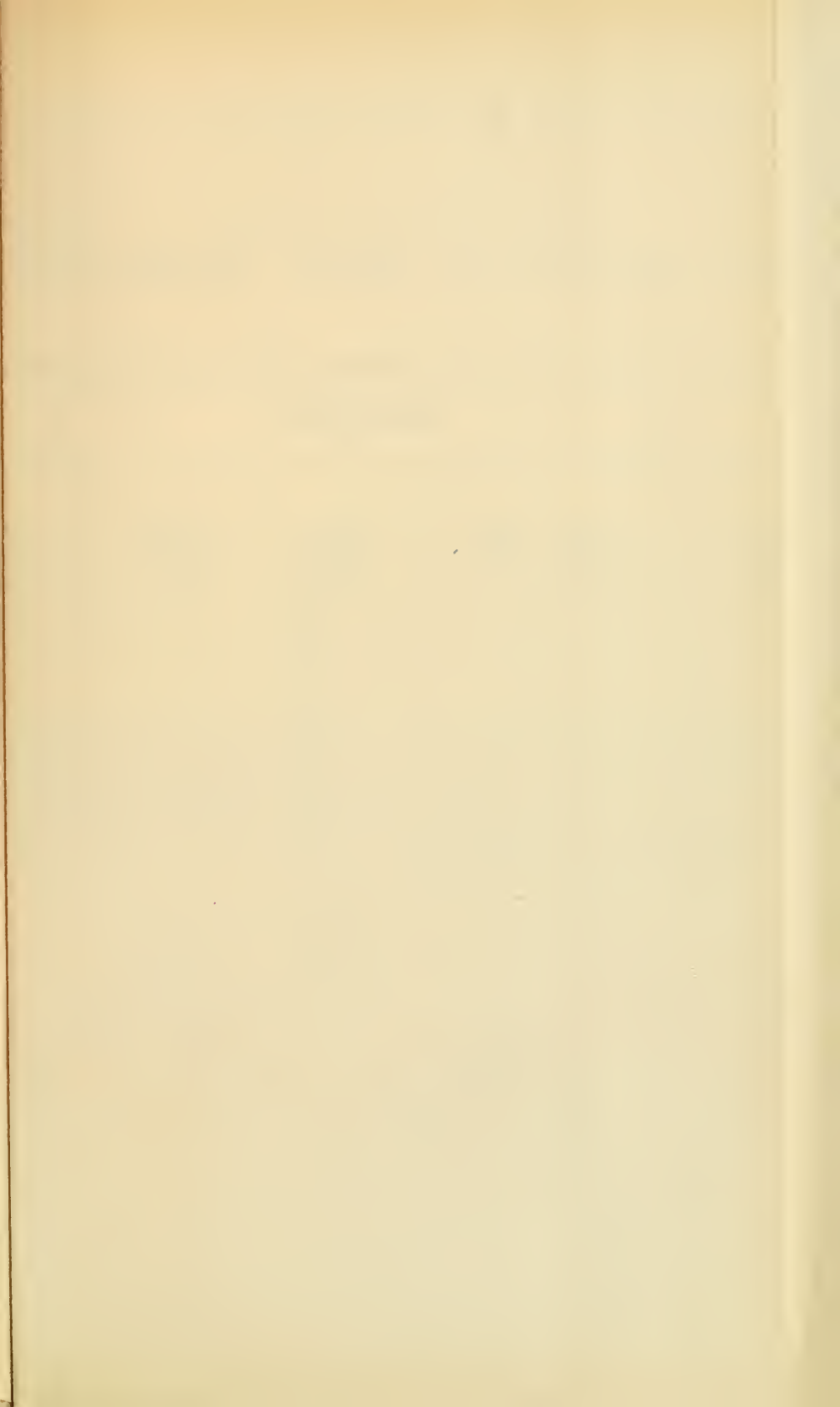

(With Daily Meteorological Observations.)

