2. Field Trip:

- (1) Area-stationed agents:

They trip in accordance with the request of the chief of the areal agricultural extension agents within the county in charge.

 - c. Attendance to the training course sponsored by the Prefectural Government.

They make trip when it is necessary to collect their datum or investigate the matters concerned. They also make trip for the training course or research meeting in compliance with the request of the area-stationed home demonstration agents or the areal agricultural extension committee.

Hereby is submitted the said report regarding the selection of "Zotansha" in seba-mura, Higashichikuma-gun, Nagano Prefecture, as follows:

Through the consultations and deliberations had at the "Meeting to select the farming settlers in Shochiku Area", the following matters were formally decided.

1. Results of Selection:

No. of those wishing to be "Zotansha": 75

No. of those screened for "Zotansha": 75

No. of those approved to be "Zotansha": 33

No. of those not permitted to be "Zotansha": 32

Area of land to be given to "Zotansha": 4 cho 3 tan 26 bu.

2. Measures Taken:

- a. Out of 32 farmers who were not permitted to be "Zotansha" Seiji Nakano and 26 others who had submitted the petition to you were recognized to entertain a full enthusiasm for reclamation as "Zotansha" for the rationalization of their farming. So the prefectural authorities, village authorities and the land commission authorities agreed after consultation



to give them for reclamation the unreclaimed land of about 2 chobu situated in the neighboring area and fitted to reclamation plus the surplus land left alone within the land purchased through the confirming survey to be started soon.

- b. The Village Land Commission will immediately make the plan to purchase the said unreclaimed land.
- c. The prefectural government will make utmost efforts for the purchase of the said unreclaimed land.
- d. The written oath and annual plan of reclamation will be requested from those who were approved to be "Zotansha" and the prefectural government will give a full guidance for their reclamation works.

PETITION FOR THE PROBLEM
OF THE AGRICULTURAL COOPERATIVES

Sir,

We take the liberty to approach you respecting the following problems about the Agricultural Cooperatives.

I. With reference to the accounting derangements

1. We (Yoshio Kobayashi and 56 other farmers of Nanase, Nagaoka-mura, Shimotakai-gun, Nagano Pref.) have left the Nagaoka-mura Agricultural Cooperatives, but we have many points of doubt on the settlement of accounting. The Cooperatives counted very much loss in the report as of the end of March, 1950 which shall be the base of the repayment to our shares in a joint right, that is the loss amount is large as 450,000 yen against the total amount of contribution 243,000 yen. Since we have not clearly understand the detail of it, we went to the Coop. on June 5th, and requested the inspection and explanation of the settlement report provided by the Agr. Coop. Law Art. 39, Paragraph 2. The responsible personnel of the Coop., however, though he was at his office on that day, refused to give a clear answer in talking ambiguously, and we could not reach to any conclusion till the evening.
2. So we sent in a written paper concerning enforcement of accounting inspection according to the Agr. Coop. Law Art. 94, Paragraph 2 to the Governor of Nagano Pref. thru Chief of Agricultural Administration Sect. (with the settlement report attached with an appraised report of professional auditor). Kitajima Agr. Administration Chief informed us, "We may take the audit in accordance with your request, but we rather want you to have some way of settlement each other." And further he added, "Why did you make such a request as to audit the detail of the Coop. report?" This attitude seems to us that the authorities of Nagano Pref. have covered feudalistic and despotic attitude of the Coop. and ignored the all laws of Japan.

