
The year started off with the lounge run. The Freshmen were overwhelmed — due to a lack of bodies and coordination — by the sophomores and juniors.

The women of Fleming organized a Fleming women's dinner and went to Kebakian's where Z. Newsome and Maurisa got chided for not cleaning their plates.



































Third Term



The final sports standings were: second in volleyball, third in basketball and third in football. The Page boys challenged us to a soccer game, which we won.









The fruits of stack-breaking





77-78 definitely proved, as other years before it, to be a year in Ruddock's history.










