THIS may certify that at a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Hopkinton, held on the 20th day of November, A. D. 1848, the following among other votes were passed, viz:—Voted, That the Expenses for the year 1848 be published.

Voted, That a Committee of three be chosen to prepare for printing the Expenses for the year 1848, and cause the same to be printed. Hiram Comee, Augustus Phipps, and Silas Mirick were accordingly chosen as said Committee.

In compliance with the above votes, we submit to the inhabitants of Hopkinton, a Report of the disbursements and Receipts of the Treasurer from March 1, 1848, to March 2, 1849, with schedules annexed from A. to L.; also a statement of the condition of the Treasury March 1, 1849.

It may not be improper to state that the disbursements appear uncommonly large, owing to changing the town scrip from notes drawing 5 to 6 per cent. interest. We have given detail as far as was consistent with economy and the facilities at our command, and if any seeming injustice is done to any individual our excuse is no design to do so.