II. Re the advice to suspend our entrance
to other Agr. Cooperatives

1. We, 57 Nanase villagers who left the Nagaoka-mura Agricultural Cooperatives made application to enter into the Hirano-mura Agricultural Coop. of a neighboring village. The Hirano-mura Agricultural Coop. made an application to Nagano Prefectural authorities an approval of a change of the articles of the association according to the Agr. Coop. Law Art. 44 Paragraph 2, in order to change district for the purpose to acknowledge our entrance. However, the Prefectural authorities, called out the applicants, Hirano Agr. Coop. and us, who applied to enter to the Coop., and advised to suspend our entrance.
2. Change of the articles of association will not come into force unless having an approval of the administrative office according to the Agr. Coop. Law Art. 44 Paragraph 2. But in view of the same articles Paragraph 3, provisions of Art. 60 and 61 will be applied, the administrative office should approve the application except those contravene a disposal of administrative office which issued according to the law or based on the law on the contents of the application. The administrative office should also notify to the applicant whether the application is approved or not within two months from the day received the application. If the notice of approval or non approval are not issued within this period it is considered that the application had been approved, and in case of notifying of non approval, the authorities should write out the reasons in the notification. In view of this, existing fact of that law, action of approval or non approval should be decided upon the direction of the law or regulations and it is clearly understand that such decision could not be done by anyone's own decision.
3. Nagano Prefectural authorities, however, not only give any approval which despite that the application of change of the Articles of Hirano-mura Agr. Coop. does not contravene the administrative disposal issued by the laws or based on the laws, but also, on the contrary, advised to suspend our entrance. This action of the Prefectural authorities is rather infringes the principle of so called "Administration based on the laws", and it is misappropriation of his official power and infringes upon personal rights.
4. Moreover, the action of such advice is considered ignoring "Agr. Coop. shall not be controlled, interfered or inspected by any administrative agencies of Japanese Government, etc." which is stated in the Parag. 8 of "the principles concerning Japanese farmers organization" of the Committee of Far East which was announced specially from Public Relation Office of SCAP, GHQ dated 21 Dec. 1945.

Of course, in case of any suspicion might be existed in connection with Agr. Coop. Law Art. 94, administrative office may inspect the accounting of the Cooperatives or only such association that carry out trusted business with understanding of HQ shall receive an audit once a year (approved at the 7th Diet), but these are entirely different matter.

5. In such an unrest and haphazard condition we, farmers can not devote with self possession for the increase of foods production which is our proper mission. We feel very sorry that we have no other proper means than to appeal to your good office who will watch with a great power on democratization of Japanese agricultural villages for its speedy progress and guarantee.
6. As the situation is above stated, we therefore earnestly pray for your mercy upon these farmers pitiful situation and issue your proper and effective order to Nagano Prefectural authorities to take a democratic treatment on these two matters -- (1) Nagaoka-mura Agr. Coop. will allow us to inspect the settlement of its accounting book, (2) the prefectural authorities will approve quickly the application of Hirano-mura Agr. Coop. to change an area in order to enable us to join to their Cooperatives.

1. Rehabilitation works for the Susobana River Bank Completed

About 1,500 m section of the said bank in Nagano City which had been washed away by Kitty Typhoon in September of last year was fully completed, reassuring greatly the citizens from the danger to be brought by the coming "typhoon season". This work is based on a 3-year-plan with the budget of 83,000,000 yen aiming at the construction of the 2.8 km embankment for the control of the part of the river running through the city. The expenditures so far for this work are 36,950,000 yen. Nagano Municipal Government has a plan to connect this embankment with the existing sight-seeing road by increasing the width of the embankment from 4m to 8m.

2. Sericultural Industry of This Prefecture

(1) Mulberry fields:

Up to date, the growth of mulberry leaves has been very favorable in most parts of the Prefecture because of the proper amount of temperature and rain, although some parts have been affected by floods. Accordingly, compared with last year, the growth is better by 30%.

(2) Silk-worm culture

The yield of spring silkworms was exceedingly favorable and the shipment of cocoons having been completed, producing about 920,000 'kan' of superior cocoons and the total yield amounted to 1,090,000 'kan'.

The output of summer silkworms also produced a good result, and the shipment of cocoons is now being conducted and it is estimated that 570,000 'kan' of cocoons will be produced. Of late, as the price of raw silk (more than ¥ 200,000 per bale containing 16 kan of raw silk) has unexpectedly risen, the will to rear silkworms on the part of silk-raisers has suddenly come to be great, and the quantity of autumn and late autumn worms to be raised has greatly increased and compared with last year, about 30% will be increased in production. At present, the cocoons of summer silk-worms now under shipment is estimated to be ¥ 1,400-1,500 per 'kan', so compared with other farm products, silk-worm raising is quite profitable, and every silk-worm raiser has spared no effort to utilize even the last piece of mulberry leaf.

