1. Interrogation was designed to bring out details of JAENKE's dealings with Büro BLANK, and other similar agencies, apart from those concerned with the handling of the stolen documents.

2. JAENKE sent papers on the following military subjects to his old CG, Gen Heinrich EBERBACH:-

Discipline and Drill for Recruits,
The Part of the Infantryman in Arm Warfare,
The composition of Army Fighting Gps with
Commandos, Air Strike Wings and Parachutists,
The Defence of Europe against the East.

These papers were passed into Büro BLANK by EBERBACH Jun at the beg 51, and JAENKE later heard that they had received flattering attention. However, he was not called to personally enlarge on them.

Spring 51 During his manifold activities, Prof CLASSEN had established contact with Prof TOCKE, the aircraft designer, who had recently completed plans and models for a hover plane and a speed boat, which allegedly represented revolutionary advances in their several fields. CLASSEN asked JAENKE if he knew any parties likely to be interested in the development of those projects, and JAENKE mentioned it to EBERBACH, at that time already in contact with Büro BLANK. As a result, a meeting was arranged at CLASSEN's home, at which the following were present:-

HULFELD, industrial merchant of WUPPERTAL,
representing Prof TOCKE,
General der Flieger SEIDMANN (8 Flieger Corps),
unofficial representative of Büro BLANK,
One unknown, representing Industry,
CLASSEN and JAENKE.

BLFL described the projects and spoke of the necessity of raising money for further development. It was suggested that the Americans be approached, but this suggestion was dropped since no-one present had the necessary access. The meeting ended inconclusively, SEIDMANN privately telling JAENKE that it was too early to consider the realisation of such ambitious plans.

Beg Aug 51 JAENKE however reported to EBERBACH that a trial speedboat was being built at VLGE SACK, and a further conference was held in the premises of Büro BLANK, after EBERBACH had officially joined that organisation.

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(NOTE: Also after the documents had passed (from JAENKE to EBERBACH.)

Present were:-

Kapitän ZENKE, described as "Seefahrt Nr 1"
at Büro BLANK,
Wulf BLEY,
JAENKE,
EBERBACH jun.

It was reported that the trial boat was completed and it was arranged on the spot for Admiral TATE (Kommandeur Kleinkampf Mittel) to represent Büro BLANK at the first run.

(NOTE: These were actually later shown in the German newspaper.)

After the meeting, BLEY and JAENKE took coffee together, BLEY questioning JAENKE as to his occupation. Nothing loath, JAENKE described his plans for the INDOA, whereupon BLEY exclaimed that he could effect JAENKE's introduction to the "greatest detective in the world". Interested, JAENKE was told of the existence of a certain Col. HEINZ, WESTFORN, Bahnhofstr 62, to whom BLEY promised he would write on JAENKE's behalf.

(NOTE: JAENKE now says he had no previous knowledge of HEINZ' existence. In the first interrogation summary he is quoted as saying that HEINZ should be excluded from access to the stolen documents, when these were handed to EBERBACH in Jul 51.)

28 Sep 51

JAENKE visited his mother in MAINZ, Freiherr v. STEINSTR.

29 Sep 51

He called at HEINZ' address, which he noted was camouflaged as the "Michael Verlag". On mentioning BLEY's name, he was immediately received by HEINZ, although the latter said that BLEY had not effected the promised introduction. JAENKE gave the purpose of his visit as being calculated to arouse interest in his INDOA plans, which he proceeded to describe. HEINZ asked him if he had been in the Abwehr and, receiving a negative answer, said that he was not concerned with industrial security, but was engaged in espionage in the spheres of high level politics and military affairs in US and Russian occupied AUSTRIA. JAENKE asked HEINZ if he were connected with Col. GEHLEN, of whose activities he had heard from EBERBACH jun. HEINZ said that he was not, and, during the course of subsequent conversation, gave the following facts about the GEHLEN organisation:-

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- a) that it employed 50/60 Analysis officers, and was thus better staffed than the Abwehr had been,
- b) that it employed 1000 operatives,
- c) that it conducted operations all over RUSSIA and the Satellite Countries,
- d) that Gen HEUSINGER was GELLEN's 2 1/2,
- e) that its HQ were in a village near MUNICH,
- f) that it was financed by the Americans.

JAHNKE expressed interest in establishing contact with the organization, so that HEINZ promised to see what he could do; he did not appear keen. When JAHNKE said that GELLEN, with such an apparatus under his control appeared to be the natural successor to CANARIS, HEINZ denied this saying that part was reserved for himself, that he was already espionage chief in Büro BLANK, with OSTFELD as his 2 1/2. Describing his wartime activities, HEINZ said that he had commanded the ERANDENBURG Boat, and had conducted radio deception operations against Britain from Holland. On parting, he extended a cordial invitation for JAHNKE to visit him at Büro BLANK, where he spent about three days each week.

On return home, JAHNKE described his interview with HEINZ to EBLERBACH Jun, and expressed wonder that HEINZ should be so indiscreet to a comparative stranger.

JAHNKE described his encounter with GERSTENBERG, saying that his intention had been to subvert a secretary, but that GERSTENBERG had been pre-warned of his visit by CLASSEN, so that they parted after an exchange of insults. His account of the LEVEMEUR incident is subjective but agrees with GERSTENBERG's in all essentials.

17 Nov 51

Charged by Coca-Cola with investigating the source of an article against CC which had appeared in the FRANKFURT KPD newspaper, "Sozialistische Volkszeitung", which was assumed to have been inspired by the German soft drink industry, JAHNKE again called on HEINZ to see if the latter would give him a lead into the local KPD. HEINZ could not, but he put JAHNKE on to the WIESBADEN LFV, as a result of which he had an interview with the chief, Mr MEYER. MEYER was also unable to help but he arranged for JAHNKE to meet his FRANKFURT vice-vis in Cafe KRANZLER, FRANKFURT at 1000 hrs on 20 Nov 51.

19 Nov 51

JAHNKE discovered that a KPD member, Reinhard SCHMIDT, was working the OPPENHEIM Coca-Cola concession; Peter HERDT & Sons. He briefed SCHMIDT to ascertain the source of the SYZ article, which SCHMIDT agreed to do.

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20 Nov 51

JAHNKE kept the HV in Cafe KRANZLER, duly meeting a certain GEPACK, who, on hearing JAHNKE's business, regretted that he had no source in the local KPD.

20 Dec 51

JAHNKE visited Büro BLANK to pick up EBERBACH jun. EBERBACH was out and, while JAHNKE was waiting, HEINZ came into the vestibule, greeted JAHNKE and, assuming that JAHNKE had called to pay the promised visit, took him into his office. Here he showed JAHNKE a map pinned to a cupboard, which bore a number cabalistic signs and which he described as prepared by OSTER under his direction to show the extent of their espionage operations. Referring again to GEHLEN, against whom he seemed to bear a grudge, he said that GEHLEN had recently suffered severe operational losses, but that he was still financed by the Americans to the extent of £6,000,000 yearly. JAHNKE then took his leave to collect EBERBACH.

He described his conversation with HEINZ to EBERBACH, who asked him to report it in writing. At first unwilling, JAHNKE eventually complied, later learning that EBERBACH had passed it to NEUSINGER, who had in turn shown it to HEINZ.

(NOTE: JAHNKE says that this incident led to EBERBACH first losing favour with BLANK, since his report was apparently not believed.)

EBERBACH jun then left for PAKIS.

JAHNKE assured that it was at this time that GERSTENBERG first repaired to KIESENHANSLOO to report CLASSEN's loose allegations regarding himself and EBERBACH. He later learned from EBERBACH jun that these were:-

- a) that JAHNKE was informed of all the PETERSBERG military discussions five minutes after they had taken place by EBERBACH,
- b) that JAHNKE was employed by BLANK, from which he had received large sums of money and the prospect of a regt command,
- c) that he maintained a dwelling with mistress for EBERBACH in a large town, where alcoholic and sexual orgies took place.

Jan 52

EBERBACH was called back from PAKIS, faced with the allegations, ordered to break contact with JAHNKE and suspended from duty without pay.

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Oem EGERBACH communicated these facts to JAHNKE and asked him to attend a council of war in BAD DOLL, enclosing DM 50 travelling expenses. Oem EGERBACH, his son and JAHNKE duly conferred, as a result of which JAHNKE learned of CLASSEN's (or GEESTEM-BERG's) allegations and the fate of his report on KELTZ. At Oem EGERBACH's request, he prepared a written refutation of the charges on the spot, later supporting it with a sworn statement prepared by his lawyer.

1. The following brief and questionnaire has been sent to the field by the War Room for the further interrogation of CLASSEN:

"Legationsrat Dr. K. O. BRAUN.

According to KIRWIL, the original Referat had no cooperation with the F.O. but, on the formation of Abt. VI C 4 liaison was established through BRAUN, who was a V-man or VI C 4.

"Under the heading STAMM, CLASSEN states that BRAUN regularly passed to the secret service the more important of STAMM's reports to the F.O. from Tokyo. CLASSEN states that he can get in touch with BRAUN.

"If it is decided to interrogate BRAUN, he should prove of interest (a) for information regarding the F.O. intelligence organisation in the Far East, and (b) his knowledge of STAMM's reports, since the latter is reported under arrest in Sugamo Prison for investigation of responsibility in regard to the Tri-Partite Pact.

"Can steps therefore be taken to arrest and interrogate BRAUN?

"V-man "BORIS"

"CLASSEN's description of "BORIS" as a white Russian, with access to the Japanese and Manchurian Embassies in Berlin, who was employed by the "Reich" Referat, is utterly at variance with previous information which indicates that "Boris" was located in China. KIRWIL stated that he was a German, possibly a Hitler Youth leader.

"The way in which CLASSEN volunteers the names of people who might be used by us, contrasts markedly with the amount of information given as to V-men used by VI C 4, sources of information, etc.

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REFUGEE

"Taking into consideration that CLASSEN was, after WEIRAUER's transfer, head of the whole department and had (according to KIRWEL) recruited V-men, I-men and agents with KIRWEL, his statement is unsatisfactory.

"Although the set-up of Abt. VI C 4 is now fairly complete as the result of the interrogation of KIRWEL and others, CLASSEN (as Head of the Department) might be asked for a more detailed general statement than he has so far provided. He should be questioned specifically as to the following:

"(1) According to KIRWEL, prior to taking over the leadership from WEIRAUER, CLASSEN was chief of the Referat of VI C 4 responsible for evaluation and compilation of reports. Incoming reports from the auxiliary referats of VI C 4 were sifted for use in further reports to RAFF, SCHLEICHEN-ETZIG, KALTENBRUNNER, HIMMLER, HITLER, P.O., Min. of Propaganda etc.

- (a) What were the various sources of information?
 - (b) How were the reports from the Police Attaché and Waffen Attaché in East Asia received?
 - (c) Were any reports received from the P.O. other than through Dr. BRAUN?
 - (d) Was he ever heard the information received from the Abwehrstelle in Shanghai associated with the name "Boris" or "Borodin"?
 - (e) Who furnished the information received by the Shanghai channel?
 - (f) What does he know of the GIS organisation in the Far East?
 - (g) Of communications to and from the Far East?
 - (h) Of intelligence personalities in the Far East?

"(2) With KIRWEL he recruited V-men, I-men and agents after 1944.

On his return to GERMANY he became a member of affiliated organisations. APPENDIX A

ABTEILUNG VI C 4 (FAR EAST) RSHA

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1. General

The work of Abt VI C 4 was the collection and evaluation of info and the subsequent publication of regular monthly and occasional intermediate reports on Far Eastern political and economic questions.

Until 1944 this work was performed by a small staff which, with one exception, lacked the necessary linguistic qualifications and background knowledge of the FAR EAST. With the sudden increase of interest in matters concerning the FAR EAST in autumn 44, WEIRUCH, head of Abt VI C 4, enlisted the services of a number of persons, chosen for their intimate or general knowledge of the FAR EAST, amongst whom was Prisoner.

What prompted Amt VI to evince this greater interest in the FAR EAST and to expand accordingly, Prisoner does not know. Being unaware of the existence of a revoked Führer order to refrain from int activities viv-à-vis the Japanese ally, he advances two theories as motives for rising interest and intensification of production.

- a) The course of events in the FAR EAST and Japanese reaction to them may have called for a closer scrutiny, born of a growing distrust, in view of the rapid worsening of GERMANY's military situation.
- b) Personal considerations on the part of SCHLEENBERG, who was possibly intending to provide himself with a staff of FAR EAST experts in case of his appointment to the post of Foreign Minister, may have been instrumental in enlarging the Abt. It was well known that SCHLEENBERG opposed the foreign policy of von RIBBENTROP and that he himself hoped to secure this appointment.

Whatever the reasons, the fact remains that in autumn 44, the material submitted by Abt VI C 4 to higher levels appears to have been considered inadequate and the need for more detailed and accurate info was felt.

2. Personnel of Abt VI C 4

Prisoner is ignorant of the original organization of the Abt, and of any subsequent changes prior to his arrival. He joined together with WILCKERLING early in Oct 44 and found WEIRUCH with his two assistants, Dr LEO and HEYER. In addition there were two secretaries, Frl KEITEL and Frl Edith (surname not known). Shortly afterwards and in the sequence mentioned KLINGERBERG, Dr KIESEL and Fr WEBERT took up duties. The secretarial staff was increased by Frl ZOBEL and Frl SOMMER. In Mar 45 a police secretary joined on the day when part of the Abt was evacuated to MARKTREDWITZ. His name is not known.

The following were the officials of Abt VI C 4, which was subordinate to Gruppe VI C of Amt VI:

TSCHIERSKY

Was head of Gruppe VI C, remaining only a short while (Dec 44) after Prisoner entered the Abt. He showed little interest in the Abt.

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PC PWDV

MFP

Originally Abw, succeeded TSCHIERSKY. He left the Abt to its own devices, not from any disinterest, but because he was actively engaged in the work of other Abts of his Gruppe, especially Abt VI C 2 (RUSSLIN).

WEIRAUCH, Peter

SS Stubaf and Reg Rat. Is believed by Prisoner to have been head of the Abt since its inception. Before his staff was increased, he tried, unsuccessfully, to offset the deficiency of suitable personnel by sheer hard work. With the new plan of expansion he had optimistic visions of a vast network of V- and I-men and Agents under the sole control of his Abt. He left in Nov/Dec 44; rumour had it that he was removed from office for inefficiency. Nominally he was appointed LO between Amt VI and Army Gp SOUTH, in which capacity he was to do six months service at the front, before being promoted to Ostubaf and Ob Reg Rat. He was then to return to the Abt, and Prisoner deputised for him during his absence.

LEO, Dr Jocrn

Was with the Abt from 1942 or 1943. The outbreak of war between GERMANY and RUSSIA had prevented his return to JAPAN, where he was manager of the propaganda dept of the German State Railways. He had an extensive knowledge of Japanese internal affairs and personalities, having spent many years there; he was a graduate of a Japanese University. He speaks and writes Japanese fluently.

KIRFEL, Dr Harald

Came from Lehr Regt KURFÜRST after a short course. Before that he was instructor in Japanese at the OKW Interpreter School. A doctor of languages, he speaks fluent Japanese and reads and writes Chinese, although he has never been to the FAR EAST. He became very enthusiastic about his work in the Abt, and, deciding to make it his career, he took the necessary steps with the personnel branch of Amt VI shortly before the collapse.

Fr HEINERT

Was employed at the request of KIRFEL with whom she was friendly. She speaks and writes Japanese.

HEYER

Prisoner knows little of him as, soon after his arrival, HEYER was transferred to BRATISLAVA. In the Abt he had been responsible for Indo-Chinese agents, a task which was taken over by KIRFEL.

WILCKERLING, Rolf

Had some slight knowledge of the FAR EAST, having been employed by a bookseller in SHANGHAI. He proved to be of little value and was attached as LO to STEIBERT, the representative of Amt VI in HAMBURG, towards end Jan 45. From that time onwards nothing was heard of him.

KLINGEBERG, Werner

An employee of the DNB, engaged by WEIRAUCH on LEO's suggestion, as it was thought that he had good connections with the Japanese colony and leading Japanese personalities in GERMANY, having established some contacts during the occasion of his stay in JAPAN as a delegate of the German Olympic Games Committee.

Frl Edith ?

Secretary to Dr LEO.

Frl ZOBEL and

Frl SOMMER

Secretaries to the other members of the Abt.

Police Secretary

He was intended for the registry and filing section

and left for MARKTREDWITZ the day he joined.

Prisoner remembers him as an East Prussian, self-taught in Russian and Japanese, of which his knowledge was imperfect.

Thus, in spite of the infusion of new blood, only four people in Abt VI C 4 had the required background, viz Prisoner, LEO, KIRFEL and WEINERT. Their qualifications were a command of the language and a knowledge of Far Eastern questions, ranging from sound to fair. The general attitude can also be described as more pro- than anti-Japanese, which, in the opinion of Prisoner, was a definite disadvantage. Their training was academic and what was lacking in experience of work was made up in enthusiasm, kindled by the prospects of getting missions to the FAR EAST.

