Motivating students to edit Wikipedia

EVEN WHEN WE ARE NOT GIVING THEM ASSIGNMENTS

- Forcing students to edit Wikipedia can be harmful.
- Following right methodologies can help in building interest in the mind of a student.



Non-Wiki Activities?

A lot of activities other than editing may qualify for non-wiki activities. In case of students, they may be:

- Playing Soccer
- Cultural activities like dancing, singing for annual days
- Preparing for annual sports day, science exhibitions etc.
- Indoor games etc.





Using non-wiki activities to motivate students

- They become long-term editors.
- They edit on their own will.
- They turn into free knowledge activists.



An example scenario

- Encourage them to do their daily school-life extra-curricular activities.
- Ask one of the students to photograph them.



An example scenario (contd.)

- Arrange a collaborative session and show the students how to upload picture on Commons.
- Also, show them how can they link this image to their school wiki page.



Learnings?

- Students learn to use Commons.
- Students learn to use Commons images on Wikipedia.
- Learning about CC licenses and their importance.



Okay. Where's the motivation?

- Non-trivial ways to teaching motivates student to learn.
- Contributing while *not contributing*.
- No more burden, but a tool to explore.




Outcomes