3. Production of Apple in the Prefecture:

The production of apple ranks next to Aomori Prefecture being the 2nd in the national ranking due to favorable climate and transportation. The planted area of apple trees was 3,690 cho in 1945 and increased to 4,519 cho at the end of 1949 (increase of 829 cho). The production occupies the important position in the economy of the farmers in the prefecture. Although the output of last year was about 10,000,000 kan due to short crop, the out-put of 15,000,000 kan is expected in this year. And the varieties and harvest-time are as follows:

Out of the estimated quantity of 15,000,000 kan, about 2,000,000 kan is for the producers' self consumption and 3,000,000 kan for the consumption within this prefecture. So the shipment of approximately 10,000,000 kan is expected. The fruiting time of the apple of this prefecture is 10 days or 2 weeks earlier than Aomori Pref. and ultra-violet ray which is abundant in the high land makes the colour and lustre fine and the taste nice. Owing to the abovementioned circumstances it is welcomed so much by market. The prefectural government is making efforts for giving production guidance to the apple producers aiming to raise the fame of "Shinshu Apple" more and for shipping guidance to let them make selective packing (packing by grade) perfectly.

4. Prefectural Counter-Unemployment Works

The Prefectural Government has made a principle to absorb as many jobless as possible to the disaster rehabilitation works commenced since June '50. In accordance with the conclusion reached at the department and section staff concerned, the following notification was issued to the city, town, village, public employment security office and construction office.

"In principle the disaster rehabilitation works to be conducted at 384 locations are to be managed directly by the prefectural, municipal, town or village government. Please try to employ daily 25,497 jobless from Aug. to Dec. (man days: 1,323,124) by the absorbing ratio from 40%-80% in the work field of forest road, river and road".

5. Project to Establish Sugadaira International Sightseeing Hotel:

It has been projected since this spring by the British Overseas Airways Corporation to establish an international sightseeing hotel at Sugadaira Heights. On August 19 & 20, the staff of the B.O.A.C., Mr. L.F. Wood (Business Section Chief of Hongkong Branch), Mr. W.E. Clerk (Business and Propagation Dep't Chief of Hongkong Branch), and Mr. Paul Raston (Chief of Tokyo Branch) inspected the spot under guidance of Nagano Prefectural Sightseeing Facilities Section Chief Shimodaira.

It was decided to begin the construction work in next spring with a cost of 40 million yen (10 million yen of which allotted to Japanese side). The lot of the hotel is 3,000 "tsubo" near the Physical Education Laboratory of Education Ministry. The hotel building will be constructed in ferro-concrete and wooden style, 530 "tsubo" of floor space, having 36 rooms and one students' room. Golf links, riding ground, tennis court and swimming-pool will be attached to the hotel.

