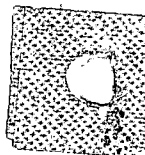
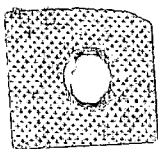

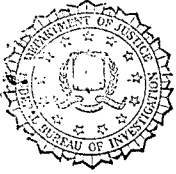

INTERNAL SECURITY - HAITI

On November 28, 1966, a confidential informant, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that he had heard the following from I. Irving Davidson:

Davidson on November 28, 1966, contacted [redacted] [redacted] ambassador to the United States and informed [redacted] (S) that on that morning he had received a visit from two gentlemen from Miami, one of whom he identified as a man named Rojas (phonetic). Davidson was not aware of the identity of the second individual.

Continuing, Davidson said that he told [Theard] (S) that the above two individuals had been telling him some stories about a meeting which had been held the previous evening in Miami and which concerned a new invasion of Haiti to be held in twelve to fifteen days. Davidson noted that his own Spanish was not too good and that these two individuals apparently had a lot of facts that Davidson did not understand.

Davidson informed [Theard] (S) that the above two individuals wanted to talk to [Theard] (S) and were "looking for some help." Davidson indicated to the informant that he told [Theard] (S) that [redacted] (S)

information had previously been received from the above individuals but had proven to be of "no interest." They now were in possession of new information and Davidson is of the opinion that they are to take part in the invasion. Davidson also indicated to the informant that he had suggested to [Theard] (S) that because he, Davidson, was unable to evaluate the information that [Theard] (S) could send [Staco] (S) (phonetic) (S) to talk (S) to the above individuals. (S)

The informant subsequently heard through Davidson that [Theard] (S) intended to send a Colonel to speak with the above individuals and cautioned Davidson that they should not know the Colonel's identity. Davidson indicated he would introduce the Colonel as a personal friend. (S)

In regard to [Staco] (S) mentioned above, it is noted that the "Diplomatic List" dated [August] (S) 1966, published by the [United States Department of State] (S) lists [Colonel Nerva Staco] (S) as [Military, Naval and Air Attache] (S) of the Embassy of Haiti. (S) *Fea*

The [position] (S) of Andre Theard (S) as previously mentioned was confirmed through the same ["Diplomatic List."] (S) (u)

On November 28, 1966, Ulda Poland, Registration Section, Internal Security Division, United States Department of Justice, advised that I. Irving Davidson is registered with the Department of Justice as an agent for the Government of Haiti, among others.

In regard to the above, it is also noted that on November 23, 1966, I. Irving Davidson advised a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that one Arsenio Rojas, then in Miami, Florida, was a "part of the invasion" of Haiti which was to be undertaken on November 23, 1966. Davidson
