London, June 22.—Still no news from Pekin. The situation in China as set forth in British government dispatches was as follows: Four thousand men of the allied forces were having sharp desultory fighting at Tien Tsin on Tuesday and Wednesday, with a prospect of being reinforced on Thursday.

The Daily Express Shanghai correspondent, calling last evening says: "Eight hundred Americans are taking part in the fighting at Tien Tsin, and they apparently form a part of the supplementary force, arriving with the Germans and British after the conflict started. It is impossible to estimate the number of the Chinese there, but they had a surprising number of guns."

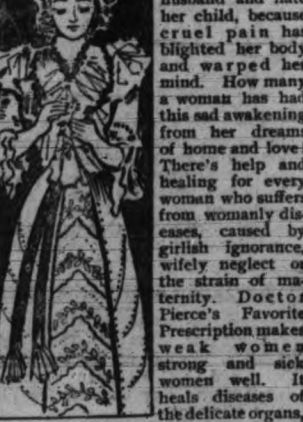