3. Amt VI/Amt Mil

For purely military matters relating to the FAR EAST Abt VI C 4 had its counterpart in Amt Mil with the nomenclature of either Mil C 4, Mil CO or Mil CFO. At its head was Obstlt OHLITZ and other officers with whom Prisoner came in contact were Maj BAECHTEL and, in particular, Hptm Dr PLAGE and Fw BRENNSCHEIDT.

Hptm PLAGE

A doctor of law, had lived 8 - 10 years in TOKYO, making a name for himself in the safeguarding of German patents, licences and copyrights and preventing their violation. He was Amt Mil LO to the Japanese military and naval attachés.

Fw BRENNSCHEIDT

A former merchant from CHINA; handled AST SHANGHAI material at the BEIZIG WT stn.

Prisoner stresses that, to all appearances, liaison and co-operation between the two Abts was very good.

4. Programme and Duties

As in 1944 Abt VI C 4 had no direct sources of info from the FAR EAST, in order to function successfully the primary need was the creation of its own network of informers, abroad and at home, when Prisoner entered the Abt.

Considering the war situation in autumn 44, the overseas projects, which never passed beyond the planning stage, were courageous and optimistic. They included the purchase of an Italian transmitter in PEKING; the despatch of KIRFEL to SOUTH CHINA or NANKING, where he was to set up his own network of V-men and agents; the despatch of WILCKERLING to the DUTCH EAST INDIES with the same mission. In this atmosphere of idealistic planning with total disregard for the difficulties of communications, even WEINAUCH and LEO had visions of going to the FAR EAST, the former as a Police Attaché and the latter to MONGOLIA. For specially trained men they were to rely on the personnel from an Abwehrakademie which SCHELLENBERG wanted to found in order to ensure a steady flow of trained recruits. The outcome of all these projects was the try of two Indo-Chinese semi-agents at the WT school of the HAVEL Institute of the RSHA.

There still remained the recruiting of V-men and agents in GERMANY for the purpose of increasing the quantity of incoming direct info. The problem was tackled after 1944 and was as great a fiasco as the overseas project. All members of the Abt with social or other contacts and

Recruited was not impressive, and though there was now quantity in incoming info, it lacked the quality. The main feature of V-reports was gossip. Prisoner voices the opinion that, from the outset, the combined efforts of the personnel of Abt VI C 4 were too amateurish and remained so to the end.

As to the duties of individual members in Abt VI C 4 there was more a pooling of tasks than a strict allocation of work, since Referate did not exist. However, later a crystallization of defined functions became apparent.

After MEIRACH left, Prisoner was assigned the task of producing the monthly and intermediate reports, wherein he was assisted with evaluation and preparatory drafts by LEO and also with sifting of daily reports and their collation by FR. DILLER. LEO also handled scientific analyses and liaison with the Press, being assisted by SCHILLEBERG. ✓

KIRFEL dealt with the collection of info from V- and I-persons and agents; in addition, he was responsible for the Indo-Chinese agents, having taken over these duties from HEYER. He was assisted by WILCZERLING after the latter had organised a registry and filing section which did not exist before Oct 44; the only documentary matter had been a card-index of Far Eastern personalities in GERMANY and abroad.

5. Situation Reports and their Distribution

Int collected by Abt VI C 4 was embodied in a monthly situation report in two parts, military and political.

The military part dealt with the Far Eastern theatres of war regionally: CHINA, BURMA, the PACIFIC, and Sea and Air. The subjects were treated objectively on a broad basis and the info was confined to facts, without including strategical considerations or tactical details. In the last report, published in Mar 45 for the month of Feb, the Japanese situation was described as hopeless, if no compromise with the opponents were possible.

The political part contained regularly an appreciation of relations between JAPAN and USA, JAPAN and RUSSIA, JAPAN and CHUNGKING-CHINA, as well as a review of the internal Japanese situation. The critical nature of the situation was stressed without prejudice, although, with the non-renewal of the Russo-Japanese non-aggression pact, it was wrongly appreciated that a weakened but still active JAPAN was of more interest to RUSSIA as an ally against the USA than a totally defeated JAPAN. Later events showed this view, a product of wishful thinking, to have been completely erroneous.

Of intermediate reports a total of four was published on the following subjects:

WANG CHING-LEI and the choice of a successor;
Gen UGAKI and peace feelers towards CHUNGKING CHINA;
CHIANG KAI-SHEK and YEN-AN Communists;
Cabinet Changes in Japan.

The reports, the quality of which had improved with a more expert presentation, were classified as "most secret" and, according to regulations, typewritten and numbered copies were distributed against signature to:-

SCHILLEBERG whose copy was later submitted to KALTENBRUNNER and HESSLER, and possibly to HITLER;

RAPP whose copy was circulated for perusal to all heads of Gruppen in Abt VI and then returned to him;

O.M Abt Ausl;
Zentral Büro Abt VI for Dr Gisolher WIRSING;

One copy was filed with Abt VI C 4.

SCHLEIMBERG gave instructions for the issue of a copy to the Foreign Office, which occurred only once during the whole period of Prisoner's employment in the Abt. Dr BRAUN was shown reports confidentially, but their text was nothing new to him.

Whilst no forecasts were demanded and, in fact, on orders from SCHLEIMBERG, were not to be attempted, Dr WIRSING (Prisoner at CADIC(NA)), of the Zentral Büro Abt VI (originally Gruppe VI A) consolidated all monthly regional reports of the Gruppen into a world political situation report. These were known as "MEONT" reports, and were documents of a top secret nature for distribution to the highest levels only. They did not circulate in Abt VI officially, but WIRSING permitted their perusal to a few members. Prisoner read some of the "MEONT" reports and was surprised at their candour about the precariousness of the German situation. In one of them peace with the Western Allies was strongly advocated if anything were still to be salvaged from the wreck. The reports were full of undisguised criticism of RIBBENTROP's foreign policy; in one of the last reports it was proposed that the Vatican should be asked to act as an intermediary in peace negotiations between GERMANY and the Eastern Powers.

6. Dissolution of Abt VI C 4

As a result of the increasing air raids on BERLIN, the Abt moved from the Borkauerstr in BERLIN/SCHMIDTSDORF to the MANSIE, where it occupied the building which also housed the staff of UNTERLICHEN Z of Abt C 2. This was in Feb 45. Abt VI C 4 ceased to function as a proper unit when evacuation measures were accelerated in Mar 45. Dr LEO with Frl Edith ? and the newly arrived police secretary went to MARKTREDWITZ. KIRFEL, KLINGELBERG and Fr MEINERT went to BAD GASTLIN to remain in contact with the Japanese Embassy, which had been evacuated to that place. They were joined later by two V-persons or agents, formerly employed by Abt VI C 2 (RUSSIA), one an Estonian woman with the Christian name of Ilona, and the other a German woman, who were sent there by order of RAFF. Frl ZOBEL went to FRANKFURT/MAIN with a departmental recommendation to the local Postal Consorship Office. Frl KJITEL was taken over by Abt VI C 3 (NEAR EAST). Frl SOMER, although advised to join her family in MÜNSTERBERG or to go to MARKTREDWITZ, preferred to remain in BERLIN. Thus Prisoner was the only member of Abt VI C 4 left in BERLIN.

On 21 Apr 45 orders were received to destroy all documents and files, which was done in the courtyard of Borkauerstr. In this connection Prisoner learned from RAFF that a similar order had gone out to MARKTREDWITZ a few days previously. On the same day, with the state of affairs verging on chaos, Prisoner was told to be prepared for a flight from BERLIN. The same evening, under RAFF's leadership, some fifteen cars left the capital in a northerly direction, but without definite destination. Prisoner recalls the presence of the following members of Abt VI in the convoy:

Dr SCHMITZ (Personal Referent to SCHLEIMBERG);
Hptstuf SCHMIDKOPF;
Dr SCHOLN (Oberfeldrichtor) and
Oblt Dr SCHÜTZ.

Because of low-level air attacks the convoy travelled by night via SCHWERIN and LÜLICK to TIEGEDORFER STRAND, where they arrived on 1 or 2 May 45.

At TIEGEDORFER STRAND it was learned that HITLER had committed suicide and that DONITZ was head of the newly formed Govt in FLENSBURG. This news was the cue for the large number of officials of a great variety of Govt

7. Appreciation of Output of Abt VI C 4

When interrogated at length on the actual int output of Abt VI C 4, Prisoner stated that its work was overrated. As regards providing first-class info to higher levels, the handicap under which the Abt laboured was too great to be outweighed by enthusiasm. Nothing produced had the nature of a scoop, as there was no outstanding source of info.

Prisoner believes that better monthly reports could have been published by the Foreign Office, where he presumes more int material was available, as it was never fully established whether Dr BRAUN imparted to Abt VI C 4 everything he knew. Info from V- and I- sources in GERMANY was valueless and Prisoner contends that nothing obtained through those channels was ever incorporated in a report.

Because exports prepared and published the reports, stylistic improvement was apparent from Oct 44. As to contents, they constituted general material on Far Eastern events, military and political, but no more. The difference between a Foreign Office report and one packed with secret and reliable int, as those of the Abt should have been, did not exist. Too young, lacking the necessary resources and with its plans of expansion overshadowed by impending defeat, Abt VI C 4 was too hampered to perform successfully what had been envisaged.

1. General

Before recording the statements made by Prisoner on the subject of V- and I-persons and agents and in order to gain a clear picture, it is felt that a few explanatory comments are necessary.

V-persons are men or women, of either German or foreign nationality, who knowingly impart infm gained, whether briefed for the purpose or not, and who are paid for such services, either in money or in kind or in both, or render such services gratuitously.

I-persons are men or women, of either German or foreign nationality, who impart infm without being aware that it will be used.

Agents are men or women, of German or foreign nationality, who secure infm for a Govt on a full-time basis against regular payment in money or in kind or in both.

No enlistment by the Abt of V- and I-persons and agents took place outside Germany. Details of all informers outside Germany known to Prisoner are given in Appendix C.

As regards enlistment in Germany after 1944, the crop of agents was meagre. There were only two Indo-Chinese (names not known to Prisoner), who received JT trg with a view to accompanying KIRFEL to the FAR EAST.

As regards I-persons after 1944, the list of names has been limited to those actually known to Prisoner. It will be appreciated that persons under this heading must include almost every Far Eastern Asiatic of notoriety in GERMANY.

Finally a list of names of V- and I-persons and agents recruited before 1945 is given in para 6 for the sake of clarity.

2. Recruiting of I- and V-men

As has been said before, a recruiting drive was inaugurated in 1945 by Abt VI C 4 to ensure a larger and better int output on the strength of infm received from these sources.

The fields to be exploited were Japanese Embassy circles; Japanese colonies in Germany, especially in BERLIN; the Legations of THAILAND, MANCHURIA, and NANKING CHINA; Indo-Chinese and other Far Eastern circles.

To this end, every qualified member of Abt VI C 4 set out to renew old and establish new contacts which promised success. In addition, Germans with known connections in the above communities were approached.

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The Doutsch-Japanische Gesellschaft, an institute for the fostering of German-Japanese relations, proved useful, as it afforded the desired scope during receptions, banquets and other social gatherings. On the whole the results remained poor except for one V-source, viz Dr BRUN. In his case the term cannot be applied in the strict sense of the word as he was not enlisted, but passed on info for personal and political reasons without solicitation.

As regards the list of names, Prisoner admits that it is incomplete, as KIRFEL must have had many more persons on his books who were not known to the other officials of the Abt.

3. Training and Briefing

Only the two Indo-Chinese would-be agents were under trg at the HVEL Institut of the RSHL. For V-persons there was a briefing process on very simple lines which were unsystematic and inexperienced. The person was generally introduced to the broader aspects of Far Eastern politics by being allowed to read a recently published situation report. Certain points were emphasised verbally and ultimately formulated into questions on, which the V-person was to get the answers or views of the Japanese.

By previous appointment a villa in BERLIN-ZEHLENDORF, Herthastr 4, was available for briefing purposes. The house was kept specially for Abt VI C 2 (RUSSL) by Gruppenleiter RAPP.

4. Remuneration of V-Persons and Agents

Remuneration for rendered services was either monetary or material, and the recipient was not required to sign for cash or goods received.

The Gruppenleiter was entitled to make payments up to RM 1000. from the Funds of the Gruppe, provided that he was satisfied with the reasons stated by the official making the application. In the application the real name of the recipient was not required.

The official making the application had to sign a receipt. For payments over RM 1000 an application on a printed form was necessary, stating reason, real and cover-name of the recipient. This form went to Amt VI and, when sanctioned, payment was made from Amt Funds, the official making the application having to sign a receipt.

Applications for cigarettes and spirits were submitted to the Gruppenleiter, who instructed his secretary to make the required issue against a receipt. In the last months it became the practice to draw the entire quota for the ensuing month by submitting a specified list, showing real or cover-names, and drawing against such supplies when necessary, signing for each individual withdrawal.

For the issue of articles in short supply (toilet requisites, suitcases, films etc) an application from the Abt via Gruppenleiter to Gruppe VI F was required. When Obstlt BÖNING, head of Gruppe VI F, had sanctioned the issue, the article in question was collected personally by the applicant from the stores of Gruppe VI F in Delbrück Str, BERLIN. All goods so received had to be signed for.

Food coupons were issued by Amt VI after the Gruppenleiter had sanctioned the required application. They were handed over against signature.

COMMUNICATIONS TO AND FROM THE FAR EAST

1. Prisoner was out of his depth when interrogated on the subject of sigs comms between GERMANY and the FAR EAST. He knows of only two channels:

a) The BELZIG WT Stn

It would appear that the BELZIG WT Stn which, according to Fw BRENNSCHEIDT, was a Foreign Office station, was shared by Amt VI because the RSHI station at the HAVEL Institut was not powerful enough for Far Eastern traffic. Hence, in the opinion of Prisoner, it is reasonable to assume that Foreign Office communications from NANKING and HSINKING came to the BELZIG WT stn via SHANGHAI, which was the main centre of activity of the Embassy in NANKING. He believes that between Foreign Office and TOKYO direct WT comm existed.

b) Telephone

MÜLLER, head of Amt IV, had weekly telephone conversations with MEISINGER, Police Attaché in TOKYO. This info came from RAPP and the fact that for security reasons the talks were in Bavarian dialect, caused much amusement.

Japanese desirous of getting in touch with relatives in JAPAN by telephone had to go to the Japanese Embassy in BERLIN.

2. In Oct 44 no transport comms existed between GERMANY and the FAR EAST. The need for these was felt so strongly that plans for the operation of passenger and transport aircraft had been carefully prepared. According to Dr BRAUN the plans had to be dropped because Göring's attitude was totally unco-operative. GAF Gen KESSLER, who was to have been the first passenger, had to approach the OKW to get accommodation on a U-boat if transport by this means were resumed in the spring of 1945 as planned. About mid-Apr 45 a U-boat was made available and sailed, carrying Gen KESSLER, who was to become the new Air Attaché in TOKYO, an assistant to the Naval Attaché in TOKYO, and also MAHLFELD, a WT frequency technician and Radar expert from the KLM. The U-boat left, but before reaching NORWAY had suffered damage which necessitated the transfer of the passengers to another U-boat. This is said to have sailed from BERGEN, but it could not possibly have reached SINGAPORE before GERMANY capitulated.

GIS ORGANISATION AND INTELLIGENCE PERSONALITIESIN THE FAR EAST

1. Prisoner is uninformed about the organisation of the GIS in the FAR EAST. Basing his statements on the int material which Abt VI C 4 received from TOKYO and SHANGHAI, he maintains that apart from 1st SHANGHAI and the German diplomatic corps, no other organisation could have existed.
2. Without being able to give details, he thinks that, like 1st SHANGHAI, the diplomatic corps must have had its own network through consular and other official establishments as well as through V-men. Furthermore he expresses the opinion that the reason for the lack of an efficient int organisation lay in the general German attitude to the FAR EAST, which was always regarded as a Japanese sphere of influence. When this attitude underwent a change, as demonstrated by the projects of expansion, it was too late and the difficulties of comms could not be overcome.

1. Final, corrected "schlussrechnung" for this project covering period from 1 December 1951 through 31 December 52. His figures are now in substantial agreement with ours; difference, at first glance, appears to be only 30 DM and, in fact, in our favor!
2. Separate, regular accounting for December - data also included in schlussrechnung as noted above.
3. Overt books of the Gesellschaft for Dec - these to be returned to him after inspection.
4. Copies of receipts for all brochure costs during life of project - to substantiate his own figures on this matter.

(2) Agent reported orally (summarize briefly; if detailed rpt. necessary, submit on separate sheet and attach to this form):

5. Special report, prepared at my request, on his impressions of way this project has been handled and his suggestions as to how it might have been improved.
6. Returned financial work sheet data I had previously loaned him as aid in preparing his final accounts.

