POLLINATION — Two varieties are needed. The only combination that is cross-incompatible is Seckel and Bartlett. A third variety is needed with the above two.

CULTURE

Pears will grow on almost any soil but will do best on a high elevation, provided the sub-soil is not too wet Wherever this is the case the ground should be thoroughly underdrained. In very poor soil a heavy top dressing of manure in the fall will be of advantage. Standard pear trees should be

planted twenty feet apart each way.

Pears are subject to fire blight, a disease controlled only by cutting back the branches beyond the point of injury.

Do not allow pears to ripen on the trees. The highest quality results from gathering fruit ten days before it is ripe. Winter pears are best stored before the heavy frost.