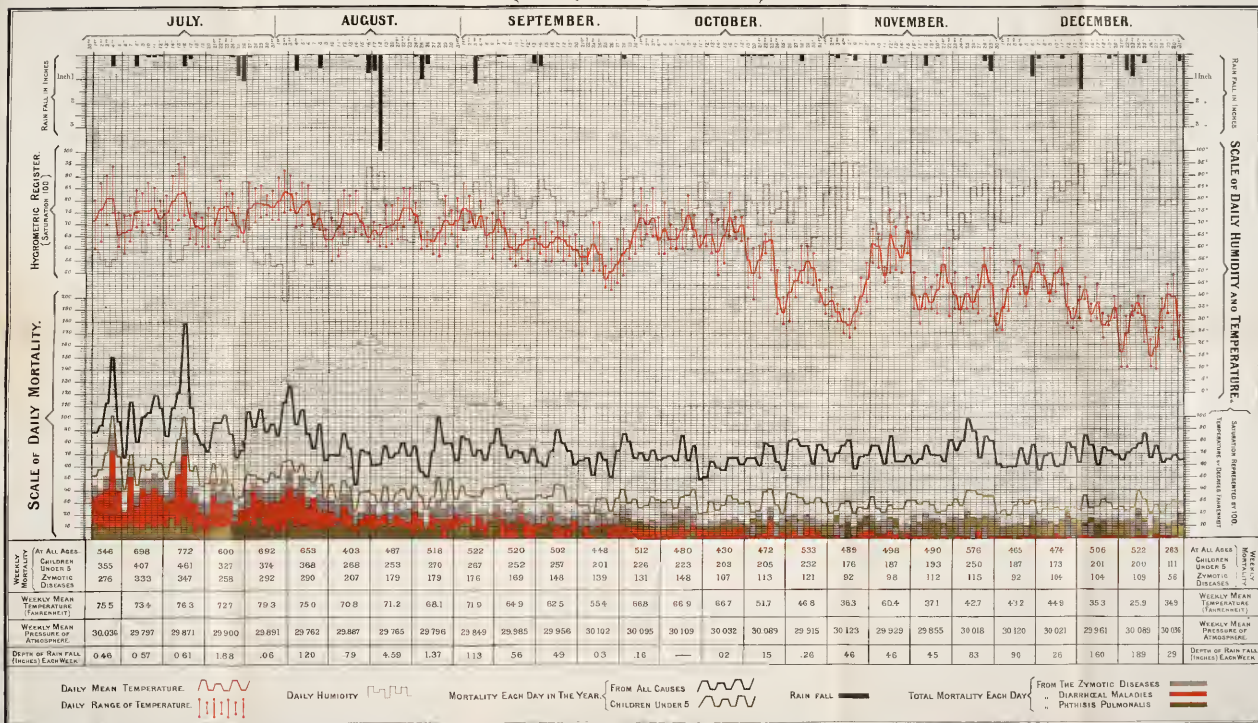

ZYMOTIC DISEASES.

It will be seen by the following tables that the total annual mortality from Zymotic diseases was 7,994, which is a favorable showing as compared with previous years.

As regards the distribution among the seasons of the deaths from the various causes, it will be seen that there were in the first quarter 1,816 deaths ; in the second, 1,683 ; in the third, 3,063 ; and in the fourth, 1,432. There were 25 deaths from small-pox ; 1,477 from scarlet fever ; 671 from diphtheria ; 537 from whooping-cough ; 244 from measles ; 178 from typhoid fever ; 390 from malarial fevers ; while the combined diarrhœal diseases were responsible for 2,965 deaths. The practical absence of small-pox will be remarked. There is nothing especially noticeable in the variations of the other diseases, excepting that in the fourth quarter measles assumed a brief importance.

The following tables of the weekly mortality for the year, from the five great classes of diseases, are made up, as usual, into quarters. The totals for each quarter maintain their ordinary relative proportions, the deaths in the summer months preponderating. The healthiest week in the year was that ending October 18, in which the deaths fell to 430, while the highest mortality occurred in the week ending July 19, when there were 772 deaths.

The most noticeable variations between the different classes will be observed to have occurred among the zymotic and local diseases.

As will be seen by the following tables, there were 4,343 deaths from phthisis pulmonalis in the city during the year, which constitutes 15.32 per cent. of the mortality from all causes whatsoever. Of these decedents from consumption 2,280 were males, and 2,063 were females. The native population paid a death toll of 1,861, while 2,482 were of foreign birth.

As regards the seasons of the year, the mortality was pretty evenly distributed, though slightly in excess in January and March.

