1. For your information there is inclosed herewith a copy of the United Nations, Department of Social Affairs, Information Bulletin, subject as above (incl 1).

2. Temporary selection committees have been formed in Tokyo and Osaka. These committees are now engaged in processing applicants for 1950 fellowships who were recently interviewed by Dr. Bulsara, Far East representative of the United Nations Department of Social Affairs. It is anticipated that a national advisory committee on United Nations affairs will be organized at a later date, but until that time the present committees will serve as advisory and fellowship selection committees. These committees have been informed of their responsibilities and the procedures to be followed.

3. Procedure for future fellowship applications is as follows:

a. Applicants will submit to the team completed copies of the "Curriculum Vitae," (incl 2). Brief comment by the welfare officer on the basis of short-contact interview, is desired on the application. For this reason any applications received directly by the selection committee from individuals residing in your prefecture will be referred to your team.

b. Two copies of the completed forms will be forwarded to this headquarters.

c. Following preliminary review, GHQ, SCAP, Public Health and Welfare Section will forward one copy through Japanese channels to the Tokyo selection committee.

1. Reference is made to Operational Directive 31, 21 April 1948, subject: "Elimination of Control Associations".
2. Recent reports from military government teams received by this headquarters, revealed that certain officials of the local Bureaus of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry have made allocations of materials contingent upon the demandant's joining a specific organization.
3. According to information received from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, the action taken by those officials constitutes not only a complete disregard for fair trade principles but also a violation of joint Ministerial Ordinance 1, 12 June 1948 which is reprinted in the Official Gazette, Extra (1) for 15 June 1948. This Ordinance provides for the equitable allocation of designated critical materials to any qualified demandant and grants him the right to appeal an adverse decision of the ministry to the Economic Stabilization Board. Furthermore, it is unlawful under the above Ordinance for any governmental official to make allocations contingent upon membership in any organization, or to encourage any firm to belong to private organizations.
4. In order to prevent the recurrence of malpractices stated in paragraph 2 above the Ministry of Commerce and Industry of the Japanese Government at the direction of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers issued instructions to all chiefs of its local Bureaus and to all prefectural governors on 25 December 1948, subject: "Compulsory Membership in Trade Associations or Commercial and Industrial Cooperative Unions". These instructions direct the local responsible Japanese officials to strictly comply with the provisions of joint Ministerial Ordinance 1 and advise them that future violations will be the subject

1. Reference is made to Operational Directive 31, this headquarters, 21 April 1948, subject: "Elimination of Control Associations".
2. Attached as inclosure 1 is a list of organizations which have been designated for closure and/or dissolution by the Closed Institution Liquidation Commission. The CILC effects the closure and/or dissolution of designated control organizations independent of the prefectural governments, and only when the situation warrants, may delegate its authority to the Ministry of Finance, which will then employ its regional representatives to close or dissolve certain organizations.
3. The designated organizations existed usually on the national level with local branches which did not constitute legal entities in themselves. These local branches may have reorganized by changing their names, but essentially may be carrying on their previous controlling functions.
4. The prefectural governments have no functions in the closure and/or dissolution of organizations which are being closed or dissolved by the CILC. To-date, the responsibility of the prefectural governors in the control association program is to conduct a survey over existing control associations in their respective prefectures, and to submit reports on the activities of these associations to military government teams and various Japanese government agencies, as described in paragraph 5, of the Operational Directive referred to in paragraph 1 above. After the completion of the present survey, they may be called upon by the Japanese Government to assume responsibility in carrying out the dissolution of the local control associations covered in that survey, but only if specifically directed by the Central Government.

2. According to Article 6 of the Cabinet Order referenced in paragraph 1b above, subject organizations were ordered to be dissolved by 31 May 1947.

3. After promulgation of Cabinet Order Number 15, 1947, the Disease Prevention Bureau, Ministry of Welfare, requested permission to utilize sanitary associations and public health associations to assist in public health administration and operation on the local level. Informal permission for the existence of such organizations was granted by the SCAP in June 1947 on the condition that they would be organized on a strictly voluntary basis and that their activities would be confined to educational and informational matters, only.

4. The conditions upon which exception from the provisions of Cabinet Order Number 15 were granted have not been adhered to by these organizations. Reports indicate that these organizations have assumed, on a wide scale, the functions of local governmental health organizations in violation of existing directives. Reports also indicate that these organizations, have in fact, adopted the pattern of organization and operation of the old Tonarigumi and in many cases are being operated or directly influenced by the same officials who formerly directed the activities of the Tonarigumi.