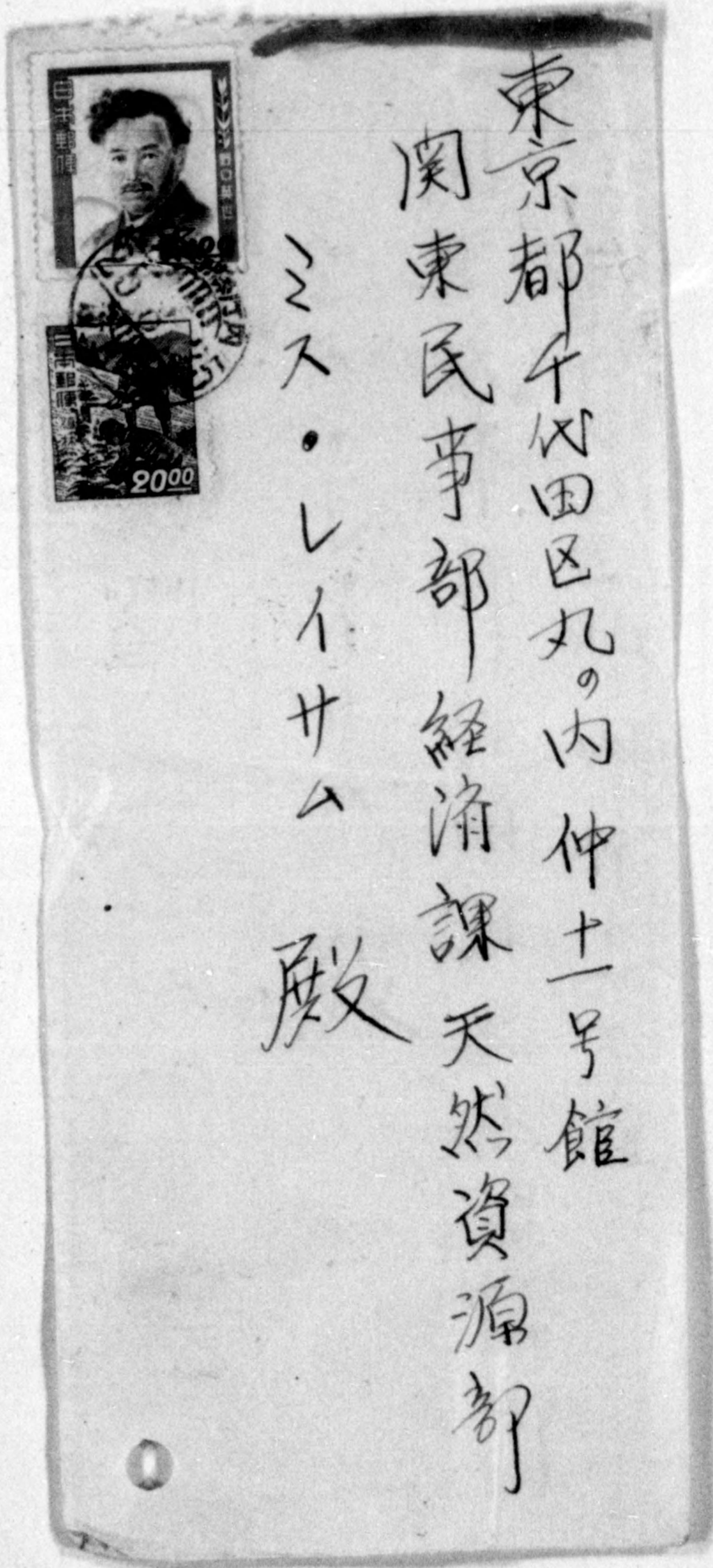

1. Housing Situation of This Prefecture

A. Status of housing acuteness:

This Prefecture suffered little from damage caused by air-raids, but with the increase of repatriates, war victims, evacuees and others, the acute housing shortage has been felt keenly throughout the Prefecture. The recent survey in this connection has revealed:-

a. No. of housing shortage

Present number of houses: 354,865
 " " " households: 400,431
 No. of houses short: 45,586

b. Presumed No. of houses short by job-type

Public worker: 40%
 Factory hand: 20%
 Company employee: 23%
 Others: 17%

c. Presumed No. of houses short by degree of acuteness

Too narrow: 50%

 Told to quit the house: 30%
 Living apart from one's family: 7%

The above survey has disclosed that geographically speaking, 6 cities are most acutely suffering from housing shortage, and classified by job-type, public workers, that is, the salaried class are most in distress, for a greater number of them are troubled with the narrowness of their present dwelling-houses, mixed residence, being urged to leave the house, etc. For meeting this situation, the Prefectural Government set up a ten-year plan as mentioned below:

- a) With the aim of procuring dwelling houses for the salaried class, houses to let are to be built within and near 6 cities
- b) For general people suffering from housing shortage, loan of funds from Housing Financing Public Corporation and banks and a Government grant for paying a fixed rate interest and other measures are taken for furthering the construction of houses on their own account.
- c) In order to make easy the redistribution of Prefectural officials, dwelling houses are to be constructed at different localities for them.
- d) For procuring dwelling places for repatriates, teachers and evacuees, guidance and assistance are to be offered for the construction of houses under the Municipal, Town, or Village management
- e) For procuring houses for repatriates, bereaved families, and widows, guidance and assistance are to be offered for the construction of houses of their own use under the Municipal, Town, or Village management.

B. Plan for construction of houses during 1950.

No. of houses to be constructed: 5,612

Amount of budget: ¥ 187,969,900

2. 2nd Term Program of Political Education

Prefectural Authorities have endeavored for diffusion of the political education among the prefectural people conducting the Political Education Reinforcement Period since this April. Such kind of movement as this, however, can not realize an anticipated result only in a period. Therefore the Prefectural Government is now going forward on the following Second Term Program of Political Education from July 1 to Sept. 30.

1) Strengthening of base of public information activities:

Regulation of public information program after holding the conferences of officials of all Prefectural Office Sections in charge of public information business.

Close connection with the Prefectural detached organs in Tokyo.

2) Strengthening of public information activities of Local Offices:

Local Office Chiefs should be responsible for activities in their areas respectively.

3) Promotion of autonomous public information activities of cities, towns and villages:

Autonomous activities of all the local communities are encouraged in order to make them independent as self-governing bodies.

4) Encouragement of "Town Meeting":

Town Meetings are encouraged to be held by all the local communities occasionally taking proper chances.

3. Present Status of Political Parties in the Prefecture:

Present status of each political party in the prefecture reported to the Investigation Section of the prefectural government by the end of July is as follows.

