





SEEDLING GLADIOLUS

I have this season some fine bulbs of blcoming size, grown from seeds. There is great variety, fine marking and colors in these flowers, and if you want something interesting to watch and see what beautiful color shows up next just plant some of these seedling bulbs. You will be well pleased with them. Blooming size, choice bulbs, 50c, per dozen. 36 bulbs for \$1.25 postpaid.

Gladiolus are easy to grow and show up well in borders and among other plants but for the best success should be planted in the open where they will get plenty of sunshine and not be robbed of fertility and moisture by the roots of other plants.

Bulbs should be planted 4 inches deep in good soil, covering not over two inches at first and gradually filling in the soil as they grow until hilled up 4 inches above the level of the soil, or if only a few are grown the stalks may be tied up to stakes to keep the spikes of flowers from breaking down. Frequent cultivation and watering during the blooming period will insure fine flowers, which if wanted for bouquets should be cut as soon as the first 2 or 3 buds open, when if placed in water they will last for days and continue to open to the last bud. There is nothing finer for a table bouquet than a bunch of fine gladiolus.