The various public institutions of the city had 1,042 deaths from phthisis.

The following tables on the mortality from predominant causes of death, day by day, in the year 1879, with the daily record of mean temperature and mean barometric pressure, show the effects of climatic influences on the death-rate to have been much as in former years, but in reading the figures we should remember that from October until June the population of the city is much greater than during the summer months, when the schools are closed and the city is comparatively empty; and this element of a changing population, which is an especial feature of New York, is of sufficient importance to be taken into account.

As regards the total mortality, May was the most favorable month, though others approached it closely, while July was by far the most fatal one. Zymotic diseases reached a maximum of 1,422 deaths in July, and a minimum of 447 in December. Deaths from Diarrhœal diseases were at their ebb during the first five months of the year, averaging only 46 per month, but with the rising temperature of June they sprang from 59 in the previous month to 355, and the next month reached 1,079, dropping to 651 in August and gradually declining, until, in the month of December, the mortality from these causes was reduced to 40. Diphtheria, Croup and Scarlatina prevailed in the first three months of the year, their combined maximum being 394 in January. The number of deaths from these diseases gradually decreased to 96 in August, rising gradually to 191 in December.

Of the 1,932 deaths which were the subjects of Coroners' inquests, 138 were attributed to accidents and negligence; 28 to accidental poisoning, and 32 to accidental suffocation. Accidental falls resulted fatally in 272 cases, and there were 97 deaths from accidental burns and scalds. There were 81 persons killed by various vehicles in the streets, of which number 22 were destroyed by steam-cars, and 24 by horse-cars. There were 145 cases of supposed accidental drowning, 48 homicidal deaths, and 117 deaths from suicide.

In concluding this report, it is proper to reiterate the statements so often made before, that the comparatively high death-rate of New York, as compared with many other cities, is more apparent than real, and does not indicate a condition of things comparatively insalubrious.

It is generally conceded that the most sensitive test of the sanitary condition of a community is to be found in the percentage which the mortality of children under five years of age bears to the total mortality, at all ages, for a given period. Accepting this standard, the following table shows a gradual gain in favor of life since the organization of a Board of Health in 1866, which, if not entirely satisfactory, is at least exceedingly gratifying.

The grateful acknowledgments of the Board continue to be due to Prof. Daniel Draper, Observer of Central Park Observatory, for the interesting meteorological tables, and I embrace this opportunity of expressing my appreciation of the intelligent and faithful services of Dr. John T. Nagle, Deputy Register; and of the various clerks in charge of the records of the Board.

SIR—I have the honor to submit the accompanying report in regard to the births, marriages, still-births, disposition of the dead, etc., of this city, during the year ending December 31, 1879 :

BIRTHS.

The number of children that were reported to this Bureau as having been born alive in this city during the year 1879 was 25,573 ; this is a decrease of 156 when compared with the number reported during the preceding year, and represents an annual birth-rate of 23.29 to every 1,000 of the population, which was estimated in the middle of the year at 1,097,563.

The returns of births received by this Bureau during the year are incomplete, and represent but about 65 per cent. of the total which took place in the city. Returns of births have been received from 26 American cities, and there is scarcely one of them that can boast of completeness in this branch of statistics. In a number of cities in the United States there is no record of births kept.

From the returns that have been received during the year, 25,236 certificates showed that the color of the children who were born during this period were white, and 337 were colored. 13,269 of them were males, and 12,303 were females, and the sex of one was not stated. 14,028 were reported to have been of foreign-born parentage, and 6,223 were of native-born parentage. 3,648 children had foreign born fathers and native-born mothers, and 1,390 had foreign-born mothers and native-born fathers. Fifteen certificates were received where the nativity of the father was stated, and that of the mother omitted; of this number 10 were native and 5 foreign; and 252 certificates were received where the nativity of the mother only was stated. Of this number 106 were native and 146 foreign-born.

There were seventeen certificates of birth received during the year, where neither the birth-place of the father nor mother was stated, and in 5,637 certificates the given name of the child was not stated.