Agent reported:

1. Gesellschaft has not yet succeeded in finding a new source of funds to permit it to stay in operation. Bonn government definitely will not pick them up - neither Blank office nor Lenz. Bundesverband der Deutschen Industrie has eyes on election campaign and money for the coalition parties...but none for the Gesellschaft.
2. Sole favorable prospect at the moment is not an encouraging one. RNSPLUNT says Gen. Felix Steiner has informed Vorstand that he has hopes of getting money for them from the "Gesellschaft fuer Neue Staatspolitik" of Ulm. I am not familiar with background of this organization, but RNSPLUNT says it is a nationalistic/rightist group, critical of Adenauer, and politically ambitious. It would like to beef itself up with "front generation" recruits and ex-officers and, if possible, get into the Federal elections, perhaps by temporarily associating some of its people with the Deutsche Partei. If it thus gets any of its people into the Bundestag, idea would be to later have these split off from DP to form nucleus of a new radical rightist party - all this according to RNSPLUNT. He said that Steiner may very well be talking thru his hat (as he has often done) and that nothing may come of this. But if it should develop, SPLUNT said both he and Von Kleist would immediately quit the Gesellschaft - they want nothing to do with the Staats Politik group. I got the impression that others of the Vorstand probably...(See notes section)

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(3) Case Officer instructed Agent:

1. Since I was unable to draw the 6,915 DM needed to terminate this project at this meeting, as scheduled, I was forced to tell him that his termination salary for 3 months, plus that of the office secty. and the funds for terminating office rent contract would not be ready until January ~~16th~~ 16th; thus another meeting should be held on that date.
2. Told him I had done my best to see if he could fit into other work with us but that fact he is rather generally known or suspected of having had American contact made another assignment regrettably impossible. He took this very well, said he understood and "you are quite right" and thanked me for trying on his behalf.

(4) Case Officer gave Agent (payments, written instructions, forms, materials of my sort):

Nothing - except volume 5. of Churchill memoirs to complete set given him as Christmas present.

(5) Special remarks (including additional observations about Agent's person, security, etc.)

NOTES

1. I cannot help but feel that Steiner is probably exaggerating his ability to raise enough money from Staatspolitik organization to keep the GfW active as an organization. Such a development as outlined above would be deplorable, but we are in no position now to do anything about it. My personal feeling is that the GfW will fold up completely within next month or two.
2. Final Gfw brochure on "Wehrkundliche Folgerungen aus dem Schicksal der Satellitenstaaten" was distributed between 16 Dec. and 24 December. (I will forward sample copies after final meeting).

[]f this office reviewed the files on Subject at OSO headquarters. The documents consist of CSDIC Preliminary Interrogation Report 150, dated 22 June 1946 and final report 85, dated 27 July 1946, of Subject. These reports were checked with our Form XX and the following discrepancies were noted:

In the CSDIC report Subject stated that in 1938 he joined the LN Regt. 12 at Frankfurt/M and served with this unit on the "Westwall" in 1939-40. On the Form XX, Subject stated that he joined the German Air Force in 1939 and after a short training period transferred to OKW (German High Command) as an analyst of enemy propaganda and East-Asian questions.

On both forms, subject related his academic mission to Japan in 1941 but on the CSDIC he states that he was transferred back to Germany and called up as a Gefr. (corporal) with the LN Regt LC 3 at Deauville, France; on the Form XX this duty is not mentioned. That he closed out his wartime service in an abwehr unit (ABT VI Cl4) and served with the Donity government is noted on both forms. His various capacities however are shaded in the CSDIC to show insignificance and in the Form XX to show responsibility. These differences are interpreted as signs of the Times(1946 - 1952). The files of the State Department were re-examined on 30 April 1952 at the suggestion of the FBI that they had information relating to our Subject.

The files of the Security, Foreign Correlation, and Visa Divisions were searched with negative results. The files of DC/R contained a letter from the U.S. Political Adviser of Germany, Frankfurt, 29 March 1946 to the Department, transmitting a detailed report by one Dr. Wilhelm -----, University of Heidelberg, received from a British source regarding the Far Eastern questions and dealing with relevant material gathered about Japanese personalities by German observation and experience. The report contained very detailed information regarding Ambassador Oshima and his staff. Dr. ----- further advised that if British authorities--in particular the Far Eastern Department of Secret Service--wished to open up a new information section embracing Far Eastern questions he would suggest collaboration with following persons owing to their specialist knowledge and their experience in making intelligence reports:

1. About six weeks ago during my last meeting with [] of MI-6, I asked him if he could tell me something about JAEMKE. I complained to him that on several occasions JAEMKE had requested a KCCO employee (Mike E. M. Kotzenhiny) to introduce him to some American intelligence official to whom he could make some rather interesting disclosures. [] admitted that he was familiar with JAEMKE's case, whom he considered an intelligence peddler involved in all sorts of shady deals. For example, the German Soft Drink Association gave JAEMKE access to their trade secrets as a basis for his investigation of the trade secrets of American soft drinks. JAEMKE sold the German secrets to the Coca-Cola representative in Dusseldorf for 10,000 DM, and the German Soft Drink Association is now considering the advisability of suing JAEMKE for breach of confidence.

2. About two weeks after my talk with [] I learned that JAEMKE had been arrested by the British. During our interest in the case, the British liaison officer this morning brought me the attached extract of their interrogation report. He was careful to explain that the report contained only items that would be of interest to us. [] should we want additional details we should get in touch with []. 

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1. The field investigation conducted on Classen revealed that an OSO dossier was maintained on him. This dossier contained a CSDIC preliminary, dated 22 June 1946, and final interrogation report, dated 27 July 1946, on Classen. The information regarding Classen's military service given in the CSDIC reports varies with the information given in Classen's PMS. The information given in the CSDIC report is shaded to show insignificance, whereas the information given in the PMS (re Classen's military career) is shaded to show responsibility.

2. This office received a request from CIC, dated 30 September 1952, regarding the Gesellschaft fuer Lehrkunde and it's business manager Classen. CIC requested that they be advised whether or not DMR is in any manner sponsoring the Gesellschaft and the activities of Classen. CIC also requested information regarding one [redacted]. Our CIC liaison representative was instructed by [redacted] on 15 October 1952 to inform CIC that this Mission has supported the Gesellschaft through contact with Classen, and that the name [redacted] is an alias used in the past by a German Mission staff officer. [redacted] also requested all information available to CIC regarding the stimulus for their interest and investigation of the Gesellschaft so that appropriate action could be taken in terms of our relations with this group. To the knowledge of this office no reply has as yet been received from CIC regarding our request.

3. This office wishes to point out that Classen was granted operational clearance upon information contained in QMFENCE's original request for clearance indicating that Classen would not be in direct contact with a staff officer, but that he would be supervised by Damerau, chief agent with the Soldaten Zeitung. This office had not been advised that Classen was in direct contact with a staff officer. Nevertheless, on the basis of the information available (preceding receipt of the CIC request outlined in paragraph 2 above), this office would have held no objection to staff officer contact with Classen. In fact, we would have agreed that Classen's activities should be separated from Damerau's control (although one of the objectives of this action has apparently not been accomplished as is evidenced by the statement in the case officer's assessment that Classen is aware of Soldaten Zeitung activities to the point of knowing when our support with the Zeitung will be terminated).

4. This office will continue to consider Classen's security status "questionable" until receipt from CIC information as to why they initiated investigation on Classen and the Gesellschaft (which might indicate how CIC was able to obtain the alias and address of our staff officer). We also wish to point out that ZIF MR is apparently well enough represented within the Gesellschaft to have obtained as much information as CIC regarding our staff officer.

He has continued to furnish us detailed reports on all foremost matters of his organization and has sought our advice and guidance on all major matters of West German policy and program. Where our views have conflicted with his own, he has accepted the course laid down by us. His honesty was successfully tested in the matter of a TIPPM report which he passed on to us.

1. POB/US files have been checked with the following results:

a. Felix STEINER. Felix Martin STEINER, born 23 May 1896 in Stallupoenen East Prussia is not a ZIPPER connection. Subject is a former Lieutenant General in the SS, he served as commander of the Viking Division. Since the war he was active in the formation of an officers group "for possible disposition within the German army". STEINER maintains contact with one Guenther REINECKE, who is a ZIPPER special connection. FGLA-3101 of 22 August 1950 gives ZIPPER's evaluation of STEINER, as "a bad character". FGLA-6613 of 23 May 1951 contains a report of STEINER in which he again advises the Americans to keep away from STEINER. A carded entry in our files, source unknown, date about 1948, states that it is believed that STEINER was connected with Dr. Willi HOETTL and working for an unidentified American Intelligence Agency. FGLA-653 contains information on STEINER's present activities in Munich.

b. Eberhard Graf von NOSTITZ. Eberhard Artur Graf von NOSTITZ, aka Eberhard Graf von NOSTIZ, aka Erich NOLTE, born on 15 February 1906, living at Oberalterallee 80a, Hamburg 20, Germany, bears ZIPPER agent number V 12 899 and is also carded as a ZIPPER "Special Connection". A TIB report of February/¹⁹⁵¹ states that NOSTITZ is an active member of ZIPPER. The attachment to MOKA-23686, a list allegedly written by UTILITY for Bundespräsident HEUSS, gives an appraisal of Graf von NOSTITZ;

"A younger general staff officer who is not without ambition. With warm heart and cool head, he is progressively inclined. Under strict supervision he would perform well. Suited as assistant in command or organization field."

c. Detloff von KALBEN. FGLA-653 lists one von KALBEN, fmu as being BDS leader in Munich. Another entry in our card files, source unknown, lists von KALBEN, fmu, as being one of STEINER's men. There is no indication that von KALBEN is connected with ZIPPER.

d. Ewald Heinrich von KLEIST. POB files indicate that Ewald Heinrich von KLEIST, born 10 July 1922 lives on Voitstrasse Munich. MGKA-28696 states that Ewald Heinrich von KLEIST, formerly, was a sub-agent of an intelligence net sponsored by O-2 USFET. There is no indication that Ewald Heinrich von KLEIST is a ZIPPERite; however, Lt. Hans Ewald von KLEIST, born 13 October 1904 is a ZIPPER staff member. We are unable to make any positive connection between the two.

e. Prinz Parchard von PREUSSEN. POB files list one Prinz Oskar von PREUSSEN as having been issued an "E" identity card on 2 March 1951. Although we do not know why the card was issued, or even if it is the same person; the issuance of an evacuation card by ZIPPER definitely denotes an interest. We have no other information on von PREUSSEN in POB files.

f. Joachim RUOFF. In addition to the information on Joachim (Jochem) RUOFF contained in MGKA-35545, attachment to MGLA-9512, and MGLA-10843, the following information on subject might be of present interest. Joachim RUOFF, former SS colonel, has recently moved from the Gasthaus "Garibaldi", Sternberg-Niederpoecking to Munich, Hildegardestrasse 22. He is a member of the "Gesellschaft fuer Ahrkunde". He is an advisor to Felix STEINER and financial backer of the BIS. He is not connected with ZIPPER, but does maintain contact with Dr. Rolf ROEDER and DIETER RUE, fmu, who have connections to ZIPPER and to Joachim USTER.

g. Dr. RIEDMIG, (Frans). A memo for record in POB files discusses a trip made by UTERITY to Switzerland in April 1949. While there he was asked by ULRICH of the Swiss Federal Police to furnish all information he might have on Dr. Franz RIEDMIG, former Swiss doctor, at that time in KONSTANZ. There is no other information in POB files.

h. Prof. Dr. Wilhelm CLASSEN. The only information on Dr. Prof. CLASSEN, other than the negative traces forwarded by telephone to DYCCLAVIER (February 1952) on Prof. Dr. CLASSEN, born 28 October 1903, is that Dr. Prof. CLASSEN, residing in Duesseldorf, am Rempalfort, is active in the "Deutschen Aktion" and the "Gesellschaft fuer Weltkunde."

2. There are no traces on Vollrath von HELLERMANN or F. J. Ritter Hentschel von GILHENHAIM in POB/US files.

3. If a ZIPPER check is desired please indicate and at the same time please forward any personal data available to aid us in making positive identifications.

1. Gesellschaft account for November. 2. Copies of issue #13 of Wehrkunde. 3. Report on Bundestag EVG Ausschuss proceedings. 4. Copy of report on developments in Egypt from Gesellschaft member in Cairo. 5. Special report, prepared at my request, accounting for all QKSNITCH expenditures from inception of project through Nov. 1952.

(2) Agent reported orally (summarize briefly; if detailed rept. necessary, submit on separate sheet and attach to this form):

1. Negative results in Gesellschaft contact with Blank Office to obtain new sponsor. 2. Asked if local sections could be kept alive thru January - at no additional cost to us - in hope that new sponsor can be found by then. 3. Reported in detail on other details of project liquidation. (FURTHER DETAILS RE: PROJECT LIQUIDATION) 4. Declared he has no compromising material of any kind from us remaining in his possession. Said he immediately destroyed all briefs, etc. when HDJ flap broke in press. (Informed me of my assurance to him that we had nothing to do with it!)

(3) Case Officer instructed Agent:

1. To complete his report reviewing & commenting on all project operations to date. 2. Authorized compilation of two brochures now in final stages of preparation to be out & distributed by Dec. 15 at latest. Refused authorization for 2 others to be started.

(4) Case Officer gave agent (payments, written instructions, forms, materials of any sort):

1. 13,900 DM to cover "regular" December expenses, plus re-print commitments already completed. (We also reviewed close-out requirements - see below)

(5) Special remarks (including additional observations about Agent's person, security, etc.): He has no idea what his personal job future will be after project close-out; since he is assured of his salary (1550 DM per month) thru March 52, he has not yet attempted to solve this problem.

(6) Next meeting (date, hour, place -- if out of town): 1600 hours on 16 December at Mannheim - Bahnhof.

(7) NOTES:

1. The Gesellschaft Vorstand has now been told by RNSPLUNT that "contributions" are drying up and the organization will have to close on December 31 unless new sources of income can be found. This announcement naturally has upset the Vorstand members and has caused them to seek other sponsors. (Actually, RNSPLUNT says they all realize that they have been US-supported.) They are bitter over this development and RNSPLUNT ~~had~~ emphasized to them the need for discretion in any public comments. He feels, however, that there is always the danger that Gen. Felix Steiner or one of the others might talk too much. Von Hellermann, von Kleist and one or two others approached the Blank Office in a body to seek financial assistance, giving the same story as noted above. However, General Heusinger, whom they visited, said the Blank Office had no funds with which to help them and left them with the impression - without trying so - that he knew they had been held up by the Americans and was enjoying their present discomfiture. The Vorstand delegates then asked him to put in a "good word" for them with State Secretary Lenz. Heusinger blandly said he would. RNSPLUNT has meanwhile written to Lenz, who is a personal friend, asking for an appointment; this letter has not yet been answered.

2. Several of the ~~key~~ Gesellschaft local sections have been notified by mail that the size of contributions do not permit continuance of the organization much longer and it has been suggested that the sections locally seek to increase their membership with persons in a position to give them some financial help - even to drawing in people who are not strictly ex-officers. Three of the sections ~~xx~~ so addressed have been able to successfully do this. The others are either not informed or are hoping that Gesellschaft headquarters will find a means to keep them going.

3. RNSPLUNT in November cut the section subsidies in half and will do so again in December, thereby ~~xxxxing~~ creating a "pool" of 1,600 DM from subsidy funds already in hand. He asked permission to allot this to the local sections for January use - thereby keeping them in existence through January instead of forcing them to close down on December 31. I did not immediately agree to this, but told him that I thought it could be done provided that there appeared to be a fair chance of the Gesellschaft finding a sponsor by the time we meet again on December 16th. In any case, if the sections are kept intact for the month of January, there will be no additional cost to us. The organization's publication "Wehrkunde" will cease in December; all other paid-for activities will also stop by 31 December. Present membership size: 112 sections throughout the country with slightly over 2,000 members.

4. With the payment of 13,900 DM at this meeting, all "regular" Gesellschaft expenses are covered through December 31. Residual obligations which are presently known or anticipated are the following:

16,460 DM.....Cost of 2 brochures in regular Gesellschaft series, previously obligated and due to be completed & distributed by Dec. 15. This sum includes: 11,000 for printing 20,000 copies of each brochure, plus 560 DM for cliches & other production costs, 400 DM for distribution expenses and 1,500 DM due on obligated writers fees including fee for one brochure which will not be completed.

4,650 DM.....RNSPLUNT's salary for January, February, March
1,140 DM.....Three months salary for same period for office secretary, according to German law. She receives 380 DM per month.

190 DM.....Xmas gratification for secretary; a moral obligation ~~xx~~ under German custom.

1,025 DM.....Rent contract thru March. This is in conflict with earlier information that contract only ran thru February; I will check up on this. In any case, it may be reduced to one month's rent if Gesellschaft finds new landlord. Monthly rent is 375 DM.

23,465 DM ... remaining expenses (anticipated).

5. We discussed vast use of Stifterverband cover. Money paid into Stifterverband was then paid by check to Gesellschaft as a "contribution". This was handled by Nord, director of Stifterverband, who is aware ~~xxxxxx~~ that Americans were behind the Gesellschaft. This due to early indiscretions of Gen. Greiner in project's early days - as, indeed, is the same realization by virtually, if not all, members of the Vorstand. No tax problems for Gesellschaft since it was not legally registered owing to lack of formal HICCG approval. Thus, no corporation taxes had to be paid and no complications with tax authorities. They have not looked at Gesellschaft books...nor will they. I asked RNSPLUNT to turn over to me all formal Gesellschaft books at close of our relationship. He agreed, however, this is not really necessary and would be inadvisable if Gesellschaft succeeds in finding new sponsor - they will then need to retain books for subsequent tax purposes after registration. As soon as treaties go into effect, there will no longer be any obstacle to registration.