5. In order to prevent any further flagrant violations, the Japanese Government was directed to issue the following instructions to the prefectural governments.

a. All so-called Sanitary Associations or Public Health Associations, and any other similar organizations in other fields of governmental activity, whatever their name may be, which are organized on the basis of local areas (such as block, neighborhood, municipality, ward, town or village) to assist health centers and other local authorities in carrying out governmental health programs (e.g. programs of immunization, parasite control, mass examination of tuberculosis, procurement or distribution of controlled sanitation supplies and equipment including DDT and chlorine products, etc.) and other governmental functions, whether such assistance is alleged to be voluntary or not, are considered to fall under the prohibition of the aforesaid Cabinet Order, and they must be dissolved, and any successor or similar organizations prohibited.

b. In case any organization described in the preceding paragraph shall not have been dissolved by 1 September 1948, the governors of each prefecture shall immediately order such dissolution pursuant to paragraph 2 of Article 6 of the Cabinet Order, referenced in paragraph 1b above.

c. Any person who was a Chief of Chonakai, Harakukai or Federation thereof, or of a Tonagumi, who was in said office during the period from or prior to September 1, 1945 till September 1, 1948 consecutively, who has issued any instruction of a compulsory nature (unless authorized by this or higher headquarters), or who shall hereafter have issued any instruction whatsoever, to neighborhood association members, or inhabitants of any districts which were formerly under his supervision, incidental to or in connection with the activities of any so-called Sanitary Association or Public Health Association, or any other organization described in paragraph 5a above, is believed to have violated the provisions of paragraph 1 of Article 4 of the Cabinet Order, referenced in paragraph 1b above, should be prosecuted immediately, pursuant to paragraph 1 of Article 6 of the cabinet order.

d. The rules issued by the Supreme Court, pursuant to the Potsdam Declaration, for expediting the trial of criminal cases involving violations of the Imperial Ordinances relating to the exclusion, removal, etc. from public office and public services and the Order relating to the abolition of certain political parties, associations, societies and other organizations, shall be made applicable to prosecutions brought pursuant to Article 4 of the Cabinet Order.

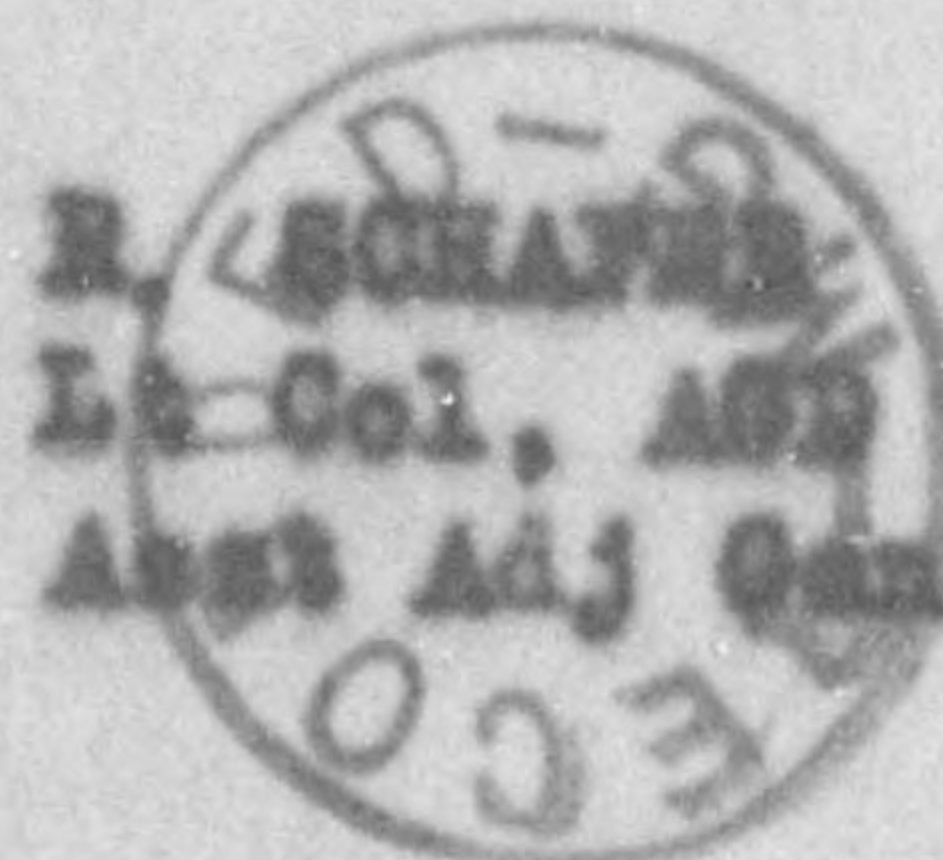

3. General publicity for the Eighth Army campaign participation will be handled by the Eighth Army Public Information Office working in cooperation with the Far East Command Public Information Office and the American Red Cross publicity organization.