Liberal Party	25 chapters	1736 members
National Democratic Party	13 "	795 "
Socialist Party	51 "	2487 "
Communist Party	289 districts (commissioners and members of cells 3413)	

Liberal Party had scarcely change since April. National Democratic Party had 19 chapters and 1444 members in April this year. But at present the number of its members has decreased to 795 due to the reservation of the attitude of the members of former People's Cooperative Party because of unsatisfaction with the amalgamation of the said party to the Democratic Party. But national ranking of the National Democratic Party in this prefecture is fourth (Tokyo, Gunma, Ishikawa). And the influence of former People's Cooperative Party which is said to have organization in farm villages is strong in the National Democratic Party.

Owing to objective good circumstances, the Socialist Party in the prefecture has increased its members every month, compared with 34 chapters and 2250 members in April, national ranking being middle. As for the Communist Party in the prefecture, in April it had 274 chapters and 3762 members. But since then the decrease of the members was seen remarkably following the purge of the central commissioners of the party, suspension of issue of "Akahata" and organ of each cell, making top the dissolution of Karayama Cell of Ikuta-mura, Shimoina-gun. Although the increase of cell is seen in this report as a result of the urging of reporting of unreported cells, actually the number of members is decreasing gradually.

The national ranking of the Communist Party in the prefecture is fifth (Tokyo, Hokkaido, Osaka, Kanagawa).

4. Request for Announcement of Reason of Arrest

The government ordinance violation case by Communist Kazuo Shimizu, Yamabuki-mura, Shimoina-gun, which was reported under the Item 2. "Arrest of Communist Distributing Anti-U.S.A. Bills", 32nd Report, is under the investigation by the Nagano District Procurator's Office. On Aug. 12 Dietman Hyakuro Hayashi, Communist from Nagano Prefecture, and other persons concerned requested the Judge of the Iida Branch of the Nagano District Procurator's Office to announce the reason of arresting the said K. Shimizu.

It is for the first time that this request was field since the enforcement of the New Criminal Procedure Law.

5. Strike of Shinshu Boshoku Co., Ltd. Settled.

This strike which was reported in the 33rd Report was settled at 16:00, Aug. 16 through the signature by the labor and management on the condition that all the developments since the strike should be cancelled and restored to the situation prior to the strike. The committee-men of each side representing each side will form a sub-committee and push on the negotiations on the labor agreement and others.