(2) Agent reported today (11/20/52) that he had been asked to speak on station sheet and added the following:

See notes below and for detailed information concerning our present news that our support of the Gesellschaft will be discontinued.

He asked permission to repeat his statement concerning members which was very successful. No copies exist. I agreed - [redacted] [redacted]

Announced that in response to our demands, he had recommended Paul Steiner to resign as 2nd chairman of the board and should be honorary chairman until expiration of his term. (Ironical that this would end the end of our relationship.)

Officer instructed Agent:

Asked for return of Sept. accounting records which had been returned to him for correction of minor error.

Informed him that because of forthcoming treaties, we feel it best to discontinue our support of the Gesellschaft as of December 31, 1952, hoping, of course, that they can find some way to discontinue on their own.

Asked him to give us detailed report and critique on our past work together. (Agent gave agent payments, written instructions, forms, materials of [redacted])

Copy of press clipping concerning the Gesellschaft.

Copy of Stalin article on economic foundations of socialism.

(5) Special remarks (including additional observations about Agent's person, security, etc.): I told SPLIUNT we intended to pay him his full salary through March 1953, i.e., for 3 months after the project cut-off date. He was very grateful since his own future is now in doubt. Instead of a lump sum payment, he suggested it be paid each month so that we could continue to meet with him monthly on developments after January 1.

(6) Next meeting (date, hour, place -- if out of town): Friday, 22 November, Wiesbaden railroad station, 1200.

(7) NOTES: RNSPLIUNT's reaction to news of the cut-off was pretty much as expected; he was obviously very much disappointed - but agreeable and resigned to our way of thinking. He had, in fact, expected such a development and was not taken completely by surprise.

He said he will make every possible effort to find new support for the Gesellschaft, but feels there is very little hope. None of their own people has enough money. The Bonn government, and the Bank office in particular, suspects them of having been American-supported, he said, although completely without evidence of such support. For this reason, he feels they are "abgestemmt", slightly tinged as collaborators. He also stated that he does not consider the idea of bitterness to be valid in this case.

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they have been living under Marshall Plan and other forms of aid ever since the war and that without it they would have long ago starved or become Communist.

As far as I am from business or industry circles, he did not feel prospects were very good. The more industrialists, he said, have pooled together a large sum of money to be shipped to the government parties in the fort existing political campaign starting January 1, (largest part of this is at the DFB) and he felt that this is what enough to spoil the Gesellschaft's chances of getting help.

He will, however, do what he can to find an angel. His initial efforts will be made at Bonn and he will undoubtedly consult with State Secretary [redacted] who is a friend of his.

I stressed to SPLUNT that there were two main considerations in my mind: (1) to close out our financial support as cleanly as possible with no legal or other obligations and (2) to preserve the security of our past relationship.

With regard to the first of three points: the Gesellschaft will function through December; we have several brochures in various stages of editorial preparation, of which two ~~should be published by December 31~~ can be completed in December. I told him to go ahead with these since we are already obligated for the 500 DM author's fees. However, they must be out by December 31. The Gesellschaft rent contract runs through February 1958 and we may have to pay 750 DM to cover the January-February period unless SPLUNT can have the contract cancelled by agreement with the owner - which he will attempt to do. There are no other outstanding obligations and no physical property to be reclaimed with the possible exception of a desk and two typewriters.

I told him that if the Gesellschaft did find a sponsor and stayed in business, I felt we could write off the typewriters and desk and they could keep them. However, if the office closes, we would want the typewriters back. The desk he could sell - and give us the money.

We have no obligations at the de Bouche printing plant - this plant was given 3000 DM in the early days of the project to expand its space and general facilities - no physical equipment is involved.

As for security, SPLUNT said he would immediately destroy the duplicate file which he has kept of all material sent to us (accounts, reports, etc.). I told him he must either destroy or turn back to me all remaining briefs and other papers on hand.

The theoretical possibilities of any flap-like repercussions to the end of QSNITCH lie, I believe, in one or both of the following:

a. Loose talk by Gen Felix Steiner (I have faith in SPLUNT's discretion) or by one of the other Vorstand people who are aware of US support to QSNITCH. Much to my surprise, SPLUNT, in answer to a query, told me that [redacted] had met not only Steiner but also von Kleist, von Gilgenheim and Riedweg in the early organizational days of the project - before SPLUNT himself came into the picture. These are all aware of US support. I will make every effort to ensure their silence and it is certainly not in their own interest to talk.

b. Agitation of the Gesellschaft's demise by their present rulers. The latter will certainly be jubilant if we SPLUNT hold up and we must expect in the near future some of it - possibly by certain that SPLUNT was artificially held up by the Americans and especially that he will be withdrawn. They might even try to bring the Gesellschaft up on some trumped-up charge of treason. This is only speculation, of course, and right now it will, in my case, be naive to risk this development if we are to move quickly.

On this point - SPLUNT spoke briefly of his relationship with us during the last year and the smoothness which characterized the cooperation. He will prepare a detailed report on the whole business, as I requested. He also said quite frankly that if the Gesellschaft does find a way to keep going - even with Bonn support - he personally would be quite willing to continue to give us complete information on their activities. I passed this off without a definite reply - but it may be worth remembering and taking advantage of, depending, of course, on circumstances including the future activities of both the Gesellschaft and SPLUNT himself.

(1) Agent submitted _____ written reports on (main subject):

1. Copies of Gesellschaft brochure #9 "Kalter Krieg - Angriff und Abwehr" which has already been distributed. The final one - #10 - is still in the works owing to the recent printing strike. It will be out and distributed before the middle of next week.
2. Cover mock-ups for brochure #10; I selected one I thought best.

(2) Agent reported orally (summarize briefly; if detailed rpt. necessary, submit on separate sheet and attach to this form.)

1. Von Hellermann and von Kleist had an appointment with von dem Bassche of the Federal Chancellery (Lans office) to seek government backing for Gesellschaft. They were not successful and there is now no hope that Bonn will keep the organization going. According to RNSPLUNT, the Chancellery spokesman made it quite clear to them that the government was aware they had been American supported but did not actually know by whom or by what means.
2. The Gesellschaft is now getting some nibbles from the Bundesverband der Deutschen Industrie - but the possibilities are still cloudy and uncertain. RNSPLUNT says its a question of how much assistance the Gesellschaft could be to the coalition parties in the forthcoming election - and what role the Gesellschaft could play, if any. It would be difficult for them to support any one party because of (a) their previous basic rule against involvement with any single party and (b) their mixed political complexion; some members being CDU, others FDP and some DP.
3. That no new Gesellschaft sections have been formally organized, although 35 have been ready for some time and merely awaiting official recognition from Gesellschaft headquarters. RNSPLUNT has called a halt to various trips by Vorstand members to the sections: Bombeck for example wanted to visit Hamburg, Bremen and other North German chapters; his request for travel authorization was refused. (I told him this was quite correct.)

Did they say anything or did they just let it drop?

It was not discussed

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(3) Case Officer instructed Agent:

1. That our next meeting - scheduled for January 6 - would be the last and that I would bring his severance salary for 3 months at that time, plus the same for the office secretary.
2. Told him to carefully review his own schlussrechnung figures in the light of the financial worksheet I gave him and to account for discrepancies noted. If his figures cannot be made to match our own, I will bring Doug to the next meeting so that the two can go over the monthly figures.
3. Told him that unfortunately we could make no financial settlement for Harnisch, von Hellermann and von Kleist as we have done for him and the office secty. Explained that we could not consider them as salaried employees since their names had never been submitted for that purpose. He agreed we had no obligation to them; said von Kleist could probably get his old job back and he could help Harnisch get a job with the Munich power company. As for von Hellermann, who receives a small pension, RNSPLUNT said he intended to assist him out of his own pocket for a short time.

(4) Case Officer gave Agent (payments, written instructions, forms, materials of any sort):

1. 16,650 DM (190 DM of this to pay for secretary's Xmas bonus, rest to cover final brochure costs.)

2. Some financial data from our side to assist him in making up his final accounts.

(5) Special remarks (including additional observations about Agent's person, security, etc.)

(6) Next meeting (date, hour, place -- if out of town): 6 January 1953 - Stuttgart
1200 hours - Bahnhof.

(7) NOTES:

1. For first time, RNSPLUNT hinted clearly that he would like to be employed by us in some capacity in the future. He went about this rather shyly, but his interest was evident and unmistakable. I did not encourage him - merely said that I would investigate and see if we had anything that would fit him, adding that at the same time he must realize that a good number of people, both in Munich and Bonn, appear to know or to strongly suspect that his organization was American-supported, a fact that would naturally limit his future use. He said he realized this and quite understood our viewpoint. I do not believe he is counting on anything further from us.

RELATIONSHIP WITH AGENCY: The Gesellschaft für Wehrkunde, a purely OPC creation, was founded a year ago when then in charge of the Soldaten Zeitung project, developed with his contacts the idea of organizing an overt, non-political study group, primarily composed of former senior German officers interested in the broader aspects of German defense. In full awareness of the nationalist-tinged tendencies of its potential membership, it was decided to restrict membership to those ex-officers and others who were willing to openly promise to oppose political extremism of both Right and Left, to work constructively for the democratic association of West Germany with the Western Allies and who were willing to accept as respected comrades those former officers who participated in the 1944 plot to overthrow the Hitler regime. The Gesellschaft was founded on the basis of these points and acceptance of them has remained a requirement for membership. Through the creation of local branches and sections, through discussion meetings and publications, the Gesellschaft was to stimulate West German feeling in favor of the Contractual Agreements and the European Defense Treaties.

Dr. Classen was recommended for the position of Gesellschaft business manager by Helmut Damerau, publisher of the Soldaten Zeitung. Damerau did not personally know Classen; the latter had been recommended to him by ex-General Felix Steiner. Classen was induced to resign from his position as business manager of a large German soft drink concern in Düsseldorf and was brought to Munich. He has since been in regular contact with a JEPENCE case officer and has shaped his management of the Gesellschaft (it now has over 100 local sections throughout West Germany and more than 2,000 members) according to our wishes and interests. Where his personal views or policies have conflicted with ours, he has accepted the course laid down by us.

ASSOCIATION WITH OTHER PROJECTS: He has no working connection with other projects. However, he is aware of our support of the Soldaten Zeitung and from the beginning has had considerable contact with Damerau,

It is clear that the two have discussed mutual problems relating to U.S. support - Classen, for example, knows from Damerau that we are terminating support of the Soldaten Zeitung by the end of January 1953.

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BACKGROUND: Dr. Classen is a full professor and doctor of philosophy. He studied at the Universities of Kln, Jena and Munich in the fields of philosophy and geography. His first teaching assignment of record was in 1931 at the German Oberrealschule in Athens, Greece. From 1932-35 he was in the Far East as a faculty member at the state college and college for economic affairs, Yamaguchi, Japan. He returned to Germany in 1935 to teach philosophy at the University of Heidelberg. Early in the war he was assigned to the propaganda section of the OKW (German High Command) as an analyst of enemy propaganda and East-Asian questions. He returned briefly to the Far East in 1941 as member of a German academic delegation sent to visit Japanese colleges. After nearly three more years of OKW duty, he was transferred to the Abwehr (AMT VI/Mil) as War Eastern expert in 1944. His final wartime assignment was as head of the East Asia section of the propaganda department in the short-lived government of Admiral Doenitz. He remained in internment until 1947, spent a year as interpreter with Military Government, then entered German commercial life.

MOTIVATION: The writer, who has been in personal contact with Dr. Classen for less than two months, finds it difficult on such short notice to accurately assess his motivation, nor are the files particularly revealing on this subject. He studied at the Universities of Koln, Jena and Munich in the fields of philosophy and geography. His first teaching assignment of record was in 1931 at the German Oberrealschule in Athens, Greece. From 1932-35 he was in the Far East as a faculty member at the state college and college for economic affairs, Yamaguchi, Japan. He returned to Germany in 1935 to teach philosophy at the University of Heidelberg. Early in the war he was assigned to the propaganda section of the OKW (German High Command) as an analyst of enemy propaganda and East-Asian questions. He returned briefly to the Far East in 1941 as member of a German academic delegation sent to visit Japanese colleges. After nearly three more years of OKW duty, he was transferred to the Abwehr (AET VI/M11) as Far Eastern expert in 1944. SPECIFIC— QWINTICH Final Termination Report

I. Introduction

1. The following items are attached as Annexes to this report: initials 26.7.61
Date

- a. Quitclaim signed by Principal Agent (Annex "A");
- b. Principal agent's summary on history, structure and purely overt activities of the Gesellschaft für Wehrkunde.
(in German only -- Annex "B");
- c. Principal agent's final critique on operational problems and internal difficulties encountered in this project.
(in German with English translation -- Annex "C");
- d. Financial summary sheet, showing sums paid into this project and list of accountings received from principal agent (Annex "D").

2. The report which follows is not as detailed as the writer would wish, particularly with respect to the project's organisational development period. This is due to the fact that the undersigned took over as Case Officer in October 1952 and began termination proceedings with the principal agent after less than three weeks of normal operation. Thus, there are unavoidable gaps in both comment and analysis. These are perhaps best filled by reference to the principal agent's critique which discusses internal problems and situations with which the writer, unfortunately, does not have first-hand experience.

3. QWINTICH refers to the Gesellschaft für Wehrkunde (Society for the study of military science), an overtly functioning association of former German officers of all military branches, many of them high ranking. At time of termination, the Gesellschaft had grown to slightly more than 100 local branches or sections throughout West Germany, with a membership of approximately 2,000. Permanent headquarters were maintained in Zürich. Principal Agent for the project was (Dr.) Willi Classen, formerly professor of psychology at Heidelberg University, recognised specialist on Far Eastern affairs, the old-time member of the Altehr. During his position as business manager of the Gesellschaft, and membership on its Board of Directors, Classen was in complete charge of Gesellschaft policy, operations and finance. This was possible since the organization was a complete HUGO creation; Classen

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was brought into the picture to run the operation under our control, and his role was agreed to by the leading personalities of the Gesellschaft, including its elderly and more or less figurehead chairman, former Major General Helmuth von Hollmann.

II. Project Origin

4. Although the Gesellschaft für Wiederau was formally organized on 5 January 1952, its roots go back to the previous year when GDRP was engaged in developmental activities under HESSENY, the master project covering veterans' affairs. There were at that time a bewildering array of budding veterans' organizations. To win them over to Western interests and exploit their psychological warfare potential, it was decided to establish a newspaper for veterans which could serve as an operational springboard toward influence and control over the veterans' movement in general, regardless of which of the several organizations rose to the top in the struggle for pre-eminence. This newspaper was Die Deutsche Soldaten Zeitung (DSZ) and GDRP controlled over it was formalized in HAMM's project KONTAKT/PRAGMAG. The Gesellschaft für Wiederau, in a sense, was an outgrowth of PRAGMAG since the idea for such an ex-officers' association apparently developed from discussions held between Capt Officer C.

5. GDRP chief agent Helmut Damerau and other Germans then connected with the newspaper, including former SS General Felix Steiner.

6. These discussions gave birth to a plan (said by Classen to be the brainchild of Felix Steiner) to organize an ex-officers' group capable of commanding respect and influence throughout West Germany and which, at the same time, could serve under KUGU's control and supervision as a cold war asset against both Communist and neo-Fascist influences in Western Germany. Included in the basic aim was the rallying of support in former German military circles for German participation in the defense of Western Europe.

7. On recommendation of Damerau, Dr. Classen was induced to resign a responsible position with a soft drink firm in the Ruhr area and come to Hamm to serve -- under Mabrowic's control -- as organizer, administrator and policy head of the Gesellschaft. A small permanent office was set up in Hamm in late 1951, staffed by Classen and a secretary, and the work of the organization began. As already noted, the Gesellschaft formally became active in January 1952.

III. Operational Development

8. In the recruiting of members and formation of sections in various parts of the Federal Republic, the Gesellschaft, on KUGU instructions, imposes the following rules of membership eligibility:

a. Loyalty to Western ideals and the concept of integrated European defense. Rejection of neutralism.

b. Rejection of neo-Fascist and neo-Nazi and groups sponsoring these or similar philosophies -- particularly the ultra-rightist and now outlawed NSDAP.

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c. Rejection of Communism and opposition to its front organizations and activities; and

d. Acceptance of the July 1944 bomb plot against Hitler as a justifiable and honorable act.