4. Benefits, entertainments, parties and similar means of fund raising are recommended but federal legislation limits use of the name or emblem of the Red Cross to those affairs where the entire gross proceeds are contributed to the American Red Cross.

5. Collections will be transmitted to the Eighth Army American Red Cross campaign chairman, Major Thomas K. Blender, Public Information Section, Headquarters, Eighth Army, APO 343, by United States Treasury Check made payable to the "American Red Cross", or any other negotiable dollar instrument. Checks will be submitted so as to reach this headquarters not later than 5 April 1948.

SUBJECT: Operations of the Forestry Products Association

TO See Distribution.

The Kyoto Military Government Team recently initiated a letter to higher headquarters relative to (1) the legality of the Nenryo Rinsan Kumiai (Forestry Products Association) under the provisions of SCAPIN 1108, and (2) the wide spread between the wholesale and retail price of charcoal. The reply from GRQ, SCAP is quoted in part for your information.

"3. The margin between producer and consumer price includes costs for freight, warehouse charges, repacking, inspection fees, loss in transit, etc. The average costs are then weighted by the amount of charcoal and firewood consumption in the three districts covering Japan. Kyoto district is in District A which also includes Tokyo, Kanagawa, Saitama, Aichi, Osaka, Hyogo, and Fukuoka.

4. The existence of Nenryo Rinsan Kumiai (Forestry Products Association) is illegal under both SCAPIN Nos. 1108 and 1394. The former provides that control associations shall be dissolved while the latter forbids any association to act as sole distributor of any commodity.

5. The Japanese Government has submitted a new regulation pertaining to the distribution of charcoal and firewood. This regulation provides for registration of many wholesalers and retailers, provided that they meet the qualifications set forth in the regulation, and in effect, this would eliminate the control presently exercised over the distribution of charcoal and firewood by the Nenryo Rinsan Kumiai.

6. However, the proposed regulation was submitted at the outset of winter and since it is believed that any change in the existing pattern of distribution can easily create a "bottleneck" in the smooth flow of charcoal and firewood, the Japanese Government has decided to postpone the announcement of the new regulation until Spring of 1948.