The largest number of births were reported in March (2,539), and the least in February (1,777). Of the 25,573 children who were born in this city during the year, 7,618 fathers and 10,017 mothers were born in the United States; 8,673 fathers and 7,229 mothers were born in Germany; 5,339 fathers and 5,123 mothers were born in Ireland; 753 fathers and 662 mothers were born in England; 461 fathers and 511 mothers were born in Bohemia; 485 fathers and 394 mothers were born in Poland; 364 fathers and 333 mothers were born in Italy, and 252 fathers and 205 mothers were born in France.

Of the 10,017 children whose mothers were born in the United States, 1,796 had fathers born in Germany; 1,073 had fathers born in Ireland; 302 had fathers born in England; 78 had fathers born in British America; 65 had fathers born in Scotland; 58 had fathers born in France; 46 had fathers born in Austria; 44 had fathers born in the West Indies; 35 had fathers born in Poland; 24 had fathers born in Switzerland; 19 had fathers born in Italy; 21 had fathers born in Denmark; 17 had fathers born in Holland; 12 had fathers born in Norway, and 11 had fathers born in Sweden; 10 each had fathers born in Spain and Russia; 8 had Bohemian fathers; 6 each had Belgian and Welsh fathers; 2 had Mexican fathers, and 1 each had Chinese, South American and Turkish fathers; 1 had a father born at sea, and another had a father born in Europe, while 146 had fathers of unknown nationalities (principally illegitimate). Of the 7,618 children who had American-born fathers, 65 had British-American mothers; 160 had English; 381 had German; 625 had Irish, and 64 had Scotch.

MARRIAGES.

8,446 marriage certificates of persons married in this city were reported to this Bureau during the year 1879; this is an increase of 817 when compared with the number received during the preceding year, and represents an annual marriage-rate of 7.69 to every 1,000 of the estimated population. The marriages returned to this Bureau do not represent all the marriages that take place in this city; the number that were received represent but about 80 per cent. of the total that take place annually.

Of the total marriages received during the year 8,237 were white males and 8,246 were white females, and 209 were colored males and 200 were colored females ; there were, therefore, 9 white females who married colored men. 4,456 of the males and 3,590 of the females who were married during the year were born in foreign countries ; 3,892 males and 4,751 females were native-born ; 3 males were born at sea, and the nativity of 95 males and 105 females was not stated. There were 6,591 males and 6,827 females married for the first time, 1,270 males and 999 females were married the second time, 82 males and 25 females were married the third time, 1 male and 3 females were married the fourth time, and on 502 certificates the number of times the groom was married, and on 592 the number of times the bride was married, was not stated.

The ages of 184 males and 2,077 females were reported to be under 20 years, and the ages of 31 males and 5 females were between 60 and 65 years. 23 males and 2 females were married between 65 and 70 years. 14 males were married between 70 and 80 years of age, and 1 male was married between 80 and 90 years of age.

Of the marriages reported during the year 5,974 bachelors selected spinsters ; 497 bachelors married widows ; 501 widowers married widows, and 789 widowers selected spinsters for wives. One bachelor between 70 and 80 years of age married a spinster whose age was between 35 and 40 years, and one spinster under 20 years married a bachelor between 50 and 55 years ; two widows, aged between 20 and 25 years, married bachelors between 45 and 50 years, and two bachelors under 20 years of age married widows between 20 and 25 years of age ; one widower, between 60 and 65 years, married a spinster under 20 years of age, and one widower aged 87 years married a spinster between 60 and 65 years ; two widowers between 65 and 70 years of age married widows whose ages ranged from 20 to 25 years, and one widower between 70 and 80 years old married a widow between 40 and 45 years of age. In the month of August the least number of marriages took place (515), and in October the largest number were received (976).

Return of marriages were received from 27 American cities, and the rate would indicate that they were reported more completely than the births.

The nativity of 4,751 brides was stated to be in the United States, 1593 were born in Germany, 856 in Ireland, 257 in England, 175 in

Italy, and 122 in Bohemia, and the nativity of 3,892 grooms was stated to be in the United States, 2,165 in Germany, 793 in Ireland, 327 in England, 203 in Italy, 135 in Austria, 122 in France, 114 in Bohemia, and 103 in Russia. The brides that were born in the United States selected husbands from the following nationalities, viz.: Australia 1, Austria 31, Bohemia 14, Belgium 4, British America 41, China 1, Denmark 6, England 162, France 32, Germany 777, Holland 6, Ireland 219, Italy 18, India 1, Mexico 2, Norway 7, Poland 11, Russia 25, Roumania 2, Scotland 37, Sweden 9, Spain 9, South America 1, Switzerland 10, West Indies 28, and Wales 3.