3. Structurally, the Gesellschaft was headed by its Executive Board under the nominal chairmanship of von Hellermann. Deputy chairman was Felix Steiner, whose tainted SS background, fuzzy political ideas and pugnacious temperment partially contributed to the organization's demise as a KUGEL project. Although not personally popular with his colleagues (Classen explains this well in his critique), Steiner, by virtue of his alleged role as foster father of the Gesellschaft, and by his aggressive personality, entrenched himself in the organization's leadership circle. The Gesellschaft also had a Beirat, or Advisory Council, headed by ex-General Hasso von Manttauffel, but this group had only honorary functions and no significant voice in Gesellschaft policy matters. Various specialized Gesellschaft committees (Arbeitsausschüsse) were also set up, each dealing with research and preparation of special papers and studies on technical military matters. Among these committees were those on Military Training and Education, Defense Propaganda (headed by Dr. Classen), Youth and Defense, Military Law, Military Organization, Military Medicine, Armored Troops and Warfare, Partisan Warfare, etc. One objective of the committees, in addition to indoctrination and instruction of section members, was to lay the groundwork for potential future usefulness in research and basic staff work on behalf of the embryo "defense ministry" (known as the Blank Office) at Bonn, charged by the Federal Government with organizing German participation in Western military affairs.

2. Pages 4 and 5 of Annex A contain a list of local Gesellschaft sections formally established or in process of organization by 10 December, 1952. These totalled 107 sections in every part of the Federal Republic. Each contained a minimum of 10 and a maximum of 30 members.

IV. Operational Control.

10. As soon as Dr. Classen appeared on the scene in late 1951 and assumed the function of principal agent, contact between Case Officer [] and the Gesellschaft was, with rare exception, maintained through him alone. A potentially complicating factor was Major U's simultaneous role as case officer for HTFUETEL/OMAGAG which put him in the difficult position of handling two "cross-fertilized" organizations. Although the control line in one case was to Demeran and in the other to Classen, nevertheless it was inevitable and unavoidable that "informed" personnel of each organization kept in touch with each other, swapped notes and generally contributed to a basically unsound situation from a clandestine operational viewpoint.

11. It is necessary to mention here that the origin of the Gesellschaft (as an offshoot, in a sense, of HTFUETEL/OMAGAG) and the circumstances of its founding, resulted in at least 21 persons connected with OMAGAG and/or the Gesellschaft being aware of American support of the latter. (Classen

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lists this number in his critique -- Annex C, page 3). The focal point of the trouble in this respect was General Steiner, whose notoriously wagging tongue was impervious to all warnings from [redacted] and Dr. Classen alike. Steiner is constitutionally incapable of keeping his mouth shut, particularly since the Gesellschaft was more or less his own idea and this weakness remains a permanent source of potential KUGOMI embarrassment.

12. Mechanisms by which the Gesellschaft implemented KUGOMI policies -- the psychological warfare line was laid down by Whybrow to Classen and faithfully followed by the latter -- were personally managed by Classen and included the following:

a. The internal information bulletin Wahrkunde, published bi-monthly and distributed to all sections and members as well as to a number of selected outside organizations. This was a house organ of 20 pages in which Classen, Editor Joachim Ruoff and other designated writers discussed topical military matters with heavy stress on U.S. and KUGOMI objectives; German integration with the Western World; an active military contribution; resistance to Communist pressure and policies, etc. The publication was intended -- and used -- as a formalized set of briefing notes for the guidance of section leaders. Its subject matter provided themes for subsequent local rallies and discussion meetings.

b. Public meetings, conducted under local Gesellschaft auspices in many cities, often with speakers directly assigned by the central office in Munich. Dr. Classen reports that as of 12 December 1952 (immediately preceding termination of KUGOMI support), a total of 67 public rallies of this kind had been held, with attendance ranging from 40 to 350 persons. This is not a bad record considering that the Gesellschaft's basic appeal is to a narrowly specialised and professional audience. Of these 67 meetings, 66 were devoted directly to promotion of German support for the European Defense Treaty, 12 to questions of military training, and 3 to lectures on civilian defense against atomic warfare. Not included in these figures are the literally hundreds of local Gesellschaft discussion evenings to which non-members were invited and debate stimulated on the European Defense Treaty issue.

c. The brochure program. This involved the publication, in series, of attractively designed booklets, usually 50-60 pages in length, on a variety of Cold War themes, including "Yes or No to the Defence Treaty", "The USA in the Eyes of a Soldier" (written by ex-General Blumhardt), "Armament in the Soviet Orbit", "The Spirit and Structure of the Red Army", "Europe Can Do It", "Attack on Germany in the Cold War", and "The Road to Satellite States". Nine such brochures were issued by the Gesellschaft during its year of KUGOMI support. The press run of each varied from 5,000 to 10,000 copies. Altogether 212,000 copies were published and distributed in the regular series, with several thousand reprints necessary to meet demand in the case of at least two of the brochures. For the most part, strict KUGOMI editorial control was maintained over this publication program. The subject matter of each brochure was discussed in advance between Whybrow and Dr. Classen, manuscripts were generally submitted for review and modification (frequent changes were made at GADOUR direction), and certain values were made of source material.

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provided by CADOUR to the Gesellschaft. Distribution of the brochures was made through the local sections and by friendly organizations such as the Bund Europaische Jugend and the Bund Deutscher Jugend, and copies were sent to all higher schools and universities in the Federal Republic, libraries, state headquarters of the coalition political parties, etc. Favorable newspaper review and congratulatory letters received by the Gesellschaft from several offices of the Federal Government, the coalition political parties, other veterans' organizations, youth groups, schools and universities, and from private organizations and individuals gave ample testimonial to the effectiveness of this phase of the Gesellschaft program.

V. Financial Support and Introduction of Funds.

13. The total cost to KUGOWN of this project from start to finish was DM 240,858.-- . Annex D itemizes by date and amount the record of advances made and accountings received from the principal agent. The individual accountings, accompanied by receipts and certificates as appropriate, have been submitted to the Mission Finance Office. With the data still available to him, the undersigned can give only an approximate functional breakdown of overall project costs. Exclusive of termination salary payments, approximately 150,000 DM were spent for support of "regular" Gesellschaft operations; 70,000 DM for authors' fees, and brochure printing and distribution costs; and 14,000 DM for two special Gesellschaft conventions which brought together delegates from various points in West Germany.

14. To camouflage introduction of KUGOWN funds, which were the sole source of Gesellschaft income, an arrangement was set up by the principal agent and [] which provided for the deposit of these funds with the Stifterverband für die Deutsche Wissenschaft (Foundation for the Advancement of German Science), located in Essen. The money was re-transmitted monthly from the Stifterverband as a "contribution" into the Munich bank account of the Gesellschaft. Occasionally, a portion of the KUGOWN funds were deposited by [] into a Hannover bank account maintained by another agent controlled by him. A check for this sum from the Hannover account would then be sent to the Stifterverband. For the most part, however, funds were passed directly from Whybrow to Classen and deposited by the latter with the Stifterverband. The fact that the Gesellschaft received its support from American sources was known to the Stifterverband director with whom the arrangement had been made early in the project's existence. This indiscretion has been attributed to General Steiner.

15. It is interesting to note from recent mail intercepts maintained on the Gesellschaft, that it has been successful in obtaining some degree of covert financial support from the Blank Office of the Federal Government subsequent to termination of our support, and that the transfer of funds from the new sponsor is apparently still being handled in the same way through the Stifterverband.

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VI. Termination of KUGOWN Support

16. The decision to terminate support of the Gesellschaft was made in November 1952 as a result of the overall policy change in German operations which, among other things, required a somewhat precipitous withdrawal from the entire field of veterans' affairs. The undersigned, who had replaced

[redacted] as Case Officer barely three weeks before, communicated the decision to Classen and termination proceedings immediately got under way. Details of this close-out phase have been fully reported in contact reports transmitted to the Home Office. However, a few aspects are perhaps worth mentioning.

17. The termination came as a stunning surprise to the Gesellschaft and the proffered explanation that we were pulling out because ratification of the European Defense Treaty was approaching and we considered the basic promotional job to have been largely completed, plus the fact that virtually complete German sovereignty was also imminent, was greeted with some skepticism and bitterness by members of the Gesellschaft Executive Board, if not by the principal agent. All members of this Board, as previously indicated, were aware of the past American support. They were also quick to find out, through the "cross fertilization" mentioned earlier, that we were abandoning HTFULFIL/QKNAGNAG.

18. Immediately a scramble started to secure new sponsorship if possible. Exploratory contacts were made at Bonn and elsewhere. To nobody's surprise, it became obvious that the Federal Government was in no hurry to take over the Gesellschaft and was convinced - without proof - that the ex-officers' group had been financed by some American agency. It was thus treated as "tainted" to some degree, although there was no question of disagreement with the Gesellschaft's record of public achievement. However, the Government's greatest reluctance to adopting the Gesellschaft centered around the person of General Felix Steiner, who apparently was as persona non grata to Bonn as he had been to KUGOWN. After some negotiating, Steiner's complete removal from the scene was made a condition for possible support by the Blank Office.

19. Steiner, meanwhile, appeared to entertain personal political ambitions (there was talk that he intended to run for the Bundestag if he could deliver the SS and other veterans' vote to the Deutsche Partei), and threw himself into the effort to line up a new sponsor. It is known that shortly after our termination was completed, he succeeded in promoting a small "loan" from a dubious Rightist organization, the Gesellschaft für Neue Staatspolitik (Society for a New National Policy) of Ulm. Shortly, however, the Executive Board of the ex-officers' Gesellschaft, faced with the alternative of closing down completely, overcame past reluctance (based on outdated concepts of officer corps mutual protection regardless of personal feeling), and politely ejected the former SS General from the organization. The Gesellschaft, according to monitored reports, was then taken under the financial wing of the Blank Office, to what degree is not known. ZIPPER is also reported to have had some support under consideration.

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20. CADOUR termination with the principal agent was amicable in every respect. The undersigned's final contact with Classen was on 17 January 1953. Classen was given a three months' salary payment and a quitclaim to sign. Although Classen obviously wanted to continue in KUGOWI employ elsewhere, it was not felt advisable to retain him because of the wide circle of people aware of his relationship to "the Americans". Classen himself recognized the validity of this point of view -- in his own words, he was "abgestempelt", or marked as an American "collaborator". So far as is known, he has remained with the Gesellschaft under its new sponsorship.

VII. Concluding Comments

21. It would appear from the record that project QKSNTCH was worthwhile and soundly conceived from a policy standpoint, if one considers the German political climate at the time of its origin. As a KUGOWI asset, it accomplished undeniably valuable work. The fact that the Communists found it necessary to create a counterpart rival - the front organization Führungsring ehemaliger Soldaten (Leadership Circle of Former Soldiers) - and to establish an anti-West, neutralist military publication to match the Gesellschaft's Wehrkunde and its brochure program, is indicative of the Gesellschaft's success in solidifying the basically pro-Western orientation of most West German ex-officers. Other contributory factors were at work to create a pro-Western majority among the ex-officers; the Gesellschaft, however, provided an organizational rallying point and a program which would have been otherwise absent.

22. There were undeniable weaknesses in the operational development of QKSNTCH. These are illustrated by the very presence of General Steiner and other SS personalities in the organization, to say nothing of Steiner's unfortunate qualities which, from all evidence available to the undersigned, led to the widespread circle of "informed" persons within the Gesellschaft and on the outside as well. It is indeed fortunate that this widespread knowledge of American support did not lead to a blow-up while the project was alive. It is difficult to blame the founding Case Officer for this unhealthy situation. QKSNTCH was developed under great pressure for speedy action in the veterans' field, and the assignment should probably never have been given to a Case Officer already involved in a parallel project with inevitable cross ties. Also, to the writer's personal knowledge, the original Case Officer was so heavily committed to other operational burdens (he handled at least five other projects of considerable complexity) that it was remarkable he was able to supervise the Gesellschaft as well as he did. And there can be little doubt but that General Steiner was the biggest thorn in the side of this project. Without him, many of the evident weaknesses would not have appeared. Those which are not related to Steiner's presence are well covered in the principal agent's critique attached to this report, and with which the undersigned is in general agreement.

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I. GRÜNDUNG

Die Gesellschaft für Wehrkunde (GfW) wurde am 5. Januar 1952 in München gegründet. An der Gründungsversammlung nahmen die folgenden Herren teil:

- 1.) Generalmajor a.D. Vollrath von Hellermann
- 2.) Ewald Heinrich von Kleist
- 3.) Oberst a.D. Eberhard Graf von Nostitz
- 4.) General der Waffen-SS a.D. Felix Steiner
- 5.) Prinz Burchard von Preussen
- 6.) Oberst d.R. a.D. Detloff von Kalben
- 7.) Oberstltn. a.D. Franz Josef Ritter von Gilgenheimb
- 8.) Oberst der Waffen-SS a.D. Joachim Ruoff
- 9.) Dr. med. Franz Riedweg
- 10.) Prof. Dr. Wilhelm Classen

Die Gründer waren sich einig darüber, daß folgende Sorgen und Überlegungen die Gründung der GfW rechtfertigten:

- 1.) Die Erkenntnis eines bedrohlich mangelnden Wehrwillens im deutschen Volke,
- 2.) die dauernd zunehmende Infiltration östlicher Ideen und Tendenzen in Kreisen der ehemaligen Offiziere,
- 3.) die Notwendigkeit, aus möglichst vielen wertvollen Offizieren Erfahrungen, Anregungen und Wünsche herauszuholen, die den zuständigen Behörden zur Verfügung gestellt werden sollen. Auf diese Weise soll mitgeholfen werden, daß die neue Wehrwacht in Übereinstimmung mit der demokratischen Staatsform der Bundesrepublik so modern wie möglich werde.

Die Gründungsversammlung erörterte Sinn und praktische Ziele der geplanten Gesellschaft und einigte sich auf diese vier Punkte:

"Der Zweck der Gesellschaft ist:

- (1) Die Verteidigung der westlichen Demokratie gegen die kommunistische Bedrohung und gegen die Bedrohung durch andere totalitäre, insbesondere auch rechtsextreme Bewegungen, zu fördern,
- (2) teilzunehmen an der psychologischen Vorbereitung gegen den Kommunismus,
- (3) den Verteidigungsbeitrag der Bundesrepublik zu propagieren, zunächst und vornehmlich in den Kreisen der ehemaligen Berufsoffiziere, daneben auch in breiteren Kreisen des Volkes,
- (4) in den Kreisen der jüngeren Generation den Wehrgeist und die Wehrbereitschaft zu erwecken und sie vertraut zu machen mit der Entwicklung der "Wehrwaltung im Ausland seit 1945".

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Die Gründungsversammlung erörterte alsdann die Bedingungen, unter denen die Mitgliedschaft in der Gesellschaft erworben werden könne. In der Aussprache über diesen Punkt setzte sich die Auffassung durch, daß die GfW keine Massenorganisation nach der Art der Soldatenbünde werden dürfe. Vielmehr sollte sie in ihrem Mitgliedsbestand zahlenmäßig beschränkt bleiben, um sicherzustellen, daß nur wirklich aktive, am Kampf gegen den Kommunismus und die kommunistische Infiltration aus Überzeugung interessierte Offiziere zusammengeführt würden. Im Hinblick hierauf legte die Gründungsversammlung fest, daß für jeden Bewerber um die Mitgliedschaft die folgenden Voraussetzungen erfüllt sein müssen:

- (1) Der Bewerber muß als Persönlichkeit integer sein. Nach Möglichkeit soll ein anderes Mitglied für ihn bürgen.
- (2) Der Bewerber muß ein überzeugter Gegner des Kommunismus und des Rechtsradikalismus (SRP) sein. Er muß sich zur Staatsform der westlichen Demokratien bekennen.
- (3) Der Bewerber muß die Teilnehmer am 20. Juli, soweit sie aus ehrenhaften Motiven gehandelt haben, als ehrenhaft anerkennen.
- (4) Der Bewerber muß sich zu der Auffassung bekennen, daß die ehemaligen Offiziere, die sich dem Osten als Experten oder als Propagandisten zur Verfügung gestellt haben, als Feinde anzusehen sind.

Um zu gewährleisten, daß trotz dieser Auslese-Beschränkungen keine Infiltration durch links- oder rechtsextremistische Elemente möglich werde, beschloß die Gründungsversammlung weiter, daß für die Aufnahme jedes Mitgliedes die einstimmige Billigung des Vorstandes der Gesellschaft herbeizuführen sei.

Nach Klarlegung der Vereinsziele und der Voraussetzungen für die Mitgliedschaft wählte die Gründungsversammlung für die Dauer von zwei Jahren den folgenden Vorstand:

- (1) Vorsitzender des Vorstandes: Vollrath von Hellermann
- (2) stellvertretender Vorsitzer d. Vorstandes: Felix Steiner
- (3) weitere Vorstandsmitglieder: Eberhard Graf von Nostitz, Ewald Heinrich von Kleist und Detloff von Kalben.

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Der Vorstand wurde ermächtigt, die Gesellschaft im Sinne der deutschen vereinsrechtlichen Bestimmungen zu führen mit der Maßgabe, daß auch die nicht in den Vorstand berufenen Gründungsmitglieder jederzeit das Recht auf Teilnahme an den ordentlichen und außerordentlichen Vorstandssitzungen haben sollen. Die Gründer stellten weiter fest, daß die beim Betrieb der Gesellschaft anfallenden Kosten von Fall zu Fall durch freiwillige Spenden vermöglicher, politisch gleichgesinnter Kreise zu decken seien. Die Gründungsversammlung beschloß endlich die beiliegende Satzung. (Anlage 1)

II. Organisation

(a) Beirat.