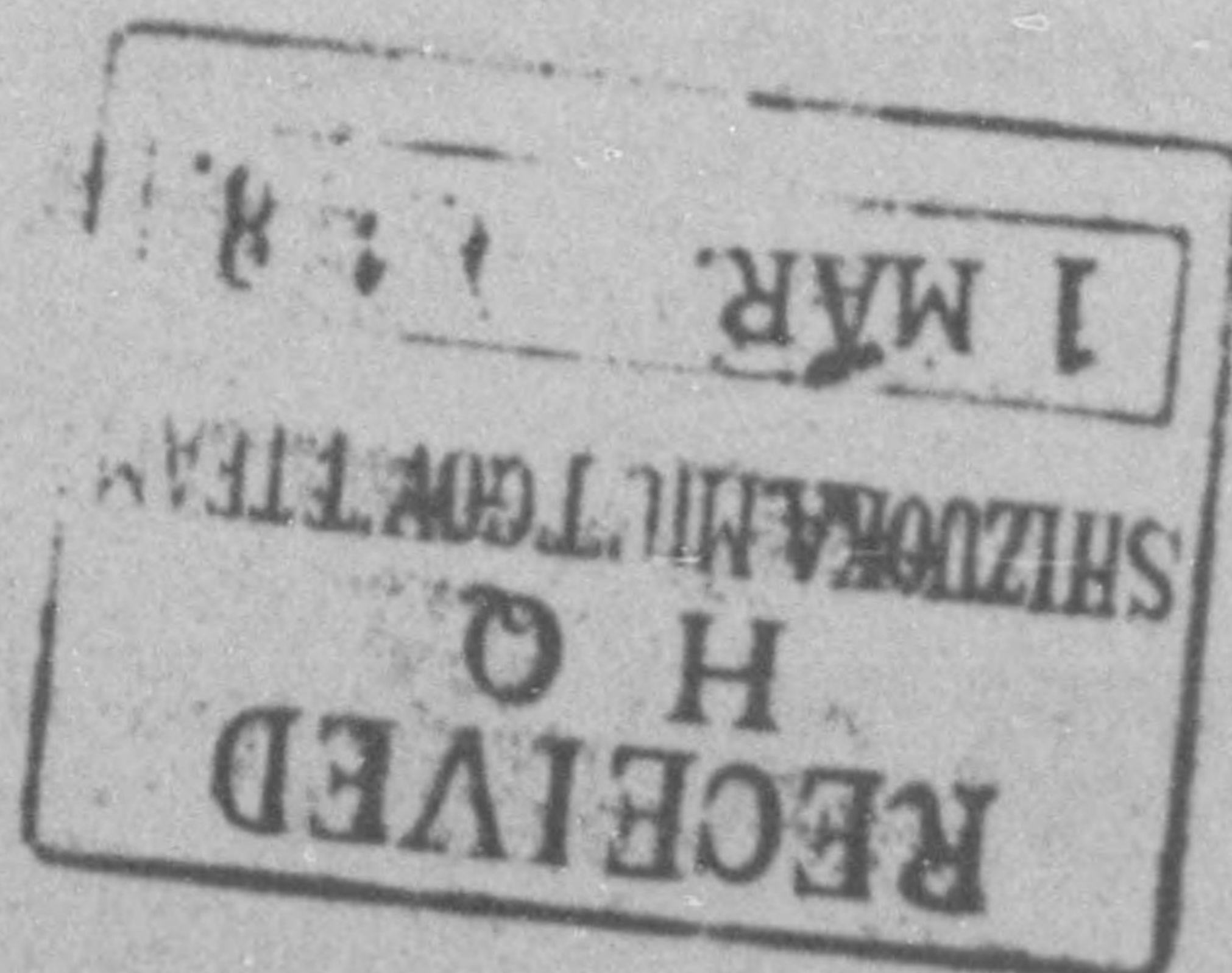
7. In the meantime, the Government will continue to purchase charcoal and firewood from producers and will sell them to the Forestry Products Association who in turn will resell them to the consumers. The ration coupons will be issued by the prefectural governors according to the allocations made by the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry."


1. Reference is made to SCAPINs 1108, 1394, and 1860, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, same subject as above.

2. This headquarters has been notified by Headquarters Eighth Army that in the near future, a new operational directive giving detailed instructions for surveillance by military government teams over the activities outlined in above SCAPINs, will be published.

3. The Japanese government has been instructed in SCAPIN 1860 to submit to military government teams, reports on activities of all control associations operating within the prefecture. Military government team commanders will forward these reports through channels to Commanding General, Headquarters Eighth Army.

4. Based on information contained in these reports, Anti-Trust and Cartels Division, Economic and Scientific Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, will issue orders for the dissolution of all control associations which are considered to be monopolistic, inefficient, or in restraint of trade.

2. Following radio from Headquarters Eighth Army is quoted for your information and compliance.

"Article 64, Child Welfare Law requires recertification of all Minsei-iin prior to 1 April 1948. Procedure is set forth in SC&F Public Health and Welfare Technical Bulletin Number 7 of November 1947. It is desired that military government units:

- (1) Examine the organization and membership of Prefecture Selection Committees and the Nominating Committees at local government level. Priority in the case of nominating committees will be given to large centers of population.
- (2) Consider carefully the total number of Minsei-iin needed and check on the number selected. Quality and not quantity is desired.
- (3) Discuss the appointing procedure with Governor of Prefecture to emphasize his personal responsibility, and importance of careful selection.