The native-born grooms selected brides who were born in the following foreign countries, viz.: Africa 1, Australia 2, Austria 3, Bohemia 4, Belgium 2, British America 47, Denmark 2, England 98, France 17, Germany 182, Greece 1, Holland 1, Ireland 193, Italy 1, Poland 2, Russia 7, Scotland 20, Sweden 3, Spain and South America 1 each, Switzerland 4, and Wales and the West Indies 3 each.

In the year 1879, 2,191 still-births were reported to this Bureau ; a decrease of one, compared with the number reported during the previous year, and represents a still-birth rate of 1.91 to every 1,000 of the estimated population. There was one still-birth to every 11.66 children reported born alive, and one to every 12.94 deaths. The number of still-births returned to this Bureau represent but about 95 per cent. of the total that have taken place in this city during the year, and this incompleteness is chiefly in the earlier periods of utero-gestation, when the child is so small that it is not interred in any regular cemetery.

1,123 of the still-births were males, 1,061 were females, and the sex of 7 was not stated ; 627 had native-born fathers, and 775 had native-born mothers ; 1,450 had foreign-born fathers, and 1,326 had foreign-born mothers, and the nativity of 114 fathers and 90 mothers was not stated. The highest number of still-births took place in the 9th month of foetal existence, and 17 occurred in the 10th month of utero-gestation. Of the total number of still-births 545 had mothers who were born in Ireland, 535 were born in Germany, 57 were born in England, 33 were born in Bohemia, 31 were born in Poland, 27 were born in Italy, and 21 were born in France ; 635 had German fathers, 511 had Irish, 79 had English, 36 had Polish, 32 had Italian, 31 had Bohemian, and 28 had French.

The 775 still-born infants who were born in New York City of mothers who were born in the United States, had fathers born in the following countries, viz. : Austria, 1 ; Belgium, 1 ; British America, 4 ; England, 25 ; France, 4 ; Germany, 105 ; Ireland, 70 ; Italy, 3 ; Poland and Russia, 1 each ; Scotland, 2 ; Switzerland, 5 ; Spain, 1 ; West Indies, 5 ; and the 627 who had fathers born in the United States, had mothers born in the following countries, viz. : Austria, 3 ; Bohemia, 1 ; British America, 3 ; Denmark, 1 ; England, 13 ; France, 3 ; Germany, 21 ; Ireland, 48 ; Poland, 1 ; Scotland, 2 ; and Switzerland, 1.

The accompanying table will show that during the year there were 28,367 permits issued (reported mortality) for the burial of persons who died in this city ; 1,140 were issued for the interment of the bodies of persons who died outside the city limits ; 2,191 were issued for the burial of still-born infants, and 131 were issued for the disinterment or removal of bodies from city cemeteries and vaults ; 238 transcripts of the birth record, 283 of marriage, 1,335 of death and 1,973 searches of the records of births and marriages were made.

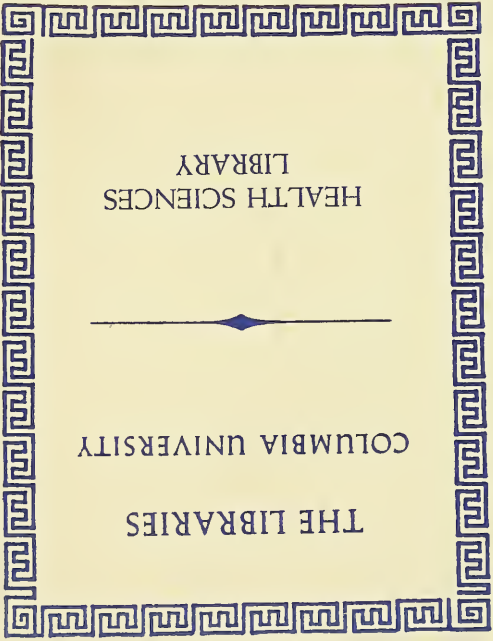