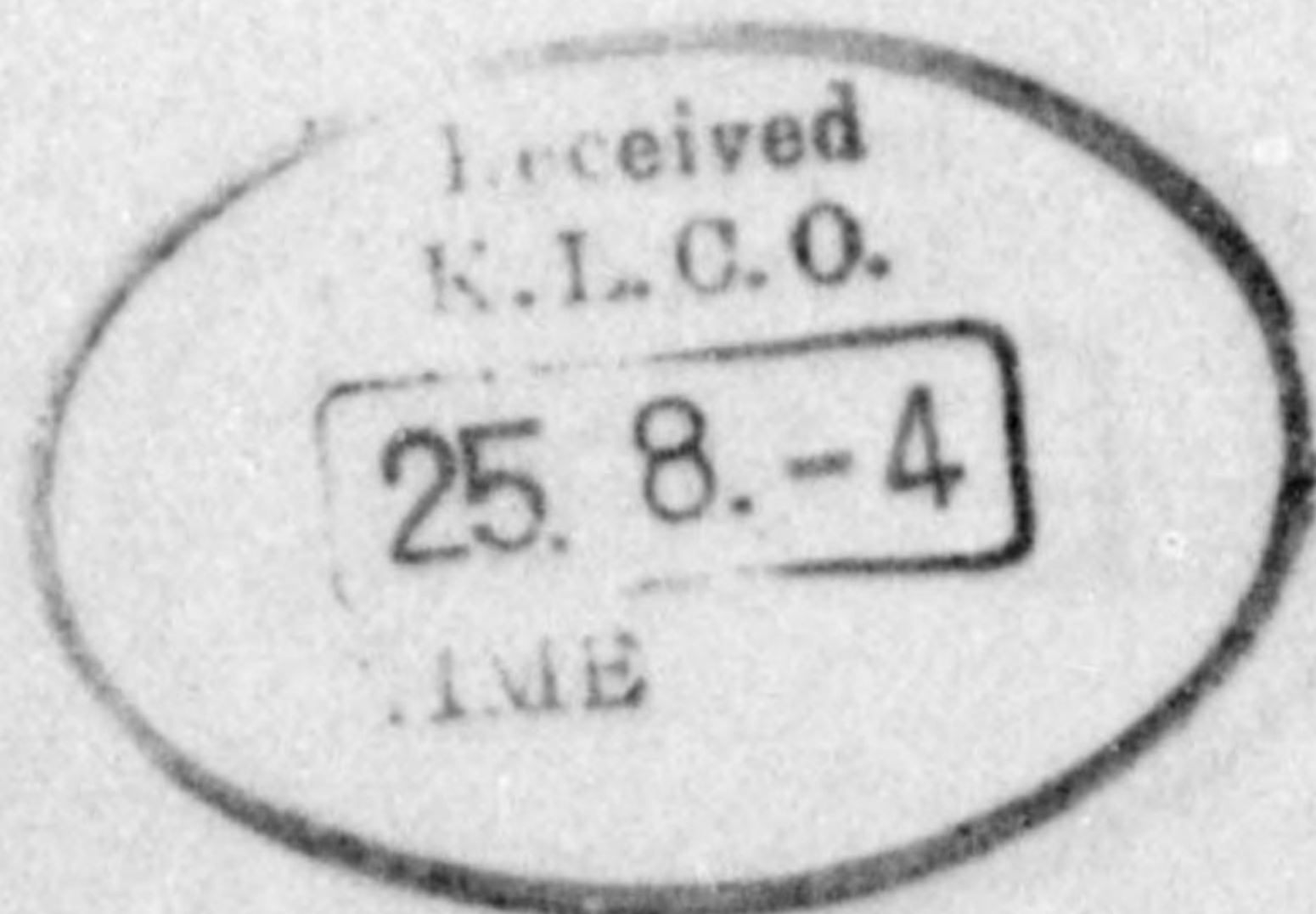

2. Principal activities related to research and agricultural improvement:
 - a. "Tsumomushi disease" and "Imochi disease" were found among the rice-plants in this prefecture. As their spreading was feared, the Prefectural Government issued a warning to the farmers through the channels of the extension agents, radio and newspapers, striving for destruction of these diseases.
 - b. It is feared that "Imochi disease" of rice-plant might be caused and spread in the southern area of the Prefecture (mainly Higashichikuma-gun, Minamiazumi-gun and Kitazumi-gun). So the Prefectural Government sprayed the drugs using the prefectural 26 motor sprays to prevent the diffusion of the disease.

1. Activities of agricultural farm advisors, home demonstration agents and agricultural improvement committees:
 - a. The numbers of the members of the Prefectural Agricultural Improvement Committee and the Areal Agricultural Committee are the same as reported in last report.
 - b. The prefectural government put an article in the Agricultural Improvement Edition of the Prefectural Newspaper on the duties of the areal agricultural committee, which was distributed to each of the committee members for enlightenment, as the said members have been re-elected and a considerable number of them was for the first time commissioned to the said duties.
The newly appointed agricultural extension and home demonstration agents were fully despatched to each area, so the areal committee held a round-table talk with them regarding the principles of the home demonstration and agricultural extension works.
 - c. As from the beginning of the 1950 fiscal year the prefectural government appointed newly one areal agricultural extension agent per each district and each one agricultural extension agent and home demonstration agent per each county ("gun") in order to make their activities more effective in compliance with the farmers' request. The prefectural government held 2 "Agents' Consultative Conferences" one each at Nagano City (on May 30) and Matsumoto City (on May 31), convoking the agents in each of the Hokushin Area and Nanshin Area: instructions on the agents' activities were given.



d. Specialized technicians

Their number at present is 2. One is an expert on harmful insects and farm diseases and the other is on the vegetable cultivation both of whom have been appointed by the prefectural government for making the agents' activities perfect.

e. Training Course for Leaders of Rural Youth Club

The prefectural government held a training course for the 110 representatives of the rural youth clubs selected out of the applicants for sound development of the rural youth clubs. They were given training on the problems of the various technical problems, agricultural extension works and their clubs for 1 night and 2 days at Nagano Prefectural Agricultural Experiment Station. They were divided into 2 groups: the first group was trained on May 26 and 27 and the second group was trained on May 27 and 28. This training course will be held in the prefecture every time it will be held in July, August, September and November regarding the same problems for bringing up of the true leaders for youth in the rural district.