Der Vorstand wählte einen Beirat, der sich zusammensetzen soll aus Soldaten, Technikern, Wirtschaftlern und Wissenschaftlern, und dessen Aufgabe es ist, den Vorstand bei wichtigen Entscheidungen zu beraten. Der Beirat ist nicht ausdrücklich in der Satzung enthalten, er gilt daher auch nicht als "Organ" der Gesellschaft im vereinsrechtlichen Sinne. Seine Funktionen werden vom Vorstand nach dessen Ermessen bestimmt. Als Mitglieder des Beirates wurden bisher bestätigt:

(b) Arbeitsausschüsse.

Zur Durchführung der fachlich-wehrkundlichen Forschungs- und Aufklärungsarbeit gliedert sich die Gesellschaft in "Arbeitsausschüsse", von denen jeder ein Spezialgebiet der Wehrkunde unter der Oberleitung eines besonders qualifizierten Experten bearbeiten sollte. Es wurden die folgenden Arbeitsausschüsse konstituiert

Wehrerziehung und -ausbildung (Leitung: v. Manteuffel)
Wehrpropaganda (Leitung: Dr. Classen)
Jugend und Wehr (Leitung: Kugler)

Wehrrecht (Leitung: Wanke)
Wehrstruktur (Leitung: Steiner)
Wehrmedizin (Leitung: Dr. Riedweg)
Panzerwaffe, Panzerkrieg, verbundene Waffen (Steiner)

Artilleristik (Leitung: Hüther)

Hinsichtlich der Ergebnisse der Arbeiten in diesen Ausschüssen wurde beschlossen, daß die fertigen Arbeitsergebnisse vom Beirat und dem Vorstand der Gesellschaft zu prüfen und nach der Entscheidung dieser beiden Institutionen zu verwerten seien. Grundsätzlich sollten die Ergebnisse der Dienststelle Blank angeboten werden, falls sie dort verwertbar erscheinen.

(c) Sektionen.

Räumlich gliederte sich die Gesellschaft in regionale Untergruppen unter der Bezeichnung "Sektionen". Sektionen wurden nach einer kurzen Anlaufzeit in den meisten größeren Städten der Bundesrepublik gegründet. Nach dem ursprünglichen Willen des Vorstandes sollten die Sektionen nur je 10 Mitglieder aufnehmen, doch wurde bei dem wachsenden Interesse, das die Gesellschaft in den Kreisen der ehemaligen Offiziere fand, diese Bestimmung aufgehoben. Seitdem haben die Sektionen die Möglichkeit, bis zu je 30 Mitglieder aufzunehmen. Zur Zeit bestehen im Bundesgebiet Sektionen in den folgenden Städten:

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Abschließende Vorbereitungen für die Gründung weiterer Sektionen sind in den folgenden Städten getroffen worden:

(d) Institut für Wehrwissenschaften.

Dieses Institut ist in Gründung befindlich. Die Zweckmäßigkeit seiner Gründung ergab sich aus der Tatsache, daß die mit den fachlich-wehrwissenschaftlichen Forschungsaufgaben betrauten Arbeitsausschüsse auf die Dauer nicht die erstmöglichkeit wissenschaftlich qualifizierte Arbeit zu leisten imstande sind, da sie weder mit den erforderlichen Mitteln ausgestattet werden, noch ihren ehrenamtlichen und lediglich in ihren Freizeiten arbeitenden Mitgliedern eine Arbeit zumutend möglich ist. So entstand der Plan, die bisher über die Ausschüsse organisierte wissenschaftliche Forschungsarbeit aus der Gesellschaft auszugliedern und sie in einem besonderen Forschungs-Institut zu verankern.

Das Institut soll selbstständig sein, aber seine Arbeitsvorhaben in arbeitsgemeinschaftlicher Bindung zur GfW durchführen. Die Sektionen der GfW stehen dem Institut als Hilfsorgane für die Beschaffung von Materialien und zur Vorbereitung der anfallenden Themen zur Verfügung.

Zum vorbereitenden Gründungsausschuß gehören die Herren Fr.-Joachim Fangohr (federführend), Vollrath von Hellerupen, Dipl.Ing. Heinz Schmid, Ernst-Günther von Roell, Fr.-J.Friedner jun., Heinz Richter, Dr. W. Classen. Es besteht Aussicht, für die wirtschaftliche Sicherung des Instituts einen Kreis von Freunden und Förderern zu gewinnen, falls eine prominente Persönlichkeit aus dem Lager der Regierungspolitik und eine führende Persönlichkeit aus der Wirtschaft für eine Beteiligung an der Gründung gewonnen werden können. Beziehungen in dieser Richtung sind im Gange.

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III. Praktische Arbeit

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Die Gesellschaft hat während ihres einjährigen Bestehens folgende Aufgaben durchgeführt.

1. Wiederbelebung des Wehrgedankens im ehemaligen Offizierskorps.

Von den über 1000 Mitgliedern der Gesellschaft, ausnahmslos ehemaligen Offizieren vorwiegend der mittleren und jüngeren Generation, standen weitaus die meisten anfanglich jedem Wehrgedanken ablehnend oder doch skeptisch gegenüber. Die Gründe dafür brauchen hier nicht aufgezählt zu werden. Ohne-Mich-Stimmung, extremistische Auffassungen, gedankliche Infiltration aus dem Lager des Ostens, Enttäuschungen persönlicher, politischer und beruflicher Art bildeten das stärkste Hemmnis einer neuen Wehrgesinnung. Die vordringlichste Arbeit der Gesellschaft bestand daher zunächst in der Beseitigung dieser Hemmnisse in den Kreisen der ehemaligen Offiziere. Erreicht wurde dies

- a) durch die gesellige Zusammenführung der örtlich benachbarten ehemaligen Offiziere, die dadurch wieder ein Gefühl der Zusammengehörigkeit erlebten und im Austausch ihrer persönlichen Schicksale zu kleinen, im Menschlichen verbundenen Gruppen wurden,
- b) durch die arbeitsgemeinschaftliche Betätigung in Fragen der modernen Fehrkunde auf den Abenden der Sektionen, wodurch wieder eine lebendige Beziehung geschaffen wurde zu den früheren Berufsinhalten und das bisher verschüttete soldatische Berufsethos und der Berufsstolz wieder zum Aufleben gebracht wurde,
- c) durch vorsichtige, von parteipolitischen Akzenten freie politische Aufklärungsarbeit, die teils durch die "Mitteilungen der Gesellschaft für Wehrkunde", teils durch die "Schriftenreihe der Gesellschaft für Wehrkunde", teils durch Vortagsveranstaltungen geleistet wurde.

2.) Propagierung einer Wehrgesinnung und Vehrbereitschaft außerhalb des Mitgliederkreises.

a) Durch öffentliche Vorträge.

Öffentliche Vortagsveranstaltungen wurden grundsätzlich durch die Sektionen der Gesellschaft, in einigen Fällen durch verwandte Organisationen (unter Gestaltung des Rechners durch die GFW) durchgeführt. Insgesamt wurden 87 größere Veranstaltungen durchgeführt, von denen 66 der Erläuterung und Propagierung des EVG-Vortragswerkes, 12 der Frage der Vehrerziehung, 8 der Frage des Schutzes in der atomaren Kriegsführung, der Rest allgemeinen wehrkundlichen Themen diente. Die Besucherzahlen schwankten zwischen 40 und 350. Nicht inbegriffen sind die von einzelnen Sektionen veranstalteten Diskussionsabende über die EVG, zu den Freunde u. Gegner der EVG gebeten wurden. Zu allen öffentlichen Veranstaltungen wurden die Behörden der btr. Städte

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bzw. Kreise geladen, die in den meisten Fällen auch teilnahmen. Das Presse-Echo dieser Veranstaltungen war ausserordentlich stark und jedenfalls durchschlagender als das der rund 1200 Vortragsveranstaltungen östlicher Tarnorganisationen über die gleichen Themen. Die erfolgreichsten Vortragsredner waren die Mitglieder Dr. Wanke, v. Pfister, v. Schönenfeldt, Mössel, Fangohr, Brunner, Steiner, Rothmund, v. Hildebrandt, Wenning, Wagner, Kugler, als Gäste sprachen, auch die Herren Dethleffsen, Teske, Straimer.

b) Durch Broschüren.

Die Gesellschaft hat durch ihren Ausschuß für Wehrpropaganda unter dem Reihentitel "Schriftenreihe der Gesellschaft für Wehrkunde" insgesamt 9 Broschüren herausgegeben:

Heft I: "Ja oder Nein zum Verteidigungsbeitrag". Das Heft enthält eine sorgfältige Analyse der gegen den deutschen Verteidigungsbeitrag gerichteten Argumente; es faßt diese Argumente in 28 Thesen zusammen und stellt ihnen 28 Gegenthesen gegenüber, in denen die "Thesen" widerlegt werden.

Heft II: "Aufrüstung im sowjetischen Machtbereich". Das Heft enthält eine aus besondere vertraulichen und zuverlässigen Quellen (die im Vorwort genannt sind) erarbeitete Übersicht über die Aufrüstungsmaßnahmen in den osteuropäischen Satellitenstaaten. Der propagandistische Leitgedanke hierbei war, die sowjetische "Friedenskampagne" als Tarnung effektiver Kriegsvorbereitungen zu entlarven.

Heft III: "Die USA in der Sicht eines Soldaten". (Verf.: General a.D. Blumentritt). Das Heft dient dem Gedanken der Versöhnung zwischen den ehemals feindlichen Soldaten. Es war ursprünglich von einem fremden Verlag geplant, wurde aber von der GFW auf Grund einer Vereinbarung mit diesem Verlag in die "Schriftenreihe" übernommen.

Heft IV: "Katyn, Vernichtung der Wehrkraft eines Volkes". Das Heft enthält eine Zusammenfassung der Ergebnisse der amerikanischen und sonstigen ausländischen Untersuchungen über die Vorgeschichte und den Ablauf des Massakers von Katyn. Der propagandistische Leitgedanke war, zu zeigen, welches Schicksal die Wehrelite eines vom Bolschewismus überwältigten Volkes zu gewartigen hat.

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Heft V: "Das EVG-Vertragswerk "Erläuterung u. Kritik".

Das Heft enthält eine von dem Mainzer Staatsrechtslehrer Prof. Frh. v.d. Heydte und Oberst Dr. Wanke erarbeitete Erläuterung der wichtigsten Vertragspunkte, es setzt sich mit den kritischen Widerständen gegen die Verträge auseinander und wirbt für eine Bejahung des Vertrages.

Heft VII: "Geist und Gefüge der Roten Armee".

Das Heft enthält eine Darstellung der Geschichte, der Organisation und des herrschenden Geistes der Roten Armee. Der propagandistische Leitgedanke war, die übertriebenen Vorstellungen von der "Unbesiegbarkeit" der Roten Armee zu zerstören.

Heft VIII: "Europa wird es schaffen,"

Das Heft enthält eine mehr belletristisch gehaltene Darstellung der großen historischen Krisensituation Europas, in denen die Gefahr einer Überwältigung durch den Osten drohte, und beschreibt die Aktionen zur Überwindung dieser Krisen. Der propagandistische Leitgedanke war, zu zeigen, daß Europa heute nicht zum ersten Male von der östlichen Überwältigung bedroht ist und daß es auch heute, wie damals, die Mittel, die Kraft und den Willen zur Selbstbehauptung aufzubringen in der Lage ist.

Heft IX: "Kalter Krieg, Abwehr und Angriff".

Das Heft enthält eine Darstellung der sowjetischen Kampfziele, Kampfauffassungen und Kampftechniken im Kalten Krieg und entwickelt sowohl die Methoden der notwendigen Abwehr wie auch die einer offensiven Begegnung. Der Leitgedanke des Heftes ist: für eine offensive Kalte Kriegsführung gegenüber dem Kolonialismus zu werben und auszurüsten.

Heft X: "Der Weg ins Satellitentum".

Das Heft enthält anhand neuester Mitteilungen eine Schilderung des "Weges der Regierungen in den östl. Satellitenstaaten vor der Stabilisierung nicht- oder halbkommunistischer Regierungen unmittelbar bei ihrer Machtübernahme" und die allmähliche Kaltstellung des sozial-faschistischen Klientelismus zur vollständigen "Machtübernahme" bzw. die orthodoxen moskaphörigen KP-Diktaturen. Der propagandistische Leitgedanke ist, zu zeigen, daß jede Form der "Anlehnung von Anfang an" an die Sowjetunion (auch die Gruppe der "sozialisierten" Deutschlands) zu einem kalten Weg des Satellitentums führt.

Die Hefte wurden auf Grund eines besonderen Verteilungssystems zur Verteilung gebracht, und zwar dergest lt, daß eine aufmerksame Lektüre gesichert erschien. Entsprechend intensiv war das Echo der Schriften, das Tausende von Nachbestellungen und zahlreiche z.T. begeisterte Zuschriften von Privatpersonen, Organisationen, Soldatenverbänden, politischen Parteien (insbes. von Untergliederungen der CDU/CSU), Jugendverbänden, kirchlichen Organisationen, sogar aus dem Ausland (Norwegen, Schweden, Holland, Frankreich, Italien, USA, sogar aus Jugoslawien) erbrachte. Entgegen der weitverbreiteten Auffassung, daß für Broschüren kein Lesepublikum mehr zu finden sei, muß an Hand der Erfahrungen der Gesellschaft festgestellt werden, daß Broschüren geradezu "gefressen" werden, wenn sie thematisch ("Das Wehrthema liegt in der Luft") in der Art der Darstellung und in ihrer äusseren Aufmachung genauestens auf die zeitbestimmten Aufklärungsbedürfnisse der Masse abgestimmt werden.

Nachdem die Gesellschaft ihre Mittel für die Herausgabe der 202.000 Exemplare erschöpft hat (sie hat auf Erlöse aus dem Vertrieb verzichtet, um nicht in den Geruch eines "Erwerbsunternehmens" zu kommen) und auch von befördlicher Seite keinerlei nennenswerte Unterstützung ihrer wehrpropagandistischen Arbeit erhielt, ist sie gezwungen, mit dem Erscheinen von Heft 10 der Schriftenreihe ihre wehrpublizistische Arbeit vorerst einzustellen.

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a) Durch die "Mitteilungen der Gesellschaft für Wehrkunde".

Die "Mitteilungen" waren ursprünglich geplant als eine verbandsinterne Zeitschrift, die lediglich den Mitgliedern ausgehändigt werden sollten. Sie gelangten aber durch die Mitglieder auch in Kreise ausserhalb der Gesellschaft und wurden z.T. (wie die Nr. 12 mit dem Aufsatz von Muthesius über "Rüstung ohne Inflation") in Arbeitsgemeinschaften wirtschaftlicher, wissenschaftlicher, politischer und militärischer Organisationen und in Universitätszirkeln als Unterlagen von Aussprachen verwandt. Die "Mitteilungen" waren inhaltlich so gegliedert, daß ein einleitender Aufsatz jeder Nummer einen politischen Leitartikel mit einer betonten Kampftendenz gegen den Bolschewismus brachte. Es folgten fachlich-wehrkundliche Aufsätze. Den Schluß bildeten kurze Wehrnotizen über den Stand der Wahr im Ausland auf Grund ausländischen Quellenmaterials. Von den "Mitteilungen" erschienen bisher 14 Nummern mit einer Auflage von jeweils 2000. Die ersten 3 Nummern erschienen hektographiert, die restlichen gedruckt.

Das ungewöhnliche Echo der "Mitteilungen" bei den Mitgliedern und ausserhalb des Mitgliederkreises ermutigte die Gesellschaft, diese bislang verbandsinterne Zeitschrift zu einer öffentlich erscheinenden Monatszeitschrift auszubauen, ein Plan, der ab 1. Januar 1953 verwirklicht werden sollte. Inzwischer hat sich herausgestellt, daß die Verwirklichung dieses Planes die Mittel der Gesellschaft übersteigt.

d) Durch fachliche Untersuchungen und Memoranda.

Diese mehr auf die fachlich-wissenschaftliche Thematik abgestellte Arbeit der Gesellschaft ist erst im Beginn ihrer Entfaltung. Bisher wurden folgende Themen in abschließenden Stellungnahmen behandelt:

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1. Grundsätze der Offiziersauslese u. Offiziersausbildung
2. Gedanken zur Wehrverfassung
3. Lehrerziehung der Jugend
4. Erfahrungen im Partisanenkampf

Für die Winterarbeit sind die folgenden Themen gestellt:

1. Gedanken über eine Disziplinarstrafordnung
2. Soll in der neuen Wehrmacht ein Eid geleistet werden?
3. Sammeln von Kriegserfahrungen
4. Panzer in Angriff und Abwehr
5. Panzerabwehr bei schnellen Verbänden
6. Das verbundene Gefecht schneller Verbände mit Fliegerkampfkraft und Fallschirmtruppe
7. Panzerjägerverbände
8. Kampf und Bewaffnung ortsgebundener Territorial-einheiten.

