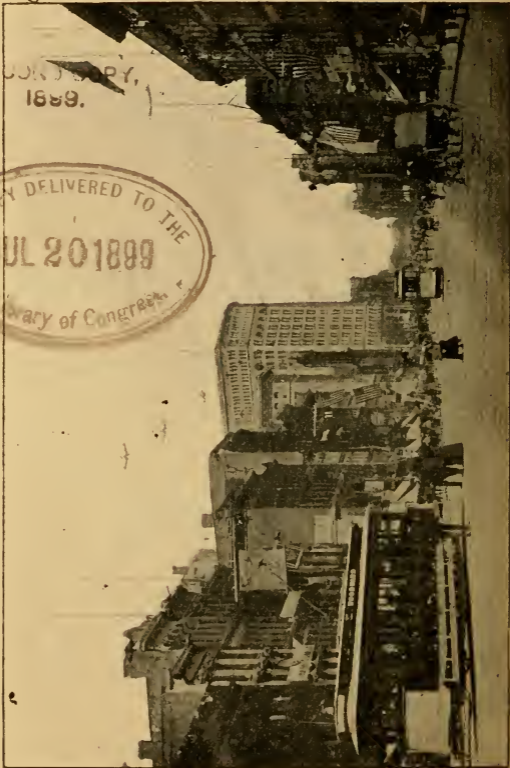

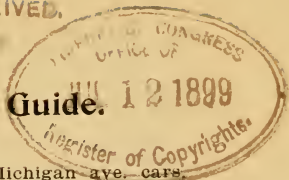

The C. E. Convention.

July 1899 is to be memorable in the history of Detroit, for the entertainment of the Christian Endeavor Convention. This organization is the largest association of young people that has ever been banded together for self-elevation and benefit to fellow-men. In the 18 years of Christian Endeavor history over 8,000,000 of young people have signed the C. E. pledge. Four millions of them have graduated into other departments of church work. There are 1,300 C. E. societies in this state with a total membership of 60,000.

In this city the preparations for the grand '99 convention have been long carried on and developed on an elaborate scale. The canvas village, which is to be the scene of meetings etc., is located on the Cass farm adjacent to the Central High School and covers an area of territory probably greater than ever before, so occupied in the history of the country. There are 47 tents, on the grounds including two hospital tents to be efficiently attended. The grounds are reached by transfer from any car line.

It is especially announced that the tents will withstand storms as well as a house would. They are said to be built on even safer lines than those turned out by the same makers for Barnum. There are a lot of extra safeguards that will be provided, so that in case of a windstorm the canvasmen can manipulate the tents so that there will be no possibility of disaster.

The headquarters of the official management of the Convention occupy during its sessions quarters in the High School building. The down-town information bureau is in the Wonderland building, corner Campus Martins and Monroe Ave.

During the five days of the convention several hundred meetings will be held in various parts of the city. The main program, however, will be carried out at Tents Endeavor and Williston and the Light Guard armory. Delegates will be admitted by badge before the hours of meeting, but after the scheduled time the public will be welcome and no ticket or card of admission will be required. On Sunday, July 9, no services will be held at the tents, in order to permit delegates to attend the churches.

PUBLIC REGISTRY SEAL.

Patrons of the Registry Department of the Detroit post-office should not fail to observe the very artistic apparatus which has been provided for the purpose of sealing valuable packages offered for registration. Issuing from a small oxidized pedestal is a tiny flame at which to heat the stick of wax which lies beside it, and, to complete the outfit, a nickel seal having the words "Registry Department, For Public Use," engraved upon it. As far as we are informed, the Detroit postoffice is entitled to credit for being the only office in the country affording such facilities to the public.

MAIL IN DISPUTE.

When a firm or company dissolves partnership, and contention arises as to whom the mail matter addressed to the former business firm or company, or its officials, shall be delivered, the postmaster will require them to designate some third person to receive the mail, retaining all mail matter until said person is selected, and if no one is designated to take the mail from the postoffice, nor an agreement between the contending parties is reached before the expiration of thirty days from the date when delivery ceased, all mail held in dispute shall be sent to the Dead Letter Office, until an agreement is made or receiver for the mail appointed. If, however, such letters bear card requests for their return if not delivered within a certain time, they shall be returned to the sender direct, at the expiration of the time named, care being taken to mark all such letters "In Dispute."

MAIL FOR THE FLATS.

Rural marine free delivery service between Detroit and Algonac, takes in all principal points at the St. Clair Flats. The places at which the carrier makes delivery are: The Old Club, Rushmere Club, Mervue Club, Star Island House, Marshland, Riverside, Joe Bedore's, Maple Leaf, San Souci, Muir's Landing, St. Clair Island, Grande Pointe Club and Algonac.