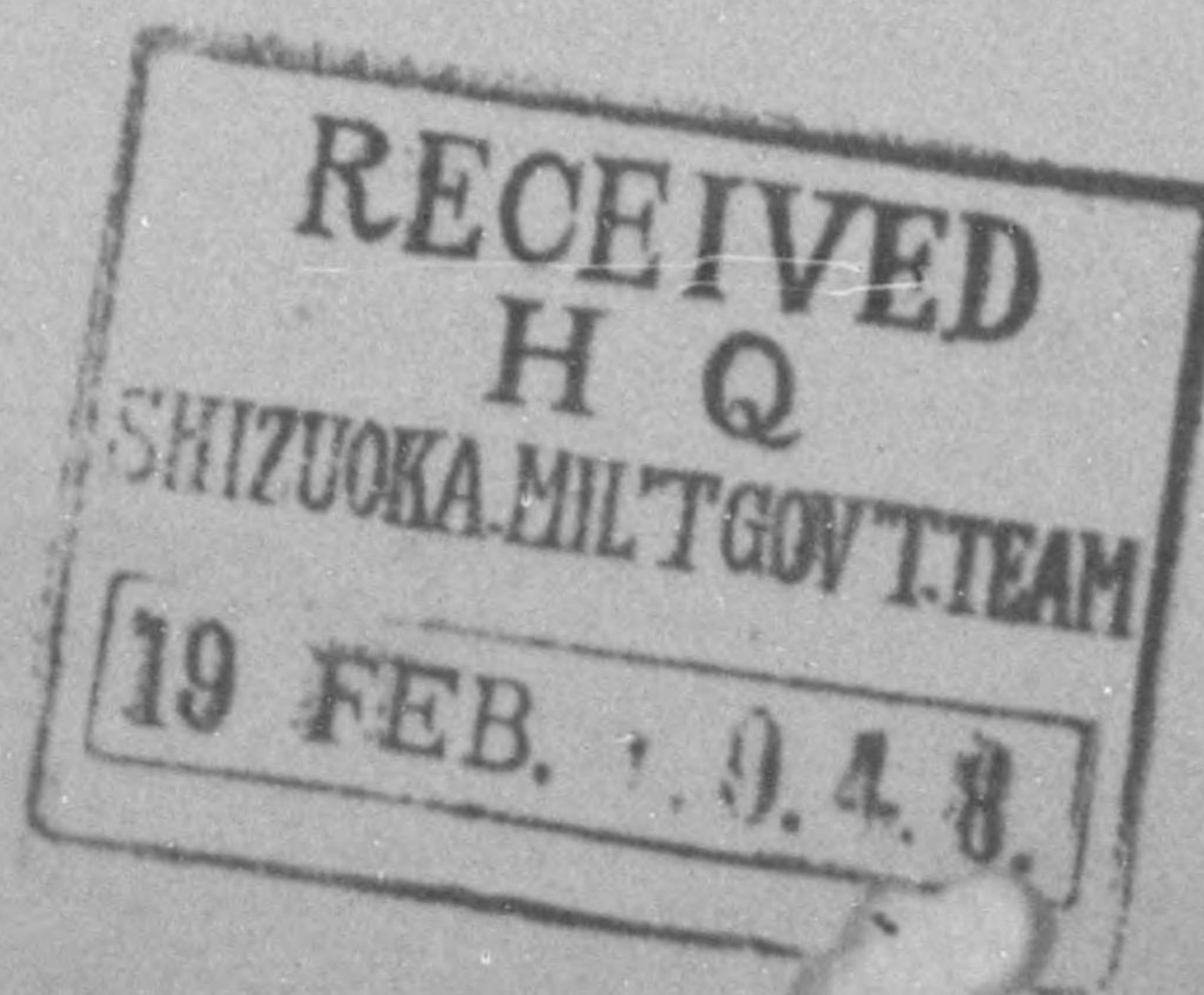



SUBJECT: Holding of Central Membership Meeting of Nogyokai.

Dated: 23 Jan. 1948.

The general membership meeting of Nogyokai to be held under Art. 8 of the Law No. 133, 1947, has to secure a quorum of two thirds of total membership within the limit of Art. 6 of the Cabinet Order No. 281, 1947. This is because it is desirable that as many members as possible should be present at the meeting in order that full information of Laws concerning Agricultural Cooperative Association may be most widely given to the members and that smooth and fair dissolution of Nogyokai may be effected.

Therefore every possible means should be taken to satisfy the requirement.

However, there may be some exceptional cases where the number of membership of Nogyokai is too big (e.g. more than several thousands) or too widely dispersed to hold the meeting at one place. In such cases, it is suggested that the quorum should be secured by holding, for example, some block meetings at several places, keeping them always in contact with each other by means of telephone and the like, so that the uniformity and integrity of these meetings as one general membership meeting may be maintained. This is particularly indispensable with regard to the selection of property Disposal Committee and the approval of business account and inventory as stipulated in Art. 9 of the Law No. 133, 1947.