IV. Gegenkräfte der Gesellschaft

Sieht man ab von ressentimentsbetonten Einwänden einzelner Persönlichkeiten, so bleiben als ausgesprochene Gegner der GfW die zahlreichen östlichen Tarnorganisationen und unter diesen in erster Linie der

"Führungsring ehemaliger Soldaten".

Die Beobachtungen der Gesellschaft ergaben zweifelsfrei, daß diese kommunistische Tarnorganisationen sich seit der Gründung der GfW im Januar 1952 mit vervielfachten Anstrengungen daran machte, die ehemaligen Offiziere i. ihr Lager herüberzuziehen. Der Führungsring ahmte zunächst die Form der regionalen Untergliederungen in Sektionen nach und suchte in den meisten Orten, in denen die CPT Sektionen errichtete, ebenfalls, und zwar zugleich zur gleichen Zeit, Sektionen einzurichten. In den meisten Fällen konnte das, nicht zuletzt auf Grund aktiver Interventionen der Sektionen der GfW, verhindert werden. Der Führungsring ahmte ferner

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die fachliche Untergliederung der GfW in fachlich-wehrkundliche Arbeitsausschüsse nach, die beinahe die gleiche thematische Aufgabenstellung übernahmen wie die Ausschüsse der Gesellschaft. Es ist allerdings nicht bekannt geworden, daß der Führungsring nennenswerte Ergebnisse auch nur eines seiner 12 Arbeitsausschüsse vorgewiesen hat. Nachdem die GfW ihre "Mitteilungen" herausbrachte, erschien der Führungsring prompt mit einer "Internationalen Militärkorrespondenz" (die gleich mit einer Nummer 4 begann), in der Zug um Zug die Themen der "Mitteilungen" im gegenteiligen Sinne bearbeitet waren. Inzwischen reiste der Herausgeber, der frühere Gaupropagandaleiter Steidl, der auch als "Major" (der er nie war) auftritt, herum und warb für die Gegen-Gründung einer "Gesellschaft für Neue Wehrkunde", die aber nach den Erkundigungen der GfW bisher nur in Bremen zustande kam. Nachdem die "Internationale Militärkorrespondenz" des Führungsringes sich allzu deutlich und zu plump als Divisionsorgan der östlichen Interessenten bloßgestellt hatte, traten die Initiatoren Steidl, Schrank u. Beyer in den Hintergrund, gewannen als Strohmann den schon lange als zwielichtig bekannten Bruder des Feldmarschalls v. Reichenau, Ernst von Reichenau, vormals Berater ebenso zwielichtiger chinesischer Provinzgeneräle, zuletzt Gehilfe der amerikanischen Anklagebehörde im Prozess gegen deutsche Angehörige der Abwehr in Schanghai, für die Herausgabe des "Militärpolitischen Forums", einer militärpolitischen Monatszeitschrift, die sehr viel vorsichtiger als die verflossene "Internationale Militärkorrespondenz", aber im Grunde doch nicht minder deutlich die Neutralitätsthese projektiert, die von den militärischen Diktatoren der SU und der SED als praktikabel ausgegeben wird vor die Zersetzung des Wehrwillens namentlich in den Kreisen des ehemaligen Offizierkorps in der Bundesrepublik.

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Es kann keinem Zweifel unterliegen, daß der kommunistische Führungsring, nach den bisherigen nachweisbaren Fehlschlägen in seiner Konkurrenz mit der GfW, mit dem "Militär-politischem Forum" erstmals die Chance einer echten und aussichtsreichen Konkurrenz gewonnen hat, und dies in einem Augenblick, da der GfW die Möglichkeit einer gleich intensiven Breitenwirkung aus Mangel an Mitteln nicht mehr möglich ist. Der Name des Herausgebers des "Forums", E. v. Reichenau, die gediegene Ausstattung der Karte, die vorsichtige Ansprache alter Ressentiments, das patriotische Pathos der Artikel, die fachlich wissenschaftliche "Verpackung" der politischen Tendenz, die freigebige Verteilung ohne Abonnementsgebühr, die großzügigen Einladungen und luxuriösen Empfänge von Offizieren (wie in München, Hamburg und Stuttgart), die zum "Freundeskreis" des "Forums" geworben werden sollen: das alles birgt in sich beträchtliche Erfolgschancen des kommunistischen Führungsringes, die erstmals die Zersetzung= und Diversionsarbeit dieser fanatischen Gruppe als ernsthaft gefährlich erscheinen lassen. Dabei sind die dem Führungsring für Arbeiten dieser Arbeit zur Verfügung stehenden Mittel anscheinend unbegrenzt. Wie der GfW bekannt geworden ist, erhält der FR über die französische KP Geldmittel östlicher Herkunft in Höhe von DM 15.000.-- monatlich, ein Betrag, der angesichts der Aufwendungen des FR selbst nicht für die Bezahlung der mit der Finanzierung des "Forums" anfallenden Kosten verwandt werden kann. Diese Kosten, die bei dem bisherigen Aufwand auf 8-10.000 DM beziffert werden müssen, sind unzweifelhaft in dem über die französische KP zur Verfügung gestellten Betrag nicht enthalten. Hinsichtlich seiner Herkunft ist die Legende von einem "ungewöhnlich hohen" privaten Vermögen des Herrn von Reichenau, der nach eigenen Angaben beträchtliche Verluste aus China nach Macao verschoben habe, erfunden worden. Herr von Reichenau setzt dieses "gerettete" Vermögen ein, um

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inem privaten Hobby zu fröhnen, nämlich dem Hobby, Westdeutschland "vor der Versklavung durch die USA zu retten".

Bisher sind die Bemühungen des FR, einen nennenswerten Einbruch in die Kreise der ehemaligen Offiziere zu erzielen, misslungen; Das war nachweislich zu einem entscheidenden Teil darauf zurückzuführen, daß die namhaften und in Kreisen der jüngeren Offiziere hochangesehenen älteren Offiziere bei der GfW waren, und daß die GfW in vertraulichen Informationen ihre Mitglieder über den "Führungsring", die "Internationale Militärkorrespondenz" und das "Militärpolitische Forum" aufklärte.

Stand so die bisherige Auseinandersetzung zwischen GfW und "Führungsring" hinsichtlich der Werbung in Kreisen der ehemaligen Offiziere und Soldaten eindeutig zu Gunsten der GfW, so besteht jetzt die Gefahr, daß diese kommunistische Tarnorganisation infolge ihrer hohen Geldmittel und ihrer rücksichtslosen Kampfmethoden an Boden gewinnt. Die GfW ist nicht mehr in der Lage, dem Führungsring mit dem Einsatz auch nur annähernd gleich hoher Mittel zu begegnen.

Betreff: "GfW".

(a) handicaps.

1. Die Gesellschaft hatte von Anfang an Schwierigkeiten, weil Steiner als führende Persönlichkeit galt und sich auch als solche ausgab. Zwar galt St. überall als aufrichtig antikommunistisch, doch waren die folgenden Gründe massgebend für eine weitgehend ablehnende Einstellung grosser Kreise des ehemaligen Offizierskorps:

- a) St. war 1932 oder 33 vom Herr zur Waffen-SS übergewechselt. Dies wurde als Opportunismus und Verletzung des alten preussischen Korpseistes der Heeresoffiziere ausgelegt. St.'s Gegner sind in der Masse nur die Heeresoffiziere. Diese bilden aber die Mehrheit des Offizierskorps überhaupt, und sie stecken noch vorwiegend in alt-preussischen Ehr- und Kastenvorstellungen.
- b) St. gilt allgemein als ein begabter Soldat, aber ebenso allgemein als ein unbegabter Politiker, der unklare oder verschwommene, z.T. romantische Verstellungen über den Staat und seine Funktionen hegt. Es wurde bekannt, dass er parteipolitische Ambitionen hat.
- c) In weiten Kreisen war bekannt, dass St. mit allen Besatzungsmächten Kontakt gesucht und auch gepflegt hat. Über seine wiederholten Aussprachen mit Vertretern der französischen Besatzungsmacht (Francois-Poncet und General König) hat er selbst gelegentlich berichtet, über Verbindungen zu englischen Offizieren gehen Gerüchte. Beides trug ihm den Ruf opportunistischen Kollaborierens ein.
- d) St. wurde verantwortlich gemacht für den verfehlten politischen Kurs der "Deutschen Soldaten Zeitung", die angeblich von ihm inspiriert worden sei. Dies trug ihm insbesondere die Ablehnung der ehemaligen Generalstabsoffiziere ein.

Die Vorwürfe gegen Steiner, die sich nachteilig für die Ausbreitung der GfW auswirkten, waren nur zum Teil substanziiert. Es war das Verdienst des Vorsitzenden von Hellermann, die gegen Steiner in den Sektionen auftauchenden Widerstände zu einem guten Teil beseitigt zu haben im Wege persönlicher Aussprachen mit den Sektionsmitgliedern.

2. Die zweite Quelle des Misstrauens war der 1. Vorsitzende von Hellermann. Er war in der Schlussphase des Krieges Leiter der Abteilung Führernachwuchs im Heerespersonalamt und soll sich in dieser Funktion sehr "nationalsozialistisch" gefühlt haben. Hinzu kam, dass er als "schwache Persönlichkeit" galt, was den Verdacht verstärkte, dass nicht er, sondern Steiner der wirkliche "Vorsitzende" der Gesellschaft sei. In Wirklichkeit hat v.H. sich als ein äusserst wertvolles Vorstandsmitglied

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erwiesen. Er war die stärkste Triebkraft gegen KP-Infiltration, für den Kampf gegen die Tarnorganisationen des "Führungsringes" und gegen die SP, außerdem neutralisierte er die ständigen parteipolitischen Extratouren Steiners. Schliesslich war auch er es, der das zur Zeit gute Verhältnis zu Bonn (v. Bonin) herstellte.

3. Das innere Leben der GfW war belastet durch zwei entgegengesetzte Tendenzen. Die eine Tendenz, vertreten durch Steiner, zielt auf die Entwicklung der GfW zu einem innerpolitischen Instrument, das im Dienst einer gegen Bonn gerichteten Rechtsopposition verwandt werden sollte. Die andere Tendenz, vertreten durch den Leiter des Ausschusses für Wehrpropaganda, wollte die GfW zu einem Instrument der kalten Kriegsführung gegen den Kommunismus machen. Beide Tendenzen sind nie zu einem völligen Ausgleich gekommen und haben zeitweise starke innere Spannungen entstehen lassen. Steiner verfolgte das Durchsetzen seiner Tendenz durch den Versuch einer engen Verkoppelung der GfW mit der Ulmer "Gesellschaft für Neue Staatspolitik", was ständig auf den Widerstand des gesamten übrigen Vorstandes stieß. Die andere Tendenz suchte sich im Wege der praktischen Arbeit durchzusetzen über die "Mitteilungen" und über die Broschüren der "Schriftenreihe". Im Fall der Beendigung aller Subventionen der GfW versucht Steiner die Gesellschaft zu einer Art branch der Ulmer Gesellschaft zu machen, indem er über die Ulmer Gesellschaft Mittel für den Weiterbestand der GfW besorgt.
4. Belastend für die GfW war von Anfang an, dass die Redaktion der "Mitteilungen" in die Hände von Ruoff gelegt wurde. Zwar hat Ruoff die Aufgaben der Schriftleitung gut gelöst. Aber seine Herkunft aus der Waffen-SS gab ihm immer wieder Anlass zu Verdächtigung, dass er zusammen mit Steiner aus der GfW ein "Waffen-SS"-Unternehmen zu machen beabsichtigte. Diese Unterstellung war objektiv unwahr. Steiner und Ruoff standen vom Beginn der Gesellschaft an in einem zeitweise recht stürmischen Spannungsverhältnis. Beide sind grundverschiedene Naturen und beide haben grundverschiedene Auffassungen hinsichtlich der politischen Lage. Trotzdem wurde der Verdacht auf eine Art SS-Verschwörung der beiden dauernd kolportiert.
5. Ein anderes handicap der GfW ergab sich daraus, dass sie von Anfang an als eng verbunden mit der DSZ ausgegeben wurde. Die Tatsache, dass Steiner und Ruoff beide dem Schildverlag bzw. der Redaktion der DSZ angehörten, war der Grund hierfür. Von der DSZ war schon vor Gründung der GfW bekannt, dass sie aus amerikanischen Mitteln finanziert wurde. So schloss man aus der Tatsache, dass Steiner und Ruoff auch zu den Gründern der GfW zählten, dass auch die GfW, ebenso wie die DSZ, aus amerikanischen Mitteln gespeist werde. Die GfW hat diese Verdachtsmomente weitergehend dadurch aus dem Wege geräumt, dass sie ihre Mittel teil-

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über den "Stifterverband für die Deutsche Wissenschaft" laufen liess. In Bonn jedenfalls sind dadurch die Verdachtsmomente geräumt worden.

6. Hemmend für die Wirksamkeit der GFW in propagandistischer Hinsicht war, dass die publizistischen Projekte von amerikanischer Seite geprüft werden mussten und dann zum Teil abgelehnt wurden. Die Zweckmässigkeit und Brauchbarkeit publizistischer Vorfahren kann nur aus einer mit der derzeitigen psychologischen Lage in der Bundesrepublik völlig vertrauten deutschen Persönlichkeit beurteilt werden. Als Beispiel sei verwiesen auf die Entwürfe des Schriftstellers Herbert Blanck-Hamburg. Sie wurden - mit Ausnahme der Schrift "Europa wird es schaffen" - von amerikanischer Seite abgelehnt. Aber gerade Blanks Stil und seine künstlerische Auswahl haben ein ganz besonderes Echo in der jungen öffenlichkeit. Seine Broschüre ist die mit dem besten und weitestreichenden Echo. Nachbestellungen kommen von der Presse, von Jugendverbänden, von Schulen und politischen Organisationen, sogar aus kirchlichen Gruppen. Der hiesige Vorschlag, sein Buch "Soldaten" wieder (nach einer entsprechenden Überarbeitung) neu zu drucken, hätte einen weitgehenden Einbruch in die Kreise der zögernden oder infiltrierten Kreise ehemaliger Soldaten erzielen können. Der amerikanische Einwand, das Buch sei zu "preussisch", ist unhaltbar angesichts dessen, dass eine moderne Überarbeitung zugemagt war und die ostzonalen Propagandabehörden inzwischen längst die preussische Tradition als eines der wirkungsvollsten Instrumente zur Infiltration begriffen und auch angewandt haben.

(b) Was bei ähnlichen Unternehmen zu beachten wäre.

1. Zwischen der amerikanischen Stelle und dem aufzubauenden Rat darf es nur EINE Mittelpersönlichkeit geben. Bei der Erstellung der GFW wussten folgende Persönlichkeiten um den Kontakt in Verbindung mit einer amerikanischen Stelle: Steiner, Damerau, Pfeiffer, Bach, v. Kalben, Frau Faulhaber, Graf Schack, Dr. Riedweg, von Jilg, Heimb, Graf Nostitz, Bolbrinker, Blumentritt, Ruoff, Frau Ruff, Prinz Burchard, v. Kleist, Röder, Spangler, Pfeiffer, Uhlig, Strasser, Dr. Classen, Frau Riedweg. Das ist unmöglich, da in einem solchen Fall eine Geheimhaltung nicht mehr unbedingt gewährleistet ist. Eine einzige (nicht einmal zwei oder drei) Persönlichkeit muss als Vertrauensperson des Auftraggebers fungieren, und diese Persönlichkeit muss volles Vertrauen genießen.

2. Wenn schon ein Offizier als Vertrauensmann ausgewählt wird, dann sollte es nicht ein Offizier der Waffen-SS, aber auch nicht ein Heeresoffizier oder eine Offizier der Luftwaffe, sondern möglichst ein Offizier der ehemaligen Kriegsmarine sein. Die Offiziere der Waffen-SS haben bei den übrigen Offizieren keinen ausreichenden Kredit, die Heeresoffiziere sind durchweg in allen Kastenvorstellungen preussischer Provenienz befangen, die Luftwaffenoffiziere werden politisch überhaupt nicht ernst genommen. Die Marineoffiziere dagegen gelten als welloffen, zolern und mehr als andere einer westlichen Orientierung zugänglich. Am besten wäre es, eine Persönlichkeit auszuwählen, die über-

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nicht in den Vorurteilen des ehemaligen Offizierskorps aufgewachsen und erzogen worden ist die aber auf der andern Seite soviel Gewicht als Persönlichkeit hat, dass sie auch von den ehemaligen Offizieren als massgebend anerkannt wird. Damit wären von Anfang viele Schwierigkeiten, die sich aus den persönlichen, karrieremässigen, politischen und traditionellen Ressentiments der deutschen Offiziere gegeneinander ergeben, vermieden.