TRANSIT OF DETROIT MAILS.

The Postal News in its current issue prints an interesting schedule of the time of transit of mail between Detroit and fifteen of the largest cities in the United States. From Detroit to Boston takes a letter 19 hours to travel; to Baltimore, 23 hours; to Chicago, 8 hours; to Cincinnati, 8 hours; to Cleveland, 6 hours; to Charleston, S. C., 37 hours; to Jacksonville, Fla., 36 hours; to Minneapolis, 24 hours; to New York, 17 hours; to Omahaw, 20 hours; to Philadelphia, 23 hours; to Pittsburg, 12 hours; to St. Louis, 15 hours; to San Francisco, 80 hours; to Washington, 22 hours.

RATES OF POSTAGE.

Letters and all other written matter, whether sealed or unsealed, and all other matter sealed,

mailed, sewed, tied, or fastened in any manner so that it cannot be easily examined, 2 cents for each ounce or fraction thereof.

All letters to all parts of the United States or Canada, 2 cents for each ounce or fraction thereof.

Local, or "drop" letters, that is, for the city or town where deposited, 2 cents where the carrier system is adopted, and 1 cent where there is no carrier system.

Postal cards, 1 cent each, go without further charge to all parts of the United States and Canada. Cards for foreign countries (within the postal union) 2 cents each. Postal cards are unmailable with any writing or printing on the address side, except the direction, or with anything pasted on or attached to them.

Printed matter, in unsealed wrappers only (all matter inclosed in notched envelopes must pay letter rates), 1 cent for each 2 ounces or fraction weight 4 lbs. except for a single book, which may weigh more.

Newspapers and periodicals (regular publications) can be mailed by the public at the rate of 1 cent for each 4 ounces or fraction thereof.

All available matter not included in the above, which is so prepared for mailing as to be easily withdrawn from the wrapper and examined, 1 cent per ounce or fraction thereof. Limit of weight, 4 lbs. Full prepayment compulsory.

When a larger sum than \$100 is required, additional orders to take it up must be obtained.

IDENTIFICATION.

Section 5, of the Act making Appropriations for the Post Office Department for the fiscal year ending June 30th,

1900, provides that, "On and after April 1st, 1899, postmasters shall not issue any money order conditioned that identification of payee, endorsee, or attorney may be waived, nor shall any postmaster pay any money order issued on or subsequent to said date without requiring identification of the payee, endorsee, or attorney."

TRANS-ATLANTIC MAILS.

Mail is forwarded to New York at each closing for that office.

Regular steamer sailings: Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Saturdays for Great Britain, France, Germany, etc.

Correspondence should be mailed at the Post-Office not later than Sunday, Monday and Thursday evenings to insure connection with above sailings.

For special information, call at the office of the Superintendent of Mails.

FOREIGN POSTAGE.

The rates for letters are for the half ounce or fraction thereof, and those for newspapers for 2 ounces or fraction thereof:

To Great Britain and Ireland, France, Spain, all parts of Germany, including Austria, Denmark, Switzerland, Italy, Russia, Norway, Sweden, Turkey (European and Asiatic), Egypt, letters 5 cents, newspapers 1 cent for each 2 ounces or fraction thereof.

To Austria, letters, via San Francisco (except to New South Wales), 5 cents; via Brindisi, 15 cents; newspapers, via San Francisco, 2 cents; via Brindisi, 4 cents. China, letters, via San Francisco, 5 cents; via Brindisi, 13 cents; 4 cents for each paper not weighing over 4 ounces. British India, Italian mail, letters 5 cents, newspapers, 1 cent for 2 ounces. Japan, letters, via San Francisco, 5 cents; newspapers, 1 cent for 2 ounces.

TO FORECAST THE WEATHER.

1. The nearer the moon's change, first quarter, full and last quarter, to midnight the fairer will be the weather during the next seven days. The time for this calculation is from ten at night until two next morning.

2. The nearer to midday or noon the phase of the moon happens, the more foul or wet weather may be expected during the last seven days. The time for this calculation is from ten in the forenoon to two in the afternoon.

3. The moon's change, first quarter, full and last quarter happening during six of the afternoon hours, i. e., from four to ten, may be followed by fair weather, but this is mostly dependent on direction of the wind at that time. If wind be N. W. fair weather follows; if S. or S. W. a rainy spell ensues.

4. To prognosticate accurately in those cases where the wind is concerned the observer should be within sight of a vane, where the four cardinal points of the compass are correctly placed.

These observations refer principally to the summer. The weather, from a variety of irregular causes is more uncertain in the latter part of autumn, the whole of winter and the beginning of spring, yet in the main this forecasting will apply to these periods also,