3. Die Geldquelle muss glaublich verschleiert werden. Bei Bekanntwerden der ausländischen Herkunft der Mittel ist das Unternehmen diskreditiert und verliert die Möglichkeit einer wirksamen Einflussnahme. Möglichkeiten zur einer wirklich einwahlfreien Verschleierung der Herkunft der Gelder sind nicht zahlreich, doch ergeben sich Anhaltspunkte bei Berücksichtigung der folgenden Hinweise:

- (a) Gründung einer Revisions- oder Treuhandgesellschaft, die von den deutschen Finanzbehörden akzeptiert wird und selber Revisions- und Kontrollfunktionen ausübt in der Lage und behördlich berechtigt ist. Diese Treuhandgesellschaft erhält die Mittel "zur Veraltung". Sie verwendet sie ausserhalb jeder behördlichen oder privaten Kontrolle.
- (b) Gründung eines wissenschaftlichen Forschungsinstitutes, dessen gemeinnütziger Charakter von der Finanzbehörde bestätigt worden ist und das daher von jeder behördlichen Kontrolle freigestellt wird.
- (c) Etablierung einer deutschen Niederlassung einer ausländischen Handelsfirma, die ihre Mittel auch der deutschen Finanzbehörde gegenüber als "Werbeausgaben" zu deklarieren in der Lage und auch berechtigt ist.
- (d) Interne Vereinbarung mit einer deutschen politischen Behörde.

Andere Wege zu einer wirksamen Verschleierung der Herkunft der Mittel gibt es in der Bundesrepublik bei der derzeitigen gesetzgeberischen Handhabe nicht.

4. Bei Abmachungen zwischen dem Auftraggeber und der deutschen Vertrauenspersönlichkeit muss absolute Klarheit über das Ziel des Unternehmens geschaffen werden. Bei der GfW ist diese Klarheit nicht erreicht worden. Steiner berief sich ständig darauf, ihm sei der Auftrag gegeben worden, ein Instrument der Außenpolitik zu schaffen und gleichzeitig eine Art "schwarze Kaderarmee" zu erstellen. Dr. Classen berief sich ständig darauf, die Gesellschaft solle ein Instrument der kalten Kriegsführung gegen den Osten werden. Unter dieser Gegensätzlichkeit hat die Entwicklung der GfW gelitten. Bei Gründungen dieser Art darf eine Unklarheit dieser Art nicht auftreten.

A. Handicaps

1. The Gesellschaft für Wehrkunde had difficulties from the very start because (ex-General) Steiner was considered to be the leading GfW personality and also passed himself off as such. Although Steiner was truthfully regarded everywhere as sincerely anti-Communist, nevertheless the following factors were responsible for a widespread negative reaction on the part of large circles of the former Officer Corps.

a. Steiner transferred from the Army to the Waffen-SS in 1932 or 1933. This move was interpreted by his fellow officers as being an act of opportunism and not in accord with the old Prussian spirit of the Army officers. Although Steiner's enemies are mainly Army officers, these constitute the majority of the Officer Corps and they still adhere, for the most part, to the old Prussian concepts of honor and caste.

b. Steiner is generally considered a gifted soldier, but he is equally regarded as an untalented politician with vague, hazy, and partly romantic notions about the State and its functions. It was well known that Steiner had party-political ambitions.

c. It was widely known that Steiner sought and cultivated contacts with all occupation powers. Incidentally, he himself talked about his repeated conversations with representatives of the French occupation powers -- Francois Poncet and General Koenig. There were rumors about contacts between Steiner and English officers. Both of these relationships brought him the reputation of being an opportunistic collaborator.

d. Steiner was held responsible for the mistaken political course of the DSZ (Deutsche Soldaten Zeitung) which was allegedly inspired by him. This especially caused Steiner to be rejected by the former General Staff officers. (Note: This refers to DSZ anti-Adenauer attacks which caused a flurry at the time; this editorial course was later changed to a more favorable attitude).

The repressions against Steiner which adversely affected the expansion of the GfW were true only in part. Part of the growing resistance to him was due to the efforts of GfW Chairman von Hellermann, who stirred up personal antagonism through private conversations with members of the GfW sections.

2. A second source of internal mistrust was GfW Chairman (ex-General) von Hellermann himself. During the closing phases of the war he was head of the Army Personnel Office section for training future leaders, and is reported to have performed his duties in a very National Socialist manner. He was also regarded as a "weak personality" which, (in connection with the GfW) strengthened the impression that not he, but Steiner, was the actual Gesellschaft Chairman. However, the truth is that von Hellermann proved to be a worthy director of the GfW. He was the strongest motivating force against Communist infiltration, against the Communist-front "Leadership Ring" (of ex-officers) and against the SRP (outlawed radical rightist party) -- to say nothing of the fact that he neutralized the perennial cut-of-turn political maneuvers of Steiner. Finally, it was also von Hellermann who established the present good GfW relations with Bonn (through von Bonin).

3. Internally, the GfW was troubled by two opposing factions. The first of these, represented by Steiner, aimed at transforming the GfW into an instrument of domestic politics tied to rightist opposition against Bonn (i.e., the Federal Government). The other faction, headed by the leader of the GfW Committee for Defense Propaganda (Classen himself) wanted to make the GfW an instrument of cold war guidance against Communism. The two factions never came to full agreement, and from time to time strife and discord broke out. Steiner tried to further the aims of his faction by attempting to closely link the GfW with the Ulm "Gesellschaft für Neue Staatspolitik", which arouses resistance from the governing Board of the GfW. The other faction sought to carry out its work by means of "Opinions" (GfW publication Wehrkunde for internal distribution) and through brochures by many different writers. In the event all support for the GfW ends, Steiner wants to transform the GfW into a branch of the Ulm group while at the same time he looks beyond the Ulm organisation for some means of long term support.

4. From the beginning, the GfW was handicapped in that the editorship of "Opinions" was placed in the hands of Ruoff. Of course, Ruoff handled the editorial work very well. However, his Waffen-SS background again and again aroused suspicion that he intended — in cooperation with Steiner -- to make a Waffen-SS undertaking out of the GfW. Objectively speaking, this supposition was not true. From the very beginning of the GfW, Steiner and Ruoff frequently had very stormy relations. The two men are completely opposite in nature and each has an entirely different conception of the political scene. Nevertheless, the suspicion spread that both were carrying on some sort of SS-conspiracy.

5. Another handicap to development of the GfW was the fact that from the very beginning it was rumored to be closely tied in with the Soldaten Zeitung. The fact that Steiner and Ruoff both were connected with the SCHILD Verlag (publishers of the DSZ), or to the editorial staff of the DSZ itself, was the basis for this rumor. Before the GfW was founded, it was known that the DSZ was financed by the Americans. Thus, Steiner's and Ruoff's presence as founding members of the GfW created the basis for implication that both the GfW and the DSZ were American-supported. The GfW dispelled this suspicion to some degree by maintaining that its support came from the Foundation for German Scientific Study (Stiftverband für die Deutsche Wissenschaft). In any case, this seemed to eliminate suspicions in Bonn.

6. Propaganda operations of the GfW were somewhat restricted in that editorials had to be examined by the Americans and then were refused in part. The appropriateness and usefulness of editorial projects can only be judged by a fully trusted German personality familiar with the present psychological situation in the Federal Republic. As an example, reference is made to the drafts of the author Herbert Blank in Hamburg. They — with the title "Europe will Do it" — were turned down by the Americans. However, Blank's style and his selection of theme have quite a large audience in Germany. His brochure is the one with the best and most far-reaching response; repeat orders are coming from the press, youth groups, schools and political organisations as well as church groups.

The proposals in this country to reprint his old book "Soldaten" (after a suitable modification of text), would make a far-reaching inroad into the circles of the dilatory or infiltrated circles of former soldiers. The American objection that the book is too "Prussian" is untenable, considering that an up-to-date re-writing of the text was promised, and that the East Zone propaganda officials have always made use of the Prussian tradition as one of the most effective instruments for infiltration.

B. What to watch for in similar undertakings

1. There should be only one middleman between the American office and a rebuilt Apparat. In the establishment of the OFW, the following people knew about its connection with an American office:

Steiner, Demerau, Parlebach, von Kalben, Frau Faulhaber,
Oraf Schack, Dr. Riedweg, von Gilgenheimb, Graf Mostits,
Bolbunker, Blumentritt, Ruoff, Frau Ruoff, Prinz Burchard,
von Kleist, Röder, Spengler, Pfeiffer, Uhlig, Strasser,
Dr. Classen, Frau Riedweg.

This was impossible since secrecy was no longer implicitly guaranteed. A single person (not even two or three) must function as agent of the employer -- and this person must enjoy full confidence.

2. When an officer is selected as agent, then he should not be an officer of the Waffen-SS, an Army officer, or an Air Force officer; but if at all possible, should be a Navy officer. The Waffen-SS officers have not sufficient prestige with the other officers; the Army officers are steeped in the old Prussian ideas of caste; the Air Corps officers are generally not seriously concerned politically. Navy officers, in comparison, are considered worldly, up-to-date and more approachable than others of a Western orientation. It would be best to select a person who, generally, has not grown up and been educated in the prejudices of the former Officer Corps and who has as much weight as a personality on the other side that he would be acknowledged by the former officers as influential. Many difficulties would thereby be avoided from the beginning which result from the opposing personal, career-wise, political and traditional resentments of the German officers.

3. The financial source must be believably concealed. The undertaking is discredited with the knowledge of the ~~original~~ origin of the money and thereby loses the possibility of readily being influential. The possibilities for a really ~~unobjectionable~~ concealment of the origin of funds are not many, however, the following specific could be considered:

a. Establishment of an auditor or trust company which is acceptable to the German finance authorities, and which is in a legally authorized position to carry on these audit and control functions. This trust company could receive the money "in trusteeship" and use it ostensibly either on behalf of official or confidential accounts.

b. Establishment of a scientific research institute whose generally useful character has been endorsed by financial authorities and which, therefore, is free from all official auditing.

c. Establishment of a German subsidiary of a foreign trade firm which, in the eyes of German finance authorities, can and is entitled to declare their money as publicity costs.

d. Internal agreement with a German political official.

There are no other means for an effective concealment of the origin of money under the present legislative arrangements in the Federal Republic.

4. In the agreement between the employer and the German agent, there must be absolute clarity on the goal of the undertaking. This clarity was not reached with the GFW. Mueller alleges that he was instructed to create an instrument of domestic policy and at the same time to establish a kind of "black cadre" Army. Dr. Glaser said the GFW was to be an instrument of cold war guidance against the Soviets. The development of the GFW has suffered under these opposing ideals. In establishments of this kind, there should not be this type of confusion.

1. Since reference was sent, POB has received further correspondence on Subject from ZIPPER routed through [] . ZIPPER having previously denied any connection to Subject - based on a routine name trade - now states that Subject is working in the sphere of "Wehrkunde" with several individuals (unnamed) who are in contact with ZIPPER. ZIPPER reports, however, that a direct connection between Subject and ZIPPER does not exist at the present time. Furthermore, they ask for any existing information on Subject which would merit a warning to Subject.
2. The above indicates that Subject is connected with the "Gesellschaft fuer Wehrkunde" which as you know is supported by ZIPPER. Consequently we are initiating intercept coverage on Subject for a trial period in an attempt to discover Subject's ZIPPER associates. Incidentally we have discovered through the [] intercepts that another office has intercept coverage on the "Gesellschaft fuer Wehrkunde," and Wilhelm CLASSEN of the GfW. We are attempting to identify the office.
3. Finally from [] intercepts we have discovered that Subject together with (Prince) Max von FUERSTENBERG, (Archduke) Otto von HABSBURG, (Prince) Burchard von PREUSSEN, (Fuerst) von OETTINGEN-WALDBURG-ZEIL (Dr) Franz RIEDWEG and [] were proposed as a committee for the establishment of a conservative weekly publication to further the interests of the new German Army by (Dr) Franz RIEDWEG who explained the aims of the new publication in a letter to FUERSTENBERG. The publication presumably comes within the scope of the Gesellschaft fuer Wehrkunde and the Abendlandische Academie, and was proposed by "a former general staff officer." The Neue Verlagsgesellschaft, Karlsruhe was proposed as the publishing house.

1. During our last meeting [] reported a conversation with Dr. MATERLICK who told him of a struggle within the UPSWING hierarchy between Colonel LANGERAU and Dr. WINTERSTEIN. The way the story goes, the two were vying for the top spot on the second level of the UPSWING command, i.e., directly below UTILITY. As reported by MATERLICK, WINTERSTEIN won out, and LANGERAU remains in charge of UPSWING's deep cover organizations.

2. Henri duLONG is still in training in Frankfurt. [] does not have the address but indicated that duLONG told him that he was living in a new house or building near the Bahnhof in Frankfurt. After a bit more training, he is to go to an Ausseestelle in Dusseldorf and then back to Pullach to work for Toni HALTER who is now described as the head of the UPSWING Satellite Section. DULONG may possibly be identical with the Henri von DULONG mentioned in ESEA-6298. When I asked INGROWN 1 how old duLONG was and where he was born, he replied that he was about 38 and thought he was born in Stettin. Von DULONG would be about that age and went to school in Stettin. [] will get his exact personal data.

3. [] mentioned that Prulein Louisa von KÖNNERITZ, formerly an employee of his but more recently employed by UPSWING, is now at the German Embassy at Ankara. He assumes she is still on the UPSWING payroll under official cover.

4. Professor CLASSEN is no longer with the Gesellschaft für Wehrkunde but is now working for UPSWING.

[] has been mentioning for several years that his main UPHILL contact, in addition to alias WINTERSTEIN, is one Dr. CLASSEN. In a discussion of [] potential with Lalogenes of MLB on 10 October 1961, it was suggested that more identifying data on Dr. CLASSEN would be useful. An MLB card showed a Dr. CLASSEN as being concerned with Africa for UPHILL and having an office above the Luitpold Kino in Munich. Traces on other individuals with similar names did not appear to be pertinent.</p> <p>2. [] confirms that his UPHILL contact is Dr. Wilhelm CLASSEN, now case officer for Africa under WINTERSTEIN with an office over the Luitpold Kino. CLASSEN was formerly head of the Gesellschaft für Wehrkunde and publisher of the magazine, "Wehrkunde", Herzog Rudolfstr. 1, Munich, which was and possibly still is of interest to UPHILL. (According to [] the present editor of "Wehrkunde", Ewald H. von KLEIST, is not in the good graces of UTILITY and probably not on his payroll.)</p> <p>3. CLASSEN, on behalf of WINTERSTEIN, comes to pump [] about his contacts close to DeGaulle (currently Compte Francois de la Noé and Jean-Claude Prost and Michel HABIB-DELONCLE) and particularly about the Algerian problem. On a visit to [] on 10 October 1961, CLASSEN disclosed that he had dispatched Dr. Alfons DALMA of the "Münchener Merkur" to Paris to get a reading on the situation in France and within NATO from General (fnu) GALLOIS, allegedly military consultant to DeGaulle, president of the French Institute for Politics and Strategy, and Chief of a technical institute at the "DAZOT" Airplane Factory. (The connection with CLASSEN is that GALLOIS was formerly a contributor to "Wehrkunde". What the connection between Dr. DALMA and CLASSEN is not known to [].) DALMA may be able to determine if DALMA is on the UPHILL payroll.) DALMA brought CLASSEN a most pessimistic report (on or about 9 October 1961) which has NATO on the verge of collapse and both the United States and NATO writing off West Germany. (MLB/Reports may be able to identify the UPHILL report, if any, resulting from DALMA's trip).</p> <p>4. Though CLASSEN is no longer connected with "Wehrkunde", he is still interested in the publishing business and is apparently an UPHILL expert on the subject. It was he who, according to [], helped sell UTILITY the idea of putting out a series of pamphlets on current events. (Aktuelle Weltpolitik) under the label "Condor-Heftreihe" published and distributed nominally by Condor-Verlag, Karlsruhe, but actually by the Karlsruher Verlagsgesellschaft (Karl FRITZ, publisher) which publishes and distributes a series of popular weekly and movie magazines. The first pamphlet in the Condor-Heftreihe was "Kennedy und seine Mannschaft" by "Thomas Sigless" which is the pen name of Archduke Otto of Austria. It was released in August or September 1961. The second pamphlet, on the Congo, written by Princess Adelhaid of Liechtenstein is ready for release. A third pamphlet on Poland, written by (fnu) FRANZEL was rejected by the UPHILL experts on Poland, allegedly because it was unrealistic.</p> <p>5. in those of whoever happens to be the Institute's business manager. At the present time, this is Dr. Alfons DALMA, Munich, Herzog-Rudolf-Strasse 1 (Telephone Munich 293993). At one time, Federal Minister von MERMATZ was the Institute's First Chairman. Currently, this position is being held by Bavarian State Minister HEUBEL. According to information supplied by DALMA, the membership of the association which backs the above Institute (it has the identical name), comes largely from the CDU/CSU. The Institute has neither a firm yearly program nor does it issue any sort of prospectus on its activities. All of the Institute's activities are conducted on an ad hoc basis. As examples, DALMA cited discussions between CDU/CSU and FMR parliamentarians, also discussions between CDU/CSU and British Conservative parliamentarians at the height of the EEC crisis. According to DALMA, the Institute also furnishes lecturers, e.g., the former French Premier PFLIMLIN for a recent meeting of the Robert-Schumann-Association at the Munich University.

3. When passing us the above memorandum, [] advised that the staffer who had prepared it had told him that - while not able to prove it - he strongly suspects the above Institute of being a French propaganda front organization.



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


